PREPARATION OF GENERAL LISTS FOR ELECTORAL DISTRICTS DURING THE WEEK ENDING 1st DECEMBER 1878.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS FOR THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY.

IT is hereby notified that holders of Electors' Rights for the Legislative Assembly issued on or before 1st December 1877, must obtain renewed Rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the general lists to be made up during the week ending the 1st December next.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new Lists to be made up as aforesaid.

The old Right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed Right will bear the same number and be in the same form and tenor as that in lieu of which it is issued, and will be available for any election that may take place before the completion of the new Rolls in January next.

No elector whose name is on a Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any district, is entitled to a renewed Electors' Right for such District (*vide* sections 61 and 62 of *The Electoral Act 1865*).

I, THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to a Bill, passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

An Act to facilitate the taking or apprehending of persons charged with certain felonies and the punishment of those by whom they are harbored.

POLICE TRAVELLING ALLOWANCE REGULATIONS.

THE Governor in Council has from and after the 1st day of November 1878 rescinded the Police Travelling Allowance Regulations, published in the Government Gazette of the 26th day of July 1872, p. 1394, and has approved of the following Regulations which are to be observed in lieu thereof, and continued in operation from the 1st day of November 1878 until the 1st day of May 1879, viz.:

POLICE TRAVELLING ALLOWANCE REGULATIONS.

For Officers. s. d.

1. For each day during which the officer travels not less than thirty miles on duty, or is necessarily absent from his station on duty not less than eight hours 7 0
2. For each night necessarily absent from his station on duty 5 0

For Sub-Officers and Constables.

3. For each day during which the sub-officer or constable travels not less than thirty miles on duty, or is necessarily absent from his station on duty not less than eight hours 1 6
4. For each night necessarily absent from his station during a journey on duty and at a place where police sleeping accommodation is not available ... 3 6
5. For each day and night when temporarily stationed at any place where police sleeping accommodation is available 1 0
6. For each day and night when temporarily stationed at any place where police sleeping accommodation is not available 2 0

These regulations apply only to duty performed in the colony.

In calculating distances travelled by claimants, four (4) miles per railway, or two (2) miles per coach shall be reckoned as one (1) mile.

ALTERATION IN POSITION OF LEADING BEACONS AND LIGHTS, BURNETT RIVER.
In consequence of the further growth southwards of the Spit from the north shore, the large sea beacons at the entrance of the Burnett are now shifted to the south side of the river, and carry the leading lights. These kept in line on a W.S.W. bearing will lead over the bar in the deepest water, and clear of the end of the spit; after passing which, the leading marks in the bend of Sea-reach may be steered for as usual.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

LIGHT, FLAT-TOP ISLAND, PIONEER RIVER.
On and after this date, the temporary light on Flat-top Island—off the entrance to the Pioneer River—will be replaced by a fixed dioptric light of the 4th order. The light stands at an elevation of 174 feet above high-water, and in fine weather is visible from a distance of about 19 miles. It will be seen as a white light between the bearings of S. by W. southerly and N.W. westerly—except where the light is intercepted by Round-top Island, between the bearings of N. 64° and 53° W.—and as a red light between the bearings of N.W. westerly, and N. by E. northerly.

Vessels from the northward, after passing m. Island and opening out the white light, will be clear of the shoal water off Shoal-water Point, the reef off Rocky Islet, and the detached reef between that islet and Flat-top Island while the light is in sight; while vessels from the southward also will be clear of the reef off Hay Point while within the south-western edge of the sector of white light.

NOTE.—Since the above notice was published, Staff-Commander Bedwell, R.N., the Admiralty Surveyor, has reported having found a three-fathom patch lying N.W. 64 miles from Slade Point. REPORT ON DANGER, OFF OLIFANT'S POINT.

H.M. Surveying Vessel *Fawn*, Table Bay,
5th June 1878.

Commodore F. W. Sullivan, C.B., Senior Officer.

Sir,—I have the honor to inform you that, on the 3rd instant, I made an examination of the locality where the Union mail steamer *Kafir* struck and was lost on February last.

2. The survey has not been exhaustive, as time would not allow me to fill up thoroughly the great blanks that have been left in the chart of the entire west shore of the Cape Peninsula, nor was there any occasion why a very close survey of the waters off Olifant's Bosch should be undertaken.

The locality is well known to fishermen, who spend great part of their lives there, and three visits that I have made by land from Simon's Town have convinced me that these men know of no danger outside the rock called by them the "Albatross," on which they one and all declare the *Kafir* to have struck, they having been eye witnesses of her movements.

3. The result of my examination is that the "Albatross" rock is 1,200 yards from the shore of Olifant's Point, or 500 yards farther seaward than previously shown on the chart.

4. The spot where the *Kafir*'s remains now lie is 1 1/2 miles to the S.E. of this rock.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything therein before contained the Governor might by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut or remove bark from the wattle trees on the unappropriated Crown lands comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:—

COUNTIES OF BORUNG AND DUNDAS, AT THE VICTORIA VALLEY.—Commencing at a point on the summit of the Serra Range bearing due east from the southern extremity of the Victoria Range; thence west to the summit of the last-named range; thence northerly by the summit of that range to the Glenelg River, at the Victoria Gap; thence north-westerly by that river to Brim Creek; thence by that creek to its source; and thence easterly and south-easterly by the summit of the Grampians Range, and south-westerly by the summit of the Serra Range aforesaid to the point of commencement.—(78.C.18864.)

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

- 1st. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
- 2nd. Order for interment must be given to the person in charge of the cemetery before Two o'clock p.m. on the day previous to the interment.
- 3rd. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.
- 4th. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.
- 5th. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten o'clock a.m. to Six o'clock p.m., except on Sundays, when the hours will be from Two o'clock to Five o'clock p.m.

6th. The charge will be remitted for the burial of any person on the certificate of a trustee, or upon evidence being produced before two of the trustees that the relatives or friends of such person are unable to pay the costs and charges.

7th. Application for permission to make a vault, or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to persons applying.

8th. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees, or some person duly appointed by them; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent in writing of such person must be left with the order.

9th. By the 19th section of *The Cemeteries Statute 1864*, any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery by and with the permission of the trustees, under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the terms of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person and his representatives for ever.

10th. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

11th. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, or covered with a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.

12th. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who may withhold permission and prevent the erection of any monument which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming, and shall determine and fix the position of any monument which may be preferred to be erected, according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

13th. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair may be removed by order of the trustees without notice to the owner.

14th. A plan of the cemetery and a registry will be kept, and may be inspected at the office of the sexton.

15th. No servant or other person employed by, or engaged in any duty in behalf of the trustees, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

16th. It is notified that any person wantonly or wilfully destroying, or doing, or causing to be done any damage to any monument, tombstone, or vault, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery, is guilty of a misdemeanour, and being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished as prescribed by the Act in that case made and provided.

17th. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.

18th. The cemetery will be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

19th. Three of the trustees to form a quorum.

20th. No grave to be of less depth than five feet.

21st. The trustees reserve the right to make any alteration, from time to time, in these regulations.

EGERTON PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the 8th section of *The Cemeteries Statute 1864*, whereby it is enacted that the trustees of any such cemetery shall have power and authority to make such rules and regulations, and to do and perform and cause to be done and performed all such acts, matters, and things as may be necessary and proper for any of the purposes aforesaid, and for directing the positions of all graves and construction of coffins to be admitted into vaults, and the covering of vaults so as to prevent the escape of any noxious exhalations or evaporations in the said cemetery, and for protecting the buildings, monuments, shrubberies, plantations, and enclosures therein and thereof from destruction or damage, the trustees of the above-named cemetery make and promulgate the following rules and regulations:—

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

No. 114.—NOVEMBER 1, 1878.—B.

2. By the 19th section of the Statute any person making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone according to the tenor of such permission to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and his or their representatives for ever.

3. Application for such permission to be made at the office of the secretary. A certificate of permission in the form set out in the schedule will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the proper charges.

4. Orders for interment to be given to the secretary of the cemetery only, such order to be given between the hours of Nine a.m. and Three p.m. the previous day.

5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug. Parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the surveyor, and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault the consent in writing of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

6. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.

7. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

8. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the usual and only hours for funerals will be from Two to Five o'clock throughout the year.

9. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or table proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription, to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the seventh section of the Act to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument according to description, size, character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper clamps must be used.

12. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

13. The ground will be open daily from sunrise to sunset.

14. A plan of the cemetery showing the situation of the purchased and other graves is kept at the office, and may be inspected, and registers of all parties are kept by the secretary.

15. The secretary or keeper has orders to turn out or take into custody, as the case may require, any person who shall behave indecorously or commit any trespass, injury to trees, flowers, or erections, or otherwise infringe the said Statute or the regulations for protection of the cemetery, and such person will be proceeded against according to the provisions of the said Statute.

16. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.
