PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished
Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony
of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the fifth section of The Bank Holidays Act 1873, I, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation appoint

FRIDAY THE 27TH DAY OF JULY INSTANT

a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Colac.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-third day of July, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and in the forty-first year of Her Majesty's reign.
