FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Constitution Act* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he might think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he should deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," now stand prorogued until Tuesday the sixth day of March next, and it is expedient to prorogue the same further: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria from Tuesday the sixth day of March next until Tuesday the third day of April in the present year.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-sixth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and in the fortieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

REGULATIONS FOR THE BRAYBROOK CRICKET
AND RECREATION RESERVE.

WE, James Dickson, Thomas Burge Derham, William Pullar, and Algernon Warren White, the duly appointed committee of management of the land temporarily reserved in the government township of Braybrook as a site for cricket and other purposes of public recreation, having made the following regulations for the care, protection, and management of said reserve, and for the preservation of good order therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such board by virtue of the powers conferred by the 108th section of *The Land Act 1869* :—

REGULATIONS.

The reserve is parcelled out into the following divisions :—

1. The grand stand, pavilion, members' and ladies' reserves.
2. The playing ground.
3. The remainder of the reserve.

The days for practice of cricket or other sports to be arranged or altered from time to time as the committee may deem advisable.

All persons shall be admitted to the third division free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on days whereon any cricket or other matches shall be played, and also on days on which sports shall be held in the said reserve.

No person shall enter at any time into any part of the first division, except on production of a ticket, issued by the committee of management, duly authorizing such person in that behalf.

All persons paying for admission to the third division, or any part thereof, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which they shall, upon demand, produce, and, if required, surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management, to demand the production or surrender of the same.

Persons renting or hiring for any cricket match or other event the grand stand or any portion thereof, or any booth in the reserve, shall abide by any order given by the committee of management in reference to the reserve, or the buildings or other erections for the time being thereon.

No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards his dress, language, or conduct.

No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or damage the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones into the reserve.

No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee of management.

No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent in writing of the committee of management first obtained.

No person except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve shall enter any plots which may be enclosed within the reserve for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Any person committing in the reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences, shall be removed from the reserve notwithstanding such person may have purchased, and shall or may be in possession of, a ticket of admission to the reserve or any part thereof :—

1. Assaulting any other person.
2. Being drunk.
3. Crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground during a cricket match or sports, or during practice at cricket, or when crossing or trespassing upon the ground would be injurious to it as a cricket ground.
4. Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
5. Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
6. Behaving improperly or riotously.
7. Being found in any part of the first, second, or third divisions, and not producing upon demand, or (if required) not surrendering to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management to demand production of the same, a ticket duly authorizing admission to that part where such person shall be so found.
8. Obtaining admission to any part of the first, second, or third divisions when disentitled to such admission under these regulations.

The following is the scale of charges or fees which shall be charged and taken for admission to the third division and to the grand stand :—

For admission of each person to the third division during any cricket match such a sum as the committee of management may determine not exceeding	s. d. 5 0
For admission of each person to the third division during any cup or other important match or sports such a sum as the committee of management may determine not exceeding 2 6
For admission of each person to the grand stand such a sum as the committee of management may determine not exceeding 7 6

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction

before any justice forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and may be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

INCORPORATION OF THE MOOROOPNA HOSPITAL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-sixth day of February 1877.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor

Sir J. McCulloch | Mr. Gillies
Mr. Kerferd | Mr. McLellan.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled *An Act for Hospitals and Charitable Institutions*, it was amongst other things enacted, that any institution established for the cure of disease, or for the relief of diseased, aged, incurable, or destitute persons, and supported in whole or in part by the voluntary contributions of not less than fifty persons, each of whom should have paid not less than One pound per annum or Twenty pounds in one donation, might be incorporated as thereafter mentioned, and all persons who should have paid as aforesaid should be deemed contributors within the meaning of the said Act; and it was also enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than twenty-five of the said persons praying that such institution might be incorporated to cause the substance or prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter-petition, signed by an equal or greater number of such persons, should have been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication) the Governor in Council might declare the contributors for the time being to such institution to be, and they should thereupon become and continue, a body politic and corporate by the style and title named in the Order in Council, and should have perpetual succession and a common seal: And whereas the Governor has received a petition, signed by not less than twenty-five contributors to the institution known as the Mooroopna Hospital at Mooroopna, praying that the said institution may be incorporated: And whereas the substance or prayer of the said petition has been published in the *Government Gazette*, and no counter-petition has been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth by this present Order declare the contributors for the time being to the institution called and known as the Mooroopna Hospital situated at Mooroopna, to be a body politic and corporate by the style and title of "The Mooroopna Hospital."

And the Honorable John Alexander MacPherson, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

and value, also the number of the order for the goods, otherwise the goods will not be received. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of.

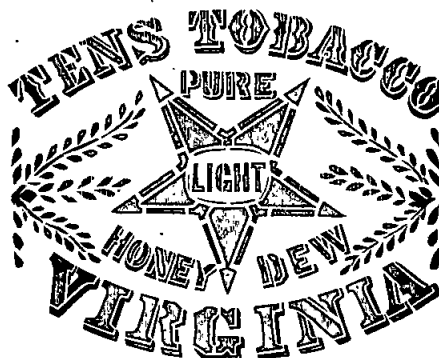
