FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Constitution Act it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor to fix W such places within Victoria and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he might think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he should deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," now stand prorogued until Tuesday the sixth day of March next, and it is expedient to prorogue the same further: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria from Tuesday the sixth day of March next until Tuesday the third day of April in the present year.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-sixth day of February, in the ear of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and in the fortieth year of Her Majesty's reigu.

Persons renting or hiring for any cricket match or other event the grand stand or any portion thereof, or any booth in the reserve, shall abide by any order given by the committee of management in reference to the reserve, or the buildings or other erectious for the time being thereon.

No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards his dress, language, or conduct.

No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut rames on, or damage the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones into the reserve.

No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee of management.

The castings are to be clean, sharp, free from surface scale, shell, cold shuts, blow holes, honeycomb, cinder, or any other imperfections, and are to be sound in every respect and thoroughly close in grain. 
