IN pursuance of the powers conferred by sections 365 and 366 of the *Local Government Act 1874*, the Council of the Shire of Flinders and Kangerong doth hereby direct that the lands described in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th November 1877, p. 2139, for the opening of the following new roads, shall be public highways from and after the publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*.

Road two chains wide along the northern boundary of allotment No. 1, parish of Flinders.

Road one chain wide commencing at a point on the telegraph road two chains sixteen links from the eastern boundary of allotment 49 bearing 9° 48' E. twenty chains two links to the ocean frontage of said allotment 49, parish of Flinders.

Road one chain wide through the special survey, parish of Kangerong, starting from the southern boundary of said "survey" at the road between allotment 28 and allotment 1 of section 2 of said parish; thence N. 29° 10' E. twenty-seven chains, N. 18° 11' E. 38-97 chains, and N. 32° 36' E. 36-54 chains to join the present telegraph road.

The new roads above described in the parish of Flinders shall be in lieu of the three-chain road between allotments 48 and 1, and two portions of the ocean frontage road as shown on plan attached to this order.

The new road, parish of Kangerong, shall be in lieu of the present road from the last-named point of junction of new road with the telegraph road, south-westerly to the south boundary of the special survey.

THE following hydrographic information relative to parts of the Australian Station is promulgated for general information and guidance.

To the respective Captains and Officers commanding  
Her Majesty's ships on the Australian Station.

*Information received from Mr. Wm. Powell.*

There is a dangerous reef lying in China Straits not marked by Captain Moresby, Papiis Island bearing S.S.W. 1½ miles, Didymus Island (centre) S.E. ½ S. 2 miles covered at low-water, and seldom breaks.

*Information received from the Commander-in-Chief of the China Station.*

Mr. G. H. Harrington, master of the British barque *Pacific Slope*, reports that, after passing through Bougainville Straits on the 2nd March 1878, he experienced a S.S.E. set of 110 miles in one night which, as a very uneasy motion had been felt on board and in the morning the ship was found to be surrounded and embedded in enormous quantities of pumice of various sizes, he attributed to the effect of submarine volcanic disturbance.

*Information received from the Commanding Officer of H.M.S. Sappho.*

The *Sappho* searched between the 26th June and 2nd July 1878 for the Lucius and Aurora Shoals in Torres Straits, and did not find any trace of them to exist in the positions assigned to them on the chart.

*Information received from British Consul at Noumea, dated 23rd September 1878.*

In August 1878, about a fortnight after H.M.'s schooner *Renard* had completed a re-survey of the harbor, rendered necessary by the volcanic upheaval which took place in the Island of Tanna in January, February, and June 1878, another earthquake and extensive upheaval took place, and Port Resolution is reported to be almost entirely destroyed.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or

any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to the undermentioned Common the Crown lands hereinafter described, that is to say:—

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained the Governor might by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed, or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark; stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live timber from the unappropriated Crown lands comprising the Rosedale Town Common.—(78.C.14109.)

## SHIRE OF SOUTH BARWON.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE SOUTH BARWON MUNICIPAL COMMON.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations for the management of commons, and in pursuance of the provisions of chapter 13 of the regulations made under the said Act by the Governor in Council on the 26th May 1873, the Council of the Shire of South Barwon as managers of the South Barwon Municipal Common, submit to the Board of Land and Works for approval, the following regulations for the management of the said common, in lieu of the regulations of the 11th October 1870:—

1st. Each person entitled to commonage shall, before depasturing any cattle on the said common, give to the herdsman a true and correct description of such cattle, and their brands and other distinctive marks, and shall obtain from the herdsman a certificate of having done so, and fees will be charged on the same until notice of removal has been given in writing to the herdsman.

2nd. Each person shall, four weeks in advance, pay to the herdsman the fees hereinafter mentioned, and, in the event of non-payment, and until payment has been made, no person shall depasture any cattle on the common.

3rd. The number of cattle which each person entitled to commonage may depasture on the common shall not exceed two horses or four head of cattle; two animals under twelve months of age being reckoned as one.

4th. The fees payable in respect of such cattle shall be the following:—

For every head of cattle, per week...	...	...	3d.
For every horse, per week ...	...	...	8d.
For sheep, per head, per week ...	...	...	1d.

5th. The manager may set apart a portion of the common for depasturing sheep thereon, and the persons depasturing shall be responsible for the same being kept on that portion of the common, if any, set apart for their use. Sheep trespassing on any other part of the common may be impounded.

6th. The managers, or their herdsman, while taking every reasonable care, will not be responsible or chargeable for the loss or damage of any cattle depasturing on the common, or undertake any responsibility should such cattle be impounded off other lands.

7th. The right of depasture shall not be transferable.

8th. No bulls or entire horses will be allowed to run on the common without special permission, in writing, from the common managers; and all goats, geese, and swine found on the common will be either impounded or destroyed.

9th. The common managers shall have full power to instruct the herdsman to sue for and recover any fees for depasturing of stock on the common.

10th. Every person offending against any regulation for the management of the common, shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

11th. The herdsman must give receipts for fees on printed forms only, and all moneys received by him on account of the common must be paid to the shire treasurer weekly.

12th. The managers shall, within one month after the termination of each year, publish in a newspaper circulating in the district wherein the common is situated, a certified account of their receipt and expenditure for the year, in the form prescribed in schedule xxv. to *The Land Act 1869*, regulations of the 26th May 1873, and forward copy thereof to the Board of Land and Works.

## MYRTLEFORD PUBLIC CEMETERY.

## REGULATIONS MADE BY THE TRUSTEES OF THE PUBLIC CEMETERY ESTABLISHED AT MYRTLEFORD.

1st. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the grave or vault is opened.

2nd. Orders must be given for interment at the office of the trustees, in Myrtleford, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 5 p.m. the previous day.

3rd. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.

4th. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the time appointed for the funeral.

5th. The hours of interment will be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. from the 1st of September to 30th of April, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the other four months of the year.

6th. The charge will be remitted for the burial of any person, on evidence being produced to the trustees that the

relatives or friends of such persons are unable to pay the costs and charges.

7th. Application for permission to make a vault, or erect a monument in the cemetery, must be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the person applying, on the payment of the proper charges.

8th. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug; but when a brick grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees, or some person duly appointed by them. And in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.

9th. All monuments, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition, at the expense of owner.

10th. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.

11th. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a copy of every proposed epitaph, must be submitted to the trustees for their approval. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

12th. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper order and repair must be removed, by order of the trustees, without notice to the owner.

13th. A plan of cemetery will be kept, together with a registry, and may be inspected at the office of the trustees.

14th. No servant or other person employed or engaged on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for discharge thereof.

15th. Any person wantonly or wilfully destroying, or doing, or causing to be done, any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery, is guilty of a misdemeanour, and being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished as prescribed by the 35th section of *The Cemeteries Statute 1864*.

16th. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.

17th. The trustees reserve the right to make alterations from time to time in these regulations.

# QUARANTINE DISTRICT UNDER "THE DISEASES IN STOCK ACT 1872" REVOKED.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has revoked the Order in Council dated 11th July 1878, declaring Gilbert Marshall's land at Yea, hereinafter mentioned, a Quarantine District, that is to say:—
