## PUBLIC HIGHWAYS IN THE CITY OF SANDHURST.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Sandhurst has requested that the streets, hereinafter mentioned, within the said city be so declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the lands acquired or used for the streets hereinafter named and described and situate in the City of Sandhurst to be public highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

## VILLAGE IN THE PARISH OF WOOSANG.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that the Governor might from time to time by a notice in the *Government Gazette* proclaim as a street or road or as a town or village any portion or portions of Crown lands, and the lands in such town or village should be sold by auction in the manner therein provided for the sale of Crown lands by public auction, and the lands upon which such street or road should have been proclaimed should be and be deemed to be thenceforward dedicated to the public: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice proclaim as an addition to the village in the parish of Woosang described in a Proclamation bearing date the twelfth day of June 1876, the portion of Crown lands hereinafter described, viz.:—

Seventy-seven acres three roods thirty-six perches, county of Gladstone, parish of Woosang: Commencing at the south angle of the existing village; bounded thence by the east boundary thereof bearing north ninety-seven chains twenty-eight links; thence by roads bearing respectively N. 89° 56' E. seven chains seventy-eight links, and south one hundred and one chains ninety-seven links; and thence by the road from Wedderburne to East Charlton bearing N. 68° 45' W. five chains sixty-eight links, and N. 43° W. three chains sixty-five links to the point of commencement.—(W.3120.)—(77.K.1331.)

## BENGWORDEN AND GOON-NURE COMMON.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE BENGWORDEN AND GOON-NURE COMMON.

WHEREAS, by regulations made by the Governor in Council, under *The Land Act 1869*, the Council of every shire in which any common is situate are appointed managers of such common, and empowered to frame rules and regulations for its management, and submit the same to the Board of Land and Works: Now, therefore, the Council of the Shire of Bairnsdale hereby submit the following regulations for the management of the Bengworden Common:—

1. In the construction and for the purposes of these regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules; and the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.
2. Persons entitled to commonage will be permitted to depasture on payment of fees, according to the following scale:—

Four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole, or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle shall be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of land cultivated by him.

3. The fees to be paid for depasturing on the common shall be as follows:—

- a. For every horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule, per annum ... Six shillings.
- b. For every cow, heifer, ox, steer, or calf, per annum ... Four shillings.
- c. For every head of small cattle, per annum ... Three shillings.

4. No cattle shall be considered as registered unless the above fees are paid at the time of entering their brand or other distinguishing mark and description by the herdsman, and all fees must be paid half-yearly in advance, the licenses dating from the 1st day of May and the first day of November in each year.

5. No fees will be charged for the progeny of registered cattle which, in the opinion of the managers or herdsman, are under six months old. No bulls or entire horses will be allowed to depasture on the common without the special consent of the managers.

6. All large and small cattle shall have a distinguishing brand on them, and horned cattle shall be marked with the common brand.

7. The herdsman will attend at the common yard every Monday from Nine a.m. to Three p.m. to register and brand all cattle brought to him, and in the performance of this duty the owners are required to assist.

8. It will be the herdsman's duty to see all cattle under his care every alternate day; the managers will not, however, be responsible for any cattle depasturing on the common, but the herdsman is required to give immediate notice to owners when he becomes aware of their cattle having strayed from off the common; neither do the managers hold themselves responsible for any neglect or irregularity on the part of the herdsman.

9. The herdsman will be authorised to impound all cattle, sheep, pigs, and goats trespassing on the common; and the entries of all impoundings shall be kept in a book for that purpose, so that all damages and fees accruing from that source may be accounted for.

10. No person shall be allowed to remove any cattle from the common without giving at least twelve hours' notice to the herdsman, and no person will be allowed to disturb or remove any cattle unless the herdsman is present.

11. The managers reserve to themselves the right to cause to be removed from the common any cattle suspected of contagious diseases.

12. Persons desirous of registering cattle shall sign a description of such cattle, describing all brands and other distinguishing marks in the form of Schedule 24 appended to the regulations made by the Governor in Council under *The Land Act 1869*. The herdsman shall give to each person registering a receipt for all money paid on account of the depasturing of any cattle, and shall hand over all such money to the shire treasurer within three days of its receipt.

13. At the request of the person registering, the herdsman may register and brand elsewhere than at the common branding yard, in which case an additional fee of One shilling per head for one beast, and Sixpence per head for two or more will be made.

14. The general mustering of cattle shall take place in the first week in May and the first week in November in each year, the three first days in each of these weeks to be for horses, the remainder for neat and small cattle. Cattle thus mustered for registration shall, if not registered and paid for, be impounded on the third of the respective days set apart for such mustering.

15. The managers are empowered to set apart a portion of the common for the grazing of sheep.

16. Persons removing cattle will be allowed to substitute others upon payment of a registration fee of One shilling per head.

17. Every person offending against any of the foregoing rules and regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

#### SHIRE OF ST. ARNAUD.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE SWANWATER AND DARKBONEE COMMON, WITHIN THE SHIRE OF ST. ARNAUD.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations for the management of commons, and in pursuance of the provisions of Chapter XIII. of the regulations made under the said Act by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of May 1873, the Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud, as managers of the Swanwater and Darkbonee Common, submit to the Board of Land and Works for approval the following regulations for the management of the said common:—

1. All persons entitled to commonage under the provisions of the Land Act of 1862, the Amending Land Act of 1865, and

the Land Act of 1869, shall be allowed to depasture stock on the Swanwater and Darkbonee Common, situate and being within the Shire of St. Arnaud, subject to these regulations and upon payment in advance of the fees specified in the schedule hereto annexed.

2. Ratepayers and other persons entitled to commonage residing within five miles of the said common may depasture thereon four head of large cattle or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. Farmers having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by them may depasture on such common in addition one head of large cattle or three head of small cattle for every ten acres of such land so cultivated.

3. Every commoner depasturing cattle must be the *bonâ fide* owner of the cattle so depastured.

4. Bulls or entire horses over the age of nine months will not be allowed on the common without the written sanction of the managers; and sheep will be allowed to depasture on such portions only of the said common as may be set apart for that purpose by the managers.

5. The herdsman of the common shall be in attendance, at a place to be named, on the seven days immediately preceding the first day of each half-year, for the purpose of registering cattle and receiving the fees thereon; and due notice of such attendance and the time and place thereof shall be given by the managers.

6. All persons taking cattle to depasture shall deliver them into the charge of the herdsman at the time and place appointed as aforesaid, together with a written statement of the number and brands of such cattle; and the herdsman shall, on receiving the fees payable on such cattle, give a receipt for the same, on behalf of the managers; and shall forthwith, with the assistance of the owner or person in charge, brand such cattle in a conspicuous place with the common brand, which shall be of pitch or tar; and such brand shall be renewed whenever necessary, so as to be plainly legible during the whole period that such cattle are depasturing on the common. On presentation of the above-named receipt the managers shall deliver or cause to be delivered to the person named therein a license for the period specified.

7. No cattle duly registered in the books of the managers shall be removed from the common unless notice of intention to remove be first given to the herdsman, who shall obtain a receipt from the owner for the cattle so removed.

8. The managers or herdsman shall not be responsible for the loss of any cattle from the common, save as provided in the next section.

9. The herdsman shall, on any cattle straying, or being otherwise removed without the owner's consent, notify the owner thereof within ten days. And in default of giving notice within that time, should such cattle be lost, the herdsman shall be held responsible for the loss, to be computed at the rate of Two pounds sterling per head for horses, and Two pounds sterling per head for horned cattle, to be deducted from the remuneration payable to the herdsman.

10. All fees must be paid half-yearly in advance to the herdsman of the common; licenses to date from the first day of November and the first day of May in each year.

11. All stock on which the prescribed fees shall not have been paid within ten days after date for renewal of license will be impounded.

12. All dead carcasses found on the common, which the owner or owners may refuse or neglect to remove after receiving twenty-four hours' notice in writing from the managers or herdsman, the managers or herdsman shall have power to remove or cause to be removed, by burning or otherwise, at the expense of such owner or owners.

13. The herdsman shall report immediately on the indication of any contagious disease in any cattle on the common to the managers, and shall give notice to the owner of such cattle to remove the same. The managers shall at once take precautionary measures to remove such cattle from the common; but they shall not be responsible for any loss the owners of such diseased cattle may sustain.

14. The herdsman shall take the necessary steps for the effectual destruction of thistles growing on the common, the expense of such work to be defrayed out of the common fund; provided that express authority for such expenditure be first obtained from the managers.

15. The herdsman shall be responsible for the efficient carrying out of the regulations for the management of the common, and shall conform to any special instructions issued to him by the managers relative to the registration, custody, and delivery to the owners of the cattle thereon, and to the prevention of trespass thereon of animals for which no commonage fees have been paid, or which are not allowed to depasture as herein provided.

16. The herdsman shall pay all moneys received by him in respect of depasturing or trespass fees, within three days after receiving the same, to the Treasurer of the shire, who shall then pay the same into the Bank of Victoria, St. Arnaud, or such other bank as may be from time to time appointed by the managers, to the credit of the managers of the said common.

17. The remuneration to be paid to the herdsman shall be taken out of the common fund, and shall not exceed seventy-five per cent. of all fees received.

18. The herdsman shall, before entering upon his duties, provide a guarantee for the due performance thereof to the

satisfaction of the managers to the amount of Twenty pounds.

19. Whenever in these regulations any act or thing is required to be done by the managers, it shall be considered to be well and truly done if done by any two or more of them duly appointed from time to time to act in their behalf.

20. The managers shall within one month after the termination of each year publish in a newspaper circulating in the district a certified account of their receipts and expenditure for the year, in the form prescribed in Schedule XXV. to the Regulations, made by the Governor in Council on the 26th May 1873, and forward copy of such account to the Board of Land and Works.

21. Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

## C R A N B O U R N E C E M E T E R Y .

#### RULES AND REGULATIONS (Under *Cemeteries Statute* 1864).

1st. Application for permission to dig a grave, make a vault, or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees, who will grant a certificate to persons applying for the same on all fees and charges being paid to the treasurer.

2nd. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, and where a brick grave or vault is required it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees or some person appointed by them.

3rd. All vaults, graves, monuments, gravestones, and fences to be kept in proper repair and condition at the owners' expense.

4th. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave must be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.

5th. A plan of every monument must be submitted to the trustees for their approval.

6th. Wooden fencing allowed, but if not kept in proper repair may be removed by order of the trustees.

7th. A plan of the grounds and a register will be kept, which may be examined on payment of the proper charges.

8th. Orders for interment to be given to the sexton or other person appointed by the trustees, such order to be given between the hours of 10 a.m. and sunset of the following day.

9th. The usual hours of interment will be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the other months of the year. On Sundays the hours will be from 8 a.m. to 10 a.m. and from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m., and the procession will be expected to arrive punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.

10th. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced to the trustees that the relations or friends of such persons are unable to pay the costs and charges.

#### CAPE OF GOOD HOPE.—SOUTH COAST.

It is hereby notified that a Light Tower is being built about two hundred to three hundred yards within the pitch of a low point (Seal Point), situated one and three-quarter miles westward of Cape St. Francis, to be hereafter called "Cape St. Francis Lighthouse."

The tower is a cylindrical stone structure, ninety-one feet high, with keepers' quarters attached at base, and is situated in latitude 34° 22' 30" south, and longitude 24° 50' 20" east of Greenwich.

It is intended to display a second order Holophotal Revolving White Light, flashing at intervals of twenty seconds, with focal plane one hundred and one and a half feet above the base of the tower, and one hundred and eighteen feet above the level of high water.

The light will be visible in clear weather about sixteen and three-quarters sea miles from the deck of a vessel fifteen feet above the sea. It will command the coast uninterruptedly to the westward, but will be cut off to the eastward by Cape St. Francis on the line N. 56° E. true, or would not be visible from the eastward on a bearing more southerly than S. 55° W. true.

The nearest existing lights are—Cape Recife, about forty-five miles to the eastward; and Mossel Bay (Cape St. Blaize), about one hundred and thirty-three miles to the westward.

The tower will probably be ready for the reception of the Lenticular about January 1878, and the light may probably be exhibited some time between 1st March and 30th April 1878, of which due and precise notice will be given.

UNDER and by virtue of the powers conferred upon us by the "Navigation Act of 1871," and by the "Navigation Act Amendment Act of 1873," we, the Marine Board of New South Wales, hereby make the following Regulations for the Harbor of Newcastle,—That is to say,—We hereby order and direct that—

No ship or other description of vessel will be allowed to occupy a berth at any wharf, staith, or jetty, whilst she is undergoing repairs that would impede loading or unloading, or necessitate her remaining alongside the said berth after her loading or unloading is completed.

No boat shall be allowed to remain at any landing-place after having discharged her cargo or passengers, nor lie off in such a manner as to obstruct the passage to or from such landing-place.

No lighter or other description of vessel will be permitted to remain at anchor in any part of the Harbor of Newcastle, at a less distance than 100 fathoms from any wharf, staith, or jetty.

No vessel, of whatsoever description, will be permitted to make fast or moor to any of the Government moorings without the permission of the Harbor-master.

All vessels employed lightering in the Harbor of Newcastle shall only be allowed to remain at anchor in such places as may be permitted by the Harbor-master, and no lighter or other description of vessel shall remain alongside any ship, wharf, or jetty, or be temporary at anchor at any place other than that authorized as aforesaid without having at least one person on board.

For the violation or infringement of any of these Regulations, or for the neglect of any duty or obligation imposed thereby, a penalty not exceeding £10 will be incurred.
