MANNER OF ELECTING COMMISSIONERS BY OWNERS OF SHIPS AND MERCHANTS AND TRADERS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the 18th day of March 1877.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor

WHEREAS by The Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1876 it was amongst other things provided that the persons registered as owners of ships registered at Melbourne and the merchants and traders whose names were on the respective rolls prepared and certified as prescribed by section 9 of the said Act should elect the number of persons to be the commissioners respectively assigned to them in the manner to be provided for by an Order of the Governor in Council. Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Exceutive Council, doth, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, make the following Order relative to the first elections of commissioners by owners of ships and merchants and traders respectively:—

1. Returning officer, his deputy and substitute, to make a declaration.

—Every returning officer, or deputy returning officer or person appointed to preside at any poll booth, shall, before he enter upon any of the duties assigned to him, make and sign before some justice of the peace a declaration to the effect following:—

before some justice of the peace a declaration to the effect following:—

I (A. B.) do solemnly declare that I will faithfully and impartially, according to the best of my skill and judgment, exercise and perform all the powers, authorities, and duties reposed in or required of me by The Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1876, or any Order in Council made thereunder, as returning officer of person appointed to preside at any poll booth), with regard to the election of harbor trust commissioners by owners of ships (or merchants and traders); and I do further soleunly promise and declare that I will not at the said election attempt to ascertain (save in the cases in which I am expressly authorized by Order in Council so to do) for what candidate any person shall vote or have voted at the said election; and that if in discharge of my duties at or concerning the said election I shall have learned or have the means of learning for what candidate any person shall vote or have voted thereat, I will not by word or act, or by any other means whatsoever, directly or indirectly, divulge or discover, or aid in divulging or discovering, the same, save in answer to any question which I may be legally bound to answer.

2. How rotes of corporations or firms to be recorded.—The vote or all the votes of any incorporated company which appears on the rolls of owners of ships or merchants and traders may be recorded by the chairman or principal director of such company, or by any director or member of the board of management thereof who may be thereunto authorized in writing under the seal of such company; and the vote or all the votes of any persons trading together in partnership, not being incorporated, may be recorded by any one of such persons.

WHEREAS by The Passengers, Harbors, and Navigation
Statute 1865, it was amongst other things enacted, that
the Governor in Council, by proclamation published in the

4. No person except the pilot and other duly authorized officers of Government and such reporters for the press as hold a written authority from the Commissioner of Trade and Customs shall go on board of or leave any ship carrying passengers entering or within any port until such vessel has been cleared by the Immigration Officer, which clearance will be indicated by the blue flag being hauled down: Provided nevertheless that agents of ships and their authorized clerks may, by written permission from the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, go on board vessels consigned to them after the clearing officer has boarded, and with his concurrence, notwithstanding the blue flag is still flying.

Australia — Queensland.

(1) Light-Vessel near No. VI., Claremont Island-Inner Route to Torres Strait.

The Government of Queensland has given notice that a light-vessel has been moored westward of No. VI., Claremont Island, in 12 fathoms water, with the beacon on the centre of Henth Rocks bearing W. by N. † N., distant 2‡ miles.

The vessel exhibits a fixed white light, 35 feet above the level of the sea, which should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 10 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses.

(2) Leading Lights on Little Sea Hill, Keppel Bay.

Also that two small fixed white leading lights, which when in line lead over the position of the Timandra Bank buoy, are now exhibited from Little Sea Hill, Keppel Bay, to assist in navigating the channel to the anchorage under Sea Hill Point.

Directions.—After passing Keppel Rocks on a west course do not bring the two lights at the Pilot Station in line before crossing the line of lights on Little Sea Hill. When both these lines of lights are crossed, which should be done near the point of intersection, the Timandra Bank buoy will be passed; then steer S.S.W., and if intending to anchor under Sea Hill Point, alter course to S. by E. ½ E., when the upper light is colipsed on a S.E. by S. bearing. Standing in, the upper light will,

again become visible, and when it bears N.E., anchorage will be found in about 5 fathoms at low water.

It should be borne in mind that between Sea Hill Point and Tinambra Bank buoy both flood and ebb tides set strongly across the line of the leading lights on Little Sea Hill.

#### NEW SOUTH WALES.

(3) Reported Bank off the Coast of New South Wales.

THE Government of New South Wales has given notice that Mr. Largie, master of the barque Jerusalem, has reported the existence of an extensive bank of soundings off the coast of New South Wales, 40 miles from the land, and about the same distance south-east of the entrance to Port Jackson.

#### MINING OPERATIONS WITHIN THE AREA OF SPRING GULLY RESERVOIR.

THE Governor in Council granted permission to Mr. Enoch Sincock to carry on mining operations, by virtue of miners' rights, within the area of the Public Water Reservoir at Spring Gully, near Castlemaine, subject to the following conditions:—

- 1. The workings shall be confined within such limits as shall be set out by the Chief Engineer of Water Supply, or such other officers as may be authorized by him in that behalf, and shall be at all times open to inspection by such officers.
- 2. All puddling in connection with such mining operations shall be done outside the limits of the reservoir and the drainage area of the same.
- 3. All earth excavated in the course of the mining operations hereby authorized which may not be removed for the purpose of being puddled shall be filled into the holes again.
- 4. The dam and bywash shall not in any way be injured.
- 4. The dam and bywash shall not in any way be injured.

  5. Previous to occupying any portion of the said land under the authority of this Order, the said Enoch Sincock shall deposit in the hands of the Receiver and Paymaster at Castlemaine the sum of Two pounds sterling, as a guarantee that he will observe and fulfil these conditions, such deposit to be retained until the said Enoch Sincock shall relinquish the said land and discontinue mining operations: and if the said conditions, restrictions, and regulations shall then have been observed and fulfilled, the said deposit shall be returned to the depositor; but if any of them shall not then have been observed and fulfilled, then the whole or such part of the sum so deposited as aforesaid as the Governor in Council shall bink fit shall by an Order of the Governor in Council be declared forfeited, and shall thereupon become public money, and be applied accordingly.

  6. In case any person or persons employed in the mining

In case any person or persons employed in the mining operations hereby authorized shall in any way violate any of the above conditions, it shall not be lawful for him or them any longer to mine under, upon, or within the said land, or to continue in any way to occupy the same; and the Governor in Council shall be the sole judge whether or not any condition has been violated.

  7. The Minister of Mines or any person authorized by him in writing shall have at any time power to order the immediate discontinuance of any mining operations within or under any part of the said land, whether the above conditions shall have been observed or not, and the mining operations shall thereupon be immediately discontinued; and an order in

writing served on any one of the miners, or a written order posted on any part of the land aforesaid, shall be sufficient notice.

8. Notwithstanding the permission hereby given, the Chief Engineer of Water Supply may at any time send water down from the water works above along the course of the Spring Gully Creek and through the reservoir area.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE EDUCATION ACT 1872.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has amended the Regulations for the distribution of the amount proposed upon the Estimates for 1876-7 to compensate teachers for losses sustained through the operation of the Regulations under the Education Act 1872 in the following

- manner, viz.:—

  1. Any teacher who was employed in a common school on the 31st of December 1872 and accepted service in a State school during 1878 may receive compensation for losses he sustained through the operation of the regulations under that Act, between the date of his appointment and the 31st of December 1875, if such losses amount to or exceed ten per cent. of the sum which he would have received during that time if his income had continued at the same rate as in 1872; and such compensation shall be at the rate of one-twelfth part of such teacher's loss for each year's service by him under any Education Act in Victoria, but shall not in any case exceed the amount of such loss. amount of such loss.
- 2. For the purpose of calculating compensation, the income for 1872 will be held to be that obtained by a teacher from all sources connected with the school in which he was employed on the 31st of December 1872, or, if he was not employed in it during the whole of the year, at the rate at which he was employed in such school.
- 3. The income for the years 1873-1-5 will be held to be that actually earned, provided it be not less than that estimated as obtainable from all sources by a fully qualified teacher on the same allotment under average management.
- 4. If a teacher has his wife or children (under 21 years of age) employed in the same school with him, his and their positions will be considered together in estimating compensation, i.e., the gain of one will be set off against the loss of another.
- 5. No teacher shall be entitled to compensation who has received promotion to a position where his annual income exceeds that which he enjoyed in 1872 by thirty-three per cent. of the amount he lost between the 1st of January 1873 and the date of such promotion, and the promotion of a teacher to a position where the income exceeds that which he enjoyed in 1872 by more than ten per cent. but less than thirty-three per cent. of such loss shall be counted pro taido against any compensation to which he might be otherwise entitled.
- . 6. No teacher who has been dismissed or removed from the service for misconduct will receive any compensation.
- 7. The administrators or assigns of any teacher deceased may receive the compensation which would have accrued to the deceased up to the date of his death.
- 8. If a teacher's earnings during 1873-4-5 have been, through any act of his own, less than they would have been had he remained in continuous employment, the teacher shall not be compensated for any loss he may have sustained thereby.

#### REGULATIONS FOR BENDIGO UNITED CRICKET CLUB RESERVE.

WE, Angus Mackay, Jonathan Latham, John Holdsworth, and John Stewart, the duly appointed committee of management of the land temporarily reserved as a site for the use of the Bendigo United Cricket Club, in the city of Sandhurst, at Back Creek, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management of the said reserve, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of The Land Act 1869.

#### REGULATIONS,

- 1. The reserve is parcelled out into the following divisions:
  - (1.) The grand stand, pavilion, members', ladies', and (2.) The playing ground.
    (3.) The remainder of the reserve.

All persons shall be admitted to the third division free of All persons shall be admitted to the third division free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on days whereon international, intercolonial, cup, and other important cricket matches shall be played, and also on days on which sports shall be held in the said reserve.

2. No person shall enter at any time into any part of the first division except on production of a ticket issued by the committee of management duly authorizing such person in that behalf.

3. All persons paying for admission to the third division, or any part thereof, shall be supplied with a ticket which they shall upon demand produce, and if required surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management to demand the production or surrender of the same

4. Persons renting or hiring for any cricket match, or other event, the grand stand, or any portion thereof, or any booth

in the reserve shall abide by any order given by the committee of management in reference to the reserve, or the buildings or other erections for the time being thereon.

5. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards his dress, language, or conduct.

6. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

7. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or damage the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones into the reserve.

8. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee of management.

9. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent in writing of the committee of management first obtained.

10. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots which may be enclosed within the reserve for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

11. Any person committing in the reserve, or in any of the buildings or crections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be removed from the reserve, not withstanding such person may have purchased and shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the reserve or any part thereof:—

(1.) Assaulting any other person.

(2.) Being drunk.

(3.) Crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground during a cricket match or sports, or during practice at cricket, or when crossing or trespassing upon the ground would be injurious to it as a cricket ground.

(4.) Using profane, indecent, or obseene language.

(5.) Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.

(6.) Behaving improperly or riotously.

(7.) Being found in any part of the first, second, or third divisions and not producing upon demand or (if required) not surrendering to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management to demand production of the same, a ticket duly authorizing admission to any part of the first, second, or third divisions when disentitled to such admission under those regulations.

The births of 576 children, viz., 312 boys and 264 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of February. In the month of January 740 births were registered, or 164 more than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in February numbered 477, viz., 261 of males and 216 of females: the births thus exceeded the deaths by 99. The deaths, though 14 less than those in January, exceeded the average of February during the previous ten years by 46. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been 33 less than the average of those ten years.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 100.3° on the 8th, and the lowest was 45.6° on the 4th. The mean temperature of the month (66.7°) was 1.1° above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (43.7°) took place on the 8th, viz., from a maximum of 100.3° to a minimum of 56.6°. The least range (86.9°) was on the 12th, viz., from a maximum of 72.1° to a minimum of 63.5°. The mean daily range was 21.92°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.908 inches) was a little above the average.

Males and females died during the month in the proportions of 55 and 45 per cent. respectively. The mortality of children under the age of 5 years averaged 51 per cent, as against 55 per cent. in February 1876; 63 per cent. in February 1876; 54 per cent. in February 1874; 55 per cent. in February 1873; 56 per cent. in February 1872; 65 per cent. in February 1871; 55 per cent. in February 1869; 57 per cent. in February 1868; and 74 per cent. in February 1869.

Twelve deaths of persons of the age of 75 years or upwards were recorded during the month, viz.:—Those of a female, aged 86, who died of diarrhea; a female, aged 80, of apoplexy; a furmer, aged 79, and a gentleman, aged 92, of paralysis; a female, aged 78, of valvular disease of the heart; one, aged 80, of bronchitis; another, aged 82, of gastritis; also one, aged 75, of synovitis; and a compositor, aged 80, and three females, aged 75, 79, and 88 respectively; of old age.

Twenty-one deaths from external causes were recorded during the month under review. Of these, 16 are set down as the result of accident, and 5 as suicidal. The following are the particulars:—A clerk, aged 19, and a farmer, aged 55, died of injuries to the skull caused by being thrown from horses; a cooper, aged 49, was passed over by a vehicle; a groom, aged 16, died of peritonitis, and a gentleman, aged 57, of fracture of the pelvis—both the result of accidental falls; a laborer, aged 57, died of the effects of fracture of the ribs; a youth, aged 17, died of an accidental gunshot wound in the head; a male infant and a female, aged 7 and 9 days respectively, died of umbilical hemorrhage a carpenter, aged 49, succumbed to an attack of tetanus, induced by an injury to the knee caused by his being thrown from a truck; a machinist, aged 20, was killed by lightning; three boys, aged 8, 6, and 10 respectively, were accidentally drowned—the last in the River Yarra; a male infant, aged 3 days, was suffocated in its mother's arms; and a farmer, aged 49, was killed by a shark whilst bathing in Hobson's Bay. Of the suicides—a mining agent, aged 43, poisoned himself with chloral; a farmer, aged 40, drowned himself in the River Yarra whilst of unsound mind; a female, aged 33, was found drowned in the same river, and is supposed to have committed suicide; and a publican, aged 44, and a female, aged 33, was found drowned in the same river, and is supposed to have committed suicide; and a publican, aged 44, and a female, aged 56, hanged themselves whilst in a state of unsound mind.

Seventy-one deaths, or 15 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—30 in the Melbourne Hoppital, 6 in the Immigrants' Home, 10 in the Alfred Hospital, 4 in the Lying-in Hospital, 5 in the Benevolent Asylum, 10 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, 3 in the Melbourne Industrial Schools, and 1 in the Melbourne Orphan Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 241 of which 135 or 55

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 241, of which 135, or 56 per cent., were of males; and 106, or 44 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 171 were under one year of age, 55 were between one and two, 6 were between two and three, 2 were between three and four, and 7 were between four and five.

Of these, 126, or 53 per cent., were males, and 110, or 47 per cent, were females; 10 were between five and ten, 9 were between ten and fifteen, 18 were between fifteen and twenty, 16 were hetween twenty and twenty-five, 12 were between thirty and thirty-five and thirty-five and thirty-five and forty, 24 were between forty and forty-five, 14 were between fifty, 23 were between fifty and fifty-five, 14 were between fifty and sixty-five and seventy, 12 were between seventy and seventy, 12 were between seventy and seventy-five and eighty, and 7 were between fifty and fifty-five and eighty, and 7 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 7 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 7 were upwards of eighty.

The deaths registered during the month under review were, allowing for the increase of population, below the average; and it will be observed, on reference to the table on the preceding page showing the mortality for February during ten years that they were the least recorded for that month since 1873. This may, however, be partly necounted for in the past two years by the fact that the mortality from scarlatina, which was then excessive, is now considerably reduced, only 5 deaths from that complaint appearing in the present returns. Diarrhoa, which was the most fatal disease during the month, caused 79 deaths, as against 89 in January. Six deaths were set down to the consequences of childbirth, or one death of a mother to every 96 births registered. Besides these a death occurred after child-bearing which is included under the head of scarlatina.
