FLAG FOR GOVERNMENT VESSELS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGOUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

IN accordance with the provisions of a despatch received from Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies, I, the Governor of Victoria, do hereby direct that in lieu of the blue ensign with the badge specified in a proclamation by the Governor of Victoria, dated 3rd February 1870, all vessels belonging to or permanently in the service of the Government of Victoria shall wear the blue ensign, having in the centre of the fly thereof on a circular white ground the distinctive badge of the colony, viz.—Five white stars representing the constellation of the Southern Cross on a blue shield surmounted by an Imperial crown.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-sixth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and in the fortieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

THE Governor in Council has, by Order of 26th March 1877, made the following arrangement with reference to the Common-toll Road hereinafter mentioned, under the provisions of the Act 33 Vict. No. 506, § 435, viz.:—

GEORGE WASHINGTON ROBINSON

AURIFEROUS QUARTZ AT DIAMOND REEF,
NILLUMBIK, MALICIOUSLY SPOILED.

THIRTY POUNDS REWARD.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGOUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that the Governor might make and proclaim reserves for the preservation and growth of timber, and might from time to time, after one month's notice should be given in the *Government Gazette*, alter and revoke any such proclamation, and the Board of Land and Works might issue licenses to cut timber upon such reserve or any part thereof on such terms and conditions, and subject to the payment of such license fee, as should from time to time be approved of by the Governor and be set forth in such license: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, alter two several proclamations relating to the Grampian State Forest bearing date respectively the 27th day of May 1872 and the 25th day of January 1875, in manner hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

THE GRAMPIAN STATE FOREST.—Described in a proclamation bearing date the 27th May 1872, diminished by Order of the 6th July 1874, and extended by Order of the 25th January 1875, is hereby further diminished by deducting therefrom the land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:—Fourteen acres nine perches, county of Borung, parish of Boroka: Commencing at the north-eastern angle of George Stephens' 19th section block, No. 34435; bounded thence by that block and a line bearing N. 74° W. twenty-one chains ninety-two links; and thence by lines bearing respectively N. 11° 35' E. four chains sixty-three links, east seventeen chains, and S. 16° 31' E. eleven chains four links to the point of commencement. REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE OMEO GOLDFIELD
COMMON.

WHEREAS, in pursuance of Chapter XIII. of the Regulations made under *The Land Act 1869* by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of May 1873, the Responsible Minister of the Crown administering the said Act, by writing under his hand, appointed Thomas Easton, Henry Foster, and Christopher Rodgers Managers of the Omeo Goldfield Common: Now therefore the said Thomas Easton, Henry Foster, and Christopher Rodgers, as Managers of such Common, submit to the Board of Land and Works the following Rules and Regulations in respect thereof:—

1. Every holder of a miner's right or business license, or any special license, resident on or within five miles of the boundaries of the common, shall be entitled to depasture four head

of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle, subject to the following conditions.

2. The following scale of fees shall be in force on the Omeo Goldfield Common:—

For each mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule, per annum	£ s. d.
For each cow, steer, heifer, or ox, per annum	0 6 0
For each sheep or goat, per annum	0 5 0
	0 2 0

3. All licenses shall be issued in the form of Schedule A, hereunto annexed.

4. During the months of April and October, or as soon thereafter as convenient, all holders of stock on the common shall be required to muster such stock in some yard within the boundaries of the common, to be determined by the managers, within forty-eight hours after receiving notice in writing, and to assist in branding them with the common brand, horses and sheep only exempt from being branded.

5. Previous to the depasturing of stock, the owners thereof shall register the same with brands and description in the herd book, and such registration shall be renewed half-yearly, and shall be made previous to the branding of such stock.

6. Holders of licenses may substitute cattle for others removed from the common during the currency of their license, by giving notice in writing to the herdsman containing the brands and number of cattle so substituted, a record of such notice to be kept by the herdsman.

7. All fees must be paid half-yearly in advance, licenses to date from the first day of April and the first day of October in each year.

8. All stock depastured on the common, if not registered, branded, and duly paid for, may be impounded by the managers.

9. The progeny of cattle, horses, or goats depastured on the common shall be exempt from fees, if under six months old.

10. No swine or entire animal shall be depastured on the common without permission of the managers.

11. Sheep specially licensed shall only be depastured on such parts of the common as the managers shall appoint; being depastured beyond those limits, they shall be deemed to be trespassing, and may be impounded.

12. No license shall be transferred without the permission of the managers.

13. When any animal shall be infected with disease, the owner of such animal shall remove the same from the common within twelve hours after receiving notice from the managers or herdsman, and such animal shall not again be put upon the common without the special permission of the managers.

14. After due notice has been given the managers shall, at the owner's expense, have power to remove all diseased animals, and also, at the owner's expense, to remove, bury, or destroy all dead carcasses found on the common.

15. Persons occupying purchased land, or land held in respect of any lease or license, within or abutting on the boundaries of the common, shall not be allowed to drive sheep across any portion of the common to any waterhole, creek, or river, or to any detached allotment of land held under lease, license, or otherwise, without first obtaining the permission of the managers.

16. A herdsman or herdsmen shall be appointed in writing under the hand of the managers of the common, and the herdsman so appointed shall perform such duties as the managers may lawfully require.

17. The managers shall keep all necessary books and accounts, and shall, at all reasonable times, produce the same for the inspection of the public when required.

18. Travellers intending to drive cattle or sheep across or through the common shall, before entering upon the common, deliver at the residence of one of the managers or herdsman of the common, a notice of his intention so to drive such cattle or sheep, and shall, by such notice, state from whence he has brought the same, and whither he is driving them. And all cattle shall be driven every day a distance of not less than ten miles, and all sheep shall be driven every day a distance of not less than miles in the direction of the place mentioned in the notice as the place to which it is intended to drive such cattle or sheep respectively.

19. Every person offending against any regulation for the management of the common shall, on conviction before a justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

20. The managers of the common may sue for and recover any fees for depasturing stock on the common, or any penalty for breach of any regulation for the management of the common.

21. Managers of the common shall, within one month of the termination of each financial year (ending the first day of May in each year), publish in a newspaper circulating in the district a certified account of their receipts and expenditure for the year in the form prescribed in Schedule B, hereunto annexed, and forward copy thereof to the Board of Land and Works, Melbourne.

22. The number of stock depastured on the common shall at no time exceed five hundred head of large cattle, or an equivalent number of small cattle, reckoning three head of small cattle to one head of large cattle, and the managers

shall have power to reduce the number held by each owner from time to time, as occasion may require.

23. In the construction and for the purposes of these regulations, the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules; the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.

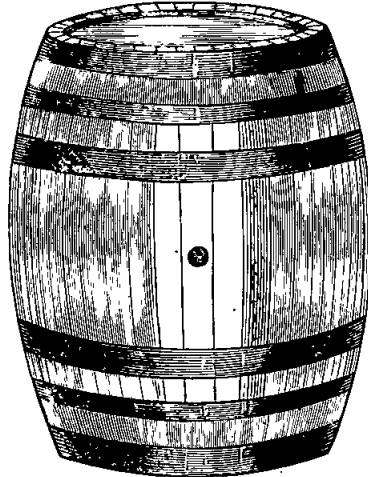
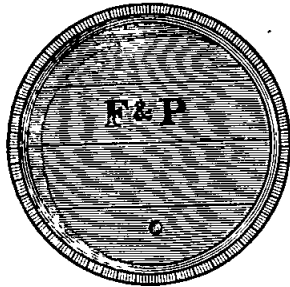
