CAUTION.

HARBOR OF LYTTELTON.

During the dredging operations now in hand in the fairway at the entrance of the Inner Harbor, between the two moles, the masters of all vessels are cautioned to take the entrance to the eastward of the dredge and her buoys.

The dredge's south-west bower anchor will be laid down about 400 feet outside the moles, and will be buoyed with a striped black and white buoy. The dredge's side-moorings will be similarly buoyed.

Masters of all vessels are hereby cautioned against going near or over the dredge moorings, and, in case of all steamers, are required to slow their engines to less than half-speed for at least 100 yards before arriving abreast of the dredge, in accordance with the *New Zealand Harbor Regulations, No. 102*.

This notification to take effect from and after the 14th May 1877, and to remain in force until revised or altered.

Masters of vessels are cautioned against entering between the moles at night.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim

BRIAGOLONG

a place where publicans' licenses may be specially granted.

PORT AND HARBOR REGULATIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Passengers, Harbors, and Navigation Statute 1865* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of ports in Victoria, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs, and might appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations; and from time to time in like manner might alter, amend, or repeal any such limits, boundaries, rules, and regulations, and substitute others in their stead: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby frame the clauses hereinafter numbered 35A, 101A, and 101B as *additional Port and Harbor Regulations*.

ADDITIONAL PORT AND HARBOR REGULATIONS.

35A. All ships and steamships within any port being at any of the public piers, jetties, or wharfs thereof shall be placed as the harbormaster, piermaster, or officer in charge of such public pier, jetty, or wharf may direct, and shall be subject to the orders of the harbormaster, piermaster, or officer in charge in regard to moving or shifting, and in regard to the extent of accommodation such ships or steamships may require from each other.

101A. When two or more steamers having passengers or goods on board arrive at any public pier, jetty, or wharf at or about the same time, and have occasion to land or take on board passengers or goods, the steamer last in arriving shall stop not less than 50 yards from the other steamer, and remain until the operations of the latter shall be completed, which must be carried out with all despatch.

101B. The master or other person in charge of all steamships carrying passengers shall depart punctually from any public pier, jetty, or wharf at the hour publicly advertised and fixed for sailing; excepting always in case of accidents actually happening to the machinery or hull, which must be immediately reported to the piermaster or officer in charge of said public pier, jetty, or wharf; and when any steamer is prevented from sailing at the hour originally announced, the harbormaster, piermaster, or officer in charge shall have power to shift her, in order to make way for the next vessel in turn for the berth.

The births of 627 children, viz., 292 boys and 335 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of April. In the month of March 672 births were registered, or 45 more than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in April numbered 442, viz., 232 of males and 210 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 185. The deaths were 6 more than those in March, and they exceeded the average of April during the previous ten years by 50. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found on the contrary to have been less than the average of those ten years by 22.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 86.0° on the 3rd, and the lowest was 39° on the 23th. The mean temperature of the month (58°) was slightly below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (37.9°) took place on the 3rd, viz., from a maximum of 86.0° to a minimum of 48.1°. The least range (8.1°) was on the 25th, viz., from a maximum of 55.1° to a minimum of 47.0°. The mean daily range was 20.2°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.070 inches) was above the average.

Deaths of males and of females recorded during the month were in the proportions of 52 and 48 per cent. respectively to the total number. Those of children under the age of 5 years amounted to 40 per cent. of the total, that being the same proportion as in April 1876, as against 47 per cent. in April 1875; 52½ per cent. in April 1874; 42 per cent. in April 1873; 50 per cent. in April 1872; 49 per cent. in April 1871; 50 per cent. in April 1870; 47 per cent. in April 1869; 52 per cent. in April 1868; and 56 per cent. in April 1867.

Sixteen deaths of persons who had attained the age of 75 years were registered in the month under review, viz.:—Those of a laborer, aged 76, of chronic rheumatism; a female, aged 76, of tumor; a farmer, aged 75, of gangrene of face; a female, aged 76, of apoplexy; an old soldier, aged 77, of paralysis; a male, aged 77, and a female, aged 80 (both inmates of the Kew Lunatic Asylum), of brain disease; a female, aged 79, of bronchitis; an importer, aged 77, of disease of the bladder; a groom, aged 79, and four females, aged 79, 83, 84, and 86 respectively, of old age; a female (a teacher of music), aged 83, of fracture of the femur; and a laborer, aged 75, of rupture of the urethra.

Fifteen deaths from external causes were recorded during the month, 10 of which are ascribed to accident, 2 to homicide, and 3 to suicide. The following are the particulars:—A laborer, aged 24, died of paralysis, the result of an injury to the spine caused by falling from a tree; a waiter, aged 49, died of fracture of the skull, also caused by a fall; a female teacher of music, aged 83, died of fracture of the femur; a porter, aged 25, died of tetanus, the result of an accidental wound in the elbow; a male infant, aged 8 months, died of scalds; two female infants, aged 9 months and 2 years respectively, died of burns; a girl, aged 5, succumbed to an overdose of whiskey; a tailor, aged 72, was found drowned in the River Yarra; a male infant, aged 12 months, was suffocated in bed with its mother. Of the deaths from homicide, a tailor, aged 63, was wilfully murdered, his skull having been fractured; and a laborer, aged 75, died of the effects of a kick in the urethra. Of those who committed suicide, a laborer, aged 55, stabbed himself in the belly whilst suffering from phreno-pneumonia; a brickmaker, aged 42, and a laborer, aged 52, drowned themselves in the River Yarra.

Ninety-eight deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—48 in the Melbourne Hospital, 7 in the Immigrants' Home, 11 in the Alfred Hospital, 8 in the Lying-in Hospital, 9 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Pentridge Stockade, and 1 in the Melbourne Industrial Schools.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 178, of which 93, or 52 per cent., were of males; and 85, or 48 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 108 were under one year of age, 56 were between one and two, 7 were between two and three, 3 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 264. Of these, 139, or 53 per cent., were males and 125, or 47 per cent., were females; 16 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 16 were between fifteen and twenty, 12 were between twenty and twenty-five, 15 were between twenty-five and thirty, 21 were between thirty and thirty-five, 20 were between thirty-five and forty, 26 were between forty and forty-five, 25 were between forty-five and fifty, 25 were between fifty and fifty-five, 13 were between fifty-five and sixty, 18 were between sixty and sixty-five, 13 were between sixty-five and seventy, 20 were between seventy and seventy-five, 11 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 5 were upwards of eighty.

Most deaths were set down to local diseases, chiefly those having their seat in the nervous and digestive systems. Of zymotic diseases, diarrhoea and dysentery were the most fatal and caused 61 deaths as against 76 in March. Typhoid fever caused 29 deaths as against 27 in March. Since the beginning of the year 88 deaths have been set down to this complaint. Of constitutional diseases phthisis caused 47 deaths as against 48 in March. In addition to the 2 deaths set down to childbirth 1 woman died of pleurisy supervening upon her confinement.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND
MANAGEMENT OF THE ELMHURST CRICKET
AND RECREATION RESERVE.

WHEREAS by the 108th section of *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the Regulations following to be observed and enforced in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order of 23rd April 1877 as a site for a Cricket Ground, and other purposes of Public recreation in the Town of Elmhurst.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against any decency as regards his dress, language, or conduct.
2. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers on the reserve.
3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones on the reserve.
4. No fires shall be lighted in the reserve without the consent in writing of the committee of management.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee of management.
6. No person shall erect any dwelling on the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent in writing of the committee of management to be first obtained.
7. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots that may be enclosed within the reserve for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

REGULATIONS FOR A COMMON.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE
CRESWICK BOROUGH COMMON.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations for the management of commons, and in pursuance of the provisions of chapter xiii. of the regulations made under the said Act by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of May 1873, the Council of the Borough of Creswick, as managers of the Creswick Borough Common, submit to the Board of Land and Works for approval the following regulations for the management of the said common:—

1. The borough common shall be held to include all land heretofore proclaimed in the *Government Gazette* for borough common purposes at Creswick, together with such addition or additions as may hereafter be made to such common in accordance with law.
2. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers may respectively depasture, within a distance of five miles from their place of residence, four head of large cattle, or the equivalent thereof in part or in whole of small cattle on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.
3. All persons depasturing cattle upon the common shall be required to take out licenses and pay fees for same at the rate of four shillings per head per annum for large cattle, and one shilling and fourpence per head per annum for small cattle.
4. All persons taking cattle to the common shall be required to deliver them into the charge of the herdsman, together with a duplicate of the written statement of the number, description, and brand of the cattle so delivered; they must also produce their depasturing license, which the herdsman will countersign to prevent any transfer or imposition. The herdsman will give a receipt for the cattle delivered to him,

and enter a copy of it in the herd-book, and shall afterwards proceed to brand the cattle with the common brand in pitch or paint; the owners in all cases to render every assistance to the herdsman during the branding; provided that it shall be optional with the owners of horses whether they have them branded with the common brand or not.

5. All cattle returning home from the common must be brought back by the owner and redelivered to the herdsman, but should the herdsman see any cattle straying from the common he shall be required to bring them back, but in no case shall the herdsman be held responsible for the absolute loss of cattle.

6. Cattle under six months of age, being the progeny of cattle depastured under license upon the common, to be free; but no bulls, riggs, or entires over the age of nine months shall be depastured upon the common without the written consent of the managers.

7. The herdsman shall be required to see that travelling herds and flocks of sheep shall keep strictly within the limits of the boundaries in passing over the common as provided in section 103 of the *Land Act 1869*.

8. The managers may from time to time call upon the owners of stock by advertisement in any newspaper circulating in the district to come forward to rebrand their cattle; and if such order be disregarded for a period of two days the herdsman shall rebrand such cattle at the expense of the owners thereof; provided that the cost of such rebranding shall not exceed one shilling per head.

9. Substitution licenses will be granted in lieu of licenses in respect of those cattle permanently removed from the common, but only in such cases in which the owner shall give notice to the herdsman of such removal, and sign the herdsman's delivery book.

10. The managers may at any time require persons putting cattle upon the common to satisfactorily prove the *bona fide* ownership of such cattle, also that they are entitled from their proximity to the common to depasture stock.

11. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the common, and shall be removed within twelve hours of notice to that effect being served upon the owner or his representative. In the event of such notice being disregarded such diseased animal shall be destroyed by the herdsman.

12. The secretary shall attend at his office, Town Hall, on each Saturday afternoon, from one to four o'clock, to register the cattle and receive the fees from all persons entitled to depasture cattle on the said common. Any person failing to pay the fees within one week after they are due will be liable to have his cattle impounded.

13. The money derived from the fees for the agistment of cattle on the common may, in addition to the defraying of remuneration of the secretary and herdsman, be expended by the managers in the publication of these regulations, the purchase of books, stationery, branding irons, and tar, and the eradication of thistles on the common. The surplus over such expenditure may be applied (with the concurrence of the Board of Land and Works) to any public purpose, and to the formation of dams for storage of water on the common, the improvement of natural waterholes, the construction and repair of stockyards, and the improvement of the approaches to the common.

14. The herdsman shall attend at such places and times as may be directed by the managers to receive and brand cattle, give receipts for same, exercise due vigilance for their safety, muster the cattle when required by the managers for any purpose, and impound stray cattle under the direction of the managers.

15. The fees derivable from impounding cattle from the common to be added to the general fund thereof; and the herdsman shall be required to bring forward at each meeting of the managers the number of such impoundings (if any), and the amount of revenue derived therefrom.

16. The common brand to be registered in the surrounding pounds, viz.:—Ballarat, Creswick, and Bungaree Shires; Clunes, Daylesford, and Creswick Boroughs; and the herdsman shall give notice to owners of stock entitled to pasturage that may get impounded in any such pounds, within twenty-four hours after receiving notice from the poundkeepers; and the cost of releasing cattle from the pound shall in all cases be paid by the owner thereof.

17. Any complaints against the herdsman of negligence, misconduct, or connivance to put cattle on the common without payment of fees for same, must be in writing; and should the managers, after investigation, consider such charges substantiated, they shall have power to dismiss such offender summarily.

18. The herdsman shall produce all books and accounts in connection with the common once a month, or oftener if required, at the office of the managers to be examined, and to conform to such other regulations as the Borough Council may from time to time consider necessary for the proper working of the common.

19. The mayor of the Borough Council for the time being shall be treasurer of the common, and all moneys received for fees by the secretary must be paid to the said treasurer, who shall place the same in the Bank of Australasia, or such other bank as may be appointed from time to time, to the credit of the managers. All payments to be made by cheque signed by the said treasurer and not less than two managers before payment of the same.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds for each offence.

TOOLAMBA WEST PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE TOOLAMBA WEST GENERAL CEMETERY.

All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is open.

2. Any person making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon the payment of the proper charges, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the separate use of such person or persons, or his or their representatives.

3. Application of such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the proper charges.

4. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on a certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

5. Orders for interment to be given between the hours of Ten a.m. and Three p.m. on the previous day.

6. The name, age, late place of residence, and date of death of deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.

7. Unless otherwise ordered the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. in

the month of September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months, except Sundays, when the only hours for funerals will be from Eleven a.m. to Four p.m. throughout the year.

8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and grave-stones to be kept in repair and in proper condition at the expense of the owners.

9. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

10. The position of all graves to be determined by the trustees.

11. All graves must be sunk to a depth of not less than six feet.

12. A drawing of every stone, font, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument according to description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan of ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner.

13. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office of the trustees, and may be inspected, and a register of grants is kept by the secretary.

14. The keeper has orders to turn out or to take into custody, as he may be legally empowered, any person who shall behave indecorously or commit any trespass or injury to the trees, flowers, or other erections, or otherwise infringe *The Cemeteries Statute*, and such persons will be proceeded against according to law.

15. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

BYE-LAWS OF THE BOARD OF MANAGEMENT OF THE MOOROOPNA HOSPITAL.

1. The object of the institution is for the purpose of affording surgical and medical relief in cases of accident or disease.

GOVERNMENT.

2. The officers of the hospital shall be directed by a board of management, consisting of the president, vice-presidents, treasurer, and not more than three honorary medical officers, and a committee of twelve life members or yearly subscribers elected at each annual meeting; and in accordance with the provisions of the Hospitals Act one-third of the elected portion of the board shall only retire annually after the first election under the Act (viz., the election of 1877), the one-third lowest on the poll to retire the first year, and the one-third next lowest on the poll to retire the second year, and every succeeding year the one-third longest in office; the retiring members to be eligible for re-election.

LIFE MEMBERS AND THEIR PRIVILEGES.

3. That a payment of £20 shall constitute a life member, who shall have the privileges of recommending three in-door or six out-door patients annually, and shall be permitted to vote by proxy at annual or special meetings of the subscribers, and shall be eligible to be elected a member of the board of management. In the event of a number of ladies organizing a bazaar in aid of the hospital whereby a sum of £100 shall have been realized for the charity, such ladies shall have the power of nominating one of their number as a life member, and shall also have power to nominate a life member for every £100 so collected.

That the board of management shall have power to elect honorary life members for special services rendered to the hospital.

ANNUAL SUBSCRIBERS AND THEIR PRIVILEGES.

4. That a subscription of £1 a year shall qualify an annual subscriber, who shall be eligible to be elected a member of the board of management and to vote at the special or annual meetings of the subscribers during the financial year in which such subscription is paid.

Annual subscribers shall have the privilege of recommending one in-door or two out-door patients for every pound they shall subscribe, the power of recommending patients to continue in force for twelve months after the date of payment of subscription, but no new subscriber shall be entitled to recommend a patient until three months after date of payment of subscription.

THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING AND ELECTION OF A BOARD OF MANAGEMENT.

5. The annual general meeting shall be held on the second Thursday in January in each year for the purpose of receiving the report of the board for the past year and of electing a new board to manage the affairs of the hospital for the current year; each candidate to be proposed and seconded by an annual or life member, and the votes to be recorded by ballot; and no person who has not paid a sum of £1 for the current year, or shall not be a life member, shall be privileged to be a member of the board of management or vote at the annual general meeting.

BOARD OF MANAGEMENT—POWER AND DUTIES.

6. The board of management shall direct the collection of funds, appoint and dismiss all paid officers and servants, frame regulations for the management of the hospital (the same not

to be repugnant to the Hospitals Act), present an annual report to the general meeting, and manage the affairs of the institution generally. They shall meet for general business on the second Tuesday in each month, and for special business when requisite, by direction of the president or four members of the board. The board, at their first meeting, shall elect two sub-committees (six members to be on each committee), one to be designated the Finance Committee, who shall examine all accounts sent in for payment and check them with the "Provision Consumption Account" previously to their being passed for payment by the board of management; such accounts to be made up to the last day in each month, and to be sent into the board four clear days before the day of meeting. The other sub-committee to be named the Visiting or House Committee, who shall visit the hospital at least once a month, in order to examine the state of the stock and report thereon to the general board. They shall recommend the purchase or repair of any articles required for the use of patients, and order repairs of building when essentially required, provided the expense does not exceed £2.

HONORARY SECRETARY AND DUTIES.

7. The board of management at their first meeting shall elect one of the board as honorary secretary (if practicable). The secretary shall keep the minutes and records of the hospital, conduct the correspondence and carry out the resolutions of the board. He shall also convene special meetings of the subscribers when directed by the president, the board of management, or on the written requisition of ten annual subscribers.

AUDITORS AND DUTIES.

8. The annual general meeting shall elect two contributors, not members of the board, as auditors for that year. The auditors shall at the end of each year examine the treasurer's financial report, and all accounts, vouchers, and documents relating thereto, and shall report thereon to the annual general meeting. The treasurer's half-yearly reports to be made up to the 30th June and the 31st December in each year.

TREASURER AND DUTIES.

9. The annual general meeting shall elect a treasurer, who shall receive all money on behalf of the institution, and invest the same in such bank as the board shall direct, to the credit of the hospital. He shall pay all accounts passed by them by drafts on the bank, which shall be countersigned by the president and the secretary. He shall also issue cards to the contributors for the admission of patients, and submit half-yearly reports for each half year ended the 30th June and the 31st December to the general meeting, having been previously examined by the auditors.

HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

10. The annual general meeting shall elect not more than three consulting medical officers, who must be legally qualified medical practitioners. They shall have access to the hospital at all times, and in case of their observing any neglect or inattention to the patients it shall be their duty to report the same to the board of management. They shall attend the hospital when required for consultation, and shall make such arrangements for ordinary visits as may be deemed advisable by them in the interests of the institution.

ELECTION OF PRESIDENT AND VICE-PRESIDENTS—PRIVILEGES OF HONORARY OFFICERS.

11. The annual general meeting shall elect a president and two vice-presidents, who, together with the treasurer and honorary medical officers shall be members of the board of management, and of all sub-committees, by virtue of their office.

QUORUM OF MEMBERS.

12. Four members of the board of management shall constitute a quorum at the monthly meetings.

VACANCIES.

13. Should vacancies occur in the offices of president, vice-president, treasurer, or consulting medical officers, or if any member of the board shall die, or resign by letter under his hand addressed to the chairman of the board, or become insolvent, or be convicted of any treason, felony, or misdemeanor, or be absent from four consecutive meetings of the board, his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of the board may declare his office vacant, and at the next ordinary meeting temporarily elect thereto an annual subscriber or life member of the hospital until the next annual meeting for the election of the board, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire, together with those who by the provisions of the Act are required to go out of office.

PAYING PATIENTS.

14. Patients who are able to pay for medical attendance, medicines, and maintenance, shall, on admission, be charged at the rate of 30s. per week, which amount may be increased or reduced by the board of management; and the general rules and regulations of the institution shall be applicable to and observed by them while in the hospital.

DESTITUTE PATIENTS.

15. Patients in destitute circumstances shall be required to make a declaration to that effect before a justice of the peace prior to their admission into the hospital.

CERTIFICATE OF ADMISSION.

16. Each annual subscriber shall receive a certificate from the treasurer that his yearly contribution has been paid, which will enable him to recommend one in-door or two out-door patients; and the treasurer shall furnish each life member with certificates for the admission of three in-door or six out-door patients; and that a subscription of ten shillings shall entitle the subscriber to a certificate for recommending one out-door patient.

PROPERTY OF DECEASED PERSONS.

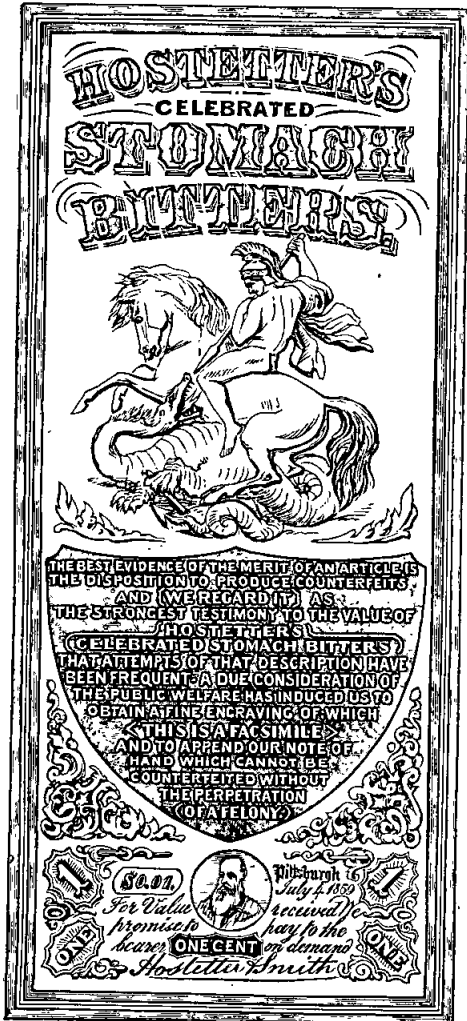
