THE SHIRES OF WARANGA AND McIVOR.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-second day of October 1877.

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act 1874 (38 Vict. No. 506, it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Order, amongst other things, altering, for the purpose of adjusting the boundaries of continuous municipal districts, being shires, without any petition; and it was further enacted that every Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act should be published in the Government Gazette, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas it has been deemed expedient that a portion of the boundary-line between the Shires of Waranga and McIvor should be altered: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby alter and adjust the boundaries of the said Shires of Waranga and McIvor, and doth re-define the boundaries thereof respectively in manner following, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF WARANGA.—Beginning at the north-west angle of the parish of Weston; thence east along the parish boundaries to the road which runs on the west side of H. C. Morrison's selected land in the parish of Crosbie; south along said road to the road from Knowsley to Mount Campbell pre-emptive right; eastward along this road past the south boundary of D. Wilkie's and E. Barker's lands to the east angle of C. P. Davis's block, 2A, parish of Redcastle; thence south 80° 30' east to Sandy Creek; down Sandy Creek and the river Goulburn to a point due north of the northern angle of Ardpatrick run; south-westward to the south-east angle of Rochester village reserve; west to the river Campaspe; and up said river to the starting point.

Wherever the line so described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary line.

THE SHIRE OF McIVOR.—Beginning at the north-west angle of the parish of Weston; thence east along the parish boundaries to the road which runs on the west side of H. C. Morrison's selected land in the parish of Crosbie; south along said road to the road from Knowsley to Mount Campbell pre-emptive right; eastward along this road, past the south boundary

of D. Wilkie's and E. Barker's lands, to the east angle of C. P. Davis's block, 2A, parish of Redcastle; south 81° 30' east to Sandy Creek; down Sandy Creek to the river Goulburn; up this river to the junction of Hughes' Creek; south-westward along the electoral boundary to Mount Koala; southward along dividing range to meet a line from the source of Mollison's Creek to the south-east angle of allotment 2, parish of Baynton; along said line to Pohlman's Creek at the latter point; down Pohlman's Creek to and westward along the parish boundary of Baynton to the north-west angle of allotment 16; westward to Piper's Creek at the south-east angle of allotment 3, section 1, parish of Emberlon; and down Piper's Creek and the Campaspe River to the starting point.

Wherever the line so described as aforesaid runs beside or along a creek or road, whether such is specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such creek or road shall be taken to be the boundary line.

And the Honorable James Brown Patterson, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The births of 722 children, viz., 369 boys and 353 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of September. In the month of August 806 births were registered, or 84 more than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in September numbered 351, viz., 183 of males and 168 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 371. The deaths were 102 less than those in August, but exceeded the average of September during the previous ten years by 55. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been only 9 in excess of the average of the same ten years.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 75.0° on the 28th, and the lowest was 37.6° on the 7th. The mean temperature of the month (52.3°) was a little below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (33.0°) took place on the 8th, viz., from a maximum of 74.0° to a minimum of 41.0°. The least range (4.5°) was on the 9th, viz., from a maximum of 54.5° to a minimum of 50.0°. The mean daily range was 16.22°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.071 inches) was more than a tenth of an inch above of the average.

Of the deaths registered during the month 52 per cent. were of males, and 48 per cent. were of females. Thirty-eight per cent. were of children who had not attained the age of 5 years as against 28 per cent. in September 1876; 35 per cent. in September 1875; 25 per cent. in September 1874; 36 per cent. in September 1873; 31 per cent. in September 1872; 37 per cent. in September 1871; 32 per cent. in September 1870; 33 per cent. in September 1869; 37 per cent. in September 1868; and 40 per cent. in September 1867.

Eight deaths of persons aged 75 years or upwards were recorded during the month, which is a number below the average, viz.:—Those of a female, aged 75, a bootmaker, aged 76, a gentlewoman, aged 79, a wheelwright and a female domestic servant, each aged 82, of old age; a male cook, aged 76, of bronchitis; a female, aged 76, of apoplexy; a female aged 83, of pulmonary congestion.

Fourteen of the deaths recorded during the month were ascribed to external causes, twelve of which were set down to accident, one to homicide, and one to suicide. The following are the particulars:—A carter, aged 36, a dealer, aged 45, and a carrier, aged 48, were passed over by vehicles; a publican, aged 35, was killed by a train passing over him (no evidence to show whether suicidal or not); a barmaid, aged 29, received a fracture of the skull caused by jumping out of an omnibus; a laborer, aged 37, died of fracture of the skull, caused by a fall whilst intoxicated; a laborer, aged 38, died of injuries caused by a fall of earth on the Gippsland Railway; a female, aged 44, died of burns; a grocer's assistant, aged 26, was accidentally drowned in Port Phillip Bay whilst bathing; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 50, was found drowned in the River Yarra; two male infants, aged respectively 7 weeks and 1 month were accidentally suffocated in bed. A newly-born female infant was murdered by suffocation. A speculator, aged 38, whilst of unsound mind, committed suicide by cutting his throat.

Seventy-six deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—40 in the Melbourne Hospital, 4 in the Immigrants' Home, 1 in the Children's Hospital, 9 in the Alfred Hospital, 8 in the Lying-in Hospital, 4 in the Benevolent Asylum, 8 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Industrial Schools.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 134, of which 70, or 52 per cent., were of males; and 64, or 48 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 88 were under one year of age, 26 were between one and two, 9 were between two and three, 7 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 217. Of these, 118, or 52 per cent., were males, and 104, or 48 per cent., were females; 14 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 8 were between fifteen and twenty, 13 were between twenty and twenty-five, 16 were between twenty-five and thirty, 19 were between thirty and thirty-five, 20 were between thirty-five and forty, 15 were between forty and forty-five, 28 were between forty-five and fifty, 22 were between fifty and fifty-five, 17 were between fifty-five and sixty, 19 were between sixty and sixty-five, 7 were between sixty-five and seventy, 4 were between seventy and seventy-five, 5 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 3 were upwards of eighty.

The mortality from most of the causes which were mentioned as having been particularly fatal in August was lower in September than in that month. Thus deaths from whooping cough fell from 20 to 17; those from typhoid fever fell from 17 to 15; those from phthisis fell from 78 to 46; those from diseases of the respiratory system fell from 85 to 64; and those from the consequences of childbirth fell from 11 to 2. A few more deaths from diseases of the nervous system occurred in the month under review than in the previous one.

AUSTRALIA,

SOUTH COAST—BANKS STRAIT—1874-77.

BANKS STRAIT separates the Furneaux group from the N.E. part of Tasmania, and may be said to lie between Goose Island to the N.W. and Eddystone Point to the S.E. The narrowest part of the strait ($8\frac{1}{2}$ miles wide) lies between Swan and Clarke islands, and here the tide runs with a velocity of 3 knots at spring tides; westerly winds accelerate the ebb stream (which runs from the westward) so much that it may be no exaggeration to say that it occasionally attains a force of 5 or even 6 knots. With a head-wind it is generally impossible for sailing vessels to get to the westward, and the custom is to anchor either under Swan Island or in Muscle Roe Bay, the latter anchorage being far preferable as the holding ground at the Swan is bad. Sometimes small craft anchor off Little Muscle Roe River, the water being shallower; but the anchorage is not so good as in the larger bay. The recent survey has proved the existence of many dangerous rocks, and the navigation of Banks Strait is now known to require great care.

GOOSE ISLAND.—The westernmost of the group, known as "Chappell islands," is only 54 feet high at its highest and northern part, and consists of nothing but granite boulders with a shallow covering of soil in the hollows, where a few sheep are grazed.

Light.—The lighthouse is situate near the south point of the island; the upper half of the tower is colored red, the lower half white; from it, at a height of 99 feet above sea level, is exhibited a fixed light, visible in clear weather 15 miles.

Anchorage.—There is anchorage to the eastward of Goose Island in 9 to 11 fathoms sand close to the lighthouse keeper's quarters. The mark for the anchorage is the northernmost house of quarters in line with the flagstaff and Hummock Island open of the N.E. point of Goose Island. This anchorage is a very good one in westerly weather, but being so close to the shore it is awkward if the wind shifts as it sometimes does to the S.E.

Tides.—It is H.W.F. & C. at Goose Island at 10 h. 48 min. Range 9 feet. The flood-stream sets to the N.W., the ebb to the S.E., with an ordinary force of 1 knot.

BADGER ISLAND, the central and largest of the Chappell group, is a flat uniform piece of land about 4 miles in extent and 100 feet in height, sparsely covered with timber. A rocky spit with only 12 feet upon it extends for nearly $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles to the northward of its N.W. extreme. Over the S.W. point is a conspicuous granite boulder. At a quarter of a mile to the eastward of the east point of Badger Island is a small islet, 17 feet high, known as Little Badger Island; and at $1\frac{1}{4}$ miles to the south-eastward of the S.E. point of Badger Island is an islet, 21 feet high, known as Beagle Island, having several off-lying rocks to the northward. One quarter of a mile to the southward of the south point is a sunken rock.

Anchorage.—There is good anchorage to the eastward of Badger Island in about 7 fathoms, sandy bottom, with Little Badger Island in line with Mount Chappell.

At one mile N.E. of the N.E. point is **MOUNT CHAPPELL ISLAND**. This island rises to a rounded summit 653 feet high, which makes it an island of great prominence. The channel between Mount Chappell and Badger islands is interspersed with sunken rocks, and the broken bottom and strong tides make it a passage of some danger even to boats. Mount Chappell Island is the favorite breeding place of the mutton-bird, or sooty petrel, and during the season above 200 men, women, and children are employed in salting the young birds (which form an article of diet amongst the poorer population in Tasmania), and collecting their oil, which is used for softening leather, lubricating machinery, and other purposes. The birds come to deposit their eggs on the 25th, 26th, and two or three following days of November. The season for obtaining the young birds and oil is from January to March. Off Mount Chappell Island to the westward, northward, and north-eastward, are several groups of rocks about 20 feet in height.

BOXEN ISLAND AND DOUBLE ROCK.—Boxen Island is a low islet, 22 feet high, having rocks and foul ground all round it, but principally on its western and northern sides, where they are distant $\frac{1}{2}$ of a mile. It lies S.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 6 miles from Goose Island Lighthouse, and from it, at a distance of one mile N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ N., is Double Rock, the highest part of which is 34 feet high. Three cables from Double Rock, in a north-westerly direction, is a sunken rock which uncovers at very low water spring tides. Nearly midway between Double Rock and Beagle Island is the Lucy sunken rock of 6 feet; in westerly weather with low tides the sea breaks upon this rock.

NIGHT ISLAND is a rocky islet with a boulder 46 feet high upon it; it is about a quarter of a mile in extent, and lies S.E. by E. $1\frac{1}{4}$ miles from Goose Island Lighthouse. A patch of dry and sunken rocks lies $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile from it in a north-easterly direction, and the southern islet, known as Little Night Island, lies $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile in a S. by E. direction. Numerous granite boulders lie scattered about the main islet. Little Night Island bears from Goose Island Lighthouse S.E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E. 15 miles.

LOOK-OUT ROCK bears from Little Night Island S.E. by E. 5 miles, its height is 60 feet, and it lies $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile in a west north-westerly direction from the south-west point of Clarke Island (Look-out Head). Between it and the south-western shore is the Napper Rock, a wash at high water. A few scattered rocks lie off Look-out Head to the south-eastward and eastward, the outer is distant 3 cables from the shore, and is 2 feet above high water.

CLARKE ISLAND, the south island of the Furneaux group, rises near its northern shore to a peaked hill 676 feet high, and a broad-topped hill 525 feet high is situate near its south-west extreme. The west point of Clarke Island is very rocky, and at half a mile from it, in a westerly direction, is the Eclipse Rock of 11 feet, about which there is a nasty sea. Southward of this west point is a deep bay, which at one time was much used by coasters, but it cannot be recommended in consequence of its western exposure. The south shore of Clarke Island forms the northern side of Banks Strait. From the south point of the island Swan Island lighthouse bears S. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. $8\frac{1}{2}$ miles. The channel between these two points forms the narrowest part of Banks Strait. The S.E. point of Clarke Island (Moriarty Point) lies N.E. by E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E. $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile from the south point, and thence the east coast of Clarke Island trends in a N. by E. direction for 7 miles to its N.E. extreme.

At E. by N. $3\frac{3}{4}$ miles from Moriarty Point lies the outer of two low rocks which may be called the Moriarty Rocks from their proximity to the Moriarty Bank; N.W. by W. 2 miles from these lie other rocks, and at 8 miles N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. is the south point of Passage Island. The whole of the space included between the east shore of Clarke Island,

the Moriarty Rocks, and Passage and Forsyth islands is either foul ground or the strong tides cause such a race and heavy break as to make the place very dangerous.

MORIARTY BANKS.—The western of these banks extends in a S.W. by W. direction nearly $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the highest of the Moriarty Rocks, the least water upon it is 1 foot, but the general depth is about 9 feet. The eastern tail of the east bank lies E.S.E. $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the same rock, the least water found on it was 16 feet; to the northward and westward of the east bank is another bank, the least water upon which is 15 feet.

A fourth bank extends in a N.E. by N. and S.W. by S. direction from the two rocks which lie N.W. by W. nearly 2 miles from the Moriarty Rocks, this bank, which has a sunken rock at its north-easterly termination, is nearly $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles long; nearly midway between it and the shore is a half-tide rock. Except in the very finest weather the sea breaks heavily on these banks.

MORIARTY BAY, lying to the northward of Moriarty Point, was found to have very bad holding ground on a broken rocky bottom, and although there is good landing in a corner of the bay the bay itself is no place for shelter, and the whole of this vicinity is to be avoided.

SWAN ISLAND, lying off the N.E. point of Tasmania, is $1\frac{3}{4}$ miles long in a N.E. by E. and S.W. by W. direction and $\frac{1}{2}$ of a mile broad; its formation is of grey granite, but sand hills covering the granite formation give it the appearance of being nearly all sand. The highest part of the island is only 109 feet above the sea. Upon the island a few sheep are grazed.

Light.—The lighthouse, the upper half of which is colored red and the lower half white, is erected on the N.E. point of the Island close to the waters edge, from it, at a height of 96 feet, is exhibited a light revolving every minute, visible 15 miles.

A group of rocks, some of which uncover at low water spring tide, lies nearly $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles in a N.W. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. direction from the lighthouse, and $\frac{1}{2}$ of a mile west of the west point of the island is a sunken rock.

An islet known as Little Swan Island lies N.W. by N. 1 mile from the west extreme of Swan Island, and at half a mile beyond in the same direction is another smaller islet named Young Swan. Between Little and Young Swan islands there are numerous rocks, some of them above high water. The Harry Rock (16 feet) lies N. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. 1 mile from Young Swan Island, and from it Swan Island Lighthouse bears S.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. distant 3 miles. At from 1 mile to $1\frac{1}{2}$ north of Swan Island there is a race or over-fall, but no shoaler water than 7 fathoms could be found.

Anchorage.—There is anchorage under Swan Island off a small sandy bay on the south-east side of the island; the bottom is sand over rock, or rock, and the holding ground is therefore bad. The *Victoria* surveying steamer lost an anchor there by fouling a rock, and dragged her anchor upon several occasions. Sailing vessels working through the strait from the eastward often manage to get as far as Swan Island with the aid of the flood-tide, and drop anchor during the strength of the ebb. This is well enough, but to drop anchor at Swan Island in expectation of heavy westerly weather is not advisable, the more especially, as it is not an uncommon thing for the wind to veer to the south-eastward.

Tides.—It is H.W., F. & C., at Swan Island at 9 h. 16 min., range 7 feet. The flood stream sets to the north-westward, the ebb to the south-eastward, with a force of 3 knots at spring tides, but this force is much accelerated by the wind.

EDDYSTONE POINT, lying at the S.E. entrance to Banks Strait, and forming the Bay of Fires, projects about a mile from the coast; its summit, 81 feet high, is in lat. $40^{\circ} 59' 57''$ S., long. $148^{\circ} 21' 14''$ E. At S.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., 4 cables

from the extremity of the point is the Eddystone Rock, 19 feet above high water, between which and the land are two half-tide rocks.

Dangers.—There are likewise three sunken rocks off the point; one named the Greyhound, with only 5 feet of water over it, lies nearly $\frac{2}{3}$ of a mile E. by N. $\frac{1}{4}$ N. from it; another (Norgate Rock) of 14 feet lies one mile east, and the third of 10 feet lies a quarter of a mile E.N.E. of Eddystone Rock. To the northward of Eddystone Point there is good landing.

The Tasmanian Government intend to erect a lighthouse on the point.

Tides.—It is H.W., F. & C., at Eddystone Point at 8 h. 10 min., range 7 feet. The flood-stream sets from the southward, the ebb from the northward, but neither stream has any particular force to the southward of Banks Strait.

BAY OF FIRES.—South of Eddystone Point is the Bay of Fires, which (although little deserving the name of bay) affords good shelter when the wind has hardened in from the westward, but should be left immediately there is a lull, as the wind often at the termination of a westerly gale flies round suddenly to the south-eastward. The anchorage is in 10 or 11 fathoms, near the centre of the bay. The water shoals suddenly when near the beach.

Note.—At page 423, Australia Directory, vol. 1, mention is made of Anson Bay; the name of bay is misleading, and upon the chart of the Bay of Fires Anson Bay has been called Anson Lake; the entrance is so small as not to be discernible from seaward, and scarcely permits boats to enter even at high water. In the course of the survey it was only upon one occasion that landing could be effected outside the entrance. At most times there is a dangerous heavy surf rolling on to the beach.

GEORGE ROCKS are a group of granite boulders, the highest 64 feet above high water; they are scattered over nearly a mile of space, and, with the exception of the two largest, are quite barren; scattered through the group are a few half-tide rocks, but most of the rocks are from 10 to 30 feet above high water. The highest of the group lies from Eddystone Point N.N.W. 4 miles. At $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles N.W. b. N. of the point and 1 mile from the coast is a rock a-wash at low water, and at N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. $\frac{1}{2}$ of a mile is a rock a-wash at high water.

From Eddystone Point the coast trends in a north-westerly direction to Cape Naturaliste or Chapman Point, with several small points and bays between: off the points are numerous granite boulders, some 20 feet in height.

The space between George Rocks and the main is, with the exception of the rock a-wash at low water above described, apparently clear, but masses of kelp all along the shore and inside the George Rocks give an appearance of hidden dangers which, though they have escaped discovery, yet may be in existence.

CHAPMAN POINT OR CAPE NATURALISTE lies N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ N. $10\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Eddystone Point; the coast about it is low, and the point itself, which is faced by sand cliffs, only rises to an elevation of 71 feet; nearer Eddystone Point the coast is somewhat higher.

MOUNTS CAMERON, WILLIAM, AND PEARSON are the only remarkable hills in this vicinity; the highest peak of Mount Cameron is 1825 feet, and lies S. b. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. $17\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Swan Island Lighthouse. It is one of several peaks, and the summit is of a haycock form; the ridge of which is the most conspicuous, as well as the highest part, is over 3 miles in length in a N.E. and S.W. direction. Mount William lies from Swan Island Lighthouse S.S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. $11\frac{1}{2}$ miles, it rises gradually to a rounded summit 714 feet high. Mount Pearson, S.S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. $15\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Swan Island Lighthouse, is a broad-topped hill 623 feet high.

BLACK REEF lies N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. $1\frac{1}{4}$ miles from Chapman Point; at its highest point it is only 9 feet above high water; rocks just a little above high water extend to a distance of $\frac{1}{2}$ of a mile N.W. by W., and at E.S.E. $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile is a rock also above high water with sunken rocks around it. At N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles is Haslewood Rock of 6 feet, which sometimes breaks. Mount Pearson over Chapman Point, S. by E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E., clears Haslewood Rock to the westward.

SALAMANDER AND EUCALYPTUS ROCKS.—The Salamander Rock of 10 feet lies E. by N. $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the Black Reef. No distinct break was ever seen on this rock. The south round hill of Mount Cameron, open south of Mount William S.W. by W., clears it to the southward, and the same, well open north of Mount William S.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., clears it to the northward. The Eucalyptus Rock, also of 10 feet, lies E. by S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. 3 miles from the Black Reef; it rarely breaks, but its position may be known by the kelp in the vicinity. Eddystone Point, open of George rocks S. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., leads between the Eucalyptus and Salamander rocks.

MUSCLE ROE POINT lies N. W. by W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W. $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Chapman Point: to the east and north-east of this point there are many sunken and low water rocks, the most outlying of which lies E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. nearly $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile from the point.

From Muscle Roe Point the coast trends south for nearly $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile to the mouth of Muscle Roe River, which is small and only navigable for boats. From the mouth of the river the coast trends S.W., west, and N.W. for about 6 miles, forming the bay known as Muscle Roe Bay.

MUSCLE ROE BAY affords the best anchorage for vessels working to the westward and unable to get through the strait.

Vessels should anchor in 6 or 7 fathoms, sandy bottom, in the north-western portion of the bay with Swan Island Lighthouse bearing about N. by W. Near the anchorage there is a sand-bank called the Cockle Bank, the least water upon which is 19 feet.

S. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. of the south point of Swan Island, and distant $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles, is Tree Point, the N.W. point of Muscle Roe Bay, from which the coast trends in a westerly direction for 2 miles to Little Muscle Roe River, the mouth of which may be entered by boats at half-tide; thence the coast trends for $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile in a north-westerly direction to a point made conspicuous by two bare sand-hills.

LITTLE MUSCLE ROE BAY.—The bay between the last-mentioned points is known as Little Muscle Roe Bay, and is used by the smaller coasters on account of the shoal anchorage; it is, however, much more exposed than the large bay of the same name, to which it is much inferior.

The coast from the point west of Little Muscle Roe River trends westerly to Cape Portland, from which it is distant $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles, and at a distance of $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles is a small point extending northwards in the direction of Foster Island; the whole of this piece of coast is irregular, with many shoals and much foul ground. Near Cape Portland, between it and Foster Island, is a low islet, and there are other islets nearer the shore connected by low water ledges; the whole locality is very dangerous for boats on account of the confused sea. There is a good navigable channel between Swan Island and the coast just described, but in consequence of the strength of the tides it is well to give a wide berth to the foul ground extending from Swan Island and Little Swan Island on the one hand and Foster Island on the other. The leading mark mid channel is Mount William in line with the land about Tree Point S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ S.

FOSTER ISLAND lies W. $\frac{3}{4}$ S. 7 miles from Swan Island Lighthouse, it is a small island 47 feet high, or more correctly speaking two islands connected at low water. A shoal with as little as $\frac{1}{2}$ a fathom upon it extends for $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles to the

eastward of the island, and a rock a-wash at low water lies N.N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. 1 mile from it; the sea breaks heavily upon this rock and there is a heavy tide rip in the vicinity.

CAPE PORTLAND, bearing W. by S. $\frac{1}{4}$ S. $8\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Swan Island lighthouse, is the north-western portion of the north-east coast of Tasmania, its extreme is low and rocky, the most elevated part lies S.S.E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E. $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile from the extreme, and here there is a pile of stones erected by land surveyors at 119 feet above the sea; this direction is also the trend of the coast from the cape whence it trends easterly for $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile and southerly $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles to a point which bears S. by E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. $2\frac{1}{4}$ miles from the cape. At N.W. of this point distant $\frac{1}{2}$ of a mile is an islet about 20 feet high, and another islet lies $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile N.N.W. of this. These islets are too small to afford shelter to the bay immediately east of them, and although used by small craft it is generally during a continuance of easterly weather; the best channel into the bay is between Cape Portland and the northernmost islet, but between the southern islet and the shore there is also a channel of $2\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms.

From the point lying S. by E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. $2\frac{1}{4}$ miles from Cape Portland, the coast trends southerly for 1 mile, and then S.S.W. along a straight sandy beach $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles to the mouth of the Ringarooma River, thence continuing south-westerly for 2 miles with the same sandy beach, and W. by N. 4 miles with coast of a rocky formation to the mouth of the Tomahawk River, from whence it runs $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile in a northerly direction to a point close off which and connected at low water is Tomahawk Island.

RINGAROOMA RIVER has latterly begun to be used by small craft occupied in the export of tin ore, quantities of which are found in the vicinity of Mount Cameron, where the Ringarooma takes its rise. The mouth of the River is small, and at low water there is very little more than 1 foot on the bar, but as the rise of tide is 7 to 9 feet, there is generally plenty of water for the small craft using the river, and the principal danger is from the surf, but this occurs with strong northerly and westerly winds, at which times vessels do not venture but wait for the subsidence of the storm. When making the voyage Waterhouse anchorage affords good shelter and is only 13 miles from the River.

TOMAHAWK RIVER is not navigable, but small craft choose a fine time and beach themselves at high-water getting off again at the next high tide. The bight about the mouth of the Tomahawk River is shoal.

HAMILTON ROAD lies to the eastward of the south-east point of Preservation Island. The anchorage is at 3 cables' distance from the south-east point in 4 fathoms of water, with patches of 3 fathoms in the vicinity. After a continuance of heavy weather from the westward a long swell rolls round the south point of Rum Island, and it was observed that the swell did not gradually increase but set in suddenly without notice, obliging the *Victoria*, then engaged in the survey of the place, to get under weigh and run for shelter to Kent Bay, where the remainder of the gale was rode out.

PRESERVATION ISLAND (summit is in lat. $40^{\circ} 28' 58.75''$ S., long. $148^{\circ} 04' 15''$ E.) is $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles long in a N.W. and S.E. direction and only 84 feet high, its formation is of granite, and its appearance similar to that of Goose Island; like Goose Island it is used for the grazing of sheep, as indeed are all the islands hereabout. Many small islets and rocks extend to a distance of $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile from its N.W. extreme, and from its east side a shoal spit extends to a distance of $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles, a small portion at $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile being dry at low water spring tides.

TIDES.—It is 'H.W., F. & C., at Preservation Island at 10 h. 36 min., range from 5 to 7 feet.

RUM ISLAND lies south of Preservation Island with which it is almost connected. At 2 cables south of its S.W. point are two rocks a-wash at half-tide, and at 4 cables east of its S.E. point is a sunken rock of 2 fathoms.

ARMSTRONG CHANNEL separates Barren and Clarke islands; it is very seldom used by shipping, the many banks and strong tides making it a passage of some intricacy; its southern entrance between Preservation and Clarke islands is nearly 2 miles wide. With the exception of the Eclipse Rock of 11 feet, $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile off the west point of Clarke Island, a rock a-wash a $\frac{1}{4}$ of a mile off the same point, and the two-fathom rock to the south-eastward of Rum Island; it has no dangers, the best side of the channel is along the Clarke Island shore, only care must be taken to give the shore to the northward of Clarke Hill a berth of $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile, and again to approach the next point so as to avoid the bank (with as little as $\frac{1}{2}$ a fathom upon it) which lies in mid-channel. To the westward of the N.E. point of Clarke Island is a bay known as Kangaroo Bay; there is a narrow channel leading into it along the western shore, and there is anchorage in the centre of the bay in 3 or $3\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms. All over the remaining portion of the bay there is shoal water. From the western point of Kangaroo Bay the channel runs over in the direction of Sloping Point, where it takes the name of the Narrows, and in one place has a depth of 41 fathoms.

KENT BAY lies between Sloping Point and the south point of Barren Island; nearly the whole of the bay is filled with shoals, and the only anchorage for an ordinary sized ship is $1\frac{1}{4}$ miles N.E. by E. of Sloping Point in 11 fathoms of water at 3 cables from the shore. Abreast of this anchorage is the most convenient place for watering ship, and the water is the best to be found.

The Sloop Rock, 12 feet above high water, lies $2\frac{1}{4}$ miles N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. of Sloping Point and about 4 cables from the shore. Small craft may anchor between it and the shore in from 3 to 6 fathoms. From $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile N.E. of the Seal Rocks, which are only 8 feet high, and lie close off the N.E. point of Clarke Island, several sand banks which dry at low water and much shoal water extends to Forsyth Island. North of this shoal water Armstrong Channel continues to run with a narrow shoal sand bank occupying a central position, and it finally ends in a passage between Forsyth and Passage islands. A smaller passage exists between Passage and Barren islands but its centre is occupied by a half-tide rock, and a tide like a sluice runs through it.

The northern passage of Armstrong Channel is neither so wide nor so straight as that along the Clarke Island shore. At the west entrance, between Barren and Preservation islands, it is not much more than $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile wide; proceeding eastward at $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles is Malm's Rock (E.N.E. nearly $1\frac{1}{4}$ miles from the north point of Preservation Island), which only uncovers at low water and lies 3 cables from the Barren Island shore; between it and Wombat Point, extending the full distance to the shore, is a shoal bank interspersed with rocks, some above water and some sunken.

WOMBAT POINT, locally known as Rocky Head, lies E. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the north point of Preservation Island; the extremity of the point is a small granite island, 74 feet high, shaped like a man's skull, off it to the south-eastward, at $1\frac{1}{2}$ cables distance, are two rocks uncovering at $\frac{1}{2}$ ebb, and to the south-westward, at $\frac{1}{2}$ of a mile, is a sand bank with $2\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms of water upon it.

SLOPING POINT bears from Wombat Point E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. 4 miles, and between these points is a shoal bay with an islet, about 20 feet high, named Battery Island, near its centre, lying E. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Wombat Point. A rock a-wash at low water lies 1 cable south of Sloping Point, and another above water lies nearer the shore.

PASSAGE ISLAND, so named from its forming one side of a passage into Armstrong Channel, lies only 3 cables from the southern point of Barren Island; it is $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles long in a N.W. b. N. and S.E. b. S. direction, and about $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile broad. At 1 cable from its N.E. point, and therefore nearly in mid-channel, is a rock dry at low water, and at 2 cables north of its north point are several rocks above water. The passage, therefore, which gives the island its name, is one

only fit to be used in an emergency. When used the Barren Island shore should be hugged, and the flood-tide will be necessary to effect a safe entrance, as the streams in the channel run with a force of 5 or 6 knots.

A few rocks above water extend 1 cable south of the south point, and sunken rocks of less than 1 fathom extend $\frac{1}{4}$ of a mile S.E. from the S.E. extreme. Off the western side a sandbank extends 4 cables from the shore, except off the N.W. point, where the narrows keep the passage deep.

FORSYTH ISLAND.—The east point of Forsyth Island lies 4 cables from the west point of Passage Island. The bank which forms the southern side of Armstrong Channel extends from $1\frac{1}{4}$ miles to the northward of the north point westerly towards Sloping Point, and innumerable banks and channels exist between Forsyth and Clarke islands. To the eastward, except off the east point, a sand bank extends to a distance of 3 cables from the shore. Off the S.E. point shoal water of $3\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms extends nearly a mile to the eastward, and almost unites with other shoal water extending south-westerly from the south point of Passage Island. About the shoal water the sea breaks heavily. At 1 mile S.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. from the S.W. point of Forsyth Island there is a rock a-wash at half-tide.

FRANKLIN SOUND OR INLET lies between Flinders and Barren islands, and is fronted to the westward by the Chappell islands. Unlike Armstrong Channel, its best and, in fact, only navigable channel is on the north shore, being separated from the other channel by islands as well as shoals. A bar extends across the entrance, the leading mark across which in $4\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms is the summit of Vansittart Island, in line with the south point of Flinders Island E. b. N. One quarter of a mile south of this leading mark on the bar is 14 feet of water, and at $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile south is only 10 feet. On the north side of the leading mark, at $\frac{1}{4}$ mile's distance, there is only 12 feet. After crossing the bar the only danger to be avoided is a sandbank parallel to East Anderson Island, $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile north of it extending in a westerly direction from the rocks at the N.E. point, and upon which are patches of 8 and 11 feet. At this part of the sound the channel is divided into three, one arm running north-eastward ending between Little Dog Island and Badger Corner; another running eastward to the south extreme of Dog Island, narrowing there between banks to a bar of $3\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms, separating it from the main channel of the sound; and the third or main channel sweeping to the south-eastward round the rocks off East Anderson Island, between them and a sandbank, over towards the Barren Island shore, but soon sweeping north-eastward again, and maintaining a broad channel up to the passage between Dog and Vansittart islands.

At the east extreme of East Anderson Island an arm of the channel runs westward, and, at a time when the direction of trade was more in this locality, ships used often to anchor off the south shore of East Anderson Island in $4\frac{1}{2}$ or 5 fathoms of water, and this for large ships is the best anchorage.

The south-western entrance to Franklin Sound is blocked by numerous rocks and banks, and this intricate channel cannot be navigated without danger.

The principal islands in Franklin Sound are the Anderson islands, the Dog islands, and Vansittart Island.

The northern of the Oyster Rocks (two in number) is 35 feet high, and lies W.N.W. 2 miles from the summit of West Anderson Island; the southern rock lies $\frac{1}{4}$ of a mile S.W. of the northern; from these rocks a sand bank extends in a westerly direction, and to the southward of them the same bank (in some places dry) is continued to the western shore of West Anderson Island. The north side of North Oyster Rock is bold.

WEST ANDERSON ISLAND.—The summit of West Anderson Island lies S. by W. 2 miles from the south point of Flinders Island, and has an elevation of 211 feet; this island originally went by the name of Woody Island, but it

is long since every particle of timber was cut down or burnt, nearly its only vegetation now is a coarse grass which grazes a few cattle and sheep as do all the islands of the Furneaux group. One cable north of West Anderson Island is an islet, connected with it at low water by a sand bank and a smaller islet, on the channel side the islet is bold. From the western side of West Anderson Island a bank, as before stated, extends towards and beyond the Oyster Rocks. The south side of West Anderson Island is foul to a distance of $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile, and a bank, with from 2 feet to 1 fathom of water upon it, extends westward to a distance of $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the island, and then north-westerly $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles, but with a greater depth to the shoal of 10 feet, lying south of the leading line into Franklin Sound, and W. by N. $3\frac{3}{4}$ miles from the summit of West Anderson Island.

A flat, in some places dry, connects East and West Anderson islands, which are distant from each other $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile.

EAST ANDERSON ISLAND, known locally as Tin-kettle, is $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles long in an east and west direction, and from $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile wide. Off its east point four rocks, only a few feet above high water, extend for a $\frac{1}{4}$ of a mile in a northerly direction, and $1\frac{1}{2}$ cables north-east of the outer rock is a rock which dries 2 feet at low water. About these rocks, and extending for $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile to the eastward of the east point, is a shoal bank. The bank to the northward of this island has been already described. At $1\frac{1}{4}$ miles N.E. of the east point is the west extreme of a sand bank, in $2\frac{1}{2}$ fms., which extends eastward towards the south extreme of Dog Island, and has a bank of 1 to 3 fms. upon which are patches of 2 and 5 feet.

SOUTHERN SHORE OF FLINDERS ISLAND.—From the south-western point of Flinders Island, which bears N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the summit of Mount Chappell Island, the coast trends south-easterly $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles to another point, a rather deep bay with a sandy beach intervening, and thence the coast runs E.S.E. $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles, E. $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles, and E. north-easterly $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles to Badger Corner, the whole distance being occupied by numerous small sandy bays and sharp projecting points, the spurs from Strzelecki Peaks generally approaching the shore at the points. The dangers off this piece of coast are Entrance Rock of 2 feet, lying S. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. $1\frac{1}{8}$ miles from the S.W. point; a rock of 2 fathoms nearer the point; a bank of 2 fathoms lying a mile off shore and to the northward of the leading line into Franklin Sound; and a shoal of 9 feet extending from the shore to a distance of $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile.

BADGER CORNER is a small shoal water cove in the western corner of a bay, the eastern point of which bears from the S.E. point of the cove E.N.E. 4 miles. This bay is $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles deep, and occupied by one large and several small islands as well as numerous rocks and shoals; it is fronted by the two Dog isles, and there is a small river in its depth known at the Samphire River. Between Little or Western Dog Island and the corner there is a group of rocks, covered at high water, to the westward of which is a very small channel of two fathoms leading to the anchorage for small craft in Badger Corner; the channel to the eastward of these rocks is blind.

DOG ISLANDS, two in number, are situate east of Badger Corner and S.W. of the S.E. point of Flinders Island. West or Little Dog Island is about $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile in extent, and distant from the S.E. point of Badger Corner 6 cables on an E. by S. bearing, its height is 118 feet; shoal water extends from its S.W. side in a south-westerly direction for $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles. There is a rock, 3 feet above high water, 2 cables off its S. extreme, and another $1\frac{1}{2}$ cables from its N.W. extreme; other rocks with numerous sand banks lie to the northward, and a sandy flat, nearly dry at low water, extends $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile to the north-eastward.

The N.W. point of Dog Island lies from the N.E. point of Little Dog Island N.E. nearly one mile. Dog Island is about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles in extent; and is made conspicuous by a flat

topped hill 254 feet high over its N.W. point; there is a shoal sandy bay to the eastward of the S.W. point of the island, in the depth of which is a house occupied by the lessee of the island, and off which small craft often anchor, but, with the exception of a hole of $\frac{1}{2}$ a fathom, the bay is dry at low water. At 6 cables E.S.E. of the S.W. point is a rock, 2 feet above high water, from which a sand bank extends for nearly $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile to the eastward parallel to and at a distance of $\frac{1}{4}$ of a mile from the southern shore of the island. Three-quarters of a mile to the northward of Dog Island is a small island locally known as Little Green Island, and 1 mile N.E. of the N.E. point of the island is a sandy point of Flinders Island, from which the S.E. shore of the same runs E.N.E. and north-easterly for 3 miles and then trends northerly. From the N.E. point of Dog Island shoal water extends nearly to the nearest point of Flinders Island. Midway between Dog and Vansittart islands is a rocky islet with shoal water extending more than a $\frac{1}{4}$ of a mile to the northward; the remainder of the space between Dog, Vansittart, and Flinders islands is clear of danger, with from 6 to 26 fathoms of water.

VANSITTART ISLAND, locally known as Gun-carriage (from the fact of a gun-carriage having been washed up there), is an island about 3 miles in extent, rising at its centre to a broad summit 552 feet high, from which a spur runs to the S.W. point of the island. On the west side of the island is a sandy bay where the residence of the owner of the island is situated. The southern shore of Vansittart Island is almost connected with the north point of Barren Island at low water.

NORTH SHORE OF BARREN ISLAND—PUNCHEON POINT.—The north point of Barren Island lies from the S.E. point of Vansittart Island E.S.E. 3 cables; several islands and rocks surrounded with sandy flats are scattered westward and south-westward of it over a space of more than a mile. From Puncheon Point the coast trends irregularly S.W. 4 miles to the Dover River; thence W.N.W. $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles to Dover Point; and thence W. $\frac{3}{4}$ N. $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles to Apple Orchard Point.

APPLE ORCHARD POINT bears from Puncheon Point S.W. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles. Inshore of a line drawn from it to the S.W. point of Vansittart Island there is nothing but shoals and sand-banks dry at low water. Three small islets extend in a north-westerly direction from the point, the N.W. extreme of the outer being distant $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile. There is good shelter to the eastward of the islets, but the tide runs very strong in different directions, and an anchor invariably comes up very foul.

From Apple Orchard Point the coast trends southerly for two miles to Lee River, and thence in a westerly direction $5\frac{1}{4}$ miles to Ned Point; to the eastward of Ned Point for 3 miles, as well as north-easterly along the shore of East Anderson Island, there is deep water, but at 2 miles N.E. by E. is the west tail of a large flat which extends the whole distance to Apple Orchard Point and inshore to Lee River. Over this piece of coast are Mounts Munro and Double Peak, the latter a conspicuous spur of the former.

MOUNT MUNRO has a rounded summit, densely timbered, 2348 feet high. It is only $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the north-western shore of Barren Island, and between it and the coast are other ranges very sterile in appearance, bare granite being the prominent feature.

NED POINT bears from Mount Munro N.W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W. $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles. It projects nearly $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile from the line of coast, and to the eastward is a small bay named Munro Bay, used by small craft. Several rocks extend from the point in a N.N.W. direction, and at a distance of half a mile there is a rocky islet extending in a N.E. and S.W. direction. The coast from Ned Point takes a south-westerly direction for 4 miles to Franklin village, containing several of the residences of the half-castes and others inhabiting the islands, the total number of whom, including women and children, is Europeans, 132; half-castes, 106. A schoolmaster lives at the village, being paid by the Government of Tasmania

to educate the children of the natives. A boat-builder also resides here, and each family has a boat of its own built of the wood of the island. Their principal occupation is "mutton-birding," as explained in the paragraph on Mount Chappell Island; the birds are their almost only diet all the year round, and the sale of the oil gives them sufficient money to purchase other necessaries. Sealing is also an occupation, and some understand shearing; but although fish abound no attempt is ever made to catch them, which is unaccountable unless explainable by the fact of their diet of mutton-birds being something between fish and flesh, and rather more of the former.

DOUGHBOY ISLAND is a small island lying W. by S. $\frac{1}{4}$ S. $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Ned Point; the soundings about this island and Ned Point are very irregular and spoil the southern passage to Franklin Sound for any moderate sized vessel.

LONG ISLAND is $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles long in a S.W. by W. and N.E. by E. direction and from $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{3}{8}$ of a mile broad. Its summit, which is over the northern part, is a conspicuous granite boulder 165 feet above high water, bearing from Ned Point S.W. by W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W. nearly $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles; near its western extreme there is another very conspicuous granite boulder 98 feet above high water. Its shores are on all sides closely bordered by rocks, and it is separated from the N.W. coast of Barren Island by a channel $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile broad, barred at the northern entrance.

WEST COAST OF BARREN ISLAND is a small piece of rock-bound coast 2 miles long in a N. by W. and S. by E. direction; it commences at 1 mile to the southward of the west point of Long Island and ends at Cape Sir John. At 1 mile to the westward of this coast and 2 miles from the S.W. point of Long Island is a rock 10 feet high.

CAPE SIR JOHN, at the south extreme of the west coast of Barren Island, has three rocks off it lying respectively S.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile, S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile, and E. by S. $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile from the cape. At $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles E. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. is a point, and the bay between this and Cape Sir John is known as Thunder and Lightning Bay; an islet lies S.E. of the last-mentioned point, and is nearly connected with the shore to the northward; eastward of the islet is another small bay, and at E. by S. $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile is the south point of the bay, having numerous boulders lying off it to a distance of $\frac{1}{4}$ of a mile; thence the coast trends south-easterly $\frac{3}{4}$ a mile and then easterly 2 miles to the point off which Malm's Rock is situate as described in the paragraph—Armstrong Channel. This latter piece of coast has numerous rocks off it to a distance of $\frac{1}{4}$ of a mile. The north point of Preservation Island bears from Cape Sir John S.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 4 miles. One mile to the northward of Cape Sir John is a conspicuous round topped hill 531 feet high.

VANSITTART SHOALS.—The eastern entrance to Franklin Sound lies between sand banks extending from the S.E. point of Flinders Island and others extending from Vansittart Island; these banks have been called the Vansittart Shoals; the channels between them are not navigable without the aid of buoys, as they are said to shift with every breeze of wind. The best and most permanent looking channel was found to have a depth of 4 fathoms. The shifting channel along the Flinders Island shore was very narrow. Northerly and north-easterly winds are said to have the greatest effect in shifting these shoals.

EAST COAST OF BARREN ISLAND.—From Punccheon Point, the N.E. point of Barren Island, the coast trends S.E. b. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles, with several rocky points and intermediate sandy bays to Harley Point, off which on an E.S.E. bearing to a distance of nearly $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile are several rocks above and below water, and beyond again, at a distance of nearly $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles on a S.E. b. E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E. bearing, is a flat rock only 3 feet above high water, with a few sunken rocks lying off it to the north-westward.

At S.E. b. S., $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Harley Point, is **CAPE BARREN**, a rounded rocky point having numerous hillocks over it; $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile to the eastward is a low rocky islet, 40 feet high, known as Gull Island, and at east, 1 mile,

is a single rock 12 feet above high water, with numerous other rocks above water and sunken extending nearly $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile in a northerly direction from it. Midway between Cape Barren and Gull Island is a sunken rocky patch of 14 feet.

CONE POINT lies S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ S. 5 miles from Cape Barren; two conspicuous cone-shaped granite rocks have given it its name. Between it and the cape two bays are formed, having sandy beaches in their depths. The point dividing the bays has a conspicuous sand patch over it.

PASSAGE POINT lies W. b. S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. 2 miles from Cone Point, a bay with a steep sandy beach lying between.

MOUNT KERFERD is the highest and most conspicuous hill of the range which rises from the various points on the S.E. shore of Barren Island. The whole range is very conspicuous, from its barren and whitish appearance, and the particular peak named Kerferd has a sharp summit 1644 feet high.

WEATHER AND GENERAL DIRECTIONS.—The months of September, October, and November are considered the worst months in the year, and everything during the continuance of the survey corroborated this opinion. It was nearly always blowing and generally from some western quarter.

At page 359 of the Australia Directory, in the weather paragraph, is the following remark, "As westerly gales invariably veer to the southward it is more advisable to stand over towards the Tasmanian coast and so be ready to take advantage of the shift of wind." This remark requires modification. It has been not an unusual thing for vessels bound westward, met by westerly gales, to stand down south under the lee of Flinders Island to Banks Strait which they endeavour to work through, but the westerly gale, which has perhaps only moderated but not subsided, has increased the force of the tide to such an extent that to work through is simply an impossibility. During the strength of the flood tide she may get a few miles ahead but almost before it is discovered that the tide has changed it is again strong ebb, and the vessel, if she does not pick up an anchorage in Muscle Roc Bay, drifts out to sea. Vessels have been known in this manner to be detained for weeks; therefore the paragraph above alluded to requires alteration to the following effect:—"In the summer months when westerly gales are of short duration it is advisable to stand over towards the Tasmanian coast and so to be ready to take advantage of the shift of wind, but in no case does it appear advantageous to stand down outside of Flinders Island with the intention of working through Banks Strait." The only difference between the weather on the Tasmanian side of Bass's Strait and that on the Victorian side is, that on the termination of a westerly gale the wind in the vicinity of Banks Strait sometimes flies round to the south-eastward; this was experienced at Swan Island and other anchorages, the barometer registering very little over 29.60. The wind never came in very heavy but sufficiently strong (the swell rolling in simultaneously) to necessitate leaving the anchorage. Experience seemed also to point to the idea that the wind had rather more southing in it, but simultaneous observations are needed to make the idea an established fact. The uncertainty of the way the wind will come in makes all anchorages in Banks Strait, which are open to the south-eastward, anchorages requiring great caution in their use. Muscle Roc Bay is recommended as the safest anchorage.

REMARKS.—Lest it should be considered that the islands of the Furneaux group are uninhabited, it may be remarked that nearly every island, no matter how small, is either purchased property or is leased from the Tasmanian Government for the purpose of grazing sheep, and the lessees or owners live upon their properties. Mount Chappell Island is reserved for the natives of the island, whose support almost entirely depends (as hereinbefore mentioned) upon the mutton-bird.

THE VARIATION of the compass at Swan Island was $10^{\circ} 21'$ E. in 1877.

NOTICE TO PASTORAL TENANTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim as a common the Crown Lands hereinafter described, that is to say:—

BURKE'S FLAT COMMON.—About Five thousand five hundred acres, county of Gladstone, parish of Telcherr, being the unappropriated Crown lands comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.: Commencing at a point on the right bank of Cochrane's Creek where the south-western side of the road from Moliagal to Burke's Flat abuts thereon; bounded thence by the south-western side of that road bearing N. 59° 30' W. to the north-west angle of J. Stephen's 19th section block, No. 847, N. 25° 20' W. twelve chains forty-two links, and N. 60° W. one hundred and twelve chains thirty-seven links; thence by lines bearing respectively west sixty-five chains and north to the north-eastern side of the aforesaid road; thence by the west side of the road forming the east boundary of E. REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE HARCOURT, FARADAY, SUTTON GRANGE, AND PORCUPINE (MOUNT ALEXANDER), FARADAY, GREENHILL, AND COBAW FARMERS' COMMONS, IN THE UNITED SHIRE OF METCALFE.

WHEREAS by the *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations for the management of commons, and in pursuance of the provisions of chapter xiii. of the regulations made under the said Act by the Governor in Council on the 26th of May 1873, the Council of the Shire of Metcalfe, as managers of the Harcourt, Faraday, Sutton Grange, and Porcupine (Mount Alexander), Faraday, Greenhill, and Cobaw Farmers' Commons, submit to the Board of Land and Works for approval the following regulations for the management of the said commons in lieu of those approved on the 19th day of September 1870.

1. Ratepayers in the shire, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers, may respectively depasture on one of the above-named commons, within a distance of five miles from their places of residence, four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such common one

additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The fees to be paid for depasturing on any of the above-mentioned commons shall be as follows:—

Class No. 1.—Neat cattle, 4s. per head per annum.

„ „ 2.—Horses, 6s. per head per annum.

„ „ 3.—Sheep or goats, 1s. 4d. per head per annum.

The depasturing of sheep upon the above-mentioned commons shall be restricted to such portions thereof respectively as may from time to time be fixed by the managers.

Class No. 4.—All weaned calves depasturing upon the commons shall be payable at the rate of Class No. 1.

The foregoing fees to be paid quarterly in advance on 1st January, 1st April, 1st July, 1st October, in each year. Cattle placed on common during the currency of the quarter shall pay for the full quarter.

3. Any person claiming to depasture by Rule 1 shall sign a statement setting forth the extent of the land occupied by him, with the proportion of same under cultivation, or that he is entitled to commonage.

4. The herdsman shall attend at the common yards, or other convenient place appointed by the managers, and of which due notice shall be given, upon every Tuesday between Ten and Three o'clock to receive cattle; to whom all cattle shall be delivered, together with the declaration mentioned in the preceding section, and a written memorandum of the number of cattle, with their brands and description (which number shall not exceed the total number to which he is shown to be entitled hereunder), and the total amount of fees chargeable thereon, for which he shall receive a receipt; and an entry shall be made of such cattle in a registry book to be kept for the purpose.

5. All cattle received upon the common shall be branded with the common far brand, and must have the owner's fire-brand thereon. All goats shall wear a triangular yoke around their neck with the owner's name painted or carved thereon.

6. If it shall be proved that any person is depasturing on the said common a number of cattle in excess of that to which he is entitled by making a false statement of the lands, miner's right, or license held by him, the number of such excess shall be impounded and the fees paid thereon forfeited.

7. No entire horse shall be allowed to run upon the common; nor any bull except such as shall be approved of by the managers.

8. Cattle shall not be taken off the common after delivery to the herdsman without giving due notice thereof, unless as hereinafter provided to the contrary; and after such notice the herdsman shall not be considered to have charge over any such cattle until they shall again be handed over to him. Except in places where cattle may be frequently required, the owner may, upon application, receive permission from the managers to remove and replace such cattle at pleasure in a quiet manner, so as not to interfere with or disturb other cattle unnecessarily, but the herdsman shall not be considered to have any supervision whatsoever over such stock.

9. It shall be competent for any person, or the managers of neighboring commons, to register with the herdsman the brands and description of missing cattle upon payment of a fee of one shilling for every head of cattle so registered, to be entered in a book kept for the purpose; and such cattle, if found upon the common, shall not be impounded till notice shall be sent to the person registering, who shall be required to remove the same with 14 days from the time of service of notice.

10. No diseased cattle shall be placed upon the common, and cattle becoming diseased shall be removed by the owner within one day after notice to him by the herdsman; and in the event of such cattle not being removed within the time specified they shall be removed or destroyed at the owner's expense.

11. The managers shall from time to time employ a herdsman, who shall find security to the satisfaction of the managers for the due execution of his duties, and such appointment shall at any time be annulled.

12. The managers are hereby required to make arrangements with the herdsman for the release from pound by him of any cattle legally entitled to depasture on the common which may have been impounded, and for the payment of all poundage fees thereon. The owners of cattle so impounded shall repay to the herdsman the poundage fees so paid by him, not exceeding two days' fees; such sums to be recoverable from the owner of cattle so impounded if not paid on demand. Excepting when cattle purchased by commoners have been brought from a distance exceeding ten miles from the common, the herdsman shall not be responsible as hereinbefore provided until such cattle have been three months on the common or adjoining farms. It shall also be the duty of the herdsman immediately to inform the owners of stock when missed off the common; he shall also attend at the common yards, or other place appointed by the managers, at times to be fixed by them, for the purpose of giving persons information respecting their cattle, and assisting in finding and removing the same if required.

13. In all cases where by these rules the right to run a number of cattle is given and the description not stated, large cattle is to be understood, or their equivalent in stock of the other classes, in the undermentioned proportions, viz.:—3 goats equal to 1 head of cattle; but no commoner shall be entitled to run more than 6 horses or 6 goats.

14. Should any common cattle acquire the habit of breaking into the neighboring cultivation paddocks, it shall be com-

patent for the managers to require the owners to remove the same from the common within 7 days' notice in writing to that effect, or in default of their removal the herdsman shall be empowered to impound them. In such cases the fees to be refunded to the owners for the portion of the quarter unexpired.

15. The accounts and books of the common shall be kept by the herdsman in the form prescribed by the Government Regulations of the 26th of May 1873, and the managers shall within one month after the termination of each year publish in a newspaper circulating in the district a certified account of the receipts and expenditure for the year, in the form prescribed in Schedule 25 of the said Regulations of the 26th May 1873, and forward copy thereof to the Board of Land and Works.

16. The herdsman shall pay over all moneys collected by him to the treasurer of the shire at such periods as may be directed by the managers, not less than once in every month, and shall report to the managers at each ordinary monthly meeting the names of persons who may have registered cattle during the past month, with the number of cattle placed upon the common, and the amounts paid by each, and shall produce his books to the managers at all times when required.

17. The herdsman shall be paid for his services by such percentage on the fees of the common as may be fixed by the managers from time to time.

18. Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £20 for each offence.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* it was amongst other things enacted that notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: And whereas by a Proclamation, under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the sixth day of August in the present year, the township of Nalinga, in the shire of Benalla, was proclaimed a district where publicans' licenses might be specially granted: And whereas it is expedient to revoke such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said proclamation; and with the advice aforesaid I do hereby proclaim the locality hereinafter described a district wherein publicans' licenses may be specially granted, under the provisions of section 44 of the said Act, that is to say:—

Commencing at the north-east angle of the township of Nalinga; thence by a three-chain road bearing south 79° 10' east nine chains and seventy-three links; thence by a line bearing south 10° 50' west six chains and three links to the north bank of the Broken River; thence by that river in a westerly direction to a point on its north bank bearing south 10° 50' west six chains and thirty-nine links from the point of commencement; thence north 10° 50' east six chains and thirty-nine links to the commencing point.

A cheese-shaped black buoy, with staff and ball, has been placed in 8 feet at low water on the shoal forming the western side of the anchorage. This buoy lies nearly due west from the chequered buoy, or in line with the extreme outer end of Point Gilbert, leaving a channel between having 9 to 10 feet through at low water.

Using either of the above channels, and steering for the large store above the landing place, will lead into a pool (having a depth of not less than 3 to 3½ fathoms at low water) capable of holding 10 or 12 small vessels. Running in from seaward the soundings gradually decrease until not more than 9 feet exists in a line with the buoys, after passing which it will soon deepen. A convenient position for anchorage should then be taken up.

Edwards' Shoal is a narrow sand-bank, steep to, upon which the sea breaks occasionally. It lies in the following position, viz.:—

South end 1½ miles N.E. by E. } Ridge Island.

At about the middle of the shoal there is at low-water springs a depth of about 7 feet, with 9 feet on either side, for a distance of ½ a mile.

Yaralla Shoal is a long narrow shoal of fine sand, steep to.
North end 6½ miles N. ¼ W. } from summit of Ridge
South end 4½ miles N. ¼ W. } Island.
It has 11 feet on its shoalest part, which lies 4 cables from its northern extremity.

The summit of Constance Islet (100 feet high) kept just open of Granite Island—which is shown on the chart as being 465 feet high—bearing N. ¼ W., leads in mid-channel between the Yaralla and Pearl shoals.

Another shoal, on the south end of which there is a depth of 15 feet, lies N. ¼ W. 9½ miles from the summit of Ridge Island. The position of its northern extremity and the least water upon it have not yet been determined.

Pearl Shoal, which is of sand, narrow and steep to, extends 2½ miles S.W. ¼ S. from Wallace Islet. Its shoalest part, upon which there is only 3 feet of water, is at a distance of 1½ miles from the shore.

Rocket Spit, of sand and steep to, with a depth of from 12 to 15 feet over it, extends to the south-westward from h. 1. Islet, from the summit of which its extremity lies S.W. by W. 1½ miles. With the flood tide there is a heavy rip over the spit.

Unless thoroughly acquainted with the navigation, vessels of heavy draught are recommended not to pass to the westward of the Beverley Group.
