NOTICE TO MASTERS OF VESSELS AND OTHERS.—DREDGING,
OPERATIONS IN LYTTELTON HARBOR.

THE notice issued by the Lyttelton Harbor Board, under date of 7th May 1877, will only remain in force up to Monday, 11th June next, when the following regulations will come into operation, and remain in force until revised or altered:—

During the dredging operations now in hand in the Fairway at the entrance of the Inner Harbor, between the two Moles, the masters of all vessels are cautioned to take the entrance to the westward of the dredge and her buoys.

The dredge's south-west bower anchor will be laid down 400 feet outside the Moles, and will be buoyed with a striped black-and-white buoy. The dredge's side moorings will be similarly buoyed.

Masters of all vessels are hereby cautioned against going near or over the dredge-moorings, and, in case of all steamers, are required to slow their engines to less than half-speed for at least 100 yards before arriving abreast of the dredge, in accordance with the "New Zealand Harbor Regulation, No. 102."

This notification to take effect from and after Monday the 11th June 1877, and to remain in force until revised or altered.

Masters of vessels are cautioned against entering between the Moles at night.

DIRECTIONS FOR BURRUM RIVER.

From the Fairway Buoy, Hervey's Bay, steer W.S.W. until the beacon on the bar of the Burrum, about 10½ miles distant, is sighted; or, if from the northward, do not, in passing Burrum Point, approach the shore within 1½ miles; then bring the bar beacon to bear W. by S. and steer for it, passing it at a distance of about 50 yards on the port hand, then keep the first red beacon (which will be seen to the W.N.W.) on the port bow, and as it is approached, gradually haul up and pass it at a distance of about 50 yards on the starboard hand. A black beacon, which stands on a rocky patch, will then be seen ahead, and, when passing it on the port hand, the first white leading mark will open out in north-westerly direction; steer for it, passing a black beacon on a sand-spit on the port hand. When abreast the white beacon, follow the starboard shore at a distance of about 100 yards until abreast of the high land, when another white leading mark, on the north shore, will open out; steer past it, and thence to a third beacon on an island; thence back to one on the north side of the entrance to the Gregory; thence to another, in a south-easterly direction, on the opposite shore, passing on the starboard side, and, at a distance of 40 yards, a red beacon on a ledge of rocks. When the white beacon is neared, another will be seen on the north shore. When it is reached, keep that shore close on board, passing a black beacon on the port hand. When abreast the upper part of the mangroves cross over to a white beacon on the south shore, and when it is passed keep a mid-channel course, leaving a black beacon on a sand-spit, on the port hand; thence follow the curving shore round past the mouth of the Isis River, rounding closely a bluff point. When abreast the next white beacon steer for another on the south shore, and keep that shore on board. After passing the next island below Blue's Flats, haul up sharp round a black beacon, and keep the port shore again on board, leaving a small island on

the starboard side. The channel here is very intricate. When abreast of the upper end of the next island, haul up round another black beacon, and regain and keep the port shore on board until a red beacon on a sand bank is neared; pass it close on the starboard hand and a black beacon on the port hand, and then steer for the next white beacon on the south shore, passing an island on the starboard hand; then keep the starboard shore on board, passing Waterhole Flats, where, in the centre of the river a sand patch dries at low water. When at these flats another white beacon will be in sight on the same side; steer for it, passing the islands on the port hand, and keep that shore close on board until three more beacons on the same shore are passed. When the last island is neared, steer for a white beacon on the port shore, leaving the island on the starboard hand. After passing the island keep a mid-channel course, and, when near Smith's house, haul over to the starboard shore, keeping that side to avoid some foul ground. From this point Whitley's coal shoot will be in sight, from the upper crossing mark to Whitley's Falls the river is clear from side to side.

Strangers would probably save time by anchoring close abreast the island below the Gregory, in 11 feet at low water, and by boat personally examining the channel of the river above this spot, before attempting to proceed further with their vessels.

The depth of water on the outer bar, at low-water springs, is 1 foot, with a rise of 9 feet; at neaps, 2 feet, with a rise of 5 feet; on the Flats, at springs, 1 foot, with a rise of 6 feet at neaps, 1 foot with a rise of 4 feet.

The births of 743 children, viz., 362 boys and 381 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of June. In the month of May 695 births were registered, or 48 less than in the month under review.

The deaths in June numbered 401, viz., 218 of males and 183 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 342. The deaths were less than those in May by 57, but exceeded the average of June during the previous ten years by 77. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of those ten years by 27 only.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 67.5° on the 5th, and the lowest was 35.5° on the 25th. The mean temperature of the month (49.2°) was more than a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (25.5°) took place on the 5th, viz., from a maximum of 67.5° to a minimum of 42.0°. The least range (6.3°) was on the 10th, viz., from a maximum of 56.1° to a minimum of 49.2°. The mean daily range was 14.0°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.212 inches) was a fourth of an inch above the average.

Of the deaths registered during the month 54 per cent. were of males, and 46 per cent. of females. Thirty-eight per cent. were of children under the age of 5 years as against 30 per cent. in June 1876; 32 per cent. in June 1875 and 1874; 33 per cent. in June 1873; 42 per cent. in June 1872; 37 per cent. in June 1871 and 1870; 40 per cent. in June 1869; 45 per cent. in June 1868; and 51 per cent. in June 1867.

The deaths of thirteen persons of the age of 75 years or upwards were returned during the month, viz.:—Those of a widow, aged 77, of erysipelas; a female, aged 77, of apoplexy; a female, aged 76, and a gentleman, aged 82, of bronchitis; a male, aged 79, of dyspepsia; a female servant, aged 79, and a gardener, aged 81, of jaundice; a laborer, aged 75, a female, a laborer, and a clergyman, each aged 76, and two females, aged 84 and 86 respectively, of old age.

Thirteen deaths from external violence were recorded during the month under review, of which all but one, a suicide, are set down to accident. The following are the particulars:—A banker, aged 47, died of fracture of the spinal column caused by part of a tree falling on him; an engineer, aged 62, died of fracture of the spine, caused by falling from a window; a female infant, aged 2 months, was accidentally poisoned by an overdose of morphia; a tobacco manufacturer, aged 14, died of narcotic poisoning from chewing tobacco; a female infant, aged 15 months, and a jeweller's apprentice, aged 18, were accidentally drowned, the latter in Port Phillip Bay; a publican, aged 48, was choked whilst eating; a female infant was accidentally suffocated during birth; three female infants, aged 1, 3, and 4 months respectively, were suffocated in bed; a male infant, aged 13 days, died of an accidental injury to head at birth. The suicidal death was that of a clerk, aged 25, who poisoned himself with laudanum whilst of unsound mind, induced by excessive drinking.

Eighty-two deaths, or 21 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—38 in the Melbourne Hospital; 10 in the Immigrants' Home, 2 in the Children's Hospital, 9 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Lying-in Hospital, 5 in the Benevolent Asylum, 2 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 11 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Industrial Schools.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 150, of which 73, or 49 per cent., were of males; and 77, or 51 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 74 were under one year of age, 41 were between one and two, 14 were between two and three, 13 were between three and four, and 8 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 251. Of these, 145, or 58 per cent., were males; and 106, or 42 per cent., were females; 20 were between five and ten, 13 were between ten and fifteen, 7 were between fifteen and twenty, 11 were between twenty and twenty-five, 14 were between twenty-five and thirty, 12 were between thirty and thirty-five, 25 were between thirty-five and forty, 25 were between forty and forty-five, 21 were between forty-five and fifty, 20 were between fifty and fifty-five, 23 were between fifty-five and sixty, 21 were between sixty and sixty-five, 15 were between sixty-five and seventy, 11 were between seventy and seventy-five, 9 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 4 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from typhoid fever which numbered 29 in April and 54 in May, fell to 20 in the month under review. Deaths from scarlatina increased from 3 in May to 5 in June; deaths from diphtheria, from 6 to 11; and deaths from whooping cough, from 13 to 16. Phthisis caused 46 deaths in May and 37 in June. Eight women died in childbirth in May and six in June; and as the births registered in the two months amounted to 1438, it follows that one mother died to every 103 births.

CUTTING OF TIMBER, ETC., ON CERTAIN CROWN LANDS PROHIBITED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything therein before contained the Governor might by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber, or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the Colony, bearing date the twenty-first day of December in the year 1875, it was declared that no person, although duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber, or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick or other earth from the Crown lands within one chain and a half on either side of the rivers named in such proclamation, and their tributaries, or should exercise on any such excepted portion of Crown lands the powers or any of them conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, revoke the Proclamation hereinbefore recited; and with the advice aforesaid, I do by this my Proclamation declare as follows, that is to say:—

SWANWATER PARISH.—No person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber, or particular description of timber or bark from the Crown lands in the parish of Swanwater, comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:—One hundred and eleven acres twenty-nine perches, county of Kara Kara, parish of Swanwater, being the land formerly held under the 19th section by Johannes Dumoller, and part of allotment 45 of section A: Commencing at the south-west angle of Hugh Fox's 19th section block, No. 603; bounded thence by the road from St. Arnaud bearing N. 70° 46' W. forty-five chains thirty-six links, and N. 57° 58' W. twelve chains seventy-three links; thence by the Swanwater pre-emptive section bearing S. 89° 31' E. fifty chains; thence by allotment 45 aforesaid bearing S. 0° 29' W. fourteen chains thirty-one links; thence by a line bearing S. 89° 31' E. forty-two chains ninety-six links; and thence by Hugh Fox's block aforesaid bearing S. 0° 29' W. twenty chains twenty-one links to the point of commencement.—(S.367.) on such terms and conditions, and subject to the payment of such license fee, as should from time to time be approved of by the Governor and be set forth in such license: And whereas by a proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony bearing date the eleventh day of March, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, a certain area was proclaimed a reserve for the preservation and growth of timber under the designation of the Dandenong and Worri Yaloak State Forest: And whereas it is expedient to diminish the said reserve: Now, therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, do hereby alter the proclamation hereinbefore mentioned, and do, with the advice aforesaid, diminish the area of the reserve described in such proclamation for the preservation and growth of timber by deducting therefrom the portion comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, that is to say:—

Two roads, more or less, county of Mornington, parish of Narre Worran: Commencing at a point on the left bank of the Fern Tree Gully where the north boundary of allotment 63° abuts thereon; bounded thence by that allotment bearing S. 74° 4' E. four chains sixty-eight links; thence by a road bearing N. 10° E. two chains twenty-five links to the gully aforesaid; and thence by that gully downwards to the point of commencement.—(N.19°.) (76.P.328.)

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to the undermentioned Common the Crown lands hereinafter described, that is to say:—

THE TOOBORAC COMMON, proclaimed by Order of the 17th November 1873, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time upon the application in writing of the council of any municipality to proclaim any part of the municipal district of such municipality, to be defined by such council, not being a borough having a population of Five hundred persons liable to be rated, as shown by the rate-book, a special area; and that it was further enacted that the fee which should be paid for a publican's license in respect of premises situated within a special area should be Ten pounds only; and the Governor in Council might from time to time revoke any proclamation made under the authority of the section of the said Act; Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim

THE BOROUGH OF TARNAGULLA

a special area under the provisions of the fourteenth section of the Act above recited.

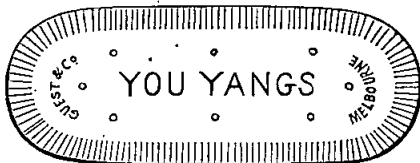
