DISTRICTS WHERE PUBLICANS' LICENSES MAY BE SPECIALLY GRANTED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore, I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the under-mentioned localities to be respectively districts wherein publicans' licenses may be specially granted under the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act, that is to say:—

The site of the new Goulburn bridge, in the parish of Kotupna, county of Moira.

A small portion on the east side of the River Goulburn, including the approach to the new bridge, known as McCoy's.

The new gold and antimony mining district about one mile east of Ringwood, on the White Horse road, about fifteen miles from Melbourne.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-first day of January in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and in the forty-first year of Her Majesty's reign.

The births of 657 children, viz., 318 boys and 339 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of December. In the month of November 625 births were registered, or 32 less than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in December numbered 497, viz., 251 of males and 246 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 160. The deaths exceeded those in November by 35, and exceeded the average of December during the previous ten years by 56. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 13.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 96.8° on the 12th, and the lowest was 43.1° on the 6th. The mean temperature of the month (61.1°) was nearly 3° below the average, and is the lowest for the month of December during the past 11 years. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (49.9°) took place on the 12th, viz., from a maximum of 96.8° to a minimum of 46.9°. The least range (8.9°) was on the 20th, viz., from a maximum of 64.1° to a minimum of 55.2°. The mean daily range was 24.1°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.821 inches) was a little above the average.

Males and females contributed in about equal proportions to the mortality of the month. Half the deaths were of children under the age of 5 years as compared with 46 per cent. in December 1876; 45 per cent. in December 1875; 60 per cent. in December 1874; 48 per cent. in December 1873; 65 per cent. in December 1872; 53 per cent. in December 1871; 52 per cent. in December 1870; 53 per cent. in December 1869; 55 per cent. in December 1868; and 54 per cent. in December 1867.

The deaths of 14 persons of the age of 75 or upwards were recorded during the month. Of these only two were males, viz., a brickmaker, aged 78, who died of valvular disease of the heart; and a chemist, aged 79, of typhoid fever. Six females, aged respectively 78, 78, 82, 85, 85, and 86, died of old age; a female, aged 75, of paralysis; one, aged 79, of paraplegia; one, aged 81, of diarrhoea; one, aged 81, of bronchitis; one, aged 85, of disease of the brain; and one, aged 86, of paralysis.

Twenty-two deaths from external causes were recorded during the month. Fourteen of these are set down to accident, 4 to homicide, and 4 to suicide. The following are the particulars:—A male aged 3, and a female aged 39, were killed by a falling chimney; a seaman, aged 18, was killed by falling from aloft; a seaman, aged 39, died from internal injuries caused by falling down stairs; a female, aged 42, was accidentally shot; two boys, aged 2 and 6 respectively, died of burns; a seaman, aged 33, died of burns caused by explosion of gas in a ship's hold; a boy, aged 6, and a laborer, aged 35, were drowned—the former in a quarry hole, the latter in the River Yarra; a fisherman, aged 25, was drowned by falling overboard whilst suffering from an epileptic fit; a seaman, aged 31, was drowned whilst bathing in a dangerous surf; a female, aged 53, was found drowned in the River Yarra. The deaths from homicide consisted of the wilful murder of three infants—a male, whose skull was fractured at birth; a new-born male, who succumbed to exposure; and a female, aged 2 months, who was deprived of food; also of a seaman, aged 50, who was stabbed in the neck. The suicidal deaths were those of a barber, aged 45, by breathing the fumes of burning charcoal; two females, aged respectively 20 and 42, by drowning whilst in a state of unsound mind; and a laborer, aged 51, who threw himself in front of a railway train.

Eighty-six deaths, or 17 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—40 in the Melbourne Hospital, 2 in the Immigrants' Home, 10 in the Alfred Hospital, 8 in the Lying-in Hospital, 5 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 9 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 2 in the Penridge Stockade, 2 in the Industrial Schools, and 2 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 249, of which 124, or 50 per cent., were of males; and 125, or 50 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 175 were under one year of age, 43 were between one and two, 13 were between two and three, 9 were between three and four, and 9 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 248. Of these, 127, or 51 per cent., were males, and 121, or 49 per cent., were females; 11 were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 14 were between fifteen and twenty, 16 were between twenty and twenty-five, 15 were between twenty-five and thirty, 22 were between thirty and thirty-five, 19 were between thirty-five and forty, 24 were between forty and forty-five, 24 were between forty-five and fifty, 25 were between fifty and fifty-five, 19 were between fifty-five and sixty, 11 were between sixty and sixty-five, 15 were between sixty-five and seventy, 8 were between seventy and seventy-five, 6 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 8 were upwards of eighty.

Scarlatina caused 16 deaths against 15 in November, diphtheria caused 6 deaths against 5, typhoid fever 18 deaths against 10, and diarrhoea 63 deaths against 25. On the other hand deaths from whooping-cough fell from 28 to 19, and deaths from dysentery from 7 to 6. Phthisis caused 43 deaths, as against 45 in November. Five deaths were set down to childbirth, or 1 death of a mother to every 131 births registered.

During the year 1877 the number of births registered in Melbourne and suburbs amounted to 8295 and the number of deaths to 5310, being in the proportion of 33.57 births and 21.49 deaths to every 1000 of the population. The gain to the population of the district by excess of births over deaths was 2985, as against 2806 in 1876, and 1910 in 1875.

PUBLIC GARDENS, DAYLESFORD.

WE, the Mayor and Councillors of the Borough of Daylesford, having the control and management of the land at Wombat Hill, Daylesford, reserved for the purposes of a Public Garden, have framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the above-mentioned reserve, and the preservation of good order and decency therein, and hereby submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by Section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The gardens shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the gardens who may offend against decency as regards his dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall pluck any of the flowers nor walk on the beds or borders, nor remove any of the tallies, nor interfere with or in any way damage any of the trees, flowers, or shrubs in the gardens.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way deface, damage, or destroy any of the trees, fences, gates, seats, or buildings in the gardens.
5. No person shall roll or throw stones in the gardens, nor deposit any rubbish therein, nor cut nor remove any grass, nor light any fire within the reserve, without the written authority of the Borough Council of Daylesford, or of some person duly authorized on their behalf.
6. No person shall carry firearms through the gardens, nor shoot, snare, or destroy any game therein, without the written authority of the Borough Council of Daylesford, or of some person duly authorized on their behalf.
7. No person shall put any cattle, goats, or pigs in the gardens, nor bring therein any cart or other vehicle, without the written authority of the Borough Council of Daylesford, or of some person duly authorized on their behalf.
8. All dogs (unless they are led by a chain or cord) and all goats, pigs, and poultry found within the gardens may be destroyed, and compensation for any damage done by them recovered from their owners before any justice of the peace.
9. Children under the age of ten years, not being under the charge of some competent person, may be removed from the gardens.
10. No visitor shall interrupt the gardeners or laborers, by conversation or otherwise.
11. No person except laborers and workmen employed in the gardens shall enter any plots which may be enclosed or set apart within the reserve for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
12. Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any of these regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace; and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Adopted by the aforesaid mayor and councillors of the Borough of Daylesford on this 23rd day of November 1877.

PUBLIC PARK AND RECREATION RESERVE, DAYLESFORD.

WE, the Mayor and Councillors of the Borough of Daylesford, having the control and management of the land within the said borough reserved as a site for a Public Park and for purposes of Public Recreation, have framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the above-mentioned Public Park and Recreation Reserve, and the preservation of good order and decency therein; and hereby submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on days set apart for public sports.

No. 11.—JANUARY 25, 1878.—3.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards his dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates; or stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones therein.

5. No person shall light any fires in the reserve, nor erect any dwellings therein, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first having been obtained.

6. No person, except laborers or workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots which may be enclosed or set apart within the reserve for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

7. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, nor bring any dog therein, unless led by a chain or cord, without the written permission of the committee of management; and any person allowing cattle, goats, or pigs to trespass within the reserve shall be prosecuted under the provisions of *The Land Act 1869*.

8. All goats, pigs, and poultry, and all dogs except as hereinbefore provided, found trespassing within the reserve may be destroyed.

9. No person shall enter the reserve on any day set apart for public recreation or sports, nor be permitted to bring any horses, carriages, or other vehicles therein, except on production of a ticket issued by the committee of management duly authorizing the admission of such person or persons, or of any horses, carriages, or other vehicles; but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the day for which it is issued, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any buildings, erections, enclosures, plantations, or cultivated plots within the reserve.

10. All persons paying for admission to the reserve, or bringing therein any horses, carriages, or other vehicles, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which they shall upon demand produce, and if required to do so surrender, to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management to demand the surrender or production thereof.

11. Any person committing in the said reserve or in any of the buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being therein, any of the following offences, shall, together with any horses, carriages, or other vehicles in his or her possession or care, be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding that such person may have purchased and be in possession of a ticket of admission:—

1st. Being drunk or using any profane, indecent, or obscene language.

2nd. Assaulting any person making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.

3rd. Trespassing upon any enclosures, plantations, or cultivated plots, or upon any portions of the ground set apart for sports, or interfering with or interrupting any person engaged by the authority of the committee in carrying out any sports or amusements.

4th. Being found in any portion of the reserve or in any building, erection, or enclosure for the time being thereon, and not producing on demand or surrendering (if required) to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to demand the production or surrender thereof a ticket duly authorizing the admission of such person to the place wherein he or she may be found, unless such person shall forthwith satisfy the committee of management or any person deputed by them that he or she has paid the proper charge for admission to such place, and that the ticket of admission supplied to such person has been lost.

12. The maximum scale of charges for admission to the reserve and to any buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon, on any day set apart for public sports, shall be as follows:—

1st. For admission of each person to the reserve, such sum as may be determined by the committee of management not exceeding	s. d.

2nd. For admission of each person to any stand, building, erection, or enclosure, such sum as may be determined by the committee of management not exceeding	2 6
3rd. For admission of each saddle-horse (exclusive of rider), such sum as the committee of management may determine not exceeding	1 0
4th. For admission of any carriage, cart, or other vehicle (exclusive of passengers), drawn by one horse or other animal, such sum as the committee of management may determine not exceeding	2 0
5th. For admission of any cart, carriage, or other vehicle (exclusive of passengers), drawn by two or more horses or other animals, such sum as the committee of management may determine not exceeding	3 0

13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, buildings, erection, or enclosure for the occasion of any public sports may be required to deposit any sum not exceeding Ten pounds which the committee of management may determine, by way of guarantee that due care is taken of such stand, buildings, erection, or enclosure, and the committee of management may make repairs or make good any damage or loss sustained by such buildings, erections, stand, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the

sum of money deposited by such lessee by way of guarantee; and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these regulations and by any order given by the committee of management in reference to the reserve, or the buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon.

14. Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any of these regulations and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before any justice of the peace, and shall on conviction thereof forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

I. All rules and regulations in force up to this date are hereby rescinded.

II. Orders for interment must be given to the honorary secretary during the previous day to that on which it is intended to take place, and all charges must be paid in full at the time of giving the order.

III. The charges on the burial of any poor person in this cemetery will be remitted on certificate of a minister of religion or other reliable evidence, satisfying the trustees that such person was a pauper, and that the relatives of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

IV. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under direction of the trustees; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault the consent, in writing, of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

V. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased must be furnished to the honorary secretary, at the time of giving the order.

VI. Until otherwise ordered, the hours for performance of funerals will be from 10 o'clock a.m. to 6 o'clock p.m. from 1st day of September to the 30th day of April, both days inclusive; and from 10 o'clock a.m. to 4 o'clock p.m. during the remainder of the year.

VII. All monuments, graves, and gravestones will be kept in proper condition and repair by the trustees, at the expense of the owners.

VIII. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave must be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

IX. The cemetery will be open daily to the public.

X. The keeper has orders to turn out any person who shall behave indecorously or commit any trespass, or injury to the trees, flowers, or erections, or otherwise infringe the Act of Parliament relating to cemeteries or regulations for the protection of this cemetery, and such persons will be proceeded against and prosecuted according to law.

XI. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument, wooden palisade, or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription must be submitted to the trustees for approval who are required by the 18th section of the Act to determine and fix the position of any objectionable monument according to the description, size, and character thereof having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery. In erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

XII. The owners of any and all cattle or other animals which may be discovered, or known to have been trespassing on or damaging the cemetery, or fence, or any part thereof, or any erection whatsoever within the fence will be prosecuted according to the law.

XIII. The trustees reserve the right to alter or amend these rules and regulations from time to time as may be deemed desirable.

AUSTRALIA—SOUTH COAST—KING GEORGE SOUND AND APPROACHES.

EXISTENCE OF SUNKEN DANGERS.

The following information, relative to sunken dangers in King George Sound and its approaches, has been received from Staff Commander W. E. Archdeacon, conducting the Admiralty Survey, Western Australia:—

1. *Passage Reefs* consists of three rocky patches, on which the sea breaks heavily with southerly gales:—

The South-west of the Passage Reefs has 18 feet water on it and 20 fathoms at the distance of a cable around, and lies N.W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W., 44 miles from the summit of the largest Eclipse Isle; S.S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E., 24 miles from Stony Island; and S.W. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W., 3 miles from Green Island.

South-east Passage Reef has 5 fathoms on it, and 20 fathoms at the distance of a cable, and lies E.S.E. from South-west Rock, distant two-thirds of a mile; N.W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W., 23 miles from the largest of the Eclipse Isles; N.W. $\frac{3}{4}$ N., 24 miles from N.W. Eclipse Rock; and S.W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W., 24 miles from Green Island.

Inner Passage Reef has 6 fathoms on it, and bears N. by E., distant 8 cables from South-west Rock; N.W., 44 miles from the largest Eclipse Isle; and W. by S. $\frac{3}{4}$ S., 24 miles from Green Island.

2. *Eclipse N.W. Rock*, a small rock, 5 feet above water, and steep-to, lies north-westerly from the N.W. extreme of the largest Eclipse Isle, distant three-quarters of a mile. The ground swell generally breaks over this rock; it should not be approached within a cable.

The channel between Passage Reefs and Eclipse N.W. rock is 24 miles in width, with depths of from 30 to 33 fathom; this channel should not be used at night.

3. A rock, nearly awash, that generally breaks, also exists about 2 cables off the north-east extremity of the largest Eclipse Isle.

4. *Maude Reef*.—The shoalest part of this reef is about 200 yards long in a north-east and south-west direction, and 150 yards in width; there is an overhanging pinnacle rock near its south-west extreme, with 8 feet water on it, 5 to 7 fathoms close around, and depths of 25 to 34 and 37 fathoms at the distance of a quarter of a mile, rocky ground. On Maude Reef the sea breaks only with a heavy south-westerly swell.

The clearing marks for Maude Reef are, the west extreme of Breaksea Island open of Bald Head, bearing N. by E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E., which leads to the eastward; West Cape Howe open south

of the south-westernmost Eclipse Isle which leads to the southward.

5. *Belches Foul Ground*, on which, during southerly gales there is a confused and dangerous sea, lies E.N.E. about 14 miles from Bald Head, and consists of several patches, the two shoalest of which are near the S.E. and S.W. extremes.

The easternmost patch (breaking heavily in southerly gales), with 5 fathoms on it, and 20 fathoms at the distance of a cable, lies with Breaksea Island lighthouse bearing N. $\frac{3}{4}$ E., 2 miles; and Bald Head W. by S. $\frac{1}{4}$ S., distant 14 miles.

The westernmost patch, with 9 fathoms on it, and 20 fathoms around it, lies with Breaksea Island lighthouse N.N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E., 24 miles; and Bald Head S.W. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W., distant 14 miles.

King Point light, bearing N.W. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W., leads through the fairway into King George Sound, between Breaksea Island and Belches Foul Ground.

6. *Michaelmas Reefs* consist of several patches, extending westward of Michaelmas Island, the shoalest of which, with 14 feet on it at low water, bears W. by S., distant one mile from the west extreme of Michaelmas Island.

Two other patches with 44 and 6 fathoms on them, and 7 to 8 fathoms close around, bear respectively S.W., one cable, and S.W. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W., 14 cables from the shoalest part of Michaelmas Reefs.

A buoy, chequered black and white, with staff and drum, has been moored in 94 fathoms water, S.W. by W., distant one-third of a mile from the 14 feet rock. Vessels, other than small craft, should not pass between Michaelmas Island and this buoy.

7. *Mount Pleasant Rock*, with 18 feet on it at low water, lies in North Channel, nearly midway between Michaelmas Island and Herald Rocks, with north extreme of Rocky Islet in line with Cape Vancouver bearing east; and the eastern extreme of the headland (*Herald Point*) north of Herald Rocks bearing N. $\frac{3}{4}$ E.

Herald Rocks have 12 feet on them at low water; between Herald and Mount Pleasant rocks the depths are from 64 to 7 fathoms; and from Mount Pleasant Rock to Michaelmas Island 6 to 64 fathoms.

Vessels drawing more than 10 feet should not use the North Channel without a pilot.

BOROUGH OF DAYLESFORD.

BYE-LAW NO. 32.

A Bye-law of the Borough of Daylesford, made under section 213 of the Local Government Act 1874, and numbered 32, for the suppression of nuisances.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the borough of Daylesford order as follows:—

1. Every person who, within the borough, shall keep any goat or goats, or shall own any goat usually kept therein, shall register with the town clerk thereof the name of such person as a keeper of goats within the borough, together with the address of such, and shall at the time of such registration pay to the town clerk the sum of Two shillings, and thereafter on the first day of January of each year shall likewise pay to the town clerk the sum of Two shillings as annual fee for each goat so kept within the borough; and shall place and keep upon the neck of every goat so owned and kept a triangle, with bars eighteen inches long, bearing the name and address so registered. And if any person shall, without lawful excuse, offend in any respect against this section, he shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for such offence a penalty not exceeding Twenty shillings.

2. If any goat shall be found within the borough having on its neck such triangle purporting to bear the name and address of a person registered in the borough as afore-

said, such goat shall *prima facie* be presumed to be owned and kept within the borough by such person.

3. The council of the borough from time to time shall provide within the borough one secure enclosure for the keeping and custody of goats for the purpose of this bye-law; and forthwith, when any such enclosure shall have been provided, shall notify the same and the situation thereof in some newspaper generally circulating within the borough.

4. Every goat found at large in any street or public place within the borough, not being furnished with a triangle as hereinbefore required, may, by the proper officer of the council, be forthwith seized and confined in such enclosure as aforesaid, until dealt with as herein-after provided.

5. Subject to the provision hereinafter in this bye-law contained, every goat so seized and confined as aforesaid, which shall not have upon his neck a triangle purporting to bear the name and address of some person registered as aforesaid, may, by the proper officer, be destroyed at or after noon of the day following the day of such seizure.

6. Any person putting or keeping on the neck of any goat belonging to him a triangle purporting to bear the name and address of the owner without the goat being registered shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for such offence a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

7. It shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for appointing, by limits to be set forth therein, certain portions of the borough in which it shall not be lawful to keep any swine; and if any person shall keep any swine within any such prescribed limits, he shall, for every day during which he shall so offend, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

8. Every person who shall empty any privy, or load, carry, or remove or deposit any nightsoil, offal, or other offensive refuse or matter, save between such hours of the night, or shall deposit the same, save at such places as respectively shall have been appointed by some regulation of the council in that behalf, or who shall use for any such purpose any cart or carriage not having a covering proper for preventing the escape of the contents of such cart, or of the stench thereof, shall forfeit for any such offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds; and it shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for appointing such hours and places as aforesaid.
