time being together with his assistants and workmen at any time during the said term to enter into and upon the said premises or any part thereof to view and inspect the works for the time being in progress and also the state and condition of the said tramway and works both during their formation and afterwards and will at all times render every reasonable facility and assistance for making such inspections as aforesaid unto all persons hereinbefore authorised to make the same And also will if any error fault or defect shall be found or appear in the workmanship or formation of the said tramway or any level crossing or of any material used in the said tramway crossing and works during the progress thereof or in the state or condition of the said premises on receiving notice to that effect from the persons hereinbefore authorised forthwith amend alter correct and repair the same And also will at all times during the continuance of the said term make full compensation to the occupiers or licensees or lessees of land from the Crown for the time being or to any owner of land or to any person or persons whomsoever for any loss injury or damage which may be sustained by them or him by reason of the works hereby authorised or any other means connected therewith immediately after such loss injury or damage shall happen And also will indemnify Her Majesty the said Board of Land and Works and the Governor of Victoria from all actions suits claims and demands on account of any such loss or damage as aforesaid And also shall and will make adequate provision for the disposal of detritus rubbish or other refuse which may arise from or be occasioned by the formation of the said works in such manner as that the same shall not be placed in or upon any creek river watercourse road or thoroughfare or upon any private land or except so far as lawful license shall have been obtained therefor into or upon any Crown land and also in such manner as that the same shall not in any way occasion any public or private damage or inconvenience And also will at the expiration or sooner determination of the said term deliver up the said premises and the works to be performed in pursuance of the covenants in that behalf hereinbefore contained in such good and substantial repair and so maintained as aforesaid and in all respects in such state and condition as shall be consistent with the due performance of the several covenants hereinbefore contained and shall not nor will use or occupy or permit to be used or occupied the said land and premises for other operations Provided that no such license shall be necessary in cases where by operation of law or otherwise a sale of the said premises or any part or parts thereof is made by any person or persons entitled to sell the same for the benefit of the creditors or a creditor of the lessee or his transferees Provided always and these presents are upon this express condition that if the lessee her executors administrators or transferees shall at any time during the said term fail to use such land *bona fide* for the purpose for which it has been demised, or if and whenever the said rent or any other payment hereby covenanted to be made shall be in arrear for ten days after the time appointed for payment thereof whether the same shall have been legally demanded or not or if and whenever administrators and transferees to expel and remove without any legal process and as effectually as the sheriff might do in case of judgment in ejectment had been obtained and a writ of *habere facias possessionem* had been issued on such judgment and in case of such entry and any legal proceeding taken in respect thereof the defendants in such proceeding may plead leave and license in bar thereof and these presents shall be conclusive evidence of such leave and license by the lessee her executors administrators and transferees or other the person or persons plaintiff or plaintiffs in such proceedings for such entry or other matters complained of in such proceedings.

COMMON ADDED TO.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act* 1869 it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to the Lucknow Common the Crown lands hereinafter described, that is to say:—

The Lucknow common proclaimed by Order of the 6th October 1873, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz., county of Dargo, parish of Wy Yung: Commencing at the south-east angle of C. Redenbach's 19th section block, No. 2600; bounded thence by that block bearing north fifty-two chains seventy-five links and west twelve chains ninety links; thence by lines bearing respectively north seventy-seven chains twenty-five links, east eighty chains, south one hundred and thirty chains, and west twenty-two chains eighty-six links; thence by P. Kennedy's 19th section block, No. 467, bearing north twenty-two chains eighty-six links, west seventeen chains fifty links, and south twenty-two chains eighty-six links; and thence by W. H. HEYFIELD COMMON.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF HEYFIELD COMMON.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act* 1869 power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations for the management of commons, and, in pursuance of the provisions of Chapter thirteen of the Regulations made under the said Act by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of May 1873, the council of the Shire of Maffra, as managers of the Heyfield Common, submit to the Board of Land and Works for approval the following regulations for the management of the said common:—

1. All residents within five miles of any portion of the gazetted boundaries of the common shall be entitled to depasture four head of large cattle or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The fees for depasturing cattle shall be paid half-yearly in advance, according to the following scale, viz.:—

- A. For horned cattle, (5s.) five shillings per head per annum.
 - B. For horses, (8s.) eight shillings per head per annum.
 - C. For sheep, (1s. 4d.) one shilling and fourpence per head per annum.
 - D. For goats, (2s.) two shillings per head per annum.
- Calves and foals, under (8) eight months old, the progeny of registered cattle on the common, shall be free.

3. When the fees are paid the herdsman shall give a receipt on the authorized form, and shall register the "brands" and descriptions of the cattle, together with the owner's name and address and the amount of fees paid, in a book to be called the "Commons Herd Book," and shall brand the cattle so registered with the commons brand.

4. No pigs shall be allowed to depasture on the common; nor any bull or entire horse without the consent of the managers, who shall at the time fix special fees.

5. The managers or herdsman will not be responsible for any cattle depasturing on the common; but the herdsman shall see all registered cattle on the common once at least in every seven days, and in the event of any straying he shall give notice in writing to the owners thereof within (24) twenty-four hours after being missed.

6. In the event of any cattle straying off the common and being impounded, the herdsman shall be responsible to the owners for the impounding expenses, and for the safe return of such cattle to the common provided the requirements of rule (5) have not been complied with.

7. The herdsman shall impound all cattle found trespassing on the common and keep correct accounts of the same, so that the fees arising therefrom shall be properly accounted for, and all fees arising from this source shall go to the credit of the commons account.

8. All persons desirous of removing stock permanently from the common shall give (24) twenty-four hours' notice of their intention to the herdsman.

9. The managers or herdsman shall have power to cause any cattle having or suspected of having any contagious disease to be removed from or to such part of the common as may be directed, and the herdsman shall give notice at once to the owners of such cattle being diseased.

10. In the event of any cattle dying upon the common, the owners of the same shall after (24) twenty-four hours' notice from the herdsman, or after having the carcass pointed out to them by the herdsman, cause all such carcasses to be at once burned or destroyed, failing which the herdsman shall cause the same to be destroyed at the owners' risk and cost.

11. The "brand" to be used for the common shall be H (pitch brand).

Due notice by advertisement in the local newspapers circulating in the district shall be given of the mustering of cattle on the common every six months, and every owner of cattle shall assist or authorize some person to represent him in branding them with the commons brand or pay Sixpence per head to the herdsman, the amount to go to the credit of the commons account.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding (20) Twenty pounds for each offence.

The foregoing rules and regulations were passed by the Maffra Shire Council, sitting as managers for the Heyfield Common, on the 6th day of December 1876, subject to the approval of the Board of Land and Works.

WYNDHAM TOWN COMMON.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE WYNDHAM TOWN COMMON.

In lieu of the Regulations approved by the Governor in Council on 29th December 1870.

WHEREAS by The Land Act 1869 power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations for the management of commons, and, in pursuance of the provisions of Chapter XIII. of the regulations made under the said Act by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of May 1873, the Council of the Shire of Wyndham, as managers of the Wyndham Town Common, submit to the Board of Land and Works for approval the following regulations for the management of the said common:—

1. All ratepayers legally entitled to commonage will be allowed to depasture not more than four head of large cattle or an equivalent number of small cattle. Bulls or entire horses will not be allowed on the common without the permission of the managers.

2. The following fees shall be paid for depasturing cattle on the common, namely:—For every head of neat cattle, twelve (12) shillings; horses, twenty-five (25) shillings; and small cattle, six (6) shillings per annum, paid quarterly in advance.

3. Applications for licenses to depasture cattle on the common to be made to the secretary of the shire, at the Shire Hall, Wyndham, who will on the receipt of the proper fees issue such license, also an order to the herdsman to receive cattle described therein on the common.

4. Licensees taking cattle to the common shall deliver them to the herdsman and produce the secretary's order. The herdsman shall sign the order and enter a copy thereof in the herd book, and, with the assistance of the licensee or his agent, forthwith brand the cattle with the common brand in pitch.

5. In the event of any registered cattle being missed from the common, the herdsman shall give notice thereof to the licensee forthwith; and in case such cattle shall be impounded previous to the giving of such notice the herdsman shall release the said cattle at his own cost. The herdsman shall impound all cattle found trespassing on the common, or otherwise deal with them in accordance with the provisions of any Act then in force for the impounding of cattle.

6. The herdsman shall reside on the township and enter into a sufficient bond with the managers for the discharge of his duties, but the managers will not be responsible for any cattle depastured on the common.

7. The herdsman shall see all cattle under his care at least once in every twenty-four (24) hours, and make an entry of each day's transactions in the herd book.

8. The licensee will not be allowed to remove cattle from the common without the production of the secretary's receipt for fees paid up to date of removal.

9. Should the fees collected be insufficient to pay management expenses incurred, an additional charge will be made on each licensee proportioned to the number of cattle by him depastured, and each license is granted subject to this condition.

10. All diseased cattle found trespassing will be immediately destroyed.

11. Special licenses may be granted when considered necessary, and weekly licenses may be issued to butchers at the rate of one shilling for large cattle and threepence for small cattle per week, payable in advance.

12. The managers shall, within one month after the termination of each year, publish in a newspaper circulating in the district wherein the common is situated a certified account of their receipts and expenditure for the year, in the form prescribed in schedule 25 of the regulations of 26th May 1873, and forward copy thereof to the Board of Land and Works.

13. Every person offending against any regulation for the management of this common shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding twenty (20) pounds for each offence.

14. The managers of this common may sue for and recover any fees for depasturing stock on the common or any penalty for breach of any regulation for management of the common.

MITTA-MITTA PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1st. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

2nd. By the 13th section of *The Cemeteries Statute 1864* any person making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their representatives for ever.

3rd. Applications for such permission to be made at the office of trustees. A certificate of permission, in the form set out in the schedule, will be granted to the party applying for such permission on the payment of the proper charges.

4th. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on order of a justice, or on the certificate of a minister of religion or other evidence, proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relatives and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

5th. Orders for interment will be received by the sexton, or by any of the trustees.

6th. The trustees will cause all graves to be dug, but parties requiring brick graves will be requested to construct them under the direction of the trustees.

7th. A form of application for burial, containing the name, age, and late place of residence of the deceased, will be provided, and must be filled up, where practicable, and entered in the interment book in the same form.

8th. The time fixed for the funeral must be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

9th. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be Ten a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the usual and only hours for funerals will be from Two to Five p.m. throughout the year.

10th. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

11th. When an interment is made in a vault or brick grave, such vault or brick grave to be closely cemented to the satisfaction of the trustees.

12th. A plan of every monument, and a copy of every inscription, to be submitted to the trustees for their approval.

13th. The plans of all fences to be submitted to the trustees. All wooden fencing must be after the model to be seen on application.

14th. No servant or other person employed by or engaged on any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

2. Bread.—A sample of the best ordinarily retailed to the public will be considered as a test loaf for first quality. Second quality to be made of flour known in the trade as "best seconds," and the third quality (that issued to prisoners of the Crown) to be made of flour, fine sharps, the produce of prime, strong, thin skinned, good colored wheat, to be perfectly free from coarse pollard or other offal.

3. Milk.—The milk must be fresh, pure, and of the best quality, and subject to test when required by the department. Should the supply prove to be not of contract quality, any expense incurred will be charged to the contractor.

4. Fresh meat is to be supplied in such proportions as may be required, and, when the quantity admits, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately, also buttocks only when ordered. When shins of beef form a portion of the supply, a fair proportion of the bone, not less than ten inches, must have been cut off. The sticking pieces must be removed from the fore quarters of beef.

5. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department concerned.

6. The order issued by the head of department must accompany the goods, and the account is to be rendered simultaneously with the delivery of the supplies. In other cases the account is to be rendered monthly. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

7. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order they will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account.

8. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 7.

9. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which it will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 7.

10. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the person to whom the rations are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department, or officer in charge of the station, will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 7.

11. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report of the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government to terminate the contract forthwith.

12. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

13. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board on behalf of the Government, or the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months; it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the contract is made.
