Provided that this bye-law shall not apply to any nightsoil produced upon the premises where such nightsoil shall be used.

No person shall cart, or carry with carts drawn by horses or otherwise, into or within the boundaries of the borough of Brighton, any nightsoil, blood, offal, or other matter being offensive to smell, except between the hours of Eleven post meridiem on any day and Six ante meridiem of the next day.

Every person guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing bye-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding £10 nor less than 10s.
