The births of 625 children, viz., 328 boys and 297 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of November. In the month of October 726 births were registered, or 101 more than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in November numbered 458, viz., 241 of males and 217 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 167. The deaths were in excess of those in October by 88, and exceeded the average of November during the previous ten years by 117. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of those ten years by 64.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 97.1° on the 26th, and the lowest was 38.5° on the 10th. The mean temperature of the month (56.8°) was three degrees below the average, and is the lowest on record since 1860, the time when these reports were first published. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (49.6°) took place on the 26th, viz., from a maximum of 97.1° to a minimum of 47.5°. The least range (8.0°) was on the 21st, viz., from a maximum of 63.8° to a minimum of 55.8°. The mean daily range was 22.7°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.858 inches) was a little below the average.

Fifty-three per cent. of the deaths registered during the month were of males, 47 per cent. were of females. Forty-two per cent. were of children who had not attained the age of 5 years as against 42 per cent. in November 1876; 46 per cent. in November 1875; 47 per cent. in November 1874; 42 per cent. in November 1873; 48 per cent. in November 1872; 42 per cent. in November 1871; 48 per cent. in November 1870; 47 per cent. in November 1869; 49 per cent. in November 1868; and 45 per cent. in November 1867.

The records of the month under review include the deaths of 20 persons of the age of 75 years or upwards, viz.:—Those of a female, aged 77, of pneumonia; a shepherd, aged 76, of disease of the brain; a tanner, aged 77, of erysipelas; a female, aged 77, of cancer; a female, aged 77, of valvular disease of the heart; another female, aged 77, of bronchitis; a male, of occupation unstated, aged 77, of pneumonia; a laborer, aged 77, of asthma; a gentleman, aged 77, of old age; a gentleman, aged 81, of paralysis; a female, aged 81, of ascites; a laborer, aged 81, of atrophy of the liver; a painter and a gardener, aged 83 and 84 respectively, of senile gangrene; a female, aged 85, of old age; another female, aged 86, of apoplexy; a solicitor, aged 88, and three females, aged respectively 88, 90, and 91 of old age.

Thirty-four deaths from external causes were recorded during the month, a number which is seldom reached in the district of Melbourne and suburbs. Of these 29 were entered as accidental, 1 as homicidal, and 4 as suicidal. The particulars are as follow:—A boy, aged 6, died of the result of a piece of wood accidentally penetrating the brain through the orbit; a

miner, aged 22, was killed by a fall of clay; a boy, aged 7, was killed by the fall of a burning tree; two female children, aged 2 and 8 respectively, were passed over by vehicles; a carter, aged 44, died of injuries received by the kick of a horse; a gardener, aged 28, and a farmer, aged 42, were killed by being thrown from vehicles; a female, aged 70, died of fracture of the femur, caused by falling down steps; a butcher, aged 28, received fatal injuries through being crushed between two vehicles; as also did a mariner, aged 39, through being crushed between the buffers of two railway trucks; a grocer, aged 23, died of dislocation of the neck whilst bathing; a carter, aged 34, died of injury to the spinal cord; a farmer, aged 58, succumbed to the effects of amputation of the foot consequent on compound fracture of the tibia; an optician, aged 57, and two females, aged 74 and 83 respectively, died of burns; a clerk, aged 27, was accidentally drowned whilst suffering from an attack of epilepsy; an able-seaman, aged 37, was drowned in Hobson's Bay whilst intoxicated; a male child, aged 11, was drowned in a quarry hole; and a female child, also aged 11, was drowned in a bath; a clerk, aged 25, three males of unknown occupations, aged 30, 40, and 45 respectively, a grocer, aged 34, and a gardener, aged 58, were found drowned; two infants, a male aged 8 months and a female aged 1 month, were suffocated in bed. The death from homicide was that of a railway night-watchman, aged 42, who was killed by stabbing. Of the deaths set down to suicide, that of an accountant, aged 30, was by stabbing; that of a domestic servant, aged 34, and that of a female, aged 48, were by drowning; that of a clerk, aged 21, was by hanging. The first and two last of these persons are stated to have been of unsound mind.

Ninety-eight deaths, or 21 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—50 in the Melbourne Hospital, 2 in the Immigrants' Home, 1 in the Children's Hospital, 9 in the Alfred Hospital, 4 in the Lying-in Hospital, 6 in the Benevolent Asylum, 8 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 11 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Homeopathic Hospital, 1 in the Eye and Ear Hospital, 4 in the Protestant Refuge, and 1 in the Industrial Schools.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 192, of which 87, or 45 per cent., were of males; and 105, or 55 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 130 were under one year of age, 33 were between one and two, 13 were between two and three, 9 were between three and four, and 7 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 266. Of these, 154, or 58 per cent., were males, and 112, or 42 per cent., were females; 18 were between five and ten, 12 were between ten and fifteen, 13 were between fifteen and twenty, 10 were between twenty and twenty-five, 14 were between twenty-five and thirty, 19 were between thirty and thirty-five, 18 were between thirty-five and forty, 27 were between forty and forty-five, 30 were between forty-five and fifty, 20 were between fifty and fifty-five, 26 were between fifty-five and sixty, 14 were between sixty and sixty-five, 12 were between sixty-five and seventy, 12 were between seventy and seventy-five, 8 were between seventy-five and eighty, 12 were upwards of eighty, and of 1 the age was unspecified.

Most deaths were set down to local diseases, especially those of the nervous and respiratory systems. The most fatal zymotic disease was whooping-cough, which caused 28 deaths, or 1 more than in the previous month. Deaths from diarrhoea also increased from 13 to 25, deaths from scarlatina from 8 to 15, and deaths from typhoid fever from 8 to 10. Under the head Constitutional diseases, phthisis caused 45 deaths, as against 49 in October. Four women died in childbirth, or 1 to every 156 of the registered births.
