MARONG DIVISION.—Commencing at the south-west angle of

CASTLEMAINE AND SANDHURST DISTRICT WATER SUPPLY.

THE Governor in Council in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by The Water Works Act 1865, has made the following regulation respecting the Castlemaine and Sandhurst District Water Supply, viz.—

The rate to be charged for water to be supplied from that portion of the main aqueduct situated between Malmsbury and the tunnel at a distance of twenty-six miles from Malmsbury, known as tunnel No. 3, and from any of the branch aqueducts which diverge from such portion of the main aqueduct, shall be one penny (1d.) per thousand gallons, payable in advance for quantities of water not less than one cuillion gallons per month.

The rate to be charged for water to be supplied in like quantities from any other portion of the main aqueduct or from any other of the branch aqueducts shall be one penny half-penny (14d.) per thousand gallons.


