**WHEREAS** by an Act passed in the thirty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign, called *The Public Health amendment Act 1876*, it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend the provisions of the twentieth section of the said Act to any part of Victoria, and from and after three months from the coming into operation of the said section in any part of Victoria if the owner of land whereon there should be a cesspool for the reception of nightsoil, which cesspool in the opinion of the local board should be in such a condition or position as to be calculated to generate disease or be a public nuisance, should be required by notice from the local board to fill up the same within a time to be expressed in such notice not being more than one month from the date thereof, such owner should be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day from the expiration of the time mentioned in such notice that such cesspool should not be filled up as thereby required: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation extend the provisions of the twentieth section of the above-recited Act to the Borough of Brown's and Scarsdale.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twelfth day of February in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and in the fortieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

The births of 740 children, viz., 379 boys and 361 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of January. In the month of December 549 births were registered, or 191 less than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in January numbered 491, viz., 293 of males and 198 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 249. The deaths, although they exceeded those in December by 68, numbered 21 less than the average of January during the previous ten years. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been as many as 115 below the average of the same ten years.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 100.7° on the 10th, and the lowest was 42.3° on the 28th, which is the minimum on record for the month of January. The mean temperature of the month (63.5°) was the lowest recorded since 1865, and was 3° below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (54.5°) took place on the 10th, viz., from a maximum of 100.7° to a minimum of 64.2°. The least range (10.8°) was on the 25th, viz., from a maximum of 68.8° to a minimum of 58.0°. The mean daily range was 21.7°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.835 inches) was above the average.

Deaths of males during the month were in the proportion of 60 per cent., those of females in the proportion of 40 per cent. to the total mortality. Deaths of children who had not attained the age of 5 years, averaged 49 per cent., as against 52 per cent. in January 1876; 66 per cent. in January 1875; 57.5 per cent. in January 1874; 49 per cent. in January 1873; 56 per cent. in January 1872; 57 per cent. in January 1871; 58 per cent. in January 1870 and 1869; 62 per cent. in January 1868; and 75 per cent. in January 1866.

Thirteen deaths were registered during the month, of persons of the age of 75 years or upwards, viz.:—Those of a widow, aged 84, who died of erysipelas; two gardeners, each aged 78 and 79 respectively, who died of senile gangrene; a laborer, aged 77, of apoplexy; a female, aged 76, and a gentleman, aged 79, of paralysis; a tailor, aged 79, of broncho pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 77, of gastritis; a housewife, aged 75, of obstruction of the bowels; and a male, occupation unknown, aged 75, a builder, aged 77, a female aged 78, and a farmer aged 75, of old age.

Twenty-four of the deaths recorded during the month were from external causes, of which 19 are set down as accidental, 3 as homicidal, and 2 as suicidal. The following are the particulars:—An apprentice on board ship, aged 17, was killed by a fall from the mast-head; a laborer, aged 29, died of fracture of the spine, caused by an accident with steam machinery; a laborer, aged 51, died of the result of the kick of a horse; a domestic servant, aged 59, was driven over by a waggnette; a laborer, aged 66, died of fracture of the thigh, the result of having been rushed by a cow; a laborer, aged 21, died of an accidental gun-shot wound in the arm—the trigger having caught in some grass; a woolsorter, aged 27, accidentally shot himself by the careless use of a fowling-piece; a female child, aged 2 years, died of a scald in the mouth; a boy, aged 9, died of insolatio; a male infant, aged 9 months, was accidentally poisoned with ammonia—it having been administered in mistake for medicine; a hawker, aged 34, was found drowned in the River Yarra; two youths, aged 15 and 16 respectively, a shoemaker, aged 12, a warehouseman, aged 42, and two boys, aged 54 and 6 respectively, were accidentally drowned—the two first in Port Phillip Bay, and the two next in the River Yarra; a male infant, aged 24 hours, was accidentally suffocated in bed, and another, aged 17 days, died of umbilical hemorrhage. Of the homicidal deaths a newly-born male infant was wilfully murdered; a pensioner, aged 57, died of the violence of a man, who was found guilty of manslaughter; and a female, aged 53, was killed by a blow

from a piece of wood thrown at her son by her husband, who was likewise convicted of manslaughter. Of the suicides—a schoolboy, aged 15, poisoned himself with strychnine; and a female, aged 29, whilst in a state of unsound mind, drowned herself in the River Yarra.

One hundred and one deaths, or 21 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—51 in the Melbourne Hospital, 6 in the Immigrants' Home, 6 in the Children's Hospital, 15 in the Alfred Hospital, 10 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 7 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, and 1 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 242, of which 140, or 58 per cent., were of males; and 102, or 42 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 225 were under one year of age, 52 were between one and two, 8 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 3 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 249. Of these, 96, or 39 per cent., were males, and 153, or 61 per cent., were females; 12 were between five and ten, 5 were between ten and fifteen, 15 were between fifteen and twenty, 15 were between twenty and twenty-five, 19 were between twenty-five and thirty, 24 were between thirty and thirty-five, 20 were between thirty-five and forty, 23 were between forty and forty-five, 24 were between forty-five and fifty, 28 were between fifty and fifty-five, 14 were between fifty-five and sixty, 14 were between sixty and sixty-five, 13 were between sixty-five and seventy, 10 were between seventy and seventy-five, 11 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 2 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from scarlatina, which had been gradually decreasing for months past, numbered 7 in the month under review as against 4 in December. The total number of deaths from this complaint in Melbourne and suburbs from the time of its first outbreak in August 1875 to the end of the month under review amounts to 1288. Deaths from diarrhoea have largely increased during the past three months, viz., from 22 in November to 61 in December, and 89 in January; those from diseases of the digestive organs likewise increased from 35 in December to 51. Phthisis caused 41 deaths as against 25 in December and 43 in November.

His age at time of application must not exceed 22 years, nor be less than 16 years.

All pupils must serve three months on probation during which period only half salary will be paid. After probationary period, should the report of the Board of Examiners be unfavorable, the services of the pupil draftsmen will be dispensed with without further remuneration.

He will also be required to make a traverse and topographical survey of a portion of land to be shown him; to establish the true meridian by transit observation from which meridian the bearings of his survey will be reckoned; to level over a line to be pointed out to him, and to make a subdivision also as pointed out. Then to produce plan showing construction lines, subdivision section line topographical features, with areas and dimensions of subdivision, accompanied by regulation field-book of survey, and the various computations.

To obtain a certificate as qualified draftsman the applicant would have to pass the period of service as before specified; then six months in the field, the latter period at a salary of £52 per annum, and afterwards pass an examination in trigonometric computation by logarithms including areas and reduction of traverses, plotting from field-books, and their construction including feature delineation.

# REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE CRICKET AND PUBLIC RECREATION RESERVE IN THE VILLAGE OF BAYUP.

WHEREAS by the 108th section of *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the Regulations following to be observed and enforced in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order of 18th September 1876 as a site for Cricket and Public Recreation in the village of Bayup:—

## REGULATIONS.

- No. 1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, except when required for special purposes.
  - No. 2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards his dress, language, or conduct.
  - No. 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
  - No. 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
  - No. 5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of three of the committee.
  - No. 6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of three of the committee being first obtained.
  - No. 7. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots which may be enclosed within the reserve for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.—(Corr. 77.C.7894.) # REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR RECREATION AND OTHER PUBLIC PURPOSES AT MAFFRA.

WHEREAS by the 108th section of *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the regulations following to be observed and enforced in respect of the land temporarily reserved, by Order of 8th May 1876, as a site for recreation and other public purposes in the parish of Maffra, at Maffra.

## REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards his dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein unless led by chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee.

6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the committee being first obtained.

7. No person, except laborers and workmen, employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots which may be enclosed within the reserve for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).—(Corr. 77/R.791.) (Chf.Cik.)

# MOOROPNA PUBLIC CEMETERY.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE MOOROPNA GENERAL CEMETERY.

All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is open.

2nd. Any person making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon the payment of the proper charges, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the separate use of such person or persons, or his or their representatives.

3rd. Application of such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the party applying for such permission, on payment of the proper charges.

4th. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on a certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence, proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

5th. Orders for interment to be given either to the keeper or at the office of the trustees, such notice to be given between the hours of Ten a.m. and Three p.m. on the previous day.

6. The name, age, late place of residence, and date of death of deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.

7th. Unless otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. in the month of September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months, except Sundays, when the only hours for funerals will be from Eleven a.m. to Four p.m. throughout the year.

8th. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and in proper condition at the expense of the owners.

9th. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

10th. The position of all graves to be determined by the trustees.

11th. All graves must be sunk to a depth of not less than 6 feet.

12th. A drawing of every stone, font, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription, to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are to determine and fix the position of any unobjectional monument according to description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan of ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner.

13th. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office of the trustees, and may be inspected, and a register of grants is kept by the secretary.

14th. The keeper has orders to turn out or to take into custody (as the case may require) any person who shall behave indecorously or commit any trespass or injury to the trees, flowers, or other erections, or otherwise infringe the Act of Council relating to the cemetery, or the regulations for the protection of the same, and such person will be proceeded against according to law.

15th. The trustees reserve the right to make any alteration from time to time in these charges and regulations.
