MANAGER OF A COMMON-TOLL ROAD.

THE Governor in Council, on the 9th April 1877, made the following arrangement with reference to the Common-toll Road hereinafter mentioned, under the provisions of the Act 38 Vict. No. 506, § 435, viz.:-

FREDERICK GEORGE MILES

having been appointed Manager of that portion of the Sydney road extending from Elizabeth street, in the city of Melbourne, to the northern boundary of the shire of Coburg, proclaimed a Common-toll Road under Order in Council of 21st August 1865, shall, upon the first day of each calendar month, receive from the collectors and lessees of all tolls upon the portion of the road so proclaimed, and upon the bridges thereon, all moneys collected by them as and for such tolls, or due by them as the rents thereof; and that he shall, within four days after the receipt, distribute the tolls so collected amongst the local bodies interested therein, in the proportions prescribed by Order in Council of 14th February 1876; such appointment to be in force from 1st of January to 30th of June 1877.

HIGHWAY IN THE BOROUGH OF CRESWICK.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette* to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, and at the request of the Council of the Borough of Creswick, do by this notice declare the land reserved or used for the road hereinafter described to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

The road from the corner of W. A. Sutcliffe's forty-ninth section block, near Cobbler's Gully, in the Borough of Creswick, extending to the Western Boundary road, near Bald Hills, which was surveyed by Messrs. Thomas and Dimelow, in October 1876.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this ninth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and in the fortieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE OMEO GOLDFIELD COMMON.

WHEREAS, in pursuance of Chapter XIII. of the Regulations made under *The Land Act 1869* by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of May 1873, the Responsible Minister of the Crown administering the said Act, by writing under his hand, appointed Thomas Easton, Henry Foster, and Christopher Rodgers Managers of the Omeo Goldfield Common: Now therefore the said Thomas Easton, Henry Foster, and Christopher Rodgers, as Managers of such Common, submit to the Board of Land and Works the following Rules and Regulations in respect thereof:—

1. Every holder of a miner's right or business license, or any special license, resident on or within five miles of the boundaries of the common, shall be entitled to depasture four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle, subject to the following conditions.

2. The following scale of fees shall be in force on the Omeo Goldfield Common:—

For each mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule, per annum	0	6	0
For each cow, steer, heifer, or ox, per annum	0	5	0
For each sheep or goat, per annum	0	2	0

3. All licenses shall be issued in the form of Schedule A, hereunto annexed.

4. During the months of April and October, or as soon thereafter as convenient, all holders of stock on the common shall be required to muster such stock in some yard within the boundaries of the common, to be determined by the managers, within forty-eight hours after receiving notice in writing, and to assist in branding them with the common brand, horses and sheep only exempt from being branded.

5. Previous to the depasturing of stock, the owners thereof shall register the same with brands and description in the herd book, and such registration shall be renewed half-yearly, and shall be made previous to the branding of such stock.

6. Holders of licenses may substitute cattle for others removed from the common during the currency of their license, by giving notice in writing to the herdsman containing the brands and number of cattle so substituted, a record of such notice to be kept by the herdsman.

7. All fees must be paid half-yearly in advance, licenses to date from the first day of April and the first day of October in each year.

8. All stock depastured on the common, if not registered, branded, and duly paid for, may be impounded by the managers.

9. The progeny of cattle, horses, or goats depastured on the common shall be exempt from fees, if under six months old.

10. No swine or entire animal shall be depastured on the common without permission of the managers.

11. Sheep specially licensed shall only be depastured on such parts of the common as the managers shall appoint; being depastured beyond those limits, they shall be deemed to be trespassing, and may be impounded.

12. No license shall be transferred without the permission of the managers.

13. When any animal shall be infected with disease, the owner of such animal shall remove the same from the common within twelve hours after receiving notice from the managers or herdsman, and such animal shall not again be put upon the common without the special permission of the managers.

14. After due notice has been given the managers shall, at the owner's expense, have power to remove all diseased animals, and also, at the owner's expense, to remove, bury, or destroy all dead carcasses found on the common.

15. Persons occupying purchased land, or land held in respect of any lease or license, within or abutting on the boundaries of the common, shall not be allowed to drive sheep across any portion of the common to any waterhole, creek, or river, or to any detached allotment of land held under lease, license, or otherwise, without first obtaining the permission of the managers.

16. A herdsman or herdsmen shall be appointed in writing under the hand of the managers of the common, and the herdsman so appointed shall perform such duties as the managers may lawfully require.

17. The managers shall keep all necessary books and accounts, and shall, at all reasonable times, produce the same for the inspection of the public when required.

18. Travellers intending to drive cattle or sheep across or through the common shall, before entering upon the common, deliver at the residence of one of the managers or herdsman of the common, a notice of his intention so to drive such cattle or sheep, and shall, by such notice, state from whence he has brought the same, and whither he is driving them. And all cattle shall be driven every day a distance of not less than ten miles, and all sheep shall be driven every day a distance of not less than six miles in the direction of the place mentioned in the notice as the place to which it is intended to drive such cattle or sheep respectively.

19. Every person offending against any regulation for the management of the common shall, on conviction before a justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

20. The managers of the common may sue for and recover any fees for depasturing stock on the common, or any penalty for breach of any regulation for the management of the common.

21. Managers of the common shall, within one month of the termination of each financial year (ending the first day of May in each year), publish in a newspaper circulating in the district a certified account of their receipts and expenditure for the year in the form prescribed in Schedule B, hereunto annexed, and forward copy thereof to the Board of Land and Works, Melbourne.

22. The number of stock depastured on the common shall at no time exceed five hundred head of large cattle, or an equivalent number of small cattle, reckoning three head of small cattle to one head of large cattle, and the managers shall have power to reduce the number held by each owner from time to time, as occasion may require.

23. In the construction and for the purposes of these regulations, the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules; the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.

RULES FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE DARGO FLAT COMMON.

Whereas, by *The Land Act 1869*, power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations for the management of commons, and, in pursuance of the provisions of Chap. 13 of the Regulations made by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of May 1873, the managers of the Dargo Flat Common have adopted and submitted to the Board of Land and Works the following draft regulations for the management of the said common:—

1. All ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, and farmers residing within a distance of five (5) miles of the above common shall be entitled to depasture four head of large cattle or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such common an additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The fees for depasturing stock on the above common shall be paid half-yearly in advance, according to the following scale:—

For horned cattle, five shillings (5s.) per head per annum.
For horses or mules, seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) per head per annum.

For small cattle, one shilling and eight pence (1s. 8d.) per head per annum.

Calves and foals, under twelve months old, the progeny of stock depasturing on the common, shall be free.

3. All persons taking cattle to the common shall deliver them to the herdsman and produce an order for him to receive the same from the person authorized to issue such order, and the herdsman shall keep a registry of the receipt and delivery of all cattle depastured on the common.

4. No bull or entire horse shall be allowed to depasture on the common without the authority of the managers.

5. No animal infected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the common.

6. The brand of the common, D in pitch or tar, shall be placed on all horned cattle depastured thereon.

7. A fortnight's notice shall be given before mustering on the common, and each owner of cattle shall assist or authorize some person to represent him in mustering and branding them with the common brand, or pay a fine of six (6) pence per head to the common account.

8. No person may remove cattle from the common without giving notice to the herdsman.

9. The managers or herdsman will not be responsible for death or loss in any other way of cattle depasturing on the common, but the herdsman shall be required to take all due care of cattle entrusted to his charge.

10. The managers of the common will allow such salaries, percentages, or other remuneration to such officers or employes as they may from time to time fix and determine, and all reasonable expenses incurred by the managers and their employes will be paid from the receipts of the common.

11. The managers shall, within one month after the termination of each year, publish in a newspaper circulating in the district wherein the common is situate a certified account of their receipts and expenditure for the year in the form prescribed in schedule 25 to the regulations of the 26th May 1873, made under *The Land Act 1869*, and forward copy of such accounts to the Board of Land and Works.

7. No person except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve shall enter any plots which may be enclosed within the reserve for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

WE, Thomas Sanderson, George Evans, John O'Neil, Thomas Potts, Samuel Morris, Hamilton Todd, and William Rockliffe, the duly appointed committee of management of the land at Bealiba reserved for recreative purposes, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management of the above-named reserve, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section one hundred and eight of *The Land Act 1869*.

REGULATIONS.

The reserve is parcelled out into the following divisions:—

(1.) The grand stand, the saddling paddock, the weighing yard, and judge's box.

(2.) The remainder of the land reserved and enclosed, including the training ground.

All persons shall be admitted to the second division free of charge.

No person shall be admitted at any race or other meeting into the first of the said divisions, nor be permitted to bring any horse, carriage, or other vehicles therein, excepting on production of a ticket to be issued by the committee of management duly authorizing him or her in that behalf.

No person except the judge or any person he may call to his assistance shall enter the judge's box at the time the horses are prepared to start or are running for any race.

No person shall enter the weighing yard or the approaches thereto except the jockeys requiring to be weighed and the owners and trainers of horses desirous of seeing their jockeys weighed.

The following persons shall not be admitted to the first division of the reserve:—

(1.) Any person proved to the satisfaction of the committee of management to have been at any time guilty of any malpractice or dishonorable conduct in connection with racing.

(2.) Any person proved to the satisfaction of the committee of management to be a defaulter.

All persons paying for admission to the first of the said division or any part thereof shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he or she shall upon demand produce or (if required) surrender to all gatekeepers and other persons having authority from the committee of management to demand the production or surrender of the same.

Persons renting or hiring for any race meeting the grand stand or any portion thereof, or any booth in the reserve, shall abide by an order given by the committee of management in reference to the reserve and the buildings and other erections for the time being thereon.

No person shall take any dog upon the racecourse.

No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards his or her dress, language, or conduct.

No person shall damage in any way any trees, shrubs, or flowers at any time planted or growing in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted in the reserve.

No person shall climb over the fence or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or slabs, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs without the authority in writing of the committee of management.

No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the committee of management being first obtained.

No person except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve shall enter any plot which may be enclosed within the reserve for plantations of young trees and shrubs.

Any person committing in the said reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences, shall, together with any horses, carriages; or other vehicles in their possession or care, be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased and is or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the first of the said divisions or any part thereof:—

(1.) Assaulting any other person.

(2.) Being drunk.

(3.) Riding, crossing, or trespassing upon the course or any part of it during a race meeting, or when the horses are prepared to start, or are running for any race.

(4.) Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.

(5.) Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.

(6.) Behaving improperly or riotously.

(7.) Being found in any part of the first of the said division, and not producing upon demand and (if required) not surrendering to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management to demand production of the same a ticket duly authorizing to that part of the first of the said divisions where such person shall be so found, unless such person shall forthwith satisfy the committee of management or the stewards deputed by them that the proper charge for admission has been paid by such person, and that such person's ticket has been lost.

(8.) Obtaining admission to any part of the first of the said divisions when disentitled to such admission under these regulations.

The following is the scale of charges or fees which shall be levied and taken for admission to the first of the said divisions and the buildings respectively:—

Provided that the committee may exempt any member of racing club wholly or partially from the payment of all or any such charges or fees. And the money so received shall (after deducting necessary expenses) be applied in the permanent improvement of the reserve for racing and recreation purposes, or in the erection, maintenance, or repairs of buildings and fences, or the planting of trees or shrubs in the reserve, as shall be necessary or expedient for the purpose of rendering the same more convenient and useful for racing and recreation purposes.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section one hundred and eight of the said Act 1869, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

The lock-ups at Melbourne, Hotham, Fitzroy, Toorak, Prahran, St. Kilda, Emerald Hill, Sandridge, Collingwood, Richmond, and the Richmond Depot are included in the contracts for the Melbourne district.
