DATES AND TIMES FIXED IN THE JURIES STATUTE 1876 ALTERED.

*At the Executive Council Chamber at Melbourne the twenty-fifth day of January 1877.*

PRESENT:

The Honorable Sir James McCulloch, Presiding for and in the absence of the Governor

WHEREAS by *The Juries Statute, 1876*, it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might, by any Order or Orders published in the *Government Gazette* on or before the first day of January A.D. One thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, extend the time or times, or alter the date or dates within or on or before which any notice is by the said Act required to be given, or any publication to be made, or any act, duty, or thing to be done: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that the times or dates prescribed in Part III. of the said Act be during the year 1877 further extended or altered to the times or dates hereinafter mentioned, viz. :—

Section of the Act.	Time prescribed in the Act.	Time as extended or altered by Order in Council of 19th January 1877 to—	Further altered by this present Order to—
Section 21 ...	Second Sunday in March ... The last two weeks of March	Second Sunday in April ... .. The last two weeks of the said month of April	First Sunday in April. The two weeks ending 17th April.
Section 22 ...	During the first week in April	On or before the twenty-fifth of April	During the week ending 25th April.

And the Honorable George Briscoe Kerferd, Her Majesty's Attorney-General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
