## INCORPORATION OF HORSHAM HOSPITAL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-seventh day of August 1877.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act for Hospitals and Charitable Institutions*, it was amongst other things enacted, that any institution established for the cure of disease,

or for the relief of diseased, aged, incurable, or destitute persons, and supported in whole or in part by the voluntary contributions of not less than fifty persons, each of whom should have paid not less than One pound per annum or Twenty pounds in one donation, might be incorporated as thereafter mentioned, and all persons who should have paid as aforesaid should be deemed contributors within the meaning of the said Act; and it was also enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than twenty-five of the said persons praying that such institution might be incorporated to cause the substance or prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter-petition, signed by an equal or greater number of such persons, should have been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication) the Governor in Council might declare the contributors for the time being to such institution to be, and they should thereupon become and continue, a body politic and corporate by the style and title named in the Order in Council, and should have perpetual succession and a common seal: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition, signed by not less than twenty-five contributors to the institution known as the Horsham Hospital, praying that the said institution may be incorporated: And whereas the substance or prayer of the said petition has been published in the *Government Gazette*, and no counter-petition has been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, declare the contributors for the time being to the institution called and known as the Horsham Hospital, situated at Horsham, in the colony of Victoria, to be a body politic and corporate by the style and title of "The Horsham Hospital."

And the Honorable Graham Berry, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

# NOTICES TO MARINERS.—AUSTRALIA AND NEW ZEALAND.

## HYDROGRAPHIC NOTICE.—[No. 14.] New Zealand Pilot.—Notice No. 4.

THE following information on Rangitoto Island. (Auckland Harbor). Rangitira Shoal near Kahau Rocks, Cook Strait, New River, Grey River, and Auckland Islands, has been derived from various sources.

[All bearings are magnetic. Variation in 1877:—Auckland Harbor,  $14^{\circ} 15'$  E.; Kahau Rocks,  $15^{\circ} 20'$  E.; Cook Strait,  $15^{\circ} 20'$  E.; New River,  $16^{\circ} 40'$  E.; Grey River,  $15^{\circ} 0'$  E.; Auckland Islands,  $17^{\circ} 45'$  E.]

### NORTH ISLAND.—EAST COAST.

**Auckland Harbor.**—*Rangitoto Island.*—A sunken pinnacle rock, having a depth of 4 feet and 21 feet close around, has been found near the reef which skirts the west side of Rangitoto Island. A black buoy has been placed westward of the rock, and lies in  $3\frac{1}{2}$  fathoms, with the following bearings, namely, Bean Rock lighthouse (at night the green light) S.S.E.; northern cone of Rangitoto N.E. by E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E., and beacon on Rangitoto Reef N. by W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W.<sup>1</sup>

Vessels are cautioned not to pass eastward of the buoy as rocky ledges extend off the shore of Rangitoto Island.<sup>2</sup>

*Erratum.* Hydrographic Notice No. 18 of 1876:—

**Kahau Rocks.**—*Rangitira Shoal.*—Kahau Rocks are situated in lat.  $41^{\circ} 22'$  S., long.  $175^{\circ} 51'$  E., or about 30 miles to the north-east of Cape Palliser, and they are not identical with Kohau Point, as was assumed in that hydrographic notice. The shoal on which the steam ship *Rangitira* grazed is supposed to lie E.N.E. 2 miles from Kahau Rocks. The weather at the time being thick, the exact position of the danger could not be ascertained. Other dangers, the positions of which are unknown, are said to exist in the same locality.<sup>3 4</sup>

### COOK STRAIT.<sup>5</sup>

**Port Nicholson.**—*Baring Head.*—Rocky ground having depths of  $4\frac{1}{2}$  to 7 fathoms lies N.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  cables from Baring Head. The ledge lies parallel to the coast, and is 3 cables long by one cable broad; the surf breaks on it in bad weather.<sup>6</sup>

Pencarrow Point N. by W. leads westward of the reef, and of other detached rocks off Baring Head. Taourakira Point open of Baring Head E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S. leads southward of these dangers.

**Toms Rock.**—About three-quarters of a mile to the southward of Toms Rock is a bank having a depth of 6 to 10 fathoms. From the depth of 6 fathoms Karori River bears N.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E., Karori Rock is in line with Cape Terawiti bearing N. W. Tide rips may be observed on this bank, especially at flood tide.

To avoid this bank when passing the coast between Cape Terawiti and Sinclair Head, Cape Terawiti should be well open westward of Karori Rock, and Pencarrow Lighthouse open southward of Sinclair Head.

**Luna Rock,** recently found by Captain Fairchild, has a depth of 6 feet, and lies about half a mile off shore with Karori Rock bearing S.E. by E., nearly 9 cables distant, and Macmanaman's House E. by N.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N. The rock is steep to.

As the stream sets towards the coast between Sinclair Head and Cape Terawiti caution is requisite.

**Queen Charlotte Sound.**—*Cape Jackson.*—Vessels should avoid the boat passage north of Cape Jackson. According to a recent examination the depths are variable; 4 fathoms was the least water found but it is stated that a vessel drawing 14 feet lately grounded in the passage.<sup>7</sup>

### MIDDLE ISLAND.—EAST COAST.

**Otago Harbor.**—*Hydra Reef* reported to lie about 4 miles south-eastward of Auroa Head and a mile off shore, has been unsuccessfully searched for by local pilots and is not considered by them to exist.<sup>8 9</sup>

### FOVEAUX STRAIT.

**New River.**—*Guiding Star rock,* a sunken danger, having a depth of 5 feet, lies S.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S. two cables from Bombay Rock and nearly in mid-channel. Abreast of the danger is moored a white buoy, which by vessels entering should be left on the starboard hand. Should the buoy be adrift the rock may be avoided by not bringing Bombay Rock to bear northward of N.E.<sup>10 11</sup>

### MIDDLE ISLAND.—WEST COAST.

**Grey or (Mawhera) River.**—At the end of Arney street two beacons have been erected, which serve as leading marks for the new channel formed in the south spit.<sup>12 13</sup>

Strangers are warned not to take the south channel while the north channel is open, as the semaphore is not adjusted for the south channel.

### AUCKLAND ISLANDS.

**Ewing Island.**—A shoal extends about half a mile from the south-west part of this island. The passage between Ewing and French's island is not recommended.<sup>14 15</sup>

**Carnley Harbor.**—There is a good anchorage in 11 fathoms, inside Flagstaff Point; the anchorage may be recognized by a sandy beach, and being close to the depot is convenient for landing stores.

### AUSTRALIA.—SOUTH COAST.—SPENCER GULF.

#### (1.) *Intended alteration in Tipara Reef Light.*

The Government of South Australia has given notice, that on or about the 1st June 1877, a light will be exhibited from an iron pile structure on Tipara Reef:—

The light will be a revolving white light of the first order, showing a bright flash every thirty seconds, and elevated 100 feet above high water.

Also, that the light-vessel on Tipara Reef, now showing a fixed light, will be withdrawn on the exhibition of the above revolving light. Further particulars will be published.

### EAST COAST.—PORT JACKSON.

#### (2.) *Storm Signals at Sow and Pigs Light-vessel, and Bradley Head.*

The Government of New South Wales has given notice, that the signal indicating an approaching southerly gale, will be shown at Sow and Pigs light-vessel, and Bradley Head, in the same manner that it is at present shown from South Head, Port Jackson.

### TASMANIA.—BANKS STRAIT.

#### (3.) *Shoal in Mussel Bay.*

Information has been received from Staff-Commander Henry Stanley, R.N., in charge of Admiralty Survey, of the existence of a shoal in Mussel Bay, north-east coast of Tasmania:—

This shoal (Cockle Bank) has 19 feet over it at low water, and bears W.N.W. from Rocky Head, distant 2 miles.

Also, with reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 90, of 19th July 1876, on the existence of sunken rocks in Banks Strait:—

That Harry Rock, lying N.W. by W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W., nearly 3 miles from Swan Island lighthouse, has 16 feet over it at low water, instead of 18 feet, as previously reported.

[The bearings are magnetic. Variation  $10\frac{1}{2}$  easterly in 1877.]

HYDROGRAPHICAL NOTICE.  
Mahé Island, Seychelles.

**Lighthouse.**—A lighthouse has been erected on the N.W. edge of the southern reef at the entrance to Port Victoria, from which, after 1st March 1877, will be exhibited a fixed red light at an elevation of 87 feet above H.W., visible in clear weather at a distance of 9 nautical miles.

The light is catoptric, and will show an unbroken arc of 142° of illumination between the bearings of S. 1° E. and N. 32° W.

Vessels outside St. Anne's and the other outlying islands will have the light visible between the following bearings only, viz.:

Between S. 1° 20' E. and S. 62° 40' W.
S. 87° 20' W. " S. 89° 20' W.
N. 89° 20' W. " N. 85° 0' W.
N. 80° 40' W. " N. 80° 0' W.
N. 77° 40' W. " N. 75° 20' W.
N. 70° 20' W. " N. 66° 30' W.
N. 49° 30' W. " N. 48° 0' W.
N. 47° 20' W. " N. 46° 0' W.
N. 40° 10' W. " N. 39° 0' W.

the remainder of the illuminated arc being obscured by land.

A fixed red light from the same lighthouse will also be shown towards the anchorage in Port Victoria (called the Inner Harbor).

**Lighthouse, Mahé.**—The lighthouse is situated in lat. 4° 36' 48" S. long. 65° 31' 0" E. is 42 feet from base to vane, built of granite on a foundation of concrete, and painted white.

**Directions.**—Entering St. Anne's Road at night, give the N. W. point of St. Anne's Island a berth of three cables and steer S.W. mag. taking care to keep the Port Victoria Light (red fixed) between the bearings of S.W. b. W. and S.W. b. W. ½ W. until the south point of St. Anne's bears E.S.E., then steer S.W. ½ S. mag. and anchor with the light bearing between W. b. S. ½ S. and W. b. S.

With the light between these latter bearings the channel for entering Port Victoria (Inner Harbor) will be open, but should never be attempted by strangers at night without a pilot.

**Moorings.**—Moorings have been laid down for the Messageries Maritimes steamers, at the entrance to Port Victoria, and an iron buoy painted red supports the bridges, from which the lighthouse bears S. 55 W. ¾ cables.

Ships anchoring in the vicinity of this buoy should give it a berth of half a cable to avoid fouling the moorings, the anchors for which are placed east and west nearly.

## VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

THE Board of Land and Works, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it by *The Public Works Statute 1865*, doth hereby make the following Bye-law for Fixing the Charges for Parcels, whether carried at the risk of the owners thereof or of the said Board, that is to say:—

1. On and after 1st October 1877, the rates, whether prepaid or to pay, for parcels forwarded by the Board at their risk as common carriers will be double the rates shown in the under-mentioned schedule, with an addition thereto of 25 per cent. upon packed parcels, also upon bicycles, feathers, furniture, hats, hat boxes, cases, millinery, mirrors (loose), musical instruments, perambulators, pictures, sewing machines, wicker-work, wire cages (loose), or other articles light or fragile.

2. But parcels, prepaid by stamps affixed thereto, may be forwarded, at the risk of the owners, for the rates and charges shown in the following schedule, provided they are stamped according to the conditions thereof.

Packed parcels, stamped, will also be carried at the above rates, but only provided that they are sent in express boxes, previously approved and registered by the Board, of not greater bulk than twenty-seven cubic feet or three feet cube for one hundred pounds weight; otherwise stamps must be affixed at double the above rates upon packed parcels of any other form or covering not previously approved and registered by the Board. Bicycles, feathers, furniture, glass, hats, hat boxes, cases, millinery, mirrors (loose), musical instruments, perambulators, pictures, sewing machines, wickerwork, wire cages (loose), or other articles light or fragile, double the above rates.

3. The stamps to be used for the prepayment of parcels freight are six in number, each of the value as follows:—

1. ... Ninepence.
2. ... One shilling and sixpence.
3. ... Two shillings and threepence.
4. ... Three shillings.
5. ... Four shillings and sixpence.
6. ... Six shillings.

4. Each Freight Stamp is in two portions, one of which is adhesive and has a progressive number. The other portion—called the check—is not adhesive, but has the same progressive number. The sender of a stamped parcel should, at or before the time of affixing the adhesive stamps and consigning the parcel, detach these checks and forward them, by post or otherwise, to the consignee or his agent.

5. The Freight Stamp should be affixed, as nearly as possible, in the same relative position on the parcel as is the postage stamp on a letter, that is, on the right hand side and close to the address. Where the package, being such as a bag, a crate, a cage, &c., does not admit of this, the freight stamp should be attached on a separate and secure label.

6. These rates and stamps do not apply to the Gippsland Railway.

7. In regard to stamped parcels upon which, when brought to a station to be carried by railway, charges have been already incurred, the Board will not recognize such charges in any way, either by cash payment thereof or by account as "paid on."

8. When two or more stamps are upon a parcel, only one of them need be filled up, and the check presented on claiming delivery should correspond therewith.

9. The delivery of stamped parcels, after they have been carried by railway, may be made, irrespectively of the ownership thereof, to the person presenting a check corresponding with the freight stamp on the parcel; or delivery may be made, irrespectively of the check, to the person who, from his description of the parcel or other evidence, appears to represent the owner or his agent. Passengers who expect their stamped parcels to be sent with them in the same train should obtain the checks before leaving, so as to avoid possible delay in obtaining the parcel at destination.

10. Every care will be taken for the delivery of parcels stamped, but without responsibility, as the rates in clause 2 are strictly conditional that stamped parcels to whomsoever delivered are solely at the risk of the owner.

11. No account or record will be kept of stamped parcels.

12. A receipt will be given, if demanded, for parcels not stamped carried at the rates provided by clause 1.

13. Although no receipt will be given or liability undertaken for stamped parcels, yet for the convenience of the public the parcels clerk will, if required to do so when the parcels are brought to him, mark the checks, provided they correspond with the stamps on the parcels. Further, he will

also mark the merchants' delivery book on the same conditions.

14. Each stamped parcel must be securely covered and addressed to its destination irrespectively of the writing upon the freight stamp. Separate parcels tied together must each be stamped.

15. When the freight stamps affixed are not of full value for the weight or distance, the sender will be required to affix the additional stamps necessary, otherwise the parcel will not be forwarded, save at the rate provided by clause 1, and at the risk of the Board.

16. Freight stamps will be sold at all stations, and also by licensed vendors, but parcels will not be received to be carried by the schedule rates in clause 2 unless the said parcels are fully stamped.

17. The parcels clerk on receiving a stamped parcel for carriage will mark the freight stamp thereon with name of the station. This mark is to be made on the right-hand side of the freight stamp over the word "Station." If he is required also to mark the checks, he will do so over the printed number. On the delivery of stamped parcels which have been carried by railway, the parcels clerk will mark the freight stamp on the left-hand side, having previously received the check for the same, which he will similarly mark and file.

The births of 706 children, viz., 366 boys and 340 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of July. In the month of June 743 births were registered, or 37 more than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in July numbered 460, viz., 246 of males and 214 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 246. The deaths exceeded those in June by 59, and were also in excess of the average of July during the previous ten years by 125. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of those ten years by 73 only.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 65°0' on the 30th and 31st, and the lowest was 31°0' on the 12th. The mean temperature of the month (48°7') was nearly one and a half degrees above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (24°4') took place on the 31st, viz., from a maximum of 65°0' to a minimum of 40°6'. The least range (5°4') was on the 19th, viz., from a maximum of 51°4' to a minimum of 46°0'. The mean daily range was 16°4'. The mean atmospheric pressure (30·188 inches) was more than a seventh of an inch above the average.

Fifty-three per cent. of the registered deaths were of males, and 47 per cent. were of females. Thirty-three per cent. were of children under the age of 5 years as against 30 per cent. in July 1876; 29 per cent. in July 1875; 38 per cent. in July 1874; 56 per cent. in July 1873 and July 1872; 84 per cent. in July 1871; 39 per cent. in July 1870; 87 per cent. in July 1869; 44 per cent. in July 1868 and July 1867.

As many as 21 deaths of persons who had attained the age of 75 years or upwards were recorded during the month, viz.:—Those of a laborer, aged 75, of remittent fever; a hotelkeeper, aged 75, of apoplexy; a laborer and two females, each aged 75, of old age; a female, aged 75, of cancer; a female, aged 76, of brain disease; four females—two aged 76 and two aged 77, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 77, of erysipelas, and one, aged 80, of disease of the heart; a widow, aged 80, who was found drowned in a water-tank; a laborer, aged 81, of dysentery; a female, aged 81, of old age; a farmer, aged 82, of senile gangrene; a female, aged 87, of asthma; a male cook and a female, each aged 87, of old age; and a lieutenant-colonel, aged 88, of bronchitis.

Twenty-three deaths from external causes were registered during the month. Four of these have been ascribed to homicide, two to suicide, and the remainder to accident. The particulars are as follow:—A rate collector, aged 47, died of fracture of the skull, the result of an accidental fall; a shoemaker, aged 59, died of fracture of the skull, caused by a fall from a horse; a girl, aged 3, a farmer, aged 16, and a female, aged 66, were passed over by vehicles; a female, aged 56, succumbed to an attack of tetanus, resulting from an accidental wound in the neck; a female child, aged one year, died of scalds; a boy, aged 2, a male of occupation unstated, aged 80, and a ship's steward, aged 81, were accidentally drowned, the second mentioned in the River Yarra, the last in Hobson's Bay; two laborers, aged 44 and 71 respectively, and a female aged 80, were found drowned, in the last case in a water-tank; three infants—a female, aged 14 days, and two females, aged 1 month and 4 months respectively, were suffocated in bed; and a female child, aged 10 months, died of accidental suffocation. Of the homicidal deaths, that a male infant, just born, was set down to criminal manipulation; that of a female, aged 60, resulted from the violence of her son, who was committed for trial on the charge of wilful murder, but was afterwards found to be insane; those of a newly-born male and a newly-born female resulted from suffocation, the verdict in the first case being "wilful murder," in the second case "homicide by neglect." Of the two persons whose deaths are set down to suicide, a clerk, aged 39, cut his throat with a razor whilst

laboring under temporary insanity; and a house-painter, aged 35, was found drowned in the River Yarra and is supposed to have committed suicide whilst under the influence of drink.

Eighty-nine deaths, or 19 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—43 in the Melbourne Hospital, 4 in the Immigrants' Home, 5 in the Alfred Hospital, 6 in the Lying-in Hospital, 11 in the Benevolent Asylum, 2 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 13 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Melbourne Industrial Schools.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 152, of which 82, or 54 per cent., were of males; and 70, or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 78 were under one year of age, 33 were between one and two, 20 were between two and three, 16 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 308. Of these, 164, or 53 per cent., were males, and 144, or 47 per cent., were females; 20 were between five and ten, 14 were between ten and fifteen, 11 were between fifteen and twenty, 12 were between twenty and twenty-five, 18 were between twenty-five and thirty, 21 were between thirty and thirty-five, 26 were between thirty-five and forty, 21 were between forty and forty-five, 38 were between forty-five and fifty, 21 were between fifty and fifty-five, 29 were between fifty-five and sixty, 20 were between sixty and sixty-five, 18 were between sixty-five and seventy, 18 were between seventy and seventy-five, 12 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 9 were upwards of eighty.

Most deaths resulted from local diseases as is usual during the winter months. The most fatal complaints under this head were those of the respiratory and nervous systems. The death of a female of congestion of the lungs, classed under the former, occurred shortly after and was probably hastened by childbearing. Under the head zymotic diseases whooping-cough caused 30, and typhoid fever 19 deaths as against 16 and 20 in the previous month. Under the head constitutional diseases, phthisis caused 61 deaths as against 37 in June.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained the Governor might by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: And whereas by a proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the Colony, bearing date the thirteenth day of August instant, it was amongst other things declared that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, from the land comprised within the boundaries thereafter described, and situate in the Wombat or Bullarook State Forest: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do hereby revoke the above-mentioned proclamation.

## PROCLAMATION

proclamation, and the Board of Land and Works might issue licenses to cut timber upon such reserve or any part thereof on such terms and conditions, and subject to the payment of such license fee as should from time to time be approved of by the Governor and be set forth in such license: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, proclaim as a reserve for the preservation and growth of timber the Crown lands herein-after described, that is to say:—

# DEVENISH PUBLIC CEMETERY.

REGULATIONS MADE BY TRUSTEES OF THE PUBLIC CEMETERY ESTABLISHED AT DEVENISH.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. Applications for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the person applying on payment of the proper charges in the form set forth in schedule A.

3. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced to the trustees that the relations or friends of such persons are unable to pay the costs and charges.

4. The trustees will cause the common graves to be dug; but when a brick grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees, or some person duly appointed by them.

5. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

6. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.

7. A plan of every monument must be submitted to the trustees for approval.

8. In the erection of tablets, copper cramps must be used.

9. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper order and repair may be removed by order of the trustees.

10. Orders for interment to be given either to the sexton or other person appointed by the trustees, such notice to be given between the hours of Ten a.m. and sunset the previous day.

11. In case an interment is to be made in any private vault or grave, the consent, in writing, of the proprietor must be left with the order.

12. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, and other information in answer to the questions contained in schedule B, must be stated at the time of giving the order.

13. The processions to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.

14. The usual hours for interment will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months of the year.

15. A plan of the cemetery and a registry will be kept and may be inspected.

16. The person in charge of the cemetery has orders to turn out any person who shall behave indecorously, or commit any trespass, or injure the trees, flowers, fences, tombs, or otherwise infringe the regulations for the protection of the cemetery.

17. The trustees reserve the right to recommend any alterations from time to time in these charges.

### INCORPORATION OF THE HOMOEOPATHIC HOSPITAL AND DISPENSARY.

WHEREAS by an order of His Excellency the Governor in Council, bearing date the 29th day of January 1876, the contributors for the time being to the institution called and known as "The Homoeopathic Hospital and Dispensary," situate in the city of Melbourne, were, under an Act intituled "An Act for Hospitals and Charitable Institutions," and numbered 220, declared to be a body politic and corporate, by the style and title of "The Homoeopathic Hospital and Dispensary":

And whereas at a public meeting of the contributors of the said incorporated hospital, holden at the hospital and dispensary on the 25th day of July 1877, and duly convened by advertisement in the *Argus* newspaper, and others published in Melbourne, one week previously thereto:—

First—For the purpose of deciding the number of the committee of such institution, and electing the same:

Second—For deciding the number of honorary medical officers, and for electing the same:

It was resolved that the number of the committee of such institution shall consist of nine ladies and nine gentlemen, and such meeting elected of such committee, together with the honorary officers, as follows:—

*President*.—Sir William Foster Stawell, Knight.

*Vice-Presidents*.—W. Templeton, Esq., P.M.; H. J. Hart, Esq., J.P.

*Hon. Treasurer*.—Ed. M. Gibbs, Esq.

It was also resolved that there should be four honorary medical officers, and the said meeting elected—

*Hon. Physicians*.—Robert Ray, Esq.; Jas. P. Teague, Esq.; Emery Gould, Esq.

*Hon. Surgeon*.—Geo. T. Teague, Esq.

And whereas by the said Act, numbered 220, intituled "An Act for Hospitals and Charitable Institutions," power is given to the corporation of any institution incorporated thereunder to make by-laws for the regulation of its own proceedings; for fixing the number of votes of contributors in proportion to the amount of their own contributions; for determining the validity of disputed elections, and for conducting such elections; and generally for all matters whatsoever affecting the management of the institution not inconsistent with the laws of the colony: The following bye-laws were adopted:—

BY-LAWS OF THE HOMOEOPATHIC HOSPITAL AND DISPENSARY, MELBOURNE.

#### INTRODUCTORY.

1. *Repeal of former By-laws*.—All by-laws made prior to the date of the making of these by-laws shall be, and the same are hereby repealed.

2. *Custody of Common Seal*.—The common seal of the corporation shall be kept at the hospital in a box under the care of the treasurer.

3. *Affixing of Seal*.—The common seal shall not be affixed to any deed, instrument, or writing, except by order of the committee at a meeting at which seven members at least are present at the time of making such order, and for which meeting notice to make such order has been given.

#### OBJECTS.

4. The objects of the institution shall be to afford gratuitous medical and surgical aid to persons in destitute circumstances, and to others upon such terms of payment as shall be determined by the general committee in rules to be made for that purpose.

#### GOVERNORS AND THEIR PRIVILEGES.

5. *Annual Governors and Life Governors*.—Any person who shall contribute the sum of £1 per annum shall be an annual governor, or not less than £20 in one donation shall be a life governor of the hospital, and shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings, and to recommend four out-patients in every year. And any person who shall contribute the sum of £5 per annum shall be an annual governor, or not less than £100 in one donation shall be a life governor, and shall be entitled to two votes at all general meetings, and to recommend two in-patients and twelve out-patients in every year. And any person who shall contribute the sum of £10 per annum shall be an annual governor, or not less than £200 in one donation shall be a life governor, and shall be entitled to three votes at all general meetings, and to recommend four in-patients and twenty out-patients in every year.

6. *Life Governors on Collections*.—Any person who shall pay to the hospital in one year in one sum collections to the amount of £20 or upwards shall be enrolled a life governor, and as such shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings and to recommend one in-patient and four out-patients in every year.

7. *Contributions by Corporations*.—Any public or corporate body which shall contribute the sum of £5 annually shall be authorized to nominate some one person to be enrolled an annual governor, who shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings, and to recommend one in-patient and ten out-patients in every year; and if the contribution shall amount to £20 per annum such nominee shall be a life governor and be entitled to two votes at all general meetings and to recommend two in-patients and twenty out-patients in every year.

8. *Life Governors under Bequests*.—The executor first named in any will through which the hospital shall receive the sum of £100 shall be enrolled a life governor and shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings, and to recommend one in-patient and four out-patients in every year.

9. *Absent Governors may Act by Attorney*.—Any governor being absent from the colony of Victoria may, by power-of-attorney containing the necessary powers, exercise all the privileges to which he would be entitled if personally present; but such power-of-attorney shall be deposited with the committee for record at least seven days before the same can be used in exercise of such privileges.

10. *Payment of Subscriptions*.—Every yearly subscription shall be paid in advance, and every first yearly payment shall be calculated from the date of such payment, but no such first yearly payment shall entitle to a vote at a general meeting within three months from the date of such payment.

11. *Privileges Suspended on Unpaid Subscriptions*.—The privileges of annual governors shall be suspended until all arrears are paid.

12. *Contributions by Firms*.—Every firm or partnership subscribing may exercise their privilege through some one member of such firm.

13. *Honorary Life Governors*.—Persons who shall have conferred any signal benefit on the hospital, irrespective of subscription, may be elected honorary life governors at any general meeting, on the recommendation of the committee, and shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings.

14. *Office-bearers*.—There shall be a president, two vice-presidents, a treasurer, and two auditors, who shall be elected by the governors as hereinafter provided.

15. *Committee*.—There shall also be a general committee of eighteen governors, one-third of whom shall retire in January next ensuing; another third in the following January, and thereafter the third shall retire who shall have held office for the longest time; but they shall all be eligible for re-election. The members who shall retire next January, and the January following, to be determined by ballot among themselves.

16. The committee shall direct all the business of the hospital; shall provide all requisites for its use; may appoint and discharge all paid officers and servants; may from time



to time make rules not inconsistent with these by-laws for the regulation of the hospital and of such paid officers and servants, and for the admission and instruction of medical and surgical pupils, and for the fees to be paid by them; and generally for all matters whether of the same kind as those hereinbefore mentioned or of a different kind, not provided for by law or by these by-laws, that they think proper.

17. *Audit of Accounts.*—The accounts of the hospital shall be audited prior to the annual meeting in the month of January in every year by the auditors, who shall sign a statement of accounts exhibiting a summary of receipts and expenditure.

#### MEETINGS IN GENERAL.

18. *Meetings of Governors.*—That the president, vice-presidents, treasurer, auditors, and one-third of the general committee of the institution shall be elected at the annual meeting to be held on the second Thursday in the month of January in each year, when the committee shall prepare a general report on the affairs of the hospital, together with the treasurer's financial statement for the past year duly audited, and any other business relating to the institution transacted. Twelve governors shall form a quorum, but if no quorum be present within half an hour of the time named, such meeting shall stand adjourned for the following week at the same day and hour. That the retiring officers and members of committee shall be eligible for re-election. That if more than the required number of candidates be nominated, such election shall take place by ballot, and all candidates for such election shall be nominated in writing, to be delivered to the secretary not less than seven days before the date of such annual meeting.

19. *Presidency at Meetings.*—At all meetings of governors or of committee the president, or in his absence one of the vice-presidents, or in their absence the treasurer, shall take the chair; but in the absence of all these officers the meeting shall choose its own chairman.

20. *Chairman to have Double Vote.*—At all meetings of the governors or of the committee, the chairman shall have a deliberative vote, and also a casting vote whenever the numbers are equal.

21. *Decision of Questions.*—All questions other than elections at meetings of governors, and all questions at meetings of the committee, shall be decided by a show of hands, and if it be demanded by any member, by a division.

#### MEETINGS OF COMMITTEE.

22. *Ordinary Meetings of Committee.*—The committee shall meet at the hospital at such times as they shall from time to time appoint, five to form a quorum.

23. *Special Meetings of Committee.*—Special meetings of the committee may be convened on the requisition of the president or one of the vice-presidents, or of any four members of the committee; and notice shall be given of the business to be transacted at such meeting, at which no other business shall be considered.

24. *Appointment of Sub-committee.*—The committee shall, at its first meeting in each year after the annual general meeting, appoint a finance committee, and may from time to time appoint such sub-committees as it thinks fit, and may appoint any members of the honorary staff, although not members of the committee, to act on any such sub-committee.

25. *Commencement of Committee Meetings and Lapsed Meetings.*—The committee shall commence business as soon after the time notified as there is a sufficient number of members present to constitute a quorum; but if, at the expiry of twenty minutes from the time specified, there is not a quorum present, the meeting shall stand adjourned to the following Wednesday.

26. *Reading of Minutes.*—No business shall be entered upon until the minutes of the previous meeting have been confirmed, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy.

#### RULES.

27. The general committee shall make, alter, and rescind rules and by-laws for the regulation of the institution in every department.

#### ALTERATION OF RULES AND BY-LAWS.

28. No proposition to make, alter, or rescind any rule or by-law shall be entertained unless one month's previous notice has been given of the same; and no motion to rescind a resolution of the general committee shall be submitted within three months after such resolution has been passed unless one month's notice of the same be given, and then such motion shall be passed by an absolute majority of the general committee.

#### ALTERATION OF BYE-LAWS.

29. No alterations shall be made to these laws unless by a majority of two-thirds of the votes of a special meeting of governors convened for the purpose of considering such proposed alterations, notice of which shall be advertised in two daily papers, and published in the *Government Gazette*, at least fourteen days before the time fixed for holding such meeting, and no such alteration so made shall be of any force or effect until one month thereafter.

#### HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

30. There shall be not less than four honorary medical officers, who shall be legally qualified medical practitioners, and elected by the governors. They shall retain office for three years, and be eligible for re-election. In the event of any vacancy occurring otherwise than above, the medical officer elected to fill the vacancy shall hold office only for the remainder of the unexpired term. The honorary medical officers shall give professional directions to, and by their joint action have power to suspend the dispenser, and report the circumstance to the general committee. They shall assist the general committee generally by their advice, and especially in

the purchase of medicines. They shall keep proper records of all cases treated, and make returns of same from time to time to the committee.

31. *Declaration by Honorary Staff.*—Every person elected or succeeding to any office on the honorary staff shall, before he enters upon the duties of his office, make and subscribe the following declaration:—

I do solemnly promise that while I hold the office of \_\_\_\_\_ in the Homœopathic Hospital, I will faithfully obey the by-laws and rules of the said hospital now or hereafter in force, so far as they apply to me, and I acknowledge that I hold my said office subject to the condition of such obedience.

32. *Attendance of Honorary Staff.*—No physician or surgeon, assistant physician, or assistant surgeon shall be absent from the hospital for more than fourteen consecutive days without the leave of the committee.

33. *Suspension of Honorary Staff.*—The committee may, by an absolute majority of the whole committee, suspend any member of the honorary staff, and shall, within two weeks after the order of suspension, convene a special meeting of the governors, and shall report to such meeting such suspension and the reason thereof. If the governors at such special meeting confirm the order of suspension by the committee, the office of the officer so suspended shall thenceforth become vacant; and if the governors refuse to confirm such order, the suspension shall thenceforth cease.

34. *Consulting Physicians and Surgeons.*—When any physician or surgeon has served as such for ten years, and has ceased to hold such office, the committee shall, upon his request, declare him to be a consulting physician or a consulting surgeon, as the case may be. But in case of his subsequent election as physician or surgeon, or assistant physician or assistant surgeon, his office of consulting physician or of consulting surgeon shall, during his continuance in such former office, be suspended.

#### IMPROPER CASES MAY BE DECLINED.

35. The admission committee or any honorary medical officer shall be authorized to decline prescribing for any person who, in his or their opinion, is not a proper object for this charity, reporting the circumstance to the next meeting of committee.

#### COMMITTEE TO APPOINT STIPENDIARY OFFICERS, ETC.

36. That the general committee may from time to time at their discretion appoint and remove such paid officers and servants as are required for the proper conduct of the institution.

37. No person who shall hold any office or place of profit under the institution, or be concerned or participate in anywise in any contract with the general committee, or in the profit thereof, or of any work to be done under the authority of the same, shall be capable of being or continuing a member of such general committee, provided that such disability shall not apply to any member of any company, partnership, or association consisting of more than twenty persons when such contract shall be entered into for the general benefit of such company, partnership, or association; but no member of the general committee shall vote or take part in the discussion of any matter in or before the committee, in which he or she shall directly or indirectly have any pecuniary interest.

#### ACCOUNTS.

38. All sums received on account of the Homœopathic Hospital and Dispensary shall be paid into the Bank of Victoria, or such other bank as the committee may appoint, to one or other of the following accounts, as the case may be, viz.:—  
Homœopathic Hospital Maintenance Fund.

" " Building  
" " Endowment  
" " "

39. *Bequests, how dealt with.*—All bequests made to the institution shall be paid to the endowment fund, due regard being had to the conditions under which such bequests are made. And all such moneys shall be invested from time to time in such manner as the committee shall direct; the interest of such endowment fund may be available for the maintenance of the institution.

40. *Accounts to be certified by Finance Committee.*—All accounts, before they are discharged, shall be submitted to the finance committee, who shall certify as to their correctness.

41. *Duties of Finance Committee.*—On the first Tuesday of each month, or such other times as the committee may appoint, the finance committee shall examine all accounts for disbursements, and certify as to their correctness, and also see that the money received by the collector has been paid into the bank to the credit of the hospital.

42. *Payments made by Committee.*—All payments shall be made by order of the committee.

43. *Cheques, how signed.*—All cheques shall be signed by the hon. treasurer, or in his absence by two members of the finance committee, and countersigned by the secretary.

#### ADMISSION OF IN-PATIENTS AND OUT-PATIENTS.

44. *Conditions of Admission of Patients.*—Every sick person may be admitted as in-patient or as out-patient if he appear to the committee to be a proper object of charity, and if the physician or the surgeon of the week report that such person is likely to receive benefit by treatment in the hospital, or, if the committee think fit, on payment of such weekly sum as shall be fixed by the admission committee.

45. *Admission when House is Full.*—Whenever the applications for admission are more than can be accommodated in the house, those cases only will be admitted which in the opinion of the committee, upon the recommendation of some medical officer, are the most urgent.
