REWARDS FOR THE DESTRUCTION OF SHARKS IN PORT PHILLIP AND WESTERN PORT BAYS, AND CORMORANTS OR SHAGS IN VICTORIA.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the following rewards will be paid for the destruction of Sharks, and Cormorants or Shags, viz.:-

Sharks over 2 feet and under 5 feet	1s. 6d. each

Cormorants or shags	3d. each

And 10s. to any person finding and pointing out the locality where the shags build their nests.

The above rewards will be paid by the Inspector of Fisheries, Melbourne, on the production of the certificate of any pier-master, officer or constable in charge of police station, or assistant inspector of fisheries, to whom the shark or cormorant is to be shown entire, and in whose presence the tail of the shark and head of the cormorant is to be cut off; such certificate to be appended to a form of account which may be obtained from the officers above mentioned, and which, when signed by the claimant to the reward, is to be presented to the Inspector of Fisheries for payment.

If the account is desired to be paid through an agent the claimant must give an order to pay such agent.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to or unite (as the case may be) the Commons hereinafter respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

MOLLAGUL AGRICULTURAL AREA COMMON.—The Mollagul Agricultural Area Common, proclaimed by Order of the 22nd October 1866, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:—County of Gladstone, parish of Mollagul: Commencing at a point on the north-eastern boundary of the parish where it is crossed by the Orville Creek; thence south-easterly and south by the boundary of the parish to the north-east angle of allotment 4 of section 4; thence west by that allotment, allotments 3, 2, and 1, and William Silke's 19th section block one hundred and twenty-five chains seventy-three links; thence by a line bearing N. 1° 13' E. twenty-nine chains eighty-eight links; thence westerly by the north boundary of sections 4, 3, 2, and 1 to the east boundary of the United Mollagul, Inkerman, and Wattle Flat Gold-field Common; thence north by that boundary to the south boundary of the McIntyre Gold-field Common; thence by the south and east boundaries of that common to the Orville Creek aforesaid; and thence by that creek downwards to the point of commencement. PUBLIC GARDEN RESERVE AT ELWOOD.— REGULATIONS.

WE, Samuel Griffiths, John George Dougharty, and Edward James Agg, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land at Elwood reserved for Public Garden, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management of the above-mentioned reserve, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869* :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
 2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards his dress, language, or conduct.
 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
 5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the said committee.
 6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the said committee first obtained.
 7. No person except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve shall enter any plots which may be enclosed within the reserve for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

BYE-LAW No. 27.

A Bye-law of the Town of Richmond, made under section 213, subdivision VIII., of the "Local Government Act 1874," for suppressing nuisances.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874 to make Bye-laws for the purpose *inter alia* of suppressing nuisances, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Richmond order as follows:—

No person shall deposit or place, or use for manure, or cause or suffer to be deposited or placed or used for manure, on any land, field, farm, or garden within the Town of Richmond any nightsoil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing without the consent in writing under the seal of the body corporate of the said Town of Richmond, nor unless under and in accordance with the conditions in such consent set forth; and any such offensive matter as aforesaid which shall, with such consent of the said Council, be so deposited or placed or used, shall, immediately on the deposit or placing or using thereof, be covered over, by the person depositing, placing, or using the same, with such a quantity of earth as will at once prevent the escape of any noxious or offensive effluvia from any such manure, soil, or other offensive matter before mentioned: Provided that this bye-law shall not apply to any nightsoil produced upon the premises where such nightsoil shall be used.

No person shall cart or carry with carts, drawn by horses or otherwise, within the boundaries of the Town of Richmond any nightsoil, blood, offal, or other matter, being offensive to smell, except between the hours of Eleven o'clock, post meridiem, on any day, and Six o'clock, ante meridiem, of the next day.

Every person guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing bye-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding £10 nor less than 10s.
