DISPOSAL OF THE ESTATES OF DECEASED SEAMEN BELONGING TO DENMARK OR ITALY.

THE Governor has directed the subjoined Declarations between Great Britain and Denmark and Italy relative to the disposal of the estates of deceased Seamen of the two nations to be published for general information.

SIR,—I have the honor to transmit to you for publication in the Colony under your Government a copy of a Declaration between Great Britain and Italy, relative to the disposal of the estates of deceased seamen of the two nations, which was signed at London on the 17th April last.

I also enclose for publication in like manner a copy of a similar Declaration between this country and Denmark, which was signed at London on the 11th April 1877.

DECLARATION BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND DENMARK, RELATIVE TO THE DISPOSAL OF THE ESTATES OF DECEASED SEAMEN OF THE TWO NATIONS.

Signed at London, April 11, 1877.

THE Government of Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and the Government of His Majesty the King of Denmark, being desirous to make arrangements as to the disposal of the estates of deceased seamen of the two nations in certain cases, the Undersigned, duly authorized to that effect, have agreed as follows:—

DA Hendes Majestæt Dronningen af det Forenede Kongerige Storbritannien og Irlands Regjering, og Hans Majestæt Kongen af Danmarks Regjering ønske at træffe Foranstaltninger om Behandlingen af Efterladenskaber efter afdøde Sömænd, henhørende til de to Nationer, ere de Undertegnede, forsynede med behørig Bemyndigelse, komne overens om Følgende:—

ARTICLE I.

If any British seaman dies on board a Danish ship, or whilst serving on board a Danish ship within Danish territory; or if, on the other hand, any Danish seaman dies on board a British vessel, or whilst serving on board a British vessel within British territory, the Governments of Denmark and of Great Britain respectively shall provide as far as possible for the protection, without loss or injury, of any estate belonging to such deceased seaman.

In the case of a British seaman dying as aforesaid, the Danish Government shall cause the estate, if not exceeding £50 in value, to be delivered, as soon as possible after the decease, to the British Consul at the Danish port where the decease occurs: or if the decease does not occur at a Danish port, but on Danish territory, to the British Consul nearest to the place where such decease occurs, or where the estate may be; or if such decease occurs at sea on board a Danish vessel, to the British Consul at the first Danish port at which the vessel arrives after such decease.

ARTIKEL I.

Dersom en Britisk Sömænd dør ombord paa et Dansk Skib eller, medens han er forhyret med et Dansk Skib, paa Dansk Territorium, eller dersom, paa den anden Side, en Dansk Sömænd dør ombord paa et Britisk Skib eller, medens han er forhyret med et Britisk Skib, paa Britiske Territorium, skulde henholdsvis den Danske og den Britiske Regjering saavidt muligt drage Omsorg for, at et haviketsomhelst Efterladenskab, der tilhører en saadan afdød Sömænd, opbevares uden at udsættes for Forringelse eller Beskadigelse.

I Tilfælde af, at en Britisk Sömænd dør, som ovenfor omtalt, skal den Danske Regjering foranstalte hans Efterladenskab, hvis Værdien deraf ikke overstiger £50, udleveret, saa snart som muligt efter Dødsfaldet, til den Britiske Konsul i den Danske Havn, hvor Dødsfaldet finder Sted; eller dersom Dødsfaldet ikke indtræffer i en Dansk Havn, men paa Dansk Territorium, til den Britiske Konsul som er nærmest ved det Sted, hvor Dødsfaldet indtræffer, eller hvor Eiendelene maatte befinde sig; eller hvis saadant Dødsfald indtræffer ombord paa Dansk Skib i rum Sø, til den Britiske Konsul i den første Danske Havn, til hvilken Skibet ankommer efter Dødsfaldet.

In the case of a Danish seaman dying, as aforesaid, his estate, if not exceeding £50 in value, shall, subject to the provision contained in Article II., be delivered by the British Government, as soon as possible, to the Danish Consul of the district to which the vessel may belong.

When the estate exceeds £50 in value, in the event of there being no person at hand who, within the period of six months, proves to be rightfully entitled to administer to the estate of the deceased seaman, the Consuls-General or Consuls of either State in whose jurisdiction such decease shall take place, shall, subject to the provision contained in Article II., have the power to take possession of and administer to the estate of such deceased seaman.

If any British seaman, whilst serving on board a Danish ship, dies within British territory; or if, on the other hand, any Danish seaman, whilst serving on board a British ship, dies within Danish territory—then the estate (if any) belonging to such deceased seaman shall, after deducting the expenses incurred, be paid over to the nearest Consul of the nation to which the ship belongs, in order that he may cause it to be, under observation of the aforesaid regulations, delivered to the competent authority in the country of the deceased seaman.

In the event of a seaman of one nation serving on board a ship of the other nation, and dying in the territory of a third nation, any estate of such deceased seaman (which may have been received by the Consul at the port where such death may have taken place of the nation to which the ship belongs) shall, after deducting the expenses incurred, be paid over to the Consul of the other nation at the same port.

In cases where a deceased seaman has signed articles either as a Danish or as a British subject, as the case may be, but the Government into whose possession his estate comes is not satisfied of his nationality, that Government shall equally protect his estate and shall send an account of it, and its value, and of all information in the possession of that Government relating to the deceased, to the other Government as soon as possible, and shall deliver the estate to the other Government immediately on receiving its assurance that there is no doubt that the deceased was a subject of it.

ARTICLE II.

If the deceased shall have served in the Royal Navy of Great Britain, any assets which may be payable by the British Admiralty shall be dealt with according to the law of Great Britain.

ARTICLE III.

The term "seaman" in this Declaration includes every person (except masters and pilots) employed or engaged in any capacity on board any merchant-ship, or who has been so employed or engaged within six months before his death, and every person (not being a Commissioner, Warrant, or Subordinate Officer, or Assistant-Engineer) borne on the books of, or forming part of the complement of, any public ship of war.

The term "estate" includes all "property, wages due, money, and other effects" left by a deceased seaman on board a ship.

The term "Consul" includes Consul-General, Consul, and Vice-Consul, and every person for the time being discharging the duties of Consul-General, Consul, or Vice-Consul.

In witness whereof the Undersigned have signed the present Declaration, which shall come immediately into operation, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

I Tilfælde af, at en Dansk Sömand dör som ovenfor omtalt, skulle hans Eiendele, hvis de ikke overstige £50 i Værdi, under Forbehold af Bestemmelsen i Artikel II. udleveres af den Britiske Regjering, saa snart som muligt, til den Danske Konsul i det Distrikt, hvor Skibet hörer hjemme.

Hvis Efterladenskabets Værdi overstiger £50, og der ikke er nogen Person tilstede, som inden en Frist af sex Maaneder beviser sig at være lovligen berettiget til at overtage Bestyrelsen af den afdöde Sömands Eiendele, da skulle General-Konsulerne, eller Konsulerne for den af de to Stater, inden hvis Jurisdiction Dödsfaldet finder Sted, være bemyndigede til, med Forbehold af Bestemmelsen i Artikel II., at tage den afdöde Sömands Eiendele i Besiddelse og bestyre dem.

Hvis en Britisk Sömand, medens han er forhyret med et Dansk Skib, dör paa Britisk Territorium, eller hvis paa den anden Side en Dansk Sömand, medens han er forhyret med et Britisk Skib, dör paa Dansk Territorium, da skulle en saadan afdöd Sömands Eiendele, hvis han efterlader sig nogen, udbetales med Fradrag af paaløbne Udgifter, til den nærmeste Konsul af den Nation, til hvilken Skibet hörer, for et han, med Tagttagelse af ovennævnte Regler, kan foranstalte dem udleverede til vedkommende Myndighed i den afdöde Sömands Fædreland.

I Tilfælde af, at en Sömand af den ene Nation, medens han er forhyret med et Skib af den anden Nation, dör paa en tredje Nations Territorium, da skal en saadan afdöd Sömands Efterladenskab, som maatte være blevet modtaget af Konsulen for den Nation, til hvilken Skibet hörer, i den Havn hvor Dödsfaldet har fundet Sted, udbetales, efter Fradrag af paaløbne Udgifter, til den anden Nations Konsul i samme Havn.

Isaadanne Tilfælde, hvor en afdöd Sömand har undertegnet Folkelisten efter Omstændighederne enten som Dansk eller som Britisk Undersaat, men hvor den Regjering i hvis Hænder hans Eiendele ere komne, nærer Tvivl om hans Nationalitet, skal denne Regjering ligesfuldt tage vare paa hans Efterladenskab, og snarest muligt sende en Opjærelse af dette og detses Værdi, tilligemed alle de Oplysninger om den Afdöde, hvoraf denne Regjering maatte være i Besiddelse, til den anden Regjering, ligesom den skal udlevere Eiendelen til den anden Regjering umiddelbart efter at have modtaget dennes Forsikkring om, at der ikke er nogen Tvivl om, at den Afdöde var dens Undersaat.

ARTIKEL II.

Skulde den Afdöde have tjent i den Kongelig Storbritanniske Marine, da skal der, med Hensyn til Tilgodehavender, der maatte være at udbetale ved det Britiske Admiralitet, forholdes efter Storbritannisk Lov.

ARTIKEL III.

Udtrykket "Sömand" i denne Deklaration indbefatter enhver Person (undtagen Skibsförere og Lødsere), som er ansat eller forhyret i en eller anden Egenskab ombord paa et Handelskib, eller som har været ansat eller forhyret saaledes, indenfor et Tidrum af sex Maaneder før hans Död, og ligesledes enhver Person (med Undtagelse af Officerer, civile Bestillingsmænd, "Warrant" eller "Subordinate Officers" eller Maskine-Assistenten), som er tilført et Orlogsskibs Lister eller hörer til sammes Besætning.

Udtrykkene "Eiendele," "Efterladenskab" indbefatte al "Eiendom, tilgodehavende Hyre, Penge eller andre Effekter," som en afdöd Sömand maatte have efterladt ombord paa et Skib.

Udtrykket "Konsul" indbefatter General-Konsul, Konsul, og Vice-Konsul samt enhver Person, som midlertidigt udforer en General-Konsuls, Konsuls, eller Vice-Konsuls Embedsforretninger.

Til Bekræftelse heraf have de Undertegnede underskrevet denne Deklaration, som umiddelbart træder i Kraft, og paatrykt den deres Vaabensegl.

DECLARATION BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND ITALY RELATIVE TO THE DISPOSAL OF THE ESTATES OF DECEASED SEAMEN OF THE TWO NATIONS.

Signed at London, April 17, 1877.

THE Government of Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and the Government of His Majesty the King of Italy, being desirous to make arrangements as to the disposal of the property of deceased seamen of the two nations in certain cases, the Undersigned, duly authorized to that effect, have agreed as follows:—

ARTICLE I.

If any British seaman dies on board an Italian ship, or whilst serving on board an Italian ship within Italian territory; or if, on the other hand, any Italian seaman dies on board a British vessel, or whilst serving on board a British vessel within British territory, the Governments of Italy and of Great Britain respectively shall provide as far as possible for the protection, without loss or injury, of any money or effects belonging to such deceased seaman.

Il Governo di Sua Maestà la Regina del Regno Unito di Gran Bretagna ed Irlanda, e il Governo di Sua Maestà il Re d'Italia, desiderando di stabilire accordi sul modo di disporre, in certi casi, dei beni lasciati da marinai defunti delle due nazioni, i Sottoscritti, debitamente autorizzati a tale oggetto, hanno convenuto di quanto segue:—

ARTICOLO I.

Se qualche marinaio Britannico muore a bordo di un bastimento Italiano, o, mentre trovasi al servizio di un bastimento Italiano, entro territorio Italiano; o se, dall'altro canto, qualche marinaio Italiano muore a bordo d'una nave Britannica, o, mentre trovasi al servizio di una nave Britannica entro territorio Britannico, i Governi d'Italia e della Gran Bretagna provvederanno rispettivamente, per quanto sarà possibile, alla tutela, senza perdita o danno, di qualsiasi danaro od effetti appartenenti a tale marinaio defunto.

In the case of a British seaman dying as aforesaid, the Italian Government shall cause the property, if not exceeding £50 in value, to be delivered, as soon as possible after the decease, to the British Consul at the Italian port where the decease occurs; or if the decease does not occur at an Italian port, but on Italian territory, to the British Consul nearest to the place where such decease occurs, or where the property may be; or if such decease occurs at sea on board an Italian vessel, to the British Consul at the first Italian port at which the vessel arrives after such decease.

In the case of an Italian seaman dying as aforesaid, his property, if not exceeding £50 in value, shall, subject to the provision contained in Article II., be delivered, as soon as possible after the decease, to the Italian Consul at the British port where the decease occurs; or if the decease does not occur at a British port but on British territory, to the Italian Consul nearest to the place where such decease occurs, or where the property may be; or if such decease occurs at sea on board a British vessel, to the Italian Consul at the first British port at which the vessel arrives after such decease.

When the property exceeds £50 in value it shall, subject to the provision contained in Article II., be paid to the legal representative of the deceased according to the law of the nation of the ship or territory where the property is at the time of the decease.

In cases where a deceased seaman has signed articles either as an Italian or as a British subject, as the case may be, but the Government into whose possession his effects come is not satisfied of his nationality, that Government shall equally protect his property, and shall send an account of it, and its value, and of all information in the possession of that Government relating to the deceased, to the other Government as soon as possible, and shall deliver the property to the other Government immediately on receiving its assurance that there is no doubt that the deceased was a subject of it.

ARTICLE II.

If the deceased shall have served in the Royal Navy of Great Britain, any assets which may be payable by the British Admiralty shall be dealt with according to the law of Great Britain.

Allorchè i beni eccedono in valore 50 lire sterline, esse verranno rimessi, salvo il disposto dell'Articolo II., al rappresentante legale del defunto in conformità della legge della nazione del bastimento o del territorio ove trovansi i beni all'epoca della morte.

Nel caso in cui un marinaio defunto avesse contratto arruolamento, sia qual suddito Italiano o qual suddito Britannico secondo che sia il caso, ma che il Governo nel di cui possesso vengono i suoi effetti non sia persuaso della di lui nazionalità, quel Governo tutelerà egualmente i di lui beni e manderà un ragguaglio di essi e del loro valore, e d'ogni informazione da esso posseduta concernente il defunto all'altro Governo al più presto possibile, e consegnerà i beni all'altro Governo immediatamente dopo essere stato da quello assicurato che non havvi dubbio che defunto era di lui suddito.

ARTICOLO II.

Se il defunto avrà servito nella Marina Reale della Gran Bretagna, qualsiasi avere che fosse pagabile dall'Armadorato Britannico sarà trattato in conformità della legge della Gran Bretagna.

ARTICOLO III.

Il vocabolo "marinaio" in questa Dichiarazione comprende ogni persona (eccettuati i capitani e piloti) impiegata od arruolata in qualsiasi qualità a bordo di qualunque bastimento mercantile, o che sia stata in tal guisa impiegata od arruolata entro sei mesi prima della sua morte, ed ogni persona (che non sia un ufficiale superiore, basso ufficiale, od ufficiale subalterno, od assistente macchinista) portata sui ruoli o formante parte del complemento di qualsiasi bastimento pubblico da guerra.

Il vocabolo "Consolo" comprende Consolo-Generale, Consolo, Vice-Consolo, ed Agente Consolare, ed ogni persona che disempegni temporaneamente le funzioni di Consolo-Generale, Consolo, Vice-Consolo, od Agente Consolare.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time upon the application in writing of the council of any municipality to proclaim any part of the municipal district of such municipality, to be defined by such council, not being a borough having a population of Five hundred persons liable to be rated, as shown by the rate-book, a special area; and it was further enacted that the fee which should be paid for a publican's license in respect of premises situated within a special area should be Ten pounds only; and the Governor in Council might from time to time revoke any proclamation made under the authority of the above recited section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim as a special area under the provisions of the fourteenth section of the Act above recited the undermentioned locality, that is to say:-

The old Township of Avenel.

TO CLOSE THE PORTS OF ENTRY AT VUNA POINT IN THE ISLAND OF TAVIUNI AND GALOA BAY IN THE ISLAND OF KADAVU.

(L.S.) ARTHUR GORDON.

Preamble. WHEREAS by a Notice published in the *Royal Gazette* No. 10 dated October 9th 1875 it was directed that the Port of Vuna Point Taviuni should be a Port of Entry and by a Notice published in the *Royal Gazette* No. 12 dated October 30th 1875 it was directed that the Port of Galoa Bay Kadavu should be a Port of Entry and whereas it is expedient that such Ports

at Vuna Point and Galoa Bay should cease to be Ports of Entry.

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council:—

Vuna Point I. That on and after the thirtieth day of September in the present year the Ports of Vuna Point in the Island of Taviuni and Galoa Bay in the Island of Kadavu shall cease to be Ports of Entry. Provided always that it shall be lawful for the Governor by Proclamation in the *Royal Gazette* to re-open such Ports as Ports of Entry at any future time.

Passed in Council this sixteenth day of August in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven.

DECREE RESPECTING CONSULAR CERTIFICATES FOR IMPORTED GOODS.

MARIANO IGNACIO PRADO, Constitutional President of the Republic, considering—1st. That, in view of the doubts expressed by many of the consuls, and communicated to the Minister of Foreign Affairs, it is necessary to determine the use which importers of merchandise are to make of the certified invoices required by Article 187 of the existing Consular Regulations; and—2nd. That Articles 187, 188, 197, and 201 are frequently broken by importers of merchandise and captains of vessels arriving with goods from foreign ports, and that it is necessary these faults should not pass unpunished, I hereby decree—

1st. Owners or consignees of cargo despatched to the ports of the Republic will present the invoice, certified by the proper Peruvian Consul, as a proof of the invoice they are bound to present by Article 38 of the Commercial Regulations.

2nd. Merchandise for which no certified invoices are presented, as required by Articles 188 and 197 of the Consular Regulations and Article 1 of this decree, will be subject to a surcharge of 25 per cent. of the duty upon them, as determined by the tariff. Merchandise entitled to enter free of duty will be taxed 25 per cent. on its total value.

3rd. Chief Inspectors of Custom Houses may concede to importers who do not present at once their certified invoices a reasonable time in which to produce them, under a bond representing the 25 per cent. of the fine, and on the production of the certificates only 5 per cent. will be collected.

4th. The captain of a ship which enters a Peruvian port without being provided with certified documents by the respective Consul of the Republic, as provided by Articles 187 and 201 of the Consular Regulations, will be subject to a fine of from 100 soles to 1000 soles, as determined by the Chief of the Custom House, but without becoming thereby exempt from the dispositions of Article 28 of the Commercial Regulations.

5th. The fine imposed by the foregoing clause will not be inflicted if the captain should prove that the non-possession of the requisite documents was occasioned by a cause over which he had no control, such as shipwreck, fire, or piracy, or if the vessel had not been cleared for a Peruvian port and only arrived through stress of circumstances.

6th. The provisions of the Commercial Regulations of December 15th 1844, which have been replaced by those of the consular decree of 22nd June 1876, are hereby declared null and void.

7th. The present Decree will be communicated to the Consuls of the Republic, and the fines established by it will be applied to the merchandise and vessels subject to them which, without having complied with the legal requisites, leave their port of departure eight days after the date on which the consul of the district shall have notified the provisions of this decree by advertisement.

8th. The dispositions contained in this Decree will be considered as additional to the Consular Regulations at present in force.

The births of 806 children, viz., 416 boys and 390 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of August. In the month of July 706 births were registered, or 100 less than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in August numbered 453, viz., 235 of males and 218 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 353. The deaths were 7 less than those recorded in July, but exceeded the average of August during the previous ten years by 140. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of those ten years by 91.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 69'4° on the 13th, and the lowest was 31'0° on the 5th. The mean temperature of the month (50'7°) was nearly a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (32°) took place on the 30th, viz., from a maximum of 63° to a minimum of 31°. The least range (11'6°) was on the 20th, viz., from a maximum of 52'8° to a minimum of 41'2°. The mean daily range was 19'4°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30'075 inches) was more than a tenth of an inch in excess of the average.

Fifty-two per cent. of the total mortality was of males, and 48 per cent. was of females. Thirty-four per cent. was of children under the age of 5 years as against 32 per cent. in August 1876; 33 per cent. in August 1875; 30 per cent. in August 1874, and in August 1873; 33½ per cent. in August 1872; 45 per cent. in August 1871; 41 per cent. in August 1870; 35 per cent. in August 1869; 43 per cent. in August 1868; and 39 per cent. in August 1867.

The deaths of 16 persons of the age of 75 years or upwards were registered during the month, viz.:—Those of a female aged 75, of old age; a laborer, aged 75, and two females, aged 76 and 77 respectively, of bronchitis; a female, aged 76, of disease of the brain; another, aged 77, of apoplexy; one, aged 79, of asthma; a laborer aged 80, of enlargement of the prostate gland; a female teacher, aged 80, of senile decay; a merchant, aged 81, of paralysis; a widow, aged 81, of hæmorrhage from the lungs; a female, aged 82, of paralysis; another, aged 83, of bronchitis; and one, aged 83, of heart disease; a landed proprietor, aged 84, of hepatitis; and a master mariner, aged 85, of fracture of the thigh from an accidental fall in his bedroom.

Of the nineteen deaths from external causes recorded during the month, fourteen were set down to accident, three to homicide, and two to suicide. The following are the particulars:—A girl, aged 8, died of concussion of the brain, and a master mariner, aged 85, of fracture of the thigh, both caused by accidental falls; a cabdriver, aged 38, received a fracture of the skull by being accidentally thrown from a wgonette; a female child, aged 2, died of inflammation of the throat, caused by drinking tea from a teapot; a male child, aged 4, died of scalds, and one, aged 3, and a female, aged 24, died of burns; a male of unstated occupation, aged 37, died of opium poisoning, and a female, aged 17, died of poisoning by phosphorus accompanied with abortion; a clerk, aged 13, and a mariner, aged 26, were accidentally drowned—the former in the River Yarra whilst boating, and the latter in Hobson's Bay, whilst intoxicated; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 45 or 50, was found drowned in the River Yarra without any marks of violence on his body; a male infant, aged 5 days, was suffocated in bed; a female infant, aged 1 month, was found dead in a quarry-hole on Richmond Flat. Of the victims to homicide, a female and a male, newly born, were wilfully murdered, by suffocation in the latter instance; and a bootmaker, aged 19, died of an injury to the brain received during a prize fight, which resulted in five persons being committed for trial for manslaughter. Of the persons who committed suicide a clerk, aged 27, cut his throat, and a solicitor, aged 40, drowned himself in the River Yarra—both of these are stated to have been of unsound mind.

One hundred and two deaths, or 23 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—58 in the Melbourne Hospital, 6 in the Immigrants' Home, 9 in the Lying-in Hospital, 6 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 9 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 2 in the Melbourne Industrial Schools.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 153, of which 82, or 54 per cent., were of males; and 71, or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 84 were under one year of age, 31 were between one and two, 19 were between two and three, 9 were between three and four, and 10 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 300. Of these, 153, or 51 per cent., were males, and 147, or 49 per cent., were females; 15 were between five and ten, 8 were between ten and fifteen, 9 were between fifteen and twenty, 27 were between twenty and twenty-five, 22 were between twenty-five and thirty, 22 were between thirty and thirty-five, 29 were between thirty-five and forty, 36 were between forty and forty-five, 25 were between forty-five and fifty, 21 were between fifty and fifty-five, 24 were between fifty-five and sixty, 19 were between sixty and sixty-five, 15 were between sixty-five and seventy, 12 were between seventy and seventy-five, 7 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 9 were upwards of eighty.

Seventy-three deaths from phthisis were recorded in August and 61 in July. In no two previous months since these reports were first published in 1850, has so large a mortality been set down to this complaint. The average monthly number of deaths from it in the twelve months prior to July was 44. Diseases of the respiratory system also caused a heavy mortality in the two months, the number of deaths from these affections having been 81 in July and 88 in August. One of the deaths under this head, tabulated as from pneumonia, occurred to a woman shortly after confinement. Besides this, 11 deaths occurred from the consequence of childbearing, or 1 death of a mother to every 73 births registered. Deaths from whooping-cough, which numbered 30 in July, fell to 20 in August; and deaths from typhoid fever fell from 19 to 17.

CUTTING OF TIMBER, ETC., ON CERTAIN LANDS IN THE WOMBAT OR BULLAROOK STATE FOREST PROHIBITED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything therein before contained the Governor might by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber, or particular description of timber, or bark from the land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter defined and situate in the Wombat or Bullarook State Forest, that is to say:—

County of Bourke, parish unnamed, situate in the Wombat or Bullarook State Forest: Commencing at the north-west angle of Crawley and Fitzpatrick's sawmill site at Spargo's Creek; bounded thence by a line bearing north one hundred and fifty-five chains, more or less, to the summit of Bald Hill Range; thence south-easterly and southerly by the summit of that range to a point thereon bearing east from the north-west angle of Crawley and Fitzpatrick's sawmill site aforesaid; and thence by a line bearing west to the point of commencement. The bearings have reference to the magnetic meridian.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby rescind to the extent hereinafter mentioned, all rules, regulations, schedules, and orders hereinafter expressed to be rescinded, and doth make in lieu thereof the Regulations following, to commence and come into force on the passing hereof:—

1. The Regulations following are in lieu of those dated the 7th February 1876, so far as relates to the matters herein prescribed respecting allotments licensed under section 49, *Land Act 1869*, within the boundaries of the Sale Municipal Common.

2. The fee to be paid for a license to occupy, under section 49, *Land Act 1869*, for residence or cultivation, land within the boundaries of the Sale Municipal Common, shall be calculated on the basis of eight per cent. (8%) on the capital value, to be ascertained as hereinafter provided. A fractional part of an acre shall be considered as an entire acre.

3. The Receiver and Paymaster and the District Surveyor respectively for the time being for the Sale district, shall assess the capital value of these lands after survey, and in such assessment shall take into account the quality of the soil, the relative elevation of each site with respect to flood level, and its distance from the business portion of the borough.

4. No licensed allotment shall in any case be put up for sale in the interest of the licensee, until the licensee shall have complied with the conditions of his license for a period of not less than three (3) years.

5. The upset price of any such allotment shall not be less than the capital value thereof, as ascertained in the manner aforesaid.

6. Any unlicensed allotments within the boundaries aforesaid may be thrown open for selection, or may be put up for tender, subject to the provisions of these Regulations.

7. These Regulations are to be read and construed with the Regulations dated 7th February 1876 and 24th July 1876 respectively.

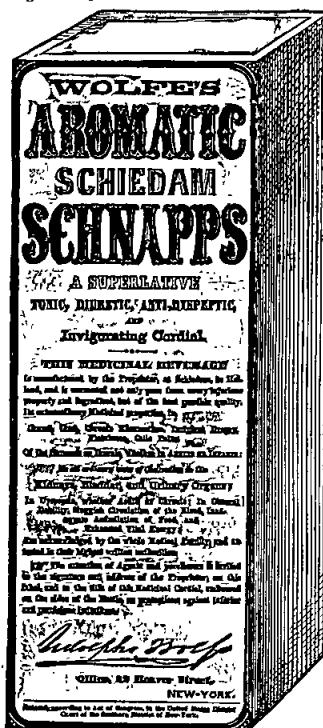
