APPOINTMENTS TO NAVAL CADETSHIPS.

WITH reference to previous notices in the *Victoria Government Gazette* respecting the nomination to the Naval Cadetships annually placed by the Imperial Government at the disposal of the Governors of the principal colonies for the sons of colonists, His Excellency the Governor of Victoria directs it to be notified that he will nominate the candidate, who, being otherwise eligible, in all respects, according to the Admiralty Regulations, shall pass the best competitive examination.

The subjects for examination will be those prescribed in the Regulations aforesaid.—See the *Victoria Government Gazette* of 11th June 1875, No. 42.

It is requested that the parents or guardians of candidates will send their applications to the Private Secretary, Government House, Melbourne, on or before the 24th day of December 1877. The certificates of birth, good conduct, and good health required by the Regulations must accompany each application.

EXAMINATIONS FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

THE subjoined Regulations are published for general information.

SIR,—I transmit to you, at the request of the Civil Service Commissioners, the enclosed Regulations for an examination of Candidates for the Civil Service of India, which is to be held in June and July 1878.

REGULATIONS FOR THE OPEN COMPETITION OF JULY 1878.

N.B.—The Regulations are liable to be altered in future years.

1. On June 25th, 1878, and following days, an examination of candidates will be held in London. At this examination not fewer than.....candidates will be selected, if so many shall be found duly qualified. Of these.....will be selected for Presidency of Bengal [.....for the Upper Provinces, andfor the Lower Provinces];for that of Madras, andfor that of Bombay.—Notice will hereafter be given of the days and place of examination.

2. Any person desirous of competing at this examination must produce to the Civil Service Commissioners, before the 1st May 1878, evidence showing:—

(a) That he is a natural-born subject of Her Majesty.

(b) That his age on the 1st January 1878, will be above seventeen years and under nineteen years. [N.B.—In the case of Natives of India this must be certified by the Government of India, or of the Presidency or Province in which the Candidate may have resided.]

(c) That he has no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity unfitting him, or likely to unfit him, for the Civil Service of India.¹

(d) That he is of good moral character.²

He must also pay such fee as the Secretary of State for India may prescribe.³

3. Should the evidence upon the above points be *prima facie* satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners, the candidate will, upon payment of the prescribed fee, be admitted to the Examination. The Commissioners may, however, in their discretion, at any time prior to the grant of the certificate of qualification hereinafter referred to, institute such further inquiries as they may deem necessary; and if the result of such inquiries, in the case of any candidate, should be unsatisfactory to them in any of the above respects, he will be ineligible for admission to the Civil Service of India, and if already selected, will be removed from the position of a probationer.

4. The examination will take place only in the following branches of knowledge:—

¹ The number of appointments to be made, and the number in each Presidency, &c., will be announced hereafter. It will probably be about half the usual number.

² Evidence of health and character must bear date not earlier than the 1st April 1878.

³ The fee for this examination will be £5, payable by means of a special stamp according to instructions which will be communicated to candidates.

⁴ Marks assigned in English Composition and Mathematics will be subject to no deduction.

⁵ A considerable portion of the marks for English History and Literature will be allotted to the work specially prepared. In awarding marks for this, regard will be had partly to the extent and importance of the periods or books selected, and partly to the thoroughness with which they have been studied.

⁶ The examination will range from Arithmetic, Algebra, and Elementary Geometry, up to the elements of the differential and integral calculus, including the lower portions of applied Mathematics.

⁷ The standard of marking in Sanskrit and Arabic will be determined with reference to a high degree of proficiency, such as may be expected to be reached by a Native of good education.

Candidates are at liberty to name, before 1st May 1878, any or all of these branches of knowledge. No subjects are obligatory.

5. The merit of the persons examined will be estimated by marks; and the number set opposite to each branch in the preceding regulation denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it.

6. The marks assigned to candidates in each branch will be subject to such deduction as the Civil Service Commissioners may deem necessary, in order to secure that "a candidate be allowed no credit at all for taking up a subject in which he is a mere smatterer."

7. The examination will be conducted by means of printed questions and written answers, and by *visà voce* examination, as may be deemed necessary.

8. The marks obtained by each candidate in respect of each of the subjects in which he shall have been examined, will be added up, and the names of the.....candidates who shall have obtained a greater aggregate number of marks than any of the remaining candidates, will be set forth in order of merit, and such candidates shall be deemed to be selected candidates for the Civil Service of India, provided they appear to be in other respects duly qualified. Should any of the selected candidates become disqualified, the Secretary of State for India will determine whether the vacancy thus created shall be filled up or not. In the former case, the candidate next in order of merit, and in other respects duly qualified, shall be deemed to be a selected candidate. A selected candidate declining to accept the appointment which may be offered to him will be disqualified for any subsequent competition.

9. Selected candidates, before proceeding to India, will be on probation for two years, during which time they will be examined periodically, with a view of testing their progress in the following subjects:—⁸

In these examinations, as in the open competition, the merit of the candidates examined will be estimated by marks, and the number set opposite to each subject denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it at any one examination. The examination will be conducted by means of printed questions and written answers, and by *visà voce* examination, as may be deemed necessary. The last of these examinations will be held at the close of the second year of probation, and will be called the "Final Examination," at which it will be decided whether a selected candidate is qualified for the Civil Service of India. At this examination candidates will be permitted to take up any one of the following branches of Natural Science, viz.:—Botany, Geology, and Zoology, for which 350 marks will be allowed.

10. Any candidate who, at any of the periodical examinations, shall appear to have wilfully neglected his studies, or to be physically incapacitated for pursuing the prescribed course of training, will be liable to have his name removed from the list of selected candidates.

11. The selected candidates who, at the final examination, shall be found to have a competent knowledge of the subjects specified in Regulation 9, and who shall have satisfied the Civil Service Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of age, health, and character, shall be certified by the said Commissioners to be entitled to be appointed to the Civil Service of India, provided they shall comply with the regulations in force at the time for that service.

12. Applications from persons desirous to be admitted as candidates are to be addressed to the Secretary to the Civil Service Commissioners, London, S. W., from whom the proper form for the purpose may be obtained.

The Civil Service Commissioners are authorized by the Secretary of State for India in Council to make the following announcements:—

1. Selected candidates will be permitted to choose,⁹ according to the order in which they stand in the list resulting from the open competition as long as a choice remains, the Presidency (and in Bengal the Division of the Presidency) to which they shall be appointed, but this choice will be subject to a different arrangement, should the Secretary of State, or Government of India, deem it necessary.

2. The probationers, having passed the necessary examinations, will be required to report themselves to their Government in India not later than the close of December 1881.

3. The seniority in the Civil Service of India of the selected candidates shall be determined according to the order in which they stand on the list resulting from the final examination.

4. An allowance of £150 a year will be given during each of the two years of their probation to all candidates who pass their probation at some university to be approved beforehand

⁸ Full instructions as to the course of study to be pursued will be issued to the successful candidates as soon as possible after the result of the open competition is declared.

⁹ This choice must be exercised immediately after the result of the open competition is announced, on such day as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

by the Secretary of State, provided such candidates shall have passed the required examinations to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners, and shall have complied with such rules as may be laid down for the guidance of selected candidates.

5. All selected candidates will be required, after having passed the second periodical examination, to attend at the India Office for the purpose of entering into an agreement binding themselves, amongst other things, to refund in certain cases the amount of their allowance in the event of their failing to proceed to India. A surety will be required.

6. After passing the final examination, each candidate will be required to attend again at the India Office, with the view of entering into covenants. The stamps payable on these documents amount to £1.

7. Candidates rejected at the final examination of 1880 will in no case be allowed to present themselves for re-examination.

GEELONG EASTERN CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. That all fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.

2. That the trustees may permit any poor person to be buried in the cemetery without fee or charge, as provided for by law or on the certificate of a minister of religion, or a statutory declaration proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, and that the relatives and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the usual fee or charge. A plain hearse only shall be allowed at such funerals.

3. That any person desiring ground for a private grave or vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, tombstone, or for any other purpose in the cemetery under *The Cemeteries Statute 1864*, shall apply to the trustees therefor. If approved, the trustees, on payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying the certificate of right of burial in the form specified in Schedule A.

4. That any person desiring to construct a brick grave, or vault, or tomb, or to erect a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection in any part of the cemetery, shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a plan, design, or drawing of such, with full particulars, for approval.

5. That any order for interment shall be given at the cemetery six working hours prior to the time fixed for burial, otherwise an extra charge will be made. No free interment shall be allowed without said notice.

6. That the name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of the deceased, and other particulars mentioned in Schedule B, shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.

7. That the trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same under direction of the surveyor, or such other person as may be appointed by the trustees, on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

8. That every coffin shall have on the lid a metal plate with the name of the deceased stamped thereon.

9. That every grave shall be at least five feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than three feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground.

10. That no interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault, except on the production of the certificate of right of burial, or satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so.

11. That no other interment shall be allowed in any private grave unless the written consent of the owner shall be given in with the order.

12. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in said cemetery without a certificate from the deputy-registrar of deaths, or coroner. Such certificate shall be delivered to the secretary or to the gatekeeper before the funeral enters the cemetery.

13. That the hour fixed for burials shall be as follows:—On Week days—from September to April inclusive, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; from May to August inclusive, from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. On Sundays—throughout the year, from 2 to 5 p.m.

14. That no burial shall be allowed to take place between the hours of 7 p.m. and 7 a.m. except by special permission of the trustees.

15. That the time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.

16. That no vehicle except the hearse and mourning coaches shall be permitted to enter the gates.

17. That every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection, shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by or at the expense of the owner.

18. That any person desiring to place any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery, shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a copy thereof.

19. That any person putting up any erection or placing any inscription or epitaph on any part of the cemetery without the permission of the trustees shall be liable to the penalties imposed by the above Act for so doing, and be further dealt with as a trespasser.

20. That every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations (extending to the bottom of the grave when ordered). All stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed at once.

21. That all materials required for the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the principal entrance, and no vehicle conveying any such materials shall be permitted to enter the cemetery without the consent of the trustees first obtained.

22. That no catacombs shall be allowed.

23. That no wooden erection shall be allowed.

24. That the trustees shall not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave, for re-interment either in said or any other cemetery.

25. That before any such exceptional case can be dealt with by the trustees, another application setting forth the reasons for the proposed removal, and verified by a statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased, and in the event of said application being granted, the permission of the Government in addition to that of the trustees shall be obtained. If found necessary the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and air-tight coffin prior to removal.

26. That any workman not employed by the trustees shall be under the supervision and control of the surveyor or person authorised by the trustees, who shall have power to regulate his hours of labor, to see that his work is completed satisfactorily and with despatch, and to remove him summarily from the cemetery upon any cause of offence.

27. That, unless otherwise ordered on special occasions, the principal entrance shall be open daily from sunrise to sunset.

28. That no child under 10 years of age shall be admitted into the cemetery, except in charge of a responsible person.

29. That no smoking shall be allowed within the cemetery, nor any firearms discharged therein.

30. That no dogs shall be admitted into the cemetery.

31. That any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, or otherwise infringing the above Act, or any rule, regulation, or bye-law made for protection of the cemetery, shall be prosecuted as the law directs.

32. That no person shall be allowed to pluck any flower or to take any flower or plant from or out of the cemetery.

33. That the surveyor, or person authorised by the trustees, shall exercise a general supervision and control, under the trustees, over all matters pertaining to the cemetery.

34. That no person employed under the trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment from the trustees.

35. That any person so employed accepting any such gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to be summarily dismissed.

36. That a plan of the cemetery, showing the distribution of the land, compartments, situations, and numbers of graves, and a registry of all certificates of right of burial shall be kept at the office, and may be inspected.

1st. That the said piece of ground shall be kept and used by the said _____ representatives solely as a burying place, and that no other use shall be made thereof.

2nd. That no enclosing wall, fence, building, monument, or tombstone shall be erected or placed on said piece of ground until a plan thereof shall have been exhibited to the said trustees and their authority given for the erection thereof.

3rd. That the said grave or vault and the said wall, fence, building, monument, or tombstone shall be maintained and kept up by or at the expense of the said _____ and representatives in proper repair to the satisfaction of the said trustees.

4th.
