[CIRCULAR.]

Downing street, 22nd August 1877.

SIR,—With reference to my Circular Despatch of the 2nd August 1876, I have the honor to transmit to you, for publication in the Colony under your Government, a copy of an Order of the Queen in Council (13th August 1877) for giving effect to a Declaration concluded between the Government of Her Majesty and the Government of His Majesty the King of the Belgians on the 23rd July last, extending the provisions of the Extradition Treaty of the 20th May 1876 to certain additional crimes.

The Declaration will come into operation on the 27th of this month.

Extract from The London Gazette of Friday, 17th August 1877.

At the Court at Osborne House, Isle of Wight, the 13th day of August 1877.

PRESENT:

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament made and passed in the session of Parliament holden in the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act for amending the Law relating to the Extradition of Criminals*, and also by an Act of Parliament made and passed in the session of Parliament holden in the thirty-sixth and thirty-seventh years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act to amend the Extradition Act 1870*, it was amongst other things enacted that where an arrangement has been made with any Foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such Foreign State; and that Her Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of Her Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the twentieth day of May One thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, between Her Majesty and the King of the Belgians, for the Mutual Extradition of Fugitive Criminals, to which Treaty the above-mentioned Acts of Parliament were applied by an Order in Council of the twenty-first day of July One thousand eight hundred and seventy-six:

And whereas a Declaration was concluded on the twenty-third of July One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, between the Government of Her Majesty and the Government of His Majesty the King of the Belgians, extending the provisions of the above-mentioned Treaty to certain additional Crimes, which Declaration is in the terms following:—

THE Government of Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and the Government of His Majesty the King of the Belgians, having judged it expedient, with the view to the more complete prevention of crime within their respective territories, that persons charged with or convicted of certain crimes in addition to those enumerated in Article I. of the Treaty between Great Britain and Belgium for the mutual surrender of fugitive criminals, of the 20th of May 1876, shall, under the provisions of that Treaty, be reciprocally delivered up, have agreed as follows:—

Persons charged as principals or accessories with or convicted of the undermentioned crimes committed in the territories of the one Party and who shall be found within the territories of the other Party, shall be reciprocally delivered up to each other under the circumstances and conditions stated in the Treaty between Great Britain and Belgium for the mutual surrender of fugitive criminals, of the 20th May 1876:—

1. Administering drugs or using instruments with intent to procure the miscarriage of women.
2. Bigamy.
3. Abandoning children, exposing or unlawfully detaining them.
4. Any malicious act done with intent to endanger persons in a railway train.
5. Receiving any chattel, money, valuable security, or other property, knowing the same to have been embezzled, stolen, or feloniously obtained.

The provisions of the present Declaration shall come into force ten days after its publication, in conformity with the forms prescribed by the laws of the High Contracting Parties.

In witness whereof, the undersigned have signed the present Declaration, and have affixed thereto the seals of their arms.

LE Gouvernement de Sa Majesté la Reine du Royaume-Uni de la Grande Bretagne et d'Irlande, et le Gouvernement de Sa Majesté le Roi des Belges, ayant jugé opportun, afin de mieux assurer la répression des crimes dans leurs territoires respectifs, de se livrer réciproquement, sous les conditions établies par le Traité conclu le 20 Mai, 1876, entre la Grande Bretagne et la Belgique pour l'extradition mutuelle des malfaiteurs, les personnes accusées ou condamnées du chef de certains crimes autres que ceux énumérés dans le dit Traité, sont convenus de ce qui suit:—

Les personnes accusées ou condamnées, comme auteurs ou complices du chef des infractions ci-dessous énumérées commises dans le territoire de l'une des Parties et qui seront trouvées dans le territoire de l'autre Partie, seront réciproquement livrées dans les circonstances et conditions établies par le Traité du 20 Mai, 1876, conclu entre la Grande Bretagne et la Belgique pour l'extradition des malfaiteurs:—

1. Administration de drogues ou usage d'instruments en vue de provoquer l'avortement.
2. Bigamie.
3. Délaissement, exposition ou recel d'enfants.
4. Tout acte punissable commis avec l'intention méchante de mettre en danger des personnes se trouvant dans un train de chemin de fer.
5. Recèlement frauduleux d'argent, valeur ou objets mobiliers provenant d'escroquerie, vol ou détournement.

La présente Déclaration entrera en vigueur dix jours après sa publication dans les formes prescrites par la législation des pays respectifs.

En foi de quoi les soussignés ont dressé la présente Déclaration, qu'ils ont revêtue du cachet de leurs armes.

The Births were in the proportion of 2.84 to every 1000 of the population.  
The Deaths were in the proportion of 1.50 to every 1000 of the population.

NOTE.—The Melbourne Hospital and the Gaol are in Gipps Ward; the Alfred Hospital is in Albert Ward; the Immigrants' Home is partly in Albert Ward and partly in Emerald Hill Town; the Lying-in Hospital is in Smith Ward; the Children's Hospital is in La Trobe Ward; the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum is in Kew Borough; the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum and the Pentridge Stockade are in "Remainder of District;" the Benevolent Asylum is tabulated in Hotham Town.

The births of 726 children, viz., 358 boys and 368 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of October. In the month of September 722 births were registered, or 4 less than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in October numbered 370, viz., 190 of males and 180 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 356. The deaths exceeded those in September by 19, and were in excess of the average of October during the previous ten years by 66. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of those ten years by only 19.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 90.0° on the 26th, and the lowest was 42.0° on the 16th. The mean temperature of the month (55.6°) was about 1½ degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (37.0°) took place on the 24th, viz., from a maximum of 81.0° to a minimum of 44.0°. The least range (6.7°) was on the 9th, viz., from a maximum of 57.1° to a minimum of 50.4°. The mean daily range was 19.3°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.007 inches) was more than a tenth of an inch above the average.

Males contributed 51 per cent., and females 49 per cent., to the registered mortality of the month. Thirty-nine per cent. were of children under the age of 5 years as against 29 per cent. in October 1876; 39 per cent. in October 1875; 35 per cent. in October 1874; 37 per cent. in October 1873; 37 per cent. in October 1872; 41 per cent. in October 1871; 32 per cent. in October 1870; 40 per cent. in October 1869; 45 per cent. in October 1868; and 40 per cent. in October 1867.

The deaths of 12 persons of the age of 75 years or upwards were recorded during the month, viz.:—Those of a male, of occupation un stated, aged 77, of old age; a market gardener, aged 77, of injuries to the skull inflicted by a hedge knife (manslaughter); a miner, aged 78, of pneumonia; a female, aged 79, of bronchitis; a "gentleman," aged 79, of old age; five females, aged respectively 81, 86, 86, 86, and 87, of old age; one female, aged 96, of apoplexy; and a Trafalgar veteran, aged 102, of natural decay.

Thirteen of the deaths registered during the month under review were set down to violence, eleven of which are supposed to have been accidental, one homicidal, and one suicidal. The particulars are as follow:—A bootmaker, aged 21, was killed by falling from a window; a seaman, aged 35, was passed over by a railway train; a groom, aged 69, died of tetanus—the result of a wound in the leg; a carpenter aged 45, died of burns; a male and a female child, each aged 2, were accidentally drowned in baths; a female child, aged 1, was accidentally drowned in a tub of water; a brewer, aged 35, a squatter, aged 42, a male of occupation unknown, aged 55, and a female, aged 40, were found drowned—the three first in the River Yarra, the last in Port Phillip Bay. The victim to manslaughter was a market-gardener, aged 77, who was stabbed in the head with a hedge knife. The suicide was that of a coach-builder, aged 57, who drowned himself in the River Yarra.

Seventy-seven deaths, or 21 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—46 in the Melbourne Hospital, 6 in the Immigrants' Home, 1 in the Children's Hospital, 6 in the Alfred Hospital, 5 in the Lying-in Hospital, 5 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Homœopathic Hospital.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 144, of which 76, or 53 per cent., were of males; and 68, or 47 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 85 were under one year of age, 31 were between one and two, 13 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 9 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 226. Of these, 114, or 50 per cent., were males, and 112, or 50 per cent., were females; 18 were between five and ten, 5 were between ten and fifteen, 12 were between fifteen and twenty, 17 were between twenty and twenty-five, 12 were between twenty-five and thirty, 19 were between thirty and thirty-five, 18 were between thirty-five and forty, 25 were between forty and forty-five, 23 were between forty-five and fifty, 20 were between fifty and fifty-five, 14 were between fifty-five and sixty, 14 were between sixty and sixty-five, 15 were between sixty-five and seventy, 7 were between seventy and seventy-five, 4 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 8 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from whooping cough, which fell from 20 in August to 17 in September, again increased to 27 in the month under review. Deaths from other miasmatic diseases also increased as follow:—Scarlatina, from 7 to 8; diphtheria, from 4 to 11; croup, from 6 to 9; dysentery, from 1 to 3; and diarrhoea, from 4 to 13. On the other hand, deaths from typhoid fever fell from 15 to 8. Under the head Constitutional diseases, deaths from phthisis increased from 46 to 49. Five deaths were set down to the consequences of childbirth, or 1 death of a mother to every 145 births registered.

TOWN OF BYADUK.—County of Normanby, parish of Byaduk, being allotments 6 of section 7, 5 and 6 of section 9, 1 of section 10, and 1 of section 11: Commencing at the south-west angle of section 9<sup>a</sup>; bounded thence by that section bearing S. 82° 25' E. fifty-seven chains; thence by a line and allotments 5<sup>a</sup> and 5<sup>b</sup> of section 7, and 1<sup>a</sup> and 1<sup>b</sup> of section 8 bearing south seventy-five chains seventy-five links; thence by allotment 2<sup>a</sup> of section 11, a line, and allotment 2<sup>a</sup> of section 10 bearing west ninety chains forty-five links; thence by a road bearing north sixty-nine chains twenty-nine links; and thence by allotment 4<sup>b</sup> of section 9 bearing east thirty-four chains, and north fourteen chains to the point of commencement. The Pitfield Common, proclaimed by Order of the 12th June 1876, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:—County of Grenville, parish of Manibadar: Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment

#### PORTLAND PUBLIC PARK RESERVE.

REGULATIONS for the care, protection, and management of the Portland Public Park Reserve, adopted by the Council of the Borough the first day of October 1877.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the council.

6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent in writing of the council first obtained.

7. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots which may be enclosed within the reserve for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE LAND TAX ACT 1877.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-first day of November 1877.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor in Council.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Land Tax Act 1877* (No. 575, § 57) the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

- For the purposes of these Regulations, unless the context be inconsistent therewith, the words "Commissioners" and "Registrar" shall mean the Commissioners of Land Tax and the Registrar of Land Tax respectively, and the word "Act" shall mean "The Land Tax Act 1877."
- The distribution of work by the Commissioners between the Classifiers shall be ordered in the form in Schedule A hereto.
- The returns to be made by the Classifiers to the Commissioners shall be in the form of Schedule B hereto.
- Directions by the Commissioners for re-classification of landed estates shall be in the form in Schedule C hereto.
- The classification for Victoria shall be in the form in Schedule D hereto.
- The Registrar shall make out lists of appeals in the form in Schedule E, and copies of such lists in the form in Schedule F hereto.
- Gazette* notices of amendments by the Commissioners of the classification of landed estates shall be in the form in Schedule G hereto.
- Lists of owners of landed estates in Victoria shall be in the form in Schedule H hereto.
- The Land Tax Register shall be kept by the Registrar in the form in Schedule I hereto.
- The Valuation for Victoria shall be kept in the form in Schedule J hereto.
- The Land Tax Register and the Valuation for Victoria shall be open to inspection of any person interested on ordinary days of business from Ten a.m. to Three p.m., excepting on Saturdays when the said books shall be open for inspection from Ten a.m. to Twelve noon. Any person whose name may appear in the said books as liable to pay land tax, or his attorney or agent duly appointed (in writing) in that behalf, or any person who may be authorized by the Commissioners or by the Registrar to make such inspection, and no other person, shall be deemed to be a person interested within the meaning of the Act.
- Applications to the Registrar for the removal of names from the Land Tax Register shall be made in the form or to the effect in Schedule K hereto.
- Notices of determination shall be given by the Registrar in the form in Schedule L hereto.

14. The Registrar-General and the Registrar of Titles respectively shall furnish to the Registrar, weekly, a return in the form in Schedule M hereto, with respect to instruments registered in their respective offices, which may work any change in the ownership of land within the meaning of the Act. The clerk of every municipality shall furnish to the Registrar of Land Tax, whenever requested by him in writing so to do, copies of the rate book or of the municipal rolls of such municipality, within one month from the making of such demand in writing by the Registrar of Land Tax, and if any such clerk shall wilfully neglect or refuse to furnish such copies so required of him within the said time, such clerk shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time upon the application in writing of the council of any municipality to proclaim any part of the municipal district of such municipality, to be defined by such council, not being a borough having a population of Five hundred persons liable to be rated, as shown by the rate-book, a special area; and it was further enacted that the fee which should be paid for a publican's license in respect of premises situated within a special area should be Ten pounds only; and the Governor in Council might from time to time revoke any proclamation made under the authority of the above recited section of the said Act: And whereas by a Proclamation, under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the Colony, bearing date the fifth day of November instant, the township of Wunghnu, in the Goulburn district, was constituted a special area under the 14th section of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to revoke such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation; and with the advice aforesaid I do hereby proclaim as special areas under the provisions of the fourteenth section of the Act above recited the respective localities hereinafter described, that is to say:—

The Broadmeadows Riding of the Shire of Broadmeadows.  
Morwell and the locality around, being a place not included in any municipal district.

## THE SHIRES OF WIMMERA AND STAWELL.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twelfth day of November 1877.*

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor in Council.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (88 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Order, amongst other things, altering, for the purpose of adjusting the boundaries of conterminous municipal districts, being shires, without any petition: And it was also enacted that any error in any Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act might be rectified by the Governor in Council by any subsequent Order: And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the fifteenth day of May 1876, the Shire of Wimmera was described anew: And whereas by another Order in Council bearing date the twenty-fourth day of September in the present year, a portion of the Shire of Wimmera therein described was severed and constituted as the Shire of Dunmunkle, and the remainder of the said Shire of Wimmera, after deducting the severed portion, was incorrectly described: And whereas the Shire of Stawell and the Shire of Wimmera are partly conterminous with the Shire of Dunmunkle, and it is expedient to adjust and define their boundaries so far as they are conterminous with the said Shire of Dunmunkle: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke so much of the hereinbefore-mentioned Orders in Council of the fifteenth of May 1876 and the twenty-fourth of September 1877 as relates to the Shire of Wimmera, and doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the said Shire of Wimmera and so much of the said Shire of Stawell (being the North Riding thereof) as abuts on the said Shire of Dunmunkle, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF WIMMERA.—Bounded by a line beginning at the most northern bend of the River Glenelg, county boundary of Lowan; thence north-westerly towards the western boundary of the colony three miles northward of Lake Cadmite as far as the intersection of the north-west boundary of Maryvale run; around Maryvale run to Mica Lake run north-eastward along the boundaries of Mica Lake, St. Mary's Lake, Wym Wyn, and Pollemcet runs to the Wimmera River, down that river to and along the south boundary of the parish of Dimboola, along the east boundary of the parishes of Dimboola, Catyil, and Terranyurk and the north boundaries of the parishes of Cannum and Werrigar East to the Yariambiack Creek, up that creek to the northern boundary of Kewell run, being the north-west angle of the Shire of Dunmunkle; thence continuing up said creek to the northern boundary of the parish of Warranook, being from the said northern boundary of Kewell run to this point, the conterminous boundary with Dunmunkle Shire; thence in continuation up the afore-mentioned creek to and up the Wimmera River to a point north-east from Brigg's Bluff, Grampian Range; to said Bluff and southward along the watershed of the Grampians to the head of the Glenelg River; and down this river to the starting point.

Wherever the line so described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken

to be the boundary-line. Unless actually defined by survey, or otherwise stated, the bearings are to be taken as magnetic.

THE NORTH RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF STAWELL.—Commencing at the Wimmera River, on the north boundary of the parish of Warranook; thence east along the parish boundaries of Warranook, Riachella, and Callawadda, to the south-east angle of allotment 192, parish of Wircheliba, and being up to this point the conterminous boundary with the shire of Dunmunkle; thence in continuation along the north boundary of the parish of Callawadda and south along the east boundary of the latter parish to the Horsham and Navarre road, south eastward along the last-named road to its junction with the Stawell and Navarre road, south westward along said road to the River Wimmera, and down this river to the starting point.
