ALTERATION OF LIGHT, BURNETT RIVER HEADS.

On and after this date the Temporary Light at the South Head of the Burnett River will be replaced by a Fixed Catoptric Light of the fifth order, which will be seen from seaward between the bearings of N.W. by W. and S.E. by E. The lens is placed at an elevation of 87 feet above the mean sea level, and will be visible from a distance of 10 or 11 miles. The tower from which the light is exhibited is hexagonal and painted white, and stands near the extreme point of the South Head.

The Leading Lights for crossing the Bar will also, after this date, be exhibited every night between sunset and sunrise.

Vessels from the northward, intending to enter the Burnett, should not approach within three miles of the shore abreast the Burnett Banks until the light bears W.S.W., when they should steer for it and bring the leading lights into line for crossing the Bar.

THE commander of H.N.M. Surveying vessel *Hydrograaf* reports, that in search of the Hypogriffe Shoal, Gaspar Straits, he found it formed by four reefs laying in a circle of 1000 met. diameter and lat. en long., as given in Tindlay's Directory for the India Archipelago, China, and Japan.

It is the same danger on some charts mentioned as Sharpshooters Reef.

Blas-Maten rock has been found in lat. 3° 22' 8" S., and long. 107° 55' 15" E., bearing shoal water island N. 80° E. at a distance of about 17 miles.

SINGAPORE STRAITS.

POSITION, &c., of a coral shoal one mile S.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. from Sultan Beacon.

A coral patch was found by Her Majesty's ship, under my command, with only 19 feet of water over it low water (spring tide) one mile S.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. from the Sultan Beacon. The Admiralty Chart, No. 2403, of the Singapore Strait showing 10 fathoms at the spot.

It is a coral patch with sharp pinacles, the lead when sounding on it falling from 19 to 23 feet.

It extends half a cable in a N.E. by N. and S.W. by S. direction, the least water (19 feet) being found at the S.W. by S. extremity, but it does not extend in any other direction.

The following bearings (magnetic) were taken from the ship whilst at anchor in 5 fathoms on the shoal:—

Sultan Shoal Beacon, N.W. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W.

Raffles Light (Cony Island), S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.

Tanjong Bolus, W. by N.

A LARGE Iron Nunn Buoy, painted red, has been placed on the centre of the Coral Shoal touched by the s.s. *Ajax* when drawing 23 feet water, on the morning of the 30th April 1877, after passing the Sultan Shoal Beacon, and steering the mid-channel course for New Harbor Heads.

This shoal has been carefully sounded all over by Captain Willcox, H.M.'s ship *Grouler*, who reports that it only extends half a cable's length N.E. by N. and S.W. by S., and that in shape it was a kind of pyramid patch, and the least water found was 19 feet at low water spring tides.

The buoy should be given a berth of two cables' length each way, and the position is one mile S.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. from Sultan Shoal Beacon, i.e.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1874 (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Borough of Stawell has requested that certain streets within the said borough be so declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the lands in the Borough of Stawell reserved or used for the streets hereinafter named and described to be public highways within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to the undermentioned Common the Crown lands hereinafter described, that is to say:-

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE PYALONG UNITED TOWN AND FARMERS' COMMON.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869*, power is given to the Go-
vernor in Council to frame regulations for the management
of commons, and in pursuance of the provisions of chapter xiii.
of the regulations made under the said Act by the Governor
in Council on the 26th day of May 1878, the Council of the
Shire of Pyalong, as Managers of the Pyalong United Town
and Farmers' Common, submit to the Board of Land and
Works for approval the following Regulations for the man-
agement of the said common, in lieu of the Regulations
approved on the 23rd day of June 1873:—

1st. *Persons entitled to commonage.*—Owners and occupiers of
land, holders of miners' rights, business and carriers' licences,

residing within five miles of the common shall be entitled to
depasture cattle thereon.

2nd. *Number of cattle allowed.*—Irrespective of land held,
each person shall be allowed to depasture, as the maximum
number, four head of large cattle or the equivalent in small
cattle. Owners and occupiers of land having under culti-
vation not less than one-tenth portion of land occupied by
them shall be entitled to depasture one additional head for
every ten acres so held, but in no case shall the total number
allowed to any person exceed twenty-eight head of large
cattle, or the equivalent in small.

3rd. *Depasturing fees.*—The fees for depasturing cattle shall
in all cases be paid to the herdsman at the time of branding,
and shall be as follows:—Large cattle, Four shillings per
head; horses, Eight shillings per head; and small cattle, One
shilling and fourpence per head per annum.

4th. *Responsibility of herdsman.*—The responsibility of the
herdsman for all cattle, branded and received on the common,
shall extend to his preventing the straying of such as shall
have been running on the common for a period of not less
than three months; nevertheless he shall exercise equal vigi-
lance over all cattle placed under his charge. Should, however,
any cattle be impounded he shall give a written notice of such
impounding to the owner or owners thereof within two days,
by delivery of such notice at his or their known place of
residence, and the proof of such delivery shall exonerate the
herdsman from further responsibility as to their release.
Failing, however, to prove the delivery of the notice, as herein
prescribed, the herdsman shall release such cattle at his own
cost.

5th. *Pounds to which the responsibility extends.*—The pounds to
which the foregoing regulations shall apply are the McIvor
Creek pound and the Sugarloaf Creek pound.

6th. *Herding and removals.*—No person depasturing cattle will
be permitted to herd his own cattle, nor shall he remove them
from the common without the knowledge of the herdsman. If,
however, in the interim of the periods which may from time to
time be fixed for branding, any owner of cattle intends to
remove his stock, or any portion of them, from the common,
he may do so by delivering a written notice to the herdsman
of such intention, and shall specify in such notice the cattle
proposed to be removed, and the day of removal, prior to
which he shall give a receipt for the same to the herdsman,
and the cattle so removed may be replaced without extra fee
by an equal number of others, or their equivalent, upon such
being produced to the herdsman for branding and registration.
Any breach of this regulation shall exonerate the herdsman
from further responsibility in respect of any cattle belonging
to such owner.

7th. *Bulls and entire horses.*—Bulls and entire horses will not
be allowed on the common.

8th. *Cattle to be produced and aid to be afforded by owners in
mustering.*—All cattle intended to be depastured on the com-
mon shall, in the first instance, be produced to the herdsman
by the owner, either at the common yards or the premises of
the owner, for the purpose of being branded and registered,
and the owner shall also furnish him, in writing, with the par-
ticulars of their private brands and general description; and
at each periodic branding the owner shall afford the herdsman
all reasonable aid in mustering his cattle.

9th. *Receipt for cattle.*—The herdsman shall give a block
receipt for all cattle registered by him.

10th. *Goats.*—No person shall be allowed to depasture more
than twelve goats on the common.

11th. *Impounding trespassing stock.*—The herdsman shall not
in any case impound stock found trespassing on the common
without a special order from the managers or their secretary.

12th. *Common register.*—The common register shall be open
at the secretary's office, and may be inspected at all reasonable
times, without fee, by any person who shall have stock running
on the common.

13th. *Contagious diseases.*—No animal infected with any con-
tagious disease shall be allowed on the common.

14th. *Herdsman's report.*—The herdsman shall pay over to
the shire secretary, the treasurer, all moneys received by him
on account of the common, within one month of their receipt,
and shall furnish a written report to each monthly meeting of
the managers. If, however, any special contingency should
arise in the interim of the meetings, imperilling the interests
of the common, he shall, without delay, report the same to the
managers through their secretary.

15th. *Herdsman's privilege.*—The herdsman shall have the
privilege of running three horses and three head of cattle upon
the common without liability to pay the prescribed fees.

16th. Every person offending against any of the preceding
regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and
pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

17th. *Interpretation.*—The term "large cattle" in the fore-
going regulations shall include any horse, mare, gelding,
yearling, colt, filly, ass, or mule, also any cow, ox, yearling-
steer, or heifer; and the term "small cattle" shall include any
ram, ewe, sheep, lamb, goat, or pig. Three head of small
cattle shall be deemed equivalent to one head of large cattle.

These regulations shall come into force on the
day of 1877.

STATUTE 1864."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, called *The Weights and Measures Statute 1864*, it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council,

at the request of and pursuant to any agreement made by the Councils or Boards of any two or more of any adjoining boroughs, shires, and road districts, might proclaim such boroughs, shires, and districts to be a Union for the purposes of the said Act, and by such Proclamation fix the proportion in which the expenses devolving upon such union under the said Act should be borne by the several bodies corporate of such boroughs, shires, or districts: And whereas the Shire of Kyneton, the Borough of Malmesbury, and the Borough of Woodend, and the Road District of Woodend, Newham, and Rochford (now the Shire of Newham), were proclaimed a Union on the 15th September 1865: And whereas the Councils of the above-named shires and borough have agreed to admit the Shire of Metcalfe into the said Union, and the Councils of the said districts have requested that the same may be proclaimed a Union, and that the expenses devolving upon such union under the said Act may be borne in the proportion of four-ninths by the Shire of Kyneton, two-ninths by the Shire of Newham, two-ninths by the Shire of Metcalfe, and one-ninth by the Borough of Malmesbury: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Shires of Kyneton, Newham, and Metcalfe, and the Borough of Malmesbury to be a Union for the purposes of the said Act, and do fix the proportion in which the expenses devolving upon such Union under the said Act shall be borne, viz., by the Council of the Shire of Kyneton, four-ninths; by the Council of the Shire of Newham, two-ninths; by the Council of the Shire of Metcalfe, two-ninths; and by the Council of the Borough of Malmesbury, one-ninth.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eighteenth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and in the fortieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

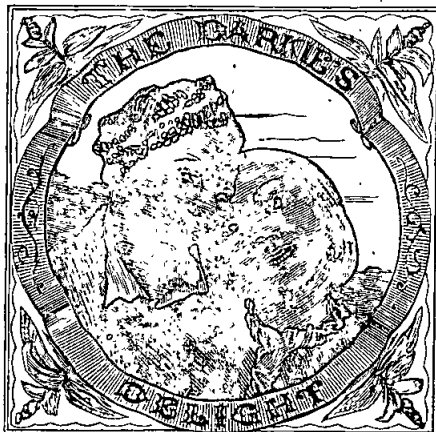

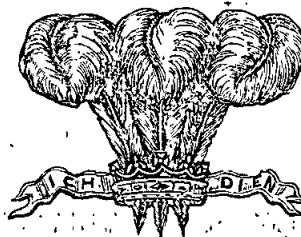
