OUTLYING DISTRICT ANNEXED TO THE BOROUGH OF FOOTSCRAY.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the first day of October 1877.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Governor in Council might from time to time make an Order to annex an outlying district forming with the municipal district of some municipality one continuous area to such municipal district; and it was also enacted that every Order annexing any district to a subdivided municipal district should (amongst other alterations) annex the annexed district to some subdivision, or in separate portions to some subdivisions of the municipal district; and it was also enacted that every petition for the annexation of an outlying district to a municipal district should be under the common seal of the municipality: And whereas a petition under the common seal of the municipality of Footscray has been presented to the Governor in Council praying for the annexation of the outlying district hereinafter described to the middle ward of the said municipality: And whereas the substance and prayer of the said petition have been duly published in the *Government Gazette* and in a newspaper circulating in the said municipality or borough of Footscray, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act: And whereas no counter petition, signed by an equal or a larger number of persons qualified to sign a like petition, has been presented to the Governor in Council within one month after the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition aforesaid: And whereas by an Order in Council made on the seventh day of May last the said borough of Footscray was subdivided into three subdivisions respectively named the North, Middle, and South Wards: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council doth by this present Order annex the district hereinafter described, forming with the borough of Footscray one continuous area to the Middle subdivision or ward of the said borough, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point on the right bank of the Saltwater River where it is intersected by the southern side of the Melbourne and Murray River Railway; thence easterly and south-easterly by that railway to the western boundary of the city of Melbourne; thence southerly by that boundary to the south side of the Melbourne and Footscray road; thence westerly by that road to the present eastern boundary of the borough; and thence northerly by that boundary to the point of commencement.

And the Honorable Graham Berry, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PUBLIC PARK AT ELTHAM.

THE Council of the Shire of Eltham, being the duly appointed committee of management of the land in the town of Eltham reserved for a Public Park, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management of the said Park, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*:—

- 1st. The reserve shall be open from sunrise to sunset for purposes of public recreation.
- 2nd. No person shall remove timber, soil, or other material from off the reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Eltham Shire Council.
- 3rd. No person shall be allowed to deposit or leave any glass, rubbish, or other matter of a similar nature upon any part of the reserve.
- 4th. All cattle, including horses, sheep, pigs, and goats, found trespassing upon the reserve shall be impounded, or the owners thereof proceeded against under the provisions of the 106th section of *The Land Act 1869*.
- 5th. Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and any person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against such regulations, and who shall not after he has been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable or authorized officer of the Eltham Shire Council desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, constable, or officer as aforesaid, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

At a meeting of the Eltham Shire Council held on Monday, 3rd September 1877, the foregoing regulations were adopted and ordered to be forwarded for the approval of the Board of Land and Works.

Power of disposition.—Power to sell, lease, mortgage, or exchange, subject to the approval of the Bishop of the Diocese of Melbourne, or during the absence of the Bishop from the Diocese, or the vacancy of the See, to the approval of the person for the time being administering the affairs of the Diocese; the Bishop or such person as aforesaid to have power to remove trustees and to appoint new trustees, and to fill up all vacancies occurring in trusteeship. The land, until otherwise disposed of, to be held for the purposes for which it was granted or reserved by the Crown.

Purposes to which proceeds of disposition are to be applied.—To such purposes of the Church of England as may be agreed upon by (1) the Bishop, or during his absence from his See, or during the vacancy thereof, by the person for the time being administering the affairs of the Diocese, (2) the trustees, and (3) the minister (if any) entitled to officiate in or occupy any building upon the land.
