SPECIAL PLACES FOR GRANTING PUBLICANS' LICENSES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGOUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* it was amongst other things enacted that notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the localities hereinafter mentioned to be respectively a district and place where publicans' licenses may be specially granted, that is to say:-

DOOKIE NORTH, and

THE RAILWAY STATION AT OAKLEIGH.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

THE PHARMACY ACT 1876.

WHEREAS by the Pharmacy Act 1876 the Board is empowered to make from time to time, and to alter or rescind regulations, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into effect: and whereas such regulations require to be confirmed by the Governor-in-Council; the Governor therefore, with the advice of the Executive Council, has approved of the subjoined regulations made in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, that is to say—

ELECTION OF MEMBERS OF BOARD.

1. *Appointment of returning officer.*—The board shall from time to time appoint (and may remove) some fit and proper person, who is registered as a pharmaceutical chemist, and not being a member of the board, to be returning officer, and to conduct the elections of members of the board in accordance with the provisions hereinafter made in that behalf.

2. *Expenses of elections.*—The board shall pay to the returning officer, for his own use, out of the moneys accruing under the Pharmacy Act 1876, a fee of £5 for each and every election conducted by such returning officer, together with a sum of money sufficient to recompense him all expenses incurred for the purpose of holding and conducting such election.

3. *Date of triennial election.*—In the month of February in the year 1880, and in the month of February in the year 1883, and in the month of February in every next and succeeding third year thence forward, the returning officer shall proceed to the election of seven persons, being registered pharmaceutical chemists of Victoria, to serve as members of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria.

4. *Extraordinary vacancies, how filled.*—If any vacancy shall occur from death, resignation, or a member becoming incapable, or being ousted by the Supreme Court, or absence from the meetings of the board, after the period of the first election hereinbefore mentioned, and before the triennial election then next ensuing, the returning officer shall, upon being notified by the board that an extraordinary vacancy has occurred, proceed to the election of a person being a registered pharmaceutical chemist to fill such extraordinary vacancy, and the person so elected shall hold office until the then next ensuing triennial election, and no longer.

5. *Returning officer to give notice of day of election and day of nomination, time and place when and where nominations will be received.*—At every election for members to serve on the board the returning officer shall give twenty-one days' notice, by advertisement in the *Argus*, *Age*, and *Daily Telegraph*, or such other papers as may from time to time be approved of by the board, of his intention to proceed on a certain day, to be named in such advertisement, to hold an election of fit and proper persons to serve as members on such board; and he shall also in such advertisement name a day, being not less than twelve days nor more than fifteen days prior to the day named for holding such election, on or before which all candidates for election must be nominated, as hereinafter provided; and he shall also in such advertisement name the time and place when and where such nominations will be received, and shall sign such notice and affix the date it is given thereto.

6. *Who may nominate, and how.*—Any person, registered as a registered pharmaceutical chemist in Victoria, desirous of nominating any other person as a candidate, shall fill up a nomination paper in the form of the First Schedule hereto, stating therein the Christian name and surname of such candidate, together with the other particulars required by such schedule, and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than five persons duly qualified to vote at such elections, and also by the person therein named as a candidate, accepting such nomination. Such nomination paper must be lodged or delivered by post before four o'clock in the afternoon of the day next preceding the day fixed for nominations.

7. *When a returning officer may declare members elected without a poll.*—When a poll shall be taken.—The returning officer shall, in the event of there not being a greater number of persons nominated than are required to fill the vacancies created, make a return to the registrar of the board, and declare such person or persons to have been duly elected member or members of the board; but if the number of persons nominated is greater than the number of persons required to fill such vacancies, a poll shall be taken, and he shall cause voting papers to be printed in the form given in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall sign each of such papers, and cause one to be enclosed in an envelope not fastened, with the name and address of the returning officer printed thereon, and one of such voting papers and printed envelopes shall be sent by post under a fastened cover to the address of each and every registered pharmaceutical chemist of Victoria, and resident in Victoria.

8. *Returning officer to ascertain number of voters for each candidate in presence of registrar and scrutineers.*—Candidates declared duly elected.—*Casting-vote of returning officer.*—The returning officer shall, on the day named in such advertisement for holding any election, proceed, in the presence of the registrar and of any scrutineers appointed by any candidate, to open the envelopes with his printed address thereon, and which have been returned to him, and to take out the voting papers therein contained, and if he is satisfied after comparing each of the signatures in such voting papers with the signatures of the voters in the signature book kept by the registrar, and that each vote is properly given, he shall proceed to ascertain the number of such votes for each candidate; and as soon as conveniently may be after the day of holding such election, the returning officer shall give public notice by advertisement of the number of votes given to each candidate, and shall declare the candidates, not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up, who have received the greatest number of votes to be duly

elected as Members of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, and if two or more candidates shall have received an equal number of votes, the returning officer shall in each case have the casting vote.

9. *Voting paper may become invalid.*—*Voting paper to be posted to address of returning officer.*—If any voter shall suffer to remain upon any voting paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of members to be elected, or shall fail to attach his signature thereto, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect, and shall not be counted by the returning officer. The voter shall enclose such voting paper in an envelope furnished to him with the printed address of the returning officer thereon, and shall post the same so that it shall be received by the returning officer in course of post before the day fixed for holding such election.

10. *How candidate may retire.*—If any person who shall duly have become a candidate for such election, and three of the persons having signed the paper nominating him shall be desirous that he retire before the day of holding such election from such candidature, such candidate and the persons aforesaid, not later than eight clear days before the day of holding such election, may sign and deliver a notice in the form of the Third Schedule hereto stating that such candidate so retires, and the returning officer on receipt of such notice shall omit the name of such person so retiring from the voting paper, and if the number of candidates shall by such retirement be reduced to the number of members to be elected, the returning officer shall declare the remaining members duly elected.

11. *Appointment of scrutineers.*—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint in writing one scrutineer, to be present when the returning officer shall open the envelopes containing the voting papers on the day of holding the election.

PROCEEDINGS OF BOARD.

12. *Election of president.*—The president shall be elected at the first meeting after the election of the board, by a majority of the members present; and if, for want of a quorum or from any other cause, a president shall not be elected at such first meeting, he shall be elected at the next meeting, a week's notice having been given by the registrar to each member of the board.

13. *Meetings of the board.*—*Special meeting.*—*Meeting to lapse when a quorum not present.*—The board shall meet in the building of the Royal Society or some other suitable place appointed by the board, on the second Wednesday in every month, at the hour of eleven a.m., and on such other days and at such time as the president or any two members of the board shall desire by requisition in writing addressed to the registrar, who shall thereupon summon the members of the board to meet on the day and at the time fixed by such requisition. If at the expiration of thirty minutes after the hour appointed for the

meeting of the board there shall not be a quorum of members present, no business shall be transacted, and the meeting shall lapse.

14. *Order of business.*—At every meeting of the board the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the previous meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to the accuracy as a record of the proceedings; such minutes, when confirmed, shall be signed by the president or chairman presiding at the time of confirmation.

After signing the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of the meeting shall be as follows, unless altered by a resolution of the board to that effect:—

Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the board.

Reading letters received and considering and ordering thereon.

Presentation of reports of committees, consideration and adoption.

Payments.

Ordinary business, including postponed or adjourned business.

Motions of which a week's notice has been previously given.

New rules or amended regulations of which 28 days notice have been given by the mover.

15. *Rules of debate.*—In all cases resort shall be had to the rules and forms provided in part II of the 15th schedule to the Act No. 506, so far as the same are applicable, and are not inconsistent with these regulations, for the purpose of regulating the proceedings in the general conduct of the business of the board.

16. *Seal of the board.*—The board may adopt by a resolution a seal as and for the common seal of the board.

17. *Custody of seal.*—The registrar shall have the custody of such seal, which shall be deposited in the office of the board, and shall not be used except as hereinafter provided.

18. *Seal, how affixed.*—The seal of the board may be affixed by the registrar, in the presence of a member of the board, to any instrument or writing when authorized by a resolution passed for that purpose and entered upon the minutes of the proceedings of the board, but not otherwise.

19. *Certificate to seal.*—Whenever the seal of the board is affixed as hereinbefore provided, the registrar shall append thereto his certificate that it has been affixed by order of the board, with the date of such order, as follows:

20. *Form of certificate of qualification.*—The board may adopt a design for the form of a certificate of qualification, to be issued to duly qualified pharmaceutical chemists, being persons who shall be qualified by examination under this Act, and such certificate shall be signed by the president and members of the board, and shall have affixed thereto the common seal of the board.

21. *Committees.*—The board may from time to time appoint from amongst themselves such committees as may be necessary, and may by resolution at any time abolish any committee so appointed. The president for the time being shall be *ex officio* a member of such committee, and if present shall preside.

22. *Seat of member, how vacated.*—If any member die, or by notice under his hand delivered to the president or registrar resign his office as member, or become incapable of being a member, or be declared ousted of such office by the Supreme Court, or be absent from four consecutive ordinary meetings of the board without leave obtained from the board in that behalf, then in every such case the office of every such member shall become vacant, and every such vacancy shall be an extraordinary vacancy and notified to the returning officer by the board.

23. *Chairman appointed during absence of president.*—If at the time appointed for holding a meeting of the board the president shall be absent, the members present may appoint one of themselves to preside as chairman at such meeting or until the president shall be present, when such chairman shall vacate the chair in favor of the president.

REGISTRAR AND REGISTRATION.

24. *Duties of registrar.*—The registrar shall be in attendance at his office at such hours as from time to time may be appointed by the board for that purpose, on every day except Saturday, and be present at all meetings of the board and committees. It shall be his duty to superintend the affairs of the board under the direction of the board and committees. The registrar shall keep the books in a neat and orderly manner; he shall conduct the correspondence and issue all summonses, take the minutes of all meetings for business and read them, and make a report of all matters that come under his cognizance for the information of the board and committees. He shall consult the president on any business requiring attention between the various meetings, and be responsible for the safe custody of all the documents and property belonging to the board which shall be under his control, and he shall find security in the sum of £100 in some fidelity or guarantee society, the premiums upon which to be repaid to him by the board.

25. The registrar shall receive all fees, fines, subscriptions, donations, and other moneys, which may become due or payable to the board, and give a printed receipt and no other for the same, retaining a block counterpart of such receipt. He shall once in each week pay over to the treasurer the amount of moneys received by him during the week, and obtain the treasurer's signature upon each block counterpart for the money therein mentioned.

26. The registrar shall receive and preserve certificates, cards, or tickets, issued by the examiners signifying that examinations have been passed.

27. *Form of register for pharmaceutical chemists—Form of register for apprentices.*—The registrar shall from time to time make out and maintain a register, in the form prescribed in the first schedule to the *Pharmacy Act 1876*, of all persons admitted by the board as pharmaceutical chemists. He shall also from time to time make out and maintain a register of all persons who have passed the preliminary examinations prescribed by these regulations for apprentices. Such register shall be in the same form as that prescribed for registered pharmaceutical chemists, inserting under the head of qualification, apprentice to A. B., registered pharmaceutical chemist, and there shall be a column for the insertion of the date when such apprentice is admitted as a pharmaceutical chemist, when his name shall be transferred to the register of pharmaceutical chemists.

28. *Signatures of registered pharmaceutical chemists.*—The registrar shall from time to time keep and maintain a signature book containing the signatures of each and every registered pharmaceutical chemist, which shall be arranged in alphabetical order, and he shall produce such book for the inspection of the returning officer appointed by the board on the day of holding each and every election provided for by these regulations.

TREASURER.

29. *Appointment of honorary treasurer.*—The board may, from time to time, appoint one of their number as honorary treasurer, who shall find security in the sum of £100, and may pay to such honorary treasurer, out of the moneys accruing under this Act, a sum sufficient to recoup him for any premiums he may have to pay to any fidelity or guarantee society for obtaining such security as aforesaid.

30. *Duties of treasurer.*—It shall be the duty of the honorary treasurer to receive all moneys from the registrar and to lodge the same in some bank, appointed by the board, to the credit of an account headed "Pharmacy Board of Victoria," and to pay by a cheque signed by the treasurer and two members of the board, such accounts as the board may from time to time order by a resolution, which shall specify the sums of money to be paid and to whom.

31. *Investment of funds.*—The board may, from time to time, direct the treasurer to invest any surplus funds in his hands over and above what is required for the working expenses of the board, in such manner and upon such security as shall be authorized by a resolution of the board.

32. *Monthly statement of treasurer and annual balance-sheet.*—The treasurer shall present to the board a monthly statement showing the receipts and expenditure for the past month, and he shall also, in the month of January in each year, prepare and present to the board an annual balance-sheet, showing the exact financial position of the affairs of the board.

AUDITORS.

33. *Appointment of auditors and term of office.*—The board shall appoint, in the month of March in each year, two fit and proper persons as auditors, who shall hold office until the month of March in the year following, and the board may pay out of the moneys accruing under the *Pharmacy Act 1876*, a fee of £2 2s. to each of such auditors.

34. *Duties of auditors.*—The auditors shall inspect the books and accounts of the board, and examine the annual balance-sheet prepared by the treasurer, and shall certify to the same if correct, and they shall also investigate and examine all contracts, accounts, invoices, books, bills of parcels, and vouchers, in any wise relating to or concerning the same, which may be kept by or in the possession of the treasurer and registrar, and they shall also examine the bank pass-book, and ascertain that it corresponds with the account of the board in the bank, and they shall present an annual report to the board, stating the result of their inspection and examination.

EXAMINERS—EXAMINATION.

35. *Appointment of examiners.*—The board shall annually appoint three of their number, or three other fit persons, to act as examiners, and may pay out of the moneys accruing under the Act such fees as they shall from time to time determine to any examiner other than a member of the board.

36. The board shall from time to time fill up any vacancy in the office of examiner.

37. *Examinations, time of, fixed by board.—Result reported to board.*—The examiners shall meet as often as may be required for the purpose of conducting examinations at such times as may be directed by the board, and such examiners shall report the result of every examination to the board at the next meeting immediately following the same.

38. *Examiners may grant or refuse certificates.*—The examiners may grant or refuse to such persons as shall have tendered themselves for examination as in their discretion may seem fit, certificates of competent skill, knowledge, and qualifi-

cation; and such certificates shall be delivered by the examiners to the registrar, and submitted at a meeting of the board for its approval.

39. *Registrar to preserve certificates.*—The registrar shall receive and preserve the certificates issued by the examiners, signifying that examinations have been passed.

REGULATIONS FOR EXAMINATIONS.

40. *Time of holding examinations.*—Examinations shall be held at least four times annually, viz., in the first week in December, the first week in March, the first week in June, and the first week in September, in each year: Provided always that the modified examination shall be held when and so often as the board may think advisable.

PRELIMINARY EXAMINATION.

41. *Preliminary examinations.*—Apprentices shall, at a preliminary examination to be fixed by the board, pass before the board, or before some person appointed by it in that behalf, in the following three subjects:—

Latin—Grammar, and translation from *De Bello Gallico*, Book I.

English—Grammar and composition.

Arithmetic—Including first four rules, simple and compound, vulgar and decimal fractions.

42. *When candidate shall not be required to pass examination.*—If the candidate produces and lodges with the registrar a certificate that he has at the matriculation examination of the Melbourne University, or the matriculation examination of some other university recognized by the board, passed in the above or corresponding subjects, he shall not be required to pass this examination.

43. *Apprentices to be registered.*—Apprentices, within twelve months from the date of their indentures, shall register the same with the registrar, upon payment of the fee of Ten shillings and sixpence.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO BE EXAMINED.

44. *Candidate to give notice of his intention to be examined.*—Every candidate desirous of being examined shall, ten days previous to the day fixed for examination, give the registrar written notice of his intention to present himself at such examination, together with his indentures of apprenticeship, and pay the prescribed fee.

CERTIFICATES OF QUALIFICATION.

45. *When certificate of qualification may issue.*—No certificate of qualification under the *Pharmacy Act 1876* shall be issued to any person who is required to pass in subjects of *Materia Medica*, *Medical Botany*, and *Practical Chemistry*, in the manner prescribed by sub-section iv. of section 18 of the said *Pharmacy Act 1876*, until he shall furnish the board with a proper certificate of his having passed in such subjects at the University of Melbourne, or any college or board of pharmacy recognized by the board.

46. *When certificate of qualification may be issued to an apprentice.*—No certificate of qualification shall be issued to any person who is by the *Pharmacy Act 1876* required to be apprenticed until he shall furnish the board with a declaration to be approved by them that he has faithfully, and without any unreasonable intermission, served his apprenticeship for the term required by the said *Pharmacy Act 1876*, and also a like declaration by the person to whom he was apprenticed.

47. *Certificate of qualification for registration as a registered pharmaceutical chemist for twelve months.*—In any case when any person shall have duly made application to be registered as a registered pharmaceutical chemist, and the board shall require any declaration for further evidence which cannot for the time being be obtained, the board may, on being satisfied as to the *bonâ fides* of the application, and that the applicant is possessed of competent knowledge and skill, grant to him a certificate in the form A to these regulations; and the person to whom such certificate is granted shall thereupon be enabled to be registered as a registered pharmaceutical chemist for any period not exceeding twelve months.

48. *When such certificate shall become void.*—If any person who shall have obtained such certificate as in the last regulation mentioned do not, within the time for which certificate is granted, furnish the board with the declaration of evidence required by them, the said certificate shall become void and of no effect, and the person named therein shall be struck off the register.

49. *Plates for printing certificates to be locked up.*—All plates used from time to time for printing the forms of certificates shall be deposited in the board room, in a box having a lock and two keys, one of which shall be in the custody of the president and the other in that of the registrar.

50. *No print to be taken except by order of the board.*—No print shall be taken from any of the said plates without an express order of the board. All prints taken shall be in the custody of the registrar.

PRACTICAL PHARMACY EXAMINATION.

51. Every candidate must be able to read without abbreviation autograph prescriptions, translate them into English, and render a literal as well as appropriate translation of the directions for use.

52. Every candidate must be able to recognize the several preparations of the *Pharmacopœia* which are not of definite chemical nature, such as extracts, tinctures, simple and compound powders, &c.; and to describe the composition of such

as are compound, and give the proportions of the active ingredients, and explain the processes of maceration, percolation, evaporation, &c.

53. Every candidate must be able to weigh, measure, and compound medicines in the most approved manner; to write the directions in concise language, as well as in a neat and distinct hand, and correctly translate the prescription; and finally, to finish and properly direct each package. He must be able to spread plasters with dexterity and neatness. He will be examined with reference to his knowledge of the strength of simple solutions ordered in the *Pharmacopœia*, by which he may be enabled to make practical application of such knowledge. He will also be examined with reference to the best excipients and methods of manipulation for forming emulsions with oils, resins, balsams, and other substances not otherwise miscible with water, and for giving a good pilular condition to substances which are administered in that form; and also as to poisons and antidotes. He will also be examined in the metrical system of weights and measures.

54. He must be able to detect unusual doses in prescriptions, and adulteration in drugs and chemicals, and recognize the ordinary chemicals used in medicine; he must also possess a practical knowledge of the processes by which they are produced; of the composition of such as are compound; and be able to explain the decompositions which occur in their production and admixture.

MODIFIED EXAMINATION.

56. The modified examination shall include prescriptions, practical dispensing, *materia medica*, quality of specimen, pharmacy, and chemistry of the *Pharmacopœia*.

PRESCRIPTIONS.

57. The candidate must be able to read autograph prescriptions, translate them into English, render a correct translation of the directions for use, and detect unusual doses.

PRACTICAL DISPENSING.

58. The candidate must be able to weigh, measure, compound medicines, write the directions neatly in suitable language, and to finish and direct each package properly.

MATERIA MEDICA.

59. The candidate must be able to recognize the *Pharmacopœia* chemicals in frequent demand, and specimens of roots, barks, leaves, fruits, resins, and gums in ordinary use; the following plants, either in a fresh or a dried state, or from plates:—*Belladonna*, *stramonium*, *hyoscyamus*, *conium*, *aconitum*, *digitalis*, or such others as may be produced to him; also, to correctly estimate the quality of each specimen submitted, and its freedom from adulteration.

PHARMACY.

60. Every candidate must be able to recognize the preparations of the *Pharmacopœia* which are not of definite chemical nature, such as extracts, tinctures, and powders, and give the proportions, of the more active ingredients.

TEXT-BOOKS.

61. The following are the text-books prescribed by the board:—

Proctor's or Redwood's *Pharmacy*.
Pereira's *Selecta & Prescriptis*.
British Pharmacopœia.
Squire's Companion to the British Pharmacopœia.

COLLEGES AND SCHOOLS OF PHARMACY.

62. The following societies and schools of pharmacy are recognized by the board:—

The *Pharmaceutical Society of Ireland*.
Le Ecoles de Pharmacie de France; et de *Belgique*.
The colleges or universities of *Germany*, *Denmark*, *Sweden*, *Russia*, *Norway*, and *Austria*; and such other societies and schools as may from time to time be approved of by a resolution of the board.

63. The words used herein in the singular shall be deemed to include the plural, and the words used in the plural shall be deemed to include the singular, unless the contrary is expressly provided.

GAOLS AT ARARAT, BALLARAT, BEECHWORTH, CASTLEMAINE, GEELONG, MARYBOROUGH, MELBOURNE, PORTLAND, AND SANDHURST.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Statute of Gaols 1864* (27 Vict. No. 219), it was amongst other things enacted, that all buildings, erections, houses, enclosed places, and premises thereafter to be erected, built, enclosed, purchased, enlarged, or maintained at the public expense, as and for public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments within Victoria, which were from time to time proclaimed by the Governor in Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, as such public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, or penal establishments, should from and after the publication of such notice, be severally deemed and taken to be the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments (hereinafter called "gaols") respectively of the place or district where the same were situated, and should be subject to the several provisions made for the regulation, discipline, management, and care of the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments already erected (also hereinafter called "gaols"), and of the prisoners confined within the same; and it was also enacted that, except where it was otherwise proclaimed by the Governor in Council, every gaol should be and be taken for all purposes as being equally a house of correction and a prison for debtors, and also every house of correction should be taken to be a prison: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of April 1864, certain premises therein described and situated at Ararat and Geelong were amongst others declared to be public gaols, prisons, and houses of correction: And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the twenty-fourth day of October 1864 the Gaols at Ballarat, Castlemaine, Maryborough, Melbourne, Portland, and Sandhurst, were with one other similarly proclaimed: And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the fifth day of February 1865 the Beechworth Gaol was with another similarly proclaimed: And whereas it is expedient to re-define the sites on which such gaols are situated and to re-proclaim such gaols: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby revoke so much of the said several Proclamations as relates to the gaols at the places hereinbefore mentioned, and do by this notice declare, proclaim, and notify that the buildings and premises hereinafter mentioned are and shall be Public Gaols, Prisons, and Houses of Correction within the meaning and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

ARARAT GAOL—Comprising all buildings, erections, houses, enclosed places, and premises erected, built, or enclosed on the following site, viz.:—Seven acres nine perches, county of Ripon, borough of Ararat: Commencing at the junction of the west side of the street which bounds the hospital site on the west with the north side of Girdlestone street; bounded thence by the last-mentioned street bearing west seven chains twenty-five links; thence by a street bearing north nine chains seventy-three links; thence by a street bearing east seven chains twenty-five links; and thence by the street first mentioned bearing south nine chains seventy-three links to the point of commencement.

No. 219), it was amongst other things enacted, that all buildings, erections, houses, enclosed places, and premises thereafter to be erected, built, enclosed, purchased, enlarged, or maintained at the public expense, as and for public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments within Victoria, which were from time to time proclaimed by the Governor in Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, as such public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, or penal establishments, should from and after the publication of such notice, be severally deemed and taken to be the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments (hereinafter called "gaols") respectively of the place or district where the same were situated, and should be subject to the several provisions made for the regulation, discipline, management, and care of the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments already erected (also hereinafter called "gaols"), and of the prisoners confined within the same; and it was also enacted that, except where it

was otherwise proclaimed by the Governor in Council, every gaol should be and be taken for all purposes as being equally a house of correction and a prison for debtors, and also every house of correction should be taken to be a prison: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony bearing date the eleventh day of April 1859 the buildings and premises called and known as The Penal Establishment at Pentridge were declared to be a public gaol, house of correction, and penal establishment of and for the colony of Victoria: And whereas it is expedient to re-define the site on which such penal establishment is situated and to re-proclaim such penal establishment: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the Proclamation hereinbefore mentioned, and with the advice aforesaid I do by this notice proclaim, declare, and notify that the buildings and premises hereinafter mentioned are and shall be a public gaol or penal establishment within the meaning and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

PENTRIDGE PENAL ESTABLISHMENT—Comprising all buildings, erections, houses, enclosed places, and premises erected, built, or enclosed on the following site, viz.:—One hundred and nineteen acres thirty-nine perches, county of Bourke, parish of Jika Jika, at Coburg, in the two separate portions hereinafter described, viz.:—

Also, that all runs or properties which are at present or may hereafter be intersected by boundary-lines common to the Central, Geelong, Gippsland, and Wimmera districts shall form a portion of and be included in the Central district. Also, that all runs or properties which are at present or may hereafter be intersected by boundary-lines common to the Wimmera, Geelong, and Warrnambool districts shall form a portion of and be included in the Wimmera district. Also, that all runs or properties which are at present or may hereafter be intersected by boundary-lines common to the Warrnambool and Geelong districts shall form a portion of and be included in the Warrnambool district. 1. There may be issued licenses to cut and take away eucalyptus timber, including red gum, from such crown lands as are specified therein.
2. Every such license shall be subject to the conditions specified in the schedule hereunder and to a yearly fee of £4.

1. That payment of fee shall be made by licensee in advance.

3. Not more than three trees shall be felled before they are cut up.
4. One person only shall cut or take away timber under this license, and the interest of the State in such timber shall not cease until it has been transported from the place wherein it has been cut to the nearest main road.
5. This license shall be liable to revocation at any time by the Board of Land and Works without any liability to satisfy any claims by the said licensee for compensation.
6. This license shall be produced by the licensee upon the request of any bailiff of Crown lands or any police constable.

6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the President of the said council being first obtained.

7. No person except laborers or workmen employed in the reserve shall enter any plots which may be enclosed within the reserve for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS.

The reserve is parcelled out into the following divisions :—

- (1st.) The grand stand, pavilion, members', and ladies' reserve.
- (2nd.) The playing ground.
- (3rd.) The bowling green.
- (4th.) The remainder of the reserves.

All persons shall be admitted to the fourth division free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on days whereon international, intercolonial, cup, and all other important cricket matches shall be played, and also on days on which sports shall be held in the said reserves.

No person shall enter at any time into any part of the first division except on production of a ticket issued by the committee of management duly authorizing such person in that behalf.

All persons paying for admission to the fourth division, or any part thereof, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which they shall upon demand produce, and (if required) surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management to demand the production or surrender of the same.

Persons renting or hiring for any cricket match or other event the grand stand, or any portion thereof, or any booth in the reserve, shall abide by any order given by the committee of management in reference to the reserve or the buildings or other erections for the time being thereon.

No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards his dress, language, or conduct.

No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserves, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or damage the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones into the reserves.

No person shall put in the reserves any cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee of management.

No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserves, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the committee of management first obtained.

No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserves, shall enter any plots which may be enclosed within the reserves for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Any person committing in the reserves, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased and shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the reserve or any part thereof :—

- (1.) Assaulting any other person.
- (2.) Being drunk.
- (3.) Crossing, or trespassing upon the playing ground during a cricket match, or sports, or during practice at cricket, or when crossing or trespassing upon the ground would be injurious to it as a cricket ground.
- (4.) Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
- (5.) Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
- (6.) Behaving improperly or riotously.
- (7.) Being found in any part of the first, second, third, or fourth divisions, and not producing upon demand, or (if required) not surrendering to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management to demand production of the same, a ticket duly authorizing admission to that part where such person shall be so found.
- (8.) Obtaining admission to any part of the first, second, third, or fourth divisions when disentitled to such admission under these regulations.

The following is the scale of charges or fees which shall be charged and taken for admission to the fourth division and to the grand stand, on such days as the committee of management shall appoint, but not to exceed in the whole four days in each year :—
