The births of 549 children, viz., 291 boys and 258 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of December. In the month of November 682 births were registered, or 133 more than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in December numbered 423, viz., 233 of males and 190 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 126. The deaths exceeded those in November by 43, but were below the average of December during the previous ten years by 31. If, moreover, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been also less than the average of those ten years by 115.

The highest temperature in the shade at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 110.7° on the 15th, which was the greatest ever recorded for December, and was only half a degree below the maximum temperature of the fourteen years over which the records extend; the lowest was 44.8° on the 3rd. The mean temperature of the month (64.3°) was half a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (46.3°) took place on the 14th, viz., from a maximum of 102.6° to a minimum of 56.3°. The least range (7.9°) was on the 2nd, viz., from a maximum of 61.0° to a minimum of 53.1°. The mean daily range was 23.9°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.866 inches) was above the average.

Males contributed 55 per cent., and females 45 per cent. to the mortality of the month; children under the age of 5 years who died were in the proportion of 46 per cent. to the total mortality, as against 45 per cent. in December 1875; 60 per cent. in December 1874; 48 per cent. in December 1873; 55 per cent. in December 1872; 53 per cent. in December 1871; 52 per cent. in December 1870; 53 per cent. in December 1869; 55 per cent. in December 1868; 54 per cent. in December 1867; and 69 per cent. in December 1866.

The deaths of 16 persons, of the age of 75 years or upwards, were recorded during the month under review, viz.:—Those of a seaman, aged 77, who died of erysipelas; a tinsmith, aged 78, of diarrhoea; a sawyer, aged 76, of phthisis; a female, aged 78, of apoplexy; a gentleman, aged 76, a gardener, aged 77, a male of no occupation, aged 86, of paralysis; a prize fighter, aged 76, of disease of the brain; two females, aged 75 and 76 respectively, of disease of the heart; a female, aged 79, of whitlow; and two females, each aged 77, a cook, aged 78, a gentleman aged 84, and a laborer, aged 85 of old age.

Twenty-six deaths were registered during the month as having been occasioned by external causes; of these, 18 are ascribed to accident; 2 to homicide; 5 to suicide, and 1 was from execution. The following are the particulars:—A seaman, aged 19, was killed by falling from aloft whilst on duty; a jeweller, aged 23, died of rupture of the duodenum, caused by running against a cart; a cook, aged 32, was stabbed during a quarrel; the latter by her clothes catching fire; two male children, aged 5 months child aged 2, and a woman, aged 49, died of burns—the latter by her clothes catching fire; a laborer, aged 53, two boys, aged 9 and 10 respectively, and 6 years respectively, and a packer, aged 40, died of insolation; a laborer, aged 53, two boys, aged 9 and 10 respectively, and a carter, aged 16, and a fireman, aged 30, were accidentally drowned—the first in the Yarra Yarra, and the three last in the Saltwater River; two male infants, aged 18 days and 2 months respectively, and a female aged 8 months were suffocated in bed. Of the homicidal deaths a male infant, aged 7 months, was murdered by the mother cutting its throat; and a female, aged 52, was murdered by her husband who cut her throat. Of the suicides, a male, age unknown, shot himself in the heart; two hair-dressers, aged 28 and 52 respectively, cut their throats; a female, aged 31, and a builder, aged 63, drowned themselves in the River Yarra Yarra—the four last are stated to have been of unsound mind. The death from execution was that of a charcoal-burner, aged 60, who was hanged in the Melbourne Gaol.

Ninety-eight deaths, or 23 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—59 in the Melbourne Hospital, 1 in the Immigrants' Home, 2 in the Children's Hospital, 8 in the Alfred Hospital, 4 in the Lying-in Hospital, 9 in the Benevolent Asylum, 8 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 8 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 196, of which 105, or 54 per cent., were of males; and 91, or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 149 were under one year of age, 27 were between one and two, 10 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 227. Of these, 128, or 56 per cent., were males, and 99, or 44 per cent., were females; 8 were between five and ten, 9 were between ten and fifteen, 11 were between fifteen and twenty, 11 were between twenty and twenty-five, 18 were between twenty-five and thirty, 26 were between thirty and thirty-five, 21 were between thirty-five and forty, 26 were between forty and forty-five, 11 were between forty-five and fifty, 26 were between fifty and fifty-five, 13 were between fifty-five and sixty, 11 were between sixty and sixty-five, 10 were between sixty-five and seventy, 9 were between seventy and seventy-five, 13 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 3 were upwards of eighty, and 1 unspecified.

A large increase will be observed under the head of diarrhoea, which caused 61 deaths as against 22 in the previous month. On the other hand, deaths from scarlatina and diphtheria decreased from 26 in November to 7 in the month under review; and diseases of the respiratory system occasioned only 25 deaths as compared with 49 and 43 in November and October respectively. Deaths from phthisis likewise diminished from 43 in November and 51 in October to 25.

The number of deaths in the quarter ended 31st December 1876 was 1,151, and the mean temperature in the shade was 60·3°. The deaths thus numbered 56 more than the average of the corresponding quarter during the previous ten years; but, if allowance be made for increase of population, they will be found to have fallen 146 short of that average. The mean temperature in the shade was the same as the average.

During the year 1876 the number of births registered in Melbourne and Suburbs amounted to 8,202, and the number of deaths to 5,896, being in the proportion of 33·52 births and 22·05 deaths to every 1,000 of the living population. The gain to the population by excess of births over deaths was 2,806.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at such time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim as a common the Crown lands hereinafter described as the Yarrowonga Common, and do also hereby unite the Beechworth United Borough and Goldfield Common with the Wooragee Common under the designation of the Beechworth and Wooragee United Common, that is to say:—

**QUALIFICATIONS FOR ADMISSION.**

1st. Having completed the first and second years of the course for the certificate of engineer in the Melbourne University, and his age at time of application must not exceed 24 years.

2nd. Having completed the first year of the course for the certificate of engineer in the Melbourne University. His age at time of entry must not exceed 23 years.

3rd. Having matriculated at the Melbourne or other recognized University, after passing in Algebra, Euclid, and Arithmetic; or passed the Civil Service Examination, including the subjects above-named; or produce such a certificate of competency in such subjects from the Board of Education of Victoria as shall satisfy this department. His age at time of application must not exceed 22 years, nor be less than 16 years.

**PERIOD OF SERVICE.**

All pupils must serve three months on probation during which period only half salary will be paid. After probationary period, should the report of the Board of Examiners be unfavorable, the services of the pupil draftsmen will be dispensed with without further remuneration.

1st. An applicant of the first class will be required to pass eighteen months in the offices of the Lands Department as a draftsman, and eighteen months in the field under the direction of a departmental surveyor.

2nd. An applicant of the second class will be required to pass eighteen months in the offices of the Lands Department, and two years in the field under the direction of a departmental surveyor.

3rd. An applicant of the third class will remain in the offices of the department as a draftsman for two years when he will

be examined in trigonometric computation by logarithms, including computation of areas and reduction of traverse surveys, plotting from field-book, plan drawing, including feature delineation; and, if he pass satisfactorily, will be required to spend two years in the field under the direction of a departmental surveyor.

**REMUNERATION.**

1st. Applicants of the first class will be paid at the rate of £52 per annum during the period of service passed in the offices of the department, and £84 during the eighteen months passed in the field.

2nd. Applicants of the second class will be paid at the rate of £52 during the eighteen months passed in the offices of the department, £60 for the first year in the field, and £84 during the last year in the field.

3rd. Applicants of the third class will be paid at the rate of £52 per annum during the two years passed in the offices of the department, £60 during the first year in the field will be £60, during the second £84.

To obtain certificate of competency as a qualified surveyor it will be required of the candidate, after the end of the term spent in the field, that he pass two months in the Melbourne Observatory to acquire a knowledge of such branches of practical astronomy as are necessary in the duties he would be called on to perform as a departmental surveyor. He will also be required to make a traverse and topographical survey of a portion of land to be shown him; to establish the true meridian by transit observation from which meridian the bearings of his survey will be reckoned; to level over a line to be pointed out to him, and to make a subdivision also as pointed out. Then to produce plan showing construction lines, subdivision section line topographical features with areas and dimensions of subdivision, accompanied by regulation field-book of survey, and the various computations.

**RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE TERRICK TERRICK WEST COMMON.**

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations for the management of commons, and in pursuance of the provisions of chapter xiv. of the regulations made under the said Act by the Governor in Council, on the 26th day of May 1873; the Council of the Shire of Swan Hill, as Managers of the Terrick Terrick West Common, submit to the Board of Land and Works for approval the following regulations for the management of the said common:—

1. In the construction and for the purpose of these regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean oxen, cows,

heifers, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules; and the words "small cattle" shall mean "sheep."

2. Ratepayers in the shire, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within a distance of five miles from the common, may respectively depasture on the common four head of large cattle, or an equivalent of the whole, or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle, on payment to the managers of the fees hereinafter prescribed. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle, or an equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of land cultivated by him, but subject to the payment aforesaid.

3. The fees for depasturing cattle shall be at the rate of (10s.) Ten shillings per head for mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules; (6s.) Six shillings per head for oxen, cows, heifers, and steers; and (2s.) Two shillings per head for small cattle.

4. The managers shall appoint certain times and places for the registering and branding of cattle, and shall give notice thereof, and shall, by their herdsman, attend at such times and places for the purposes aforesaid; and all persons desirous of depasturing cattle shall be in attendance with their cattle at the time and place appointed, for the purpose of assisting to brand the same, and shall pay the prescribed fees for such cattle before the same be branded.

5. All fees shall be paid in advance half-yearly, the licenses dating from 1st January and 1st July in each year. No fees shall be charged for the progeny of registered cattle which, in the opinion of the managers or herdsman, are under six months old.

6. No bulls, entire horses, rams, pigs, or goats will be allowed to depasture on the common without the special consent of the managers.

7. All large cattle shall have a distinguishing brand on them, and large horned cattle shall be marked with the common brand.

8. The managers shall not be responsible for any loss or injury of or to any cattle depasturing on the common.

9. The herdsman shall be required to give immediate notice to owners when he becomes aware of their cattle having strayed off the common.

10. The herdsman will be empowered to impound all cattle, pigs, and goats trespassing on the common, or to proceed against the owners by summonses.

11. Persons removing cattle shall be allowed to substitute others, upon payment of a registration fee of One shilling per head.

12. No person shall be allowed to transfer his or her right of commonage.

13. At the time of placing cattle on the common the owner thereof shall furnish a statement in writing, setting forth the extent of his or her occupation, together with the number of acres under cultivation, and give the herdsman a memorandum in writing of the number, brands, and description of the cattle so placed on the common; and all the cattle shall have the owner's fire-brands thereon.

14. Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty not exceeding (£20) Twenty pounds.

SHIRE OF ECHUCA.—REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE TORRUMBERRY AND UNDERA FARMERS' COMMONS, BOTH CONTAINED WITHIN THE WESTERN RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF ECHUCA.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869*, power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations for the management of commons, and in pursuance of the provisions of chapter XIII. of the regulations made under the said Act by the Governor in Council, on the 26th day of May 1873, the Council of the shire of Echuca, as Managers of the Torrumberry and Undera Farmers' Commons, submit to the Board of Land and Works for approval the following regulations, viz.:

1st. In the construction and for the purposes of these regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules; the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep; the word "farmer" shall mean a person who resides on and uses, for the purpose of agriculture or dairying, land held by that person either in fee, or under lease or license issued under *The Land Act 1862*, *The Amending Land Act 1865*, or *The Land Act 1869*.

2nd. Chapter XIII. of the regulations made under *The Land Act 1869*, by the Governor in Council, on the 26th day of May 1873, is hereby adopted, in so far as its provisions can apply to farmers' commons proclaimed under the said Act.

3rd. The fees for depasturing shall, in all cases, be payable quarterly in advance, on the first days of January, April, July, and October in each year, and so on in proportion for any less period not under one month; and all cattle remaining on either of the above-named commons seven days after the

period for which payment has been made may be impounded without notice.

4th. The fees to be paid for depasturing on either of the above-named commons shall be as follows:—For every cow, heifer, bullock, or steer, at the rate of Four shillings per annum; for every mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule, at the rate of Five shillings per annum; for every sheep at the rate of Two shillings per annum.

5th. No person shall be allowed to transfer his or her right of commonage.

6th. No entire horse, bull, or ram shall be allowed to run on either of the above-named commons.

7th. All sheep depasturing on either of the above-named commons must be tended by and in charge of a shepherd.

8th. Persons depasturing sheep shall be responsible for the same being kept on such portion of the common as the managers may from time to time set apart for their use; and sheep trespassing on any other part of the common may be impounded.

9th. At the time of depasturing cattle, the owners thereof shall hand to the herdsman a memorandum in writing setting forth the extent of land in their occupation, the number of acres of such land under cultivation, and specifying also the number, brands, and description of the cattle depastured.

10th. Cattle shall not be taken off either of the above-named commons without notice to the herdsman from the owners thereof, except in cases where they may be frequently required, when the managers may, if they think proper, grant permission to the owners to remove and replace the same at pleasure, in a quiet manner, so as not to interfere with or disturb other stock unnecessarily; but the herdsman shall not be considered to have any supervision whatsoever over such cattle.

11th. Any person having right of commonage, or the managers of any neighboring common, may register with the herdsman of any common the description and brands of any missing cattle in a book to be kept for that purpose, upon payment of a fee of One shilling for every head of cattle so registered; and such cattle if found on such common shall not be impounded until notice has been given to the owners or person registering, who shall be required to remove the same within fourteen days from such notice being given, otherwise they shall be impounded.

12th. Cattle becoming diseased, after being placed on either of the above-named commons, shall be removed within twenty-four hours after notice by the herdsman to the owner thereof; and in case such cattle be not removed within the time specified, the same shall be removed or destroyed at the expense of the owner. No dead cattle shall remain on the common; should such not be removed within twelve hours after notice has been given to the owner thereof, they shall be removed at the owner's expense.

13th. Managers of commons shall not be responsible for any cattle placed on their respective commons.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

WHEREAS by the 229th clause of the Act Victoria No. 506, entitled "An Act to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to Local Government," it is enacted that every bye-law, ordinance in the nature of a bye-law, or regulations in force in any municipality may be altered or repealed by any subsequent bye-law inconsistent therewith: And whereas the Council of the Borough of Brighton deems it expedient to alter bye-law No. 27, regulating the places and times at and

during which persons of either sex shall be entitled to bathe: In pursuance of the powers conferred by the above recited Act, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Brighton order as follows:—

1st. From the first day of October in every year to the following thirtieth day of April, both inclusive, the part hereinafter mentioned of the beach or shore of Port Phillip Bay adjoining the borough shall be and the same is hereby set apart as bathing ground exclusively for females between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. of every day during the above period.

*Part of the beach referred to.*

1st. Between the prolongation to high-water mark of the centre of McMillan street and the continuation to high-water mark of the north side of the jetty near Park street.

2nd. No male person above the age of Ten years shall bathe upon any portion of the said bathing ground, or within fifty yards from the water-edge thereof, within the time hereinbefore exclusively limited to females.

3rd. No male person shall, within such time before mentioned, unnecessarily resort to or linger about the said bathing ground when any female is bathing or having just bathed.

4th. No person of either sex shall bathe upon that portion of the said bathing ground between the prolongation to high-water mark of the south boundary of Bay street, and the continuation to high-water mark of the north side of the jetty, near Park street, or within fifty yards from the water-edge thereof, after the hour of 6 p.m.

5th. Any person who shall offend against this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6th. From and after the coming into force of this bye-law, bye-law No. 27 shall be and is hereby repealed.

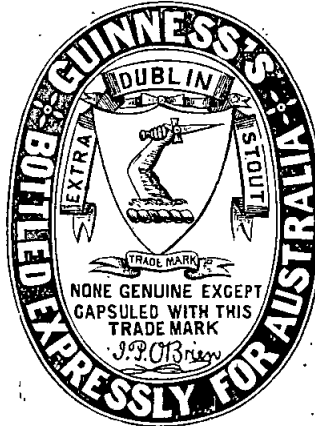
