**RULES UNDER THE "DUTIES ON THE ESTATES OF DECEASED PERSONS STATUTE 1870."**

PURSUANT to the provisions of the "*Duties on the Estates of Deceased Persons Statute 1870.*" the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, frames the following rules:—

1. The rules framed under the "*Duties on the Estates of Deceased Persons Statute 1870.*" dated respectively the second day of February One thousand eight hundred and seventy-one and the thirteenth day of November One thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, are hereby repealed.

2. The time referred to in section 7 of the said statute as "the prescribed time," wherever such expression is used in the said section shall be two calendar months, and the words, "the prescribed time," wherever they occur in the said section shall be read as "two calendar months."

3. In cases of probate or letters of administration, limited to any particular property of a testator or intestate, the executor or administrator shall, within two calendar months from the grant of probate or letters of administration to him, file the statement mentioned in sub-section V. of section 7 of the said statute.

4. The respective statements required by section 7 of the said statute shall contain the particulars of property and of debts and liabilities respectively required by the said section, and every such statement shall be verified by the affidavit or statutory declaration of the person by the said section required to file the same, and if there shall be more than one such person, then of every such person, and if any other person has wholly or partially prepared such statement, then such statement shall be also verified by the affidavit or statutory declaration of such other person.

5. The time referred to in section 9 of the said statute, after which the duty payable under the said statute must be paid, shall be four calendar months from the grant of probate or letters of administration as the case may be.

6. The notice referred to in section 9 of the said statute, after which the duty payable under the said statute must be paid, shall be a notice signed by the Master-in-Equity or the officer appointed by the Governor under the said statute, addressed to the person liable to pay such duty, specifying the amount of such duty and requiring payment thereof within fourteen days after service of such notice, and stating that in default of payment within such time, application will be made to the Supreme Court for an order that a sufficient part of the testator's or intestate's property may be sold and the proceeds thereof applied in payment of the duty and of the costs of the order and sale and consequent thereon.

7. Every such notice may be served either personally on the person to whom the same is addressed or his proctor or agent, or if there be more than one such person then on any one of such persons, or his proctor or agent, or by sending it through the post in a registered letter addressed to the person to whom the notice is addressed, or if there be more than one such person, then to any one of such persons at his last-known place of abode or business; but no such notice shall be served until after the expiration of four calendar months from the grant of probate or letters of administration, as the case may be.

8. Every settlement referred to in section 20 of the said Statute shall be registered within two calendar months from the death of the settlor, or such further time as the Master may allow.

9. The statement required by section 20 of the said Statute shall specify the particulars of the real and personal property comprised in the settlement and the value thereof respectively, and shall be verified by the affidavit or statutory declaration of the trustee of the settlement; or if there be more than one trustee resident in the colony of Victoria, then of all such trustees; or if there be no trustee of the settlement resident in the colony of Victoria, then by the affidavit or statutory declaration of some person beneficially interested under the settlement; and if any other person has wholly or partially prepared such statement, then such statement shall be also verified by the affidavit or statutory declaration of such other person.

10. The Master may assess the duty payable in respect of any settlement referred to in section 20 of the said Statute, and not registered within the prescribed time or such further time as the Master may allow, according to what he shall find to be the value of the property comprised in such settlement either upon oral evidence taken upon oath before him or upon affidavits or statutory declarations.

11. The time within which the duty payable in respect of any settlement, in the last preceding rule referred to shall be paid, shall be four calendar months from the death of the settlor.

12. The notice referred to in section 20 of the said statute as "the prescribed notice," shall be a notice signed by the said Master-in-Equity or the officer appointed by the Governor under the said statute, addressed to the trustees of the settlement or any one of them or to any person beneficially interested under the settlement, specifying the amount of the duty payable under the said statute in respect of such settlement, and requiring payment thereof within fourteen days after service of such notice, and stating that in default of payment within such time, application will be made to the Supreme Court for an order that a sufficient part of the property, included in such settlement, be sold, and the proceeds

of such sale applied in payment of the duty and of the order and sale and consequent thereon.

13. Every such notice may be served either personally on the person to whom the same is addressed, or his solicitor or agent, or if there be more than one such person, then on any one of such persons or his solicitor or agent, or by sending it through the post in a registered letter, addressed to the person to whom the notice is addressed, or if there be more than one such person, then to any one of such persons at his last-known place of abode or business, but no such notice shall be served until after the expiration of four calendar months from the death of the settlor.

14. Every statement filed under the provisions of the said statute shall specify some address or place in the Colony of Victoria to which notices, addressed to the person by whom or on whose behalf the same is filed, may be posted, and every such address or place shall be deemed to be the last-known place of abode or business of such person.

15. No notice mentioned or referred to in any of these rules shall be held to be a substitute for or to dispense with the necessity of any notice of motion required by the said statute or by the ordinary practice of the Supreme Court in its Equity Jurisdiction.

**PRELIMINARY NOTICE.**

Notice is hereby given that Lighthouses are now in the course of erection at Portland Island, Centre Island, and Puysegur Point. It is anticipated that Portland Island Light will be ready for exhibition early in 1878, Centre Island and Puysegur Point a few months later. The following is a description of the lights that will be exhibited:—

*Portland Island Lighthouse* is situated on the southern extremity of Portland Island, which lies off the southern end of the Mahia Peninsula, Hawke's Bay, on the East Coast of the North Island of New Zealand. The Light will be a Second-Order Revolving White Light, visible all round seaward. It will attain its greatest brilliancy every thirty seconds. WE, Colin Robertson Tulloh, James Donaldson, Thomas Henry Peet, John Thomas Edgar, Charles Shrive, and Colin McLean, the duly appointed committee of management of the land at Harrow reserved for recreative purposes, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management of the above-mentioned recreation reserve, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*:-

4. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee of management, or some one appointed by them.
5. No person shall erect any dwelling, nor any booth, or other structure in the reserve, nor offer for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the committee of management, or stewards for the time being of any races or sports which may be held therein, being first obtained.
6. Any person committing any of the following offences shall be removed from the reserve, together with any horses and carriages, or other vehicles, which may be in their possession or care:-
  - i. Assaulting any other person, or using any threatening, abusive, or insulting language.
  - ii. Being drunk, or using any profane or obscene language.
  - iii. Riding, crossing, or trespassing upon the course, or any part of it, during a race meeting, or when the horses are prepared to start, or are running for any race.
7. The maximum charge for admission to the reserve during any race meeting, or sports of any kind, shall be as follows:-

taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time upon the application in writing of the council of any municipality to proclaim any part of the municipal district of such municipality, to be defined by such council, not being a borough having a population of five hundred persons liable to be rated, as shown by the rate-book, a special area; and it was further enacted that the fee which should be paid for a publican's license in respect of premises situated within a special area should be Ten pounds only; and the Governor in Council might from time to time revoke any proclamation made under the authority of the above recited section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim as special areas under the provisions of the fourteenth section of the Act above recited the respective localities hereinafter described, that is to say:—

The part of the Municipal District of the Shire of Bunin-gong, situate and being within one mile of the Town of Ballaarat East.

The portion of the county of Evelyn not included in any municipal district, and comprised within the following boundaries, viz.: Commencing at the junction of the Worric Yallock Creek with the Yarra, up the said creek and its main eastern branch, called Menzie's Creek, to the county boundary between Evelyn and Mornington; thence along the Dividing Range in an easterly direction to near Mount Baw Baw; thence north-westerly to the Great Dividing Range; thence westerly along the Great Dividing Range to Mount Monda south magnetic to the Watts River; and southward down the Watts River to its junction with the Yarra; and up the Yarra Yarra to the commencing point.
