WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign, called The Public Health amendment Act 1876, it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time by proclamation in the Governoment Gazette extend the provisions of the twentieth section of the said Act to any part of Victoria, and from and after three months from the coming into, operation of the said section in any part of Victoria if the owner of land whereon there should be a cesspool for the reception of nightsoil, which cesspool in the opinion of the local board should be in such a condition or position as to be calculated to generate disease or be a public nuisance, should be required by notice from the local board to fill up the same within a time to be expressed in such notice not being more than one month from the date thereof, such owner should be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day from the expiration of the time mentioned in such notice that such cesspool should not be filled up as thereby required: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation extend the provisions of the twentieth section of the above-recited Act to the Borough of Brown's and Scarsdale.

The births of 740 children, viz., 379 boys and 361 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of January. In the month of December 549 births were registered, or 191 less than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in January numbered 491, viz., 293 of males and 198 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 249. The deaths, although they exceeded those in December by 68, numbered 21 less than the average of January during the previous ten years. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been as many as 115 below the average of the same ten years.

The highest temperature in the chald recorded at the Melbourne and suburbs during the month of January during the previous ten years.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 100.7° on the 10th, and the lowest was 42.3° on the 28th, which is the minimum on record for the month of January. The mean temperature of the month (63.5°) was the lowest recorded since 1865, and was 3° below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (54.5°) took place on the 10th, viz., from a maximum of 100.7° to a minimum of 64.2°. The least range (10.8°) was on the 28rd, viz., from a maximum of 68.0°. The mean daily range was 21.7°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.835 inches) was above the average.

Deaths of males during the month were in the proportion of 60 per cent., those of females in the proportion of 40 per cent, to the total mortality. Deaths of children who had not attained the age of 5 years, averaged 49 per cent, as against 52 per cent. in January 1876; 56 per cent. in January 1876; 575 per cent. in January 1874; 49 per cent. in January 1878; 56 per cent. in January 1872; 57 per cent. in January 1873; 58 per cent. in January 1872; 57 per cent. in January 1873; 58 per cent. in January 1873; 58 per cent. in January 1874; 62 per cent. in January 1868; and 75 per cent. in January 1866.

Thirteen deaths were registered during the month, of persons of the age of 75 years or upwards, viz.:—Those of a widow, aged 24, who died of crysipelas; two gardeners, each aged 78 and 79 respectively, who died of senile gangrone; a laborer, aged 77, of apoplexy; a female, aged 76, and a gentleman, aged 79, of paralysis; a tailor, aged 79, of broncho pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 77, of gastritis; a housewife, aged 75, of obstruction of the bowels; and a male, occupation unknown, aged 75, a builder, aged 77, a female aged 78, and a farmer aged 75, of old age.

Twenty-four of the deaths recorded during the month were from external causes; of which 19 are set down as accidental, 3 as homicidal, and 2 as suicidal. One hundred and one deaths, or 21 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:-51 in the Melbourne Hospital, 6 in the Immigrants' Home, 6 in the Children's Hospital, 15 in the Alfred Hospital, 10 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 7 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, and 1 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 242, of which 140, or 58 per cent., were of males; and 102, or 42 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 223 were under one year of age, 52 were between one and two, 8 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 3 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 249. Of these, 96, or 39 per cent, were males, and 153, or 61 per cent, were females; 12 were between five and ten, 5 were between ten and fifteen, 15 were between fifteen and twenty, 15 were between twenty and twenty-five, 19 were between twenty-five and firty, 24 were between thirty and thirty-five, 20 were between thirty-five and forty, 28 were between forty-five, 24 were between forty-five, 24 were between fifty, 28 were between fifty and fifty-five and sixty, 14 were between sixty-five and seventy, 10 were between seventy, 10 were between seventy and seventy-five, 11 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 2 were upwards of eighty. upwards of eighty.

Deaths from scarlatina, which had been gradually decreasing for months past, numbered 7 in the month under review as against 4 in December. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on a certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence, proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and

charges.

5th. Orders for interment to be given either to the keeper or at the office of the trustees, such notice to be given between the hours of Ten a.m. and Three p.m. on the previous

tween the hours of Ten a.m. and Three p.m. on the previous day.

6. The name, age, late place of residence, and date of death of deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order. 7th. Unless otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. in the month of September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months, except Sundays, when the only hours for funerals will be from Eleven a.m. to Four p.m. throughout the year.

8th. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and in proper condition at the expense of the owners.

9th. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.
10th. The position of all graves to be determined by the

trustees.

11th. All graves must be sunk to a depth of not less than

6 feet.

12th. A drawing of every stone, font, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be crected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription, to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are to determine and fix the position of any unobjectional monument according to description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan of ronamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner.

13th. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office of the trustees, and may be inspected, and a register of grants is kept by the secretary.

and may be inspected, and a register of grants is kept by the secretary.

14th. The keeper has orders to turn out or to take into custody (as the case may require) any person who shall behave indecorously or commit any trespass or injury to the trees, flowers, or other erections, or otherwise infringe the Act of Council relating to the cemetery, or the regulations for the protection of the same, and such person will be proceeded against according to law.

15th. The trustees reserve the right to make any alteration from time to time in these charges and regulations.
