FLAG FOR GOVERNMENT VESSELS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

IN accordance with the terms of a despatch received from Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies, I, the Governor of Victoria, do hereby direct that in lieu of the blue ensign with the badge specified in my proclamation dated the 26th day of March 1877, all vessels belonging to or permanently in the service of the Government of Victoria shall wear the blue ensign, having in the centre of the fly thereof the distinctive badge of the colony, viz.:—Five white stars representing the constellation of the Southern Cross surmounted by an Imperial crown.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twelfth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and in the forty-first year of Her Majesty's reign.

Extract from Sailing Directions sent to Hydrographic Office
from Her Majesty's surveying schooner *Alacrity*, Septem-
ber 1877.

SUVA TO THUVU (or Thüb).

Suva to Navua R.—From Suva to Navua R. the general
direction of the coast is south-westerly. An irregular chain
of reefs lies parallel to the shore, forming four prominent
elbows, two of which are 8 miles distant from the nearest part
of the coast.

Navua Roads.—The Navua Roads is the name given to the
anchorage formed by the deposit from the Navua R. In
westerly winds good shelter can be obtained west of the river,
under the lee of the Rovondrau Reefs in 4 fathoms mud.

Rovondrau Bay.—Two miles to the westward of Navua River
is Rovondrau Bay, where there is good anchorage in moderate
depth, well protected from the prevailing south-east winds by
the Rovondrau Reefs.

Coral Cay.—The Rovondrau Reefs terminate one-third of a
mile south-west of a cay of coral grit which stands one foot
above high water, and is conspicuous in bright weather.

Mbengha Passage.—The Mbengha passage, between the island
of Mbengha and the south coast of Viti Levu, is 10 miles long,
and has for its limits—on the south side, the Pratt Reefs, the
Pearl Rock, the Cæsar Rocks, and the Nisithi Rocks; and on
the north side the Naitata Flats, the Rovondrau Reefs, Combe,
Lake and Shark Reefs, and the Lerua Reef. Between Shark
Reef and the Cæsar Rock, the passage is but little over one
mile wide, the depth in the middle being 150 fathoms.

Land Marks.—In passing through the Mbengha passage, the
most conspicuous land marks are Storm Islet, Mbengha,
Yanutha, and Bird Islet on the port hand; the Korondrau
Cay, Shark's Fin Hill, and a sandy cay on the Shark Reef on
the starboard hand.

Directions for Mbengha Passage.—Pass within one mile of the
Rovondrau Cay, and steer W. by S. 4 S., keeping well over
to the Shark Reef to ensure clearing the Cæsar Rocks, which do
not break. The Cæsar Rocks are passed when Shark Reef Cay
is in line with the Shark's Fin, when a more southerly course
may be steered, if necessary, to clear the reefs off Lerua.

Pratt Reefs.—The Pratt Reefs are a group of coral patches
halfway between the north shore of Mbengha and Rovondrau
reefs. In the centre of the largest patch is a sandy cay
which is awash at low water.

Pearl Rock.—Pearl Rock, W.S.W. 2 miles of the sand cay
mentioned above, is a coral patch with 3 fathoms on it at low
water.

Cæsar Rocks.—The Cæsar Rocks are two small coral heads 6
feet below low water, situated N.E. ½ N. 2½ miles from Bird
Islet. There is seldom or ever any break on them.

Nisithi Rocks.—Between the Cæsar Rocks and Thakau Nisithi
the bottom is very foul, being strewn with rocks about 6 to 12
feet below low water.

Thakau Nisithi.—Thakau Nisithi is the name given by the
natives to the coral reef upon which is situated the Bird Islet
(of Wilkes) which is a small sandy cay with a group of bushes
on it making its entire height 4 feet above high water.

Yanutha Island (called Nanuka on Chart 2691).—Yanutha
Island, 8 miles W. by S. of Mbengha Peak, is 1 mile long by ½
mile broad. It has 3 peaks, the highest of which is 450 feet.
There is anchorage in 7 fathoms sand, off the N.W. coast pro-
tected from prevailing winds. In going north from this island
care must be taken to avoid the coral heads between the
Yanutha Reefs (to the west of Yanutha) and Thakau Nisithi.

The Shark's Fin.—In passing through the Mbengha Passage
the most conspicuous landmark on the starboard hand is the
Shark's Fin, a hill covered with trees and 680 feet high.

Combe Reef.—Combe Reef is a large patch awash at low
water 1½ miles W. by S. of the Rovondrau Cay.

Lake Reef.—Lake Reef, 1½ W. by S. of Combe Reef, is below
low water, and less conspicuous than the latter.

Shark Reef.—Shark Reef is 1½ miles long. The western half
of it is awash, but the eastern half is a few feet below low

water. The sand cay on Shark Reef is 1 foot above high
water, and is situated 2½ miles S. ½ E. of the Shark's Fin.

Lerua Harbor.—Lerua Harbor is well protected from all
winds, but not suitable for sailing vessels on account of the
difficulty of egress when the trade wind is blowing. There is
good anchorage in 16 fathoms mud, with left extreme Lerua
Islet in line left extreme land beyond, distant 1200 yards.

The Hog's Back. 2½ miles west of Lerua Harbor, is a round
wooded hill, called The Hog's Back, conspicuous for many miles
from both east and west.

Hog's Back Point.—Hog's Back Point is the extremity of the
ridge running down from The Hog's Back.

Harbors between Lerua and Thuvu.—Vunaniu (called Grandy
Harbor in Chart 2691), Seri and Thuvu harbors are suitable
for steam vessels only.

Vunaniu Harbor.—Vunaniu Harbor is 1½ miles W. by S. of
Hog's Back Point. Good anchorage in 8 fathoms mud, well
protected.

Seri.—Seri Harbor, 17½ miles W. ½ N. of Hog's Back Point,
has anchorage in 7 fathoms sand.

Thuvu.—Thuvu or Thüb Harbor (erroneously called Ndronga
on published Chart No. 176), is 6½ miles W. by N. of the
Langatope River, anchorage in 5 fathoms sand. Staff Com-
mander Hoskin has executed a sketch of this small port.

It appears from the above positions that islands fixed by
the U.S. expedition are placed too far west. Biva has prob-
ably been corrected since. The position of Tartar Reef
should not be altered with the islands as it was probably
determined independently of them.

The natives of Waia state that several reefs exist between
Virva (Biva) and Waia; also between Virva and Baldwin
Island, which only break in strong gales from west.

From the summit of Waia two patches were seen in the
channel between Waia lai i thake and Knox Island, awash
at low water.

From summit of Baldwin Island the sea to the westward
appeared dotted with patches for a distance of three or four
miles from the island. Apparently there was not less than
two fathoms on any of them at low water.

OLOZENGA ROCK—GERMAN NOTICE TO MARINERS.

Position of a rock (Olozenga) near the Kermadec Group, West
Polynesia.

ACCORDING to a report of Captain Knorr, R.N., Commander
of H.M.S. *Hertha*, the captain of the schooner *Olozenga*, Captain
Ranzon, has given notice, that 25th December 1876, at about
7 p.m., he has seen breakers in about lat. S. 29° 48' and long.

E. 177° 18' on his voyage to Auckland. When examined it was found these breakers proceeded from a shallow rock a very little way under water. The schooner having no chronometer on board, the longitude with regard to current drift was as much as possible corrected after having reached the land four days after. According to this correction the rock lies in about lat. S. 29° 48' and long. E. 176° 45'.

Hydrographical information furnished by officers of H.M.S. "Sappho," 23rd July 1877.

It is reported, on reliable authority, that the fixed white light exhibited from a lighthouse on Cape Wanbrow, at the Port of Oamaru, said to be seen in clear weather about 15 nautical miles over an arc of 146° 15' between N.N.W. and S. by W. from seaward is a small light and is not visible at a distance of 15 miles.

Information furnished by Lieutenant Masters, Commander H.M. schooner "Conflict."

The Kaan Islands are ten in number in lat. 3° 32' S. long. 158° 30' E. Natives ferocious, naked, and armed with spears.

Man Island, Chart No. 794, is incorrectly placed.

The passage between Man Island and New Britain is about 5 miles wide, quite clear of danger with the exception of one shoal nearly dry at low water, which is about 2 miles off the New Britain coast.

The following bearings, which put it on the land on Chart No. 794, show that Cape Stevens is incorrectly placed on that chart—

Bearings from shoal { The Mother, east.
Cape Stevens, N. 51° E.

A vessel of any draft could pass between it and New Britain.

Off Cape Luen there is a dangerous reef running out a mile or so in a northerly direction. West of the cape is a small island called Urare, between which and the cape is a good passage with three shoal patches in it close together, easily discernible from mast-head, about ¼ a mile off reef in a westerly direction.

ENTRANCE TO KAIPARA HARBOUR.

[No. 35 of 1877.]

The following report, by Captain Johnson of this department, containing amended sailing directions for entering Kaipara Harbor, is published for general information.

Sir,—From the recent survey I made of the approaches to Kaipara Harbor, I have the honor to report that I found that the Galatea Channel was the only one to be recommended as being the most safe and easiest to navigate. The bar on this channel has shifted ¼ miles further seaward than is shown in the Admiralty chart, and is 8 miles distant from the green hillocks on North Sand Heads, and ¼ miles in width at its entrance, with 15 fathoms close up to it, and 5½ fathoms on it at low-water springs, carrying from 6 to 7 fathoms in for 12 miles, when it gradually deepens, the greatest depth of 23 fathoms being found between Tory Shoal and North Head. Considerable alteration in the line of banks has also taken place since last surveyed. Tory Shoal has greatly increased towards North Head, narrowing this part of Galatea Channel to only ¼ of a mile, with deep water steep to on both sides.

The tides between Tory Shoal and North Head are very strong, both ebb and flood set partly on to the North Head; great care should therefore be exercised in beating or during light winds.

The tides have worked an indentation or bight in the North Head seaward of the hillocks, and have extended the North Spit or flats ¼ of a mile further seaward than is shown in chart.

The following will be found the best marks for crossing the bar.—Bring Pukitu, a remarkable triangular green patch on the south side, to bear E. by N. with the westernmost of the three green hillocks on the North Head N.E. ¼ N., the vessel will then be two miles seaward of the outer edge of the bar, and right in the fairway with Wakahoranga, a conspicuous conical hill inland 2½ degrees open of the North Head; from this position steer in a N.E. ¼ N. course for the middle green patch until Pukitu bears E.S.E., Wakahoranga will then be just over the North Head, and the beacon, house, and flagstaff, which are erected at the back of the centre green patch, will be seen in one; the vessel will then be guided in by the semaphore arm by steering in the direction the arm points, and steadying the course when the arm drops. Should the signals not be seen, the vessel should be kept a ¼ to ½ mile from shore, and when abreast of signal station a safe course for either the Kaipara or Wairoa branch may be shaped.

The pilot station is on Pouo Point, which has now a telegraph communication with the signal station.

His Excellency the Governor in Council.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (88 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Order, amongst other things, altering, for the purpose of adjusting the boundaries of continuous municipal districts, being shires, without any petition; and it was further enacted that every Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the date of such publication: And whereas it has been deemed expedient that a portion of the boundary-line between the Shires of Korong and Bet Bet should be altered and adjusted: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby alter and adjust the boundaries of the said Shires of Korong and Bet Bet, and doth re-define the boundaries of the continuous portions or ridings of such shires respectively in manner following, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF KORONG (Kingover Riding).—Bounded by a line commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 1, section F, parish of Tarnagulla; thence westward to the north-east angle of Mary A. Fyfe's 19th section block, west along its north boundary and that of J. Peterson's 19th section block to the Tarnagulla and Bridgewater Road, along said road southward eighty-two chains or so to and along the north boundary of the selected land of Alfred Day, west two hundred and forty-two chains to the north-west angle of M. Hughes' 19th section block, south to the north-west angle of allotment 50, section C, south 85° 30' west to the north-west angle of allotment 45, section C, south to the north-west angle of allotment 101, at the west boundary of the parish of Tarnagulla, north 25° 52' west twenty-three chains and a half, west to the north-west angle and along the west boundary of T. Fotheringham's 19th section block, south to a point on the north boundary of the 19th section block of C. E. Belcher, and west to its north-west angle, south-westward to the Trig. Station on Mount Mollagul, south 76° 30' west to the Avoca River, being to this point the adjusted continuous boundary with Bet Bet Shire; thence down said river to the north boundary of Avoca Forest run, along said boundary to and northward around the boundaries of Spring Hill and Brenanah runs to the south-west angle of Inglewood Goldfields Common, eastward along boundary of said common to the Loddon River, and up this river to the starting point.

Wherever the line described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically described or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary-line.

THE SHIRE OF BET BET (Bealiba Riding).—Bounded by a line beginning at the north-west angle of allotment 101, parish of Tarnagulla; thence north 25° 52' west twenty-three chains and a half; west to the north-west angle and along the west boundary of T. Fotheringham's 19th section block; south to a point on the north boundary of the 19th section block of C. E. Belcher, and west to its north-west angle; south-westward to the Trig. Station on Mount Mollagul; south 76° 30' west to the River Avoca, being up to this point the adjusted continuous boundary with Korong shire; thence up said river to the south-east angle of Natta Yalok pre-emptive right; eastward along the boundary of Dunolly mining division to the parish of Wareek, Harp, and Dunolly to the south-west angle of the parish of Waanyarra; and northward along the boundaries of that parish and of Tarnagulla to the starting point, excluding

Fyfe's 19th section block; west along its north boundary and that of J. Peterson's 19th section block to the Tarnagulla and Bridgewater road; along said road southward eighty-two chains or so to and along the north boundary of the selected land of Alfred Day; west two hundred and forty-two chains to the north-west angle of M. Hughes' 19th section block; south to the north-west angle of allotment 50, section C; south 85° 30' west to the north-west angle of allotment 45, section C; south to the north-west angle of allotment 101, at the west boundary of the parish of Tarnagulla, and being to this point the adjusted continuous boundary with Korong shire; thence southward and eastward along the parish boundaries of Tarnagulla, Waanyarra, and Eddington to the River Loddon; and down same to the starting point, excluding the borough of Tarnagulla.

Wherever the line so described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically named or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary-line.

And the Honorable James Brown Patterson, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FENOUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, sec. 14) it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time upon the application in writing of the council of any municipality to proclaim any part of the municipal district of such municipality, to be defined by such council, not being a borough having a population of five hundred persons liable to be taxed, as shown by the rate-book, a special area; and it was further enacted that the fee which should be paid for a publican's

license in respect of premises situated within a special area should be Ten pounds only; and the Governor in Council might from time to time revoke any proclamation made under the authority of the above recited section of the said Act: And whereas by a Proclamation, under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the Colony, bearing date the eleventh day of December 1871, the whole of the Shire of Beechworth (except the townships of Stanley and Eldorado) was proclaimed a district (amongst other districts) within which Certificates for licenses chargeable with a fee of £10 might be granted under the provisions of the Act No. 390 which has since been repealed: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the portion of the said Proclamation relating to the said Shire of Beechworth: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation so far as it relates to the said Shire of Beechworth; and with the advice aforesaid I do hereby proclaim as special areas under the provisions of the fourteenth section of the Act above recited the respective localities hereinafter described, within which the fee to be paid for a publican's license shall be Ten pounds only, that is to say:—

The Shire Riding of the United Shire of Beechworth;
The Moriac and Coast Ridings of the Shire of Barrabool;
The part of the Municipal district of the Shire of Corio situate and being within a mile of the Town of Geelong;

The whole of the Borough of Steiglitz.

The undermentioned localities, being places not included in any municipal districts, viz.:—

(1.) That portion of the Upper Goulburn Police District extending from the southern boundary of the Shire of Howqua to the northern boundary of the Borough of Wood's Point, in the county of Delatite;

(2.) That portion of the Upper Goulburn Police District extending from the southern boundary of the Borough of Wood's Point to the junction of the Aberfeldy and Thomson rivers, in the county of Tanjil;

(3.) That portion of the Upper Goulburn Police District extending from the eastern boundary of the Borough of Wood's Point to Marysville inclusive, being portions of the county of Delatite and the county of Anglesey.

SHIRE OF BELLARINE.

BYE-LAWS OF THE SHIRE OF BELLARINE, MADE UNDER SECTION 213, LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1874, AND NUMBERED 11, 12, AND 13, FOR REGULATING WATERWORKS, DRAINS, FISHING; ALSO MISCELLANEOUS MATTERS; ALSO FOR REGULATING PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL AND ITS OFFICERS, ETC.

IN pursuance of the power conferred by the Local Government Act 1874, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bellarine order as follows:—

That sections numbered 1, 3, 4, 5, and 6, of part II. of the 13th schedule of the Local Government Act 1874, and sections numbered 1, 2, and 3, of part IX. of said 13th schedule, and part number IX. of the same 13th schedule, excepting such additions to and alterations of said part number XI. and excisions therefrom as described below, be hereby adopted in and for the Shire of Bellarine.

BYE-LAW No. 11.—PART II., SECTIONS 1, 3, 4, 5, AND 6.—
WATERWORKS, DRAINS, ETC.

1. *Polluting water.*—Whosoever shall bathe in any stream, reservoir, conduit, aqueduct, or other waterworks belonging to or under the management or control of the council, or shall wash, cleanse, throw or cause to enter therein any animal, whether alive or dead, or any rubbish, filth, stuff, or thing of any kind whatsoever, or shall cause, or permit, or suffer to run, or be brought therein, the water of any sink, sewer, drain, engine, or boiler, or other filthy, unwholesome, or impure water, or shall do anything whatsoever whereby any water or waterworks belonging to the council, or under their management or control, shall be fouled, obstructed, or damaged, shall for every such offence forfeit, on conviction, a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and a further sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for each day while such offence is continued after written notice in that behalf.

3. *Damming water without consent.*—Whosoever shall, without the consent in writing of the council, construct or place any dam or embankment in or across any river, creek, or natural watercourse, or permanently obstruct the same in any way, shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds, and a further sum not exceeding Five pounds for every day after such conviction during which such dam, or embankment, or any part thereof shall continue.

4. *Diverting water or causing it to be foul.*—In any case in which the council shall have the exclusive right of collecting for the supply of any reservoir or waterworks belonging to the council, or under their management or control, the storm-water having fallen on any gathering ground, whosoever shall by any means whatsoever divert any such water from the course of its natural flow, so that the same shall tend to flow elsewhere than to such reservoir or waterworks, or some water-course leading thereto, or shall flow to the same respectively in a foul state, shall forfeit, on conviction, a sum not exceeding Fifty pounds, and a further sum not exceeding Ten pounds for every day after such conviction during which such water so tends to flow or flows, as the case may be.

5. *Shooting or fishing.*—It shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for prohibiting or regulating the shooting of waterfowl and the taking of fish upon or in or within one quarter of a mile of any stream, reservoir, or other waterworks belonging to or under the management or control of the council; and every person who shall offend contrary to any such regulation shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

6. *Culverts.*—Whosoever shall obstruct or damage any culvert, sewer, or drain belonging to or under the control of the council, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds, and shall pay to the council by way of compensation for any such damage such further sum not exceeding Ten pounds as the convicting justice shall order.

BYE-LAW No. 12.—PART IX., SECTIONS 1, 2, AND 3.—MISCELLANEOUS MATTERS.

1. *Bathing.*—Where any part of the sea shore or strand of any river or creek, used as a public bathing place, is within the municipal district, or within three hundred yards of the boundary thereof, and not within any borough, the council may make regulations for and with respect to the time and place of bathing at or within such part, and according to the sex of the persons bathing or otherwise, and also as to persons resorting to or passing by such part, whether by land or by water, and for the stands of bathing machines, and otherwise for securing reasonable privacy for bathers and the observance of decency.

2. *Damaging trees, &c.*—If any person shall wilfully and without the authority of the council cut, break, bark, root up, or otherwise destroy or damage the whole or any part of any tree, sapling, shrub, or underwood, growing in or upon any street, road, or place under the management of the council, although the injury done shall not be to the amount of One shilling, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

3. *Removing soil.*—If any person shall without the authority of the council break, displace, or remove the surface or soil of

any land belonging to or under the control or management of the council, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

BYE-LAW No. 13.—PART XI.—REGULATIONS OF PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL AND ITS OFFICERS, ETC.

1. *General conduct of business as in Parliament.*—In all cases not herein provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the council.

2. *Read minutes: Committees' minutes.*—At every meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meetings shall then be signed; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the council at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting.

3. *Order of business.*—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follow, or as near thereto as may be practicable; but for the greater convenience of the council, at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- i. Reading of copies of letters sent by authority of the council.
- ii. Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- iii. Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- iv. Presentation of reports of committees and shire officers.
- v. Payments.
- vi. Ordinary business.
- vii. Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- viii. Extraordinary business, and new rules and regulations.
- ix. Other business of which previous notice has been given.
- x. Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. *Divisions.*—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any councillor, the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the president or chairman.

5. *Addresses to Governor.*—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the president and secretary of the council, unless otherwise ordered by the council.

6. *Notice of motion.*—All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered and given by the intending mover to the secretary at the close of the meeting of council, and if not required by law to be given at a meeting, then twelve clear days prior to the next meeting of council; and the secretary shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

7. *No discussion without notice.*—No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

8. *No motion on petition until next meeting.*—No motion, except that for receiving same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application, until the next ordinary meeting of council after that at which it has been presented.

9. *Motion to come on in order.*—Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the secretary in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed, shall be struck out.

10. *Motion to be moved by notice.*—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.

11. *Draft of petition &c., and twelve days' notice to Secretary of motion for an address or petition.*—No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall have given twelve clear days' notice in writing to the secretary of his intention to do so, and the secretary shall enter the same in his notice of motion book.

12. *Manner of addressing the Chair: Order of debate.*—Any councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the president or chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the councillor (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

13. *Nature of motion.*—Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the council thereon.

14. *Not to be withdrawn.*—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.

15. *Must be seconded: Standing orders.*—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the council unless it be seconded, but a councillor may require the enforcement of any standing order of the council by directing the president or chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

16. *Mover of motion and seconder.*—A councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a councillor merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

17. *Designation of councillors.*—The councillors in meeting of council shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of president, chairman, or councillor, as the case may require.

18. *President to decide as to priority.*—If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time the president or chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

19. *Standing when addressing.*—The president or chairman shall rise in addressing the council to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

20. *Not to speak twice.*—No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

21. *President's decision on order.*—The president or chairman when called upon to decide on points of order or practice shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

22. *No digression—No imputation.*—No councillor shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other councillor in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on councillors shall be deemed highly disorderly.

23. *Apology.*—Whenever any councillor shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being offensively applied to any other councillor, the councillor so offending shall be required by the president or chairman to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the council.

24. *When called to order to sit down.*—Any councillor called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

25. *Refusal to obey president an offence.*—Any councillor using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and to apologise for such conduct and refusing to do so, shall be guilty of an offence.

26. *Disorderly conduct of strangers an offence.*—Any person not being a councillor who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the council, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the president or chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, if necessary by force, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

27. *Call of whole council to be obeyed.*—Any councillor not attending in compliance with an order for a call of the whole council without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof shall be guilty of an offence.

28. *Documents to be produced.*—Any councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the council applying to the question under discussion.

29. *Not voting an offence.*—The council shall vote by show of hands, and any councillor present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

30. *Manner of taking votes.*—The president or chairman shall, in taking the sense of the council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

31. *Written resolutions.*—At every meeting of the council all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, if required by the president or chairman, signed by the mover, and delivered to the president or chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

32. *Order of amendments.*—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

33. *Rejecting words in original motion.*—If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

34. *Second amendment.*—If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the council for discussion at a time.

35. *Right of reply—To speak only once.*—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

36. *Adjournment motion.*—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for the adjournment of the council; but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice-paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

37. *Protest and intention to protest—Entered in minutes—Expunged.*—Any councillor may protest against any resolution of the council, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for the protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the council by the protesting councillor in a book to be kept for that purpose in

the secretary's office and signed by such councillor, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the council to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the council.

38. *Debating interrupted by only minority being present.*—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted, on motion upon notice.

39. *Debate resumed when council is sitting.*—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of numbers as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-book for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

40. *Committees' reports.*—Minutes of all proceedings of committees, as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committees' minute-book, and being signed by the chairman of the committee shall be presented to the council; and the secretary, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of committees.

41. *Meetings of committee.*—The secretary shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time thereafter, by order of the council, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee or of any two members of the committee.

42. *No petitions to be presented after the orders of the day.*—No petition shall be presented after the council shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

43. *Councillor presenting a petition to see that such is respectful.*—It shall be incumbent on every councillor presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the council, and that the contents do not violate any bye-law, or any provision thereof.

44. *Councillor's name to be written to petitions.*—Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

45. *How petitions are to be written.*—Every petition shall be in writing, and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

46. *Petitions to be signed by petitioners.*—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

47. *No writing to be attached.*—No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

48. *Matter of petitions to be stated.*—Every councillor presenting a petition to the council, shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

49. *Appointments to offices.*—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the council shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the shire, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

50. *Salaries to be fixed by council.*—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the council shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same and before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

51. *Councillor or officer not to be surety.*—No councillor or officer of the council, and no auditor of the shire, shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the council, or for any work to be done for the council.

52. *Security to be provided at the expense of person providing.*—In case of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

53. *Plans and specifications open full five days.*—All plans and specifications for any public work where the council deem it necessary, shall be open for inspection not less than five days before contracts for the same be entered into, and any ratepayer may inspect the same during that time.

54. *Shire treasurer to disburse.*—It shall be lawful for the shire treasurer, from time to time, on the written order of the president, to disburse such moneys as shall have been appropriated by the council for the purposes of the last preceding clause, and as shall be required for any necessary occasion, not exceeding in the whole, in any interval between two ordinary meetings of the council, the sum of five pounds.

56. *How to suspend bye-laws.*—Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this bye-law may be suspended for a special purpose, on motion, upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended, except by a majority of the votes of at least two-thirds of the council then present.
