ELECTORAL DIVISIONS OF MANDURANG DISTRICT ALTERED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-seventh day of December 1877.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor in Council.

WHEREAS by *The Electoral Act Amendment Act 1876* (No. 548), it was amongst other things enacted that the boundaries and divisions and the names of the electoral districts should be those set forth in the Second Schedule thereto, and should be substituted in lieu of the boundaries and divisions repealed by the said Act, but the Governor in Council might, by an Order to be published in the *Government Gazette* before the first day of January One thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, alter, vary, extend, subdivide, or abolish any of such divisions: And whereas it is expedient that the boundary-line between the Laanecoorie and Marong divisions of the Electoral District of Mandurang should be altered: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order alter the boundaries of the said Laanecoorie and Marong divisions of the Electoral District of Mandurang, and doth hereby redefine the area of the said divisions, the boundaries whereof shall be as follow, that is to say:—

LAANECOORIE DIVISION.—Commencing at a point on the south boundary of the electoral district where it is intersected by the Melbourne and Sandhurst Railway; thence by the southern and western boundaries of the electoral district to the north-west angle of allotment 3 of section 7, parish of Woodstock; thence by the road from Newbridge to Kangaroo Flat to a point bearing south from the south-west angle of the electoral district of Sandhurst; thence by a direct line to that angle; thence by the southern boundary of the said electoral district of Sandhurst to the aforesaid railway; and thence by that railway to the commencing point.

MARONG DIVISION.—Commencing at the south-west angle of the parish of Tandarra; thence by the east and south boundaries of the parish of Yallock to the north-east angle of the parish of Yarraberb; thence by the east and south boundaries of that parish to the north-east angle of the parish of Leichardt; thence by the east and south boundaries of that parish to the north-east angle of the parish of Woodstock; thence by the east boundary of that parish to the south-east angle of allotment 1 of section 30; thence by the road from Newbridge to Kangaroo Flat to a point bearing magnetic south from the south-west angle of the electoral district of Sandhurst; thence by a direct line to that angle; thence by the western boundary of the said electoral district, the south-western, northern, and north-eastern boundaries of the electoral division of Eaglehawk, and the north-western and north-eastern boundaries of the said electoral district to Bendigo Creek; thence by that creek to the south boundary of allotment 12, section 20, parish of Huntly; thence to the south-west angle of that allotment; thence magnetic north to the south-east angle of allotment 125, parish of Kamarooka; and thence by the south boundary of the said parish and of the parish of Tandarra to the commencing point.

CASTLEMAINE AND SANDHURST DISTRICT WATER SUPPLY.

THE Governor in Council in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by *The Water Works Act 1865*, has made the following regulation respecting the Castlemaine and Sandhurst District Water Supply, viz.:—

The rate to be charged for water to be supplied from that portion of the main aqueduct situated between Malmesbury and the tunnel at a distance of twenty-six miles from Malmesbury, known as tunnel No. 3, and from any of the branch aqueducts which diverge from such portion of the main aqueduct, shall be one penny (1d.) per thousand gallons, payable in advance for quantities of water not less than one million gallons per month.

The rate to be charged for water to be supplied in like quantities from any other portion of the main aqueduct or from any other of the branch aqueducts shall be one penny half-penny (1½d.) per thousand gallons.

THE Governor in Council has revoked the Orders in Council herein mentioned, that is to say:—

Order in Council of the 7th September 1875, fixing the price of water to be supplied from the Malmesbury reservoir, for sluicing purposes, at one penny (1d.) per thousand gallons, during those periods when water is running to waste from such reservoir.

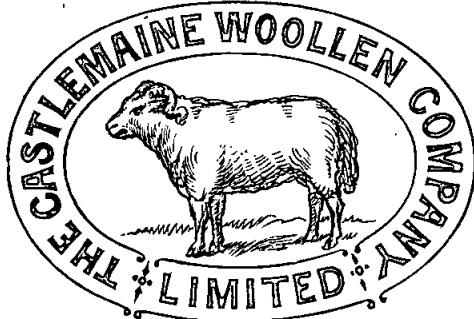
