PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Passengers, Harbors, and Navigation Statute* 1865 it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of ports in Victoria and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs, and might appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations; and from time to time in like manner might alter, amend, or repeal any such limits, boundaries, rules, and regulations, and substitute others in their stead: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby frame the clause hereinafter numbered 67 A as an Additional Port and Harbor Regulation, viz.:

67 A.—Such certificates may be cancelled or suspended when it shall be found to the satisfaction of the Chief Harbormaster that any engine is out of repair, or that any engine-driver has been guilty of such misconduct as in the opinion of the Chief Harbormaster constitutes a sufficient cause for the cancellation or suspension of any certificate issued under the preceding clause.

and Horned Hill S. 4 E.

The Police Magistrate's House on Vivien Point being nearly in line with the south-east peak of Friday Island.

Vessels entering the Passage from the eastward should keep the north point of Prince of Wales Island in line with the north-west extremity of Horn Island while passing the line of the Midway Hill and King Point. After passing this line, the northern end of Channel Rock should be steered for until the north-west end of Horn Island bears S.W., when the buoys at the eastern end of Ellis Channel will be in sight, and a course may be steered for the anchorage under Thursday Island accordingly.

REGULATIONS.

2. The following persons shall not be admitted to the first division of the reserve:—
 - (1) Any person proved to the satisfaction of the trustees to have been at any time guilty of any malpractice or dishonorable conduct in connection with racing.
 - (2) Any person proved to the satisfaction of the trustees to be a defaulter.
3. All persons paying for admission to the first of the said divisions shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he or she shall, upon demand, produce or (if required) surrender to all gatekeepers and other persons having authority from the trustees to demand the production or surrender of the same.
4. No person shall take any dog into either of the said divisions or any building thereon.
5. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards his or her dress, language, or conduct.
6. No person shall erect any dwelling or booth or other structure upon or within the reserve without the consent of the trustees.
7. Any person committing in the reserve, or in any building or erection for the time being thereon, any of the following offences, shall, together with any horses, carriages, or other vehicles in their possession or care, be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased and is or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the first or second division of the reserve:—
 - (1) Assaulting any other person.
 - (2) Being drunk.
 - (3) Riding, crossing, or trespassing upon the course, or on any part of it, during a race meeting, or when the horses are prepared to start, or are running for any race.
 - (4) Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
 - (5) Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
 - (6) Behaving improperly or riotously.
