ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

An Act to vest Property held on Public, Religious, and Charitable Trusts in the Succeeding Trustees without Conveyance or Assignment, and for other purposes.

An Act to further amend the Law relating to Neglected and Criminal Children.

An Act to abolish forfeitures for Treason and Felony, and to otherwise amend the Law relating thereto.

An Act to amend the Lunacy Statute.

An Act to sanction the issue and application of a certain sum of money under "The Railway Loan Act 1878."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-eighth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and in the forty-second year of Her Majesty's reign.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS FOR THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY.

IT is hereby notified that holders of Electors' Rights for the Legislative Assembly issued on or before 1st December 1877, must obtain renewed Rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the general lists to be made up during the week ending the 1st December next.

The old Right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed Right will bear the same number and be in the same form and tenor as that in lieu of which it is issued, and will be available for any election that may take place before the completion of the new Rolls in January next.

No elector whose name is on a Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any district, is entitled to a renewed Electors' Right for such district (*vide* sections 61 and 62 of *The Electoral Act 1865*).

FIJI GROUP.

THE rocks shown as (1) S. by W. 10 miles from Vanua Vatu and (2) N.W. $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Frost Reef, near Mago, do not exist.

The S.E. horn of the Bukatatanoa or Argo Reef is 18 miles in error. Its correct position is latitude $18^{\circ} 21' S.$, longitude $178^{\circ} 12\frac{1}{2}' W.$

NEW GUINEA AND TORRES STRAITS.

Teste Island.—A passage with good anchorage inside the reef is said to exist close to the westward of East Islet. There is a rock in the centre of the passage which may be passed on either side.

Tisot Island.—A sunken patch is reported N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ mile from N.W. end of this island. A patch with 2 fathoms on it is reported in latitude $10^{\circ} 41' S.$, longitude $150^{\circ} 2' E.$ (approx.). The sunken barrier from about longitude $149^{\circ} 43'$ to longitude $149^{\circ} 50' E.$, and about 3 miles to northward of its position as marked on Chart No. 2123 is reported to have several patches awash.

The islet marked on Chart No. 2123 with centre in latitude $10^{\circ} 30\frac{1}{2}' S.$, longitude $149^{\circ} 51' E.$, is part of the mainland.

There is a good passage eastward of Dufaire Island, the passage north of this island is not recommended.

Robinson Harbor (Hydro. Notice No. 11 of 28th April 1877).—Entrance to this harbor is very difficult, and there is probably less than 3 fathoms water in it.

Isabel Cove is not recommended.

Stacey Island (South Cape, on charts to 1875).—Good anchorage was found off the London Missionary Society's Station, on the north of this island.

Hood Lagoon.—The Barrier Reef extends about N.N.W. 3 miles from point on west side of entrance into Hood's Lagoon, and is about a mile off shore at its western end. The *Sappho* went inside this reef from Hood Bay, passing about half-a-mile off shore and carried 5 fathoms into the entrance of the lagoon, where she anchored in 8 fathoms mud. The water from Hood Lagoon making the water muddy the reef cannot be seen from aloft. A large ship should not attempt to enter Hood Lagoon, as there are some shoals of about 24 fathoms within a mile of the entrance, but anchorage under the reef in from 6 to 8 fathoms may be obtained outside these shoals.

Round Head Point.—Inside the Barrier Reef, in the vicinity of this point, numerous coral patches and heads exist, and great care is required as they do not show out from aloft. From about 5 miles to the northward of Round Head Point to Port Moresby the passage inside the reef was found clear with the exception of a few patches which were easily seen.

Port Moresby.—A coral patch awash to S.W., extending N.W. and S.E. 23 cables and N.E. and S.W. 1 cable, lies with its centre S.W. by W. 6 cables from S.W. end of Ethel Island. The patch lying N. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 35 cables from Faga Point, and marked on Plan No. 2126 with 2 fathoms on it, appears to be nearly awash at low-water. Inside the reef, between Port Moresby and Caution Bay, the least water obtained was 4 fathoms.

Just inside Basilisk Passage the water shoals; 33 fathoms was the least obtained by the *Sappho*.

During the *Sappho's* cruise on the S. coast of New Guinea in June, July, and August, the S.E. trade blowing fresh, the land was covered with haze rendering it indistinct at a short distance.

Torres Straits, Great N.E. Channel.—In picking up an anchorage north of Coconut Islet soundings of 6 were obtained, and the ship anchored in 17 fathoms with Coconut Islet E. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. and Dove Islet N.N.E.

Ipili Reef.—The small red beacon placed upon a portion of wreck lying N.N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ mile from the reef is now gone. The

sunken reefs "D" are reported by the signal-man at Goode Island to have grown out to the W.S. Westward to longitude $142^{\circ} 6' 15' E.$, the course recommended passing very close to them.

Banda and Moneta Shoals.—The *Sappho* passed very close to the position of the Banda and Moneta Shoals, no signs of their existence was seen.

Lucius and Aurora Shoals.—The ship also searched for the Lucius and Aurora Shoals, of which nothing was seen.

Ellis Channel.—The following buoys and beacons have been placed in Ellis Channel, Torres Straits:—

Black beacon on reef, north 5 cables from east side of Black Rock.

Black buoy close off the reef west of Thursday Island.

Red buoy on Rocky Patch. Channel Rock on with S.E. of Thursday Island, and Quoin Point on with Vivien Point.

Red beacon on reef S.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 7 cables from Vivien Point.

Black beacon on reef S.S.E. $7\frac{1}{2}$ cables from east end of Thursday Island.

Red buoy S.S.E. $6\frac{1}{2}$ cables from east end of Thursday Island.

Black buoy west end of Hovell Bank.

Black buoy east end of Hovell Bank.

It is intended to place a red buoy north $1\frac{1}{2}$ cables from West Hovell Bank buoy.

Note.—The black beacons are square, red triangular.

The following Charts are affected by this information, viz., Nos. 2123, 2122, 2121, 2375, 1043, 691, 2126.

Information received from Lieutenant Musters, H.M.'s schooner *Conflict*, in July and August 1878.

Santa Maria.—Found a first-rate anchorage at Santa Maria, Banks' Group, with fresh water round south-west point. Sounding from 18 fathoms, decreasing; sand; anchored in 7 fathoms. Marks for anchorage—Black sand beach, only one in the bay, bearing east; south-west point of island S. 9° W. Pass inside rocky patches, marked doubtful, which are very doubtful.

Passed through several fields of drift pumice stone a little north of Torres Island. (This pumice stone appears to be working to the S.E.)

LOUISIADE ARCHIPELAGO.

Anchorage may be obtained in bay, between Bousquet Point and Garden Island (Louisiade Archipelago), in 10 to 12 fathoms, taking care not to go too deep into bay, as numerous coral patches exist.

Nepenthes Point.—Found the water in the creek where H.M.S. *Rattlesnake* watered unfit for use. Anchorage in bay, to eastward of point, in 12 to 13 fathoms; mud.

Proceeding from Sharp Island to Du Chateau Island passed over a 3 fathom patch of some extent on the way, not marked on chart.

Proceeding from Du Chateau Island to Kosmann Island experienced a strong set to S.W. in Jomard entrance. There are several dangerous coral patches S.W. of the latter island, not shown on chart.

Marau Sound, Guadalcanar Island, Solomon Group.—Is a good and secure anchorage in all winds, protected from the sea by a chain of islands encircled by a barrier reef. Recommend southern passage during S.E. trades. The southern island of the group can be seen, in clear weather, about ten miles distant. Steer for that, leaving remainder of group on star-board hand, until Barrier Reef is made out, distant about 5 miles. A small island further to the westward (called Ferguson Island), will then be observed, which steered for leads through the reef passage, which is clear of dangers. Careful look out is necessary, as two shoal patches lay in the centre of the channel to the sound, off Ferguson Island. Anchorage may be obtained under Ferguson Island, but the principal one is in the sound, about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles further to the N.W. A large island, the highest peak of which bears about N.N.W. from Ferguson Island, also bears about E. by N. from the entrance to the sound, and is a good mark for finding it. A rock awash lies at entrance. Good water can be obtained from a creek W.S.W. from this rock, about a mile distant. General depth of water between rock and creek, 8 to 12 fathoms; mud. The main passage to the north appears clear of dangers, with the exception of the reefs extending off the different islands, which a careful look out can avoid.

Information received from Lieutenant Horne, H.M.'s schooner *Sandfly*.

On the 16th July 1878, when in latitude $8^{\circ} 50' N.$ longitude $159^{\circ} 37' E.$, passed through great quantities of pumice stone. Strong N.E. current.

BROUGHAM SHOAL.

The *Sandfly* passed over the position of Brougham Shoal, but saw nothing of it.

Ariel Cove, Island of Corrambangara, Solomon Group, is situated on the west coast of this island. The harbor, which runs in a N.N.E. and S.S.W. direction, is entered between two reefs, from 80 to 100 yards apart, with plenty of water close to their edges. The length of the harbor is about three-quarters of a mile, and greatest breadth half-a-mile. A fringe shoal of sandy mud extends for a short distance around its

shores. This is a most excellent place for watering, as boats, i.e., gigs, can be taken at high or low water about a quarter of a mile up the stream situated at the head of the harbor.

Information received from Lieutenant de Hoghton, H.M.'s schooner *Beagle*.

Lesson Point, New Britain, extends much further to the eastward than shown in chart 764 (1873). The island marked "P.D.", between Duke of York and Praed Point, does not exist. There are several shoals to the westward and south-westward of Morada.

Beagle experienced a confused sea, with heavy southerly swell, off Cape St. George; also, a set in 48 hours of 75 miles to the southward.

BRIDGEWATER AND PRINCESS SHOALS.

Bridgewater and Princess Shoals do not exist in the position assigned to them on the chart.

Referring to notices issued from this department on the 27th July 1877, the 25th January 1878, and the 6th June 1878, mariners are now hereby informed that on and after the 14th day of February 1879, a revolving light (of the first order), flashing every fifteen seconds, will be exhibited from a light-tower, painted white, and 40 feet in height, erected on the large Althorpe Island. The color of the light will be white, except between the bearings, from the lighthouse, of N. 25° W., and N. 61° W., where a red arc of light will be shown, leading half-a-mile to eastward of Emmes Reef, and nearly half-a-mile southward of the S. W. Rock.

The focal plane of the light will be at an elevation of 850 feet above the sea-level. In ordinary weather, the bright portion of the light should be observed from a ship's deck about twenty-five miles distant, and the red arc of light about seventeen miles.

When much refraction exists both lights may be seen at a greater distance.

The following letter, received from Captain Miles, of the brig *Rio Logo*, relative to the position of Rennells and Bellona Islands, is published for general information.

G. GREY.

RENNELS AND BELLONA ISLANDS.

Dunedin, 3rd October 1878.

Sir,—I have the honor to report to you an error in the position of some islands I passed on my passage from Poochow to this port in the brig *Rio Logo*. These islands, named Rennells and Bellona, are marked as "doubtful" islands on the latest published charts, and are situated directly in the track between China and Australia. The position assigned to Rennells Island is N.W. point 11° 12' south latitude, and 160° 19' east longitude, whereas the correct position should be for the N.W. point 11° 30' south latitude, and 160° 8' east longitude, making an error of 18' in latitude and 11' in longitude. My observations were taken within two or three miles of the N.W. point, and the error of my chronometer found only the day before at Christoval, so that I can rely upon the position. The S.E. point I place in 11° 51' south and 160° 42' east, approximate.

Rennells Island and Bellona bear from each other N.W. by W. and S.E. by E. not more than fifteen miles distant.

I cannot find in any directory a description of Rennells Island, and I believe there is none published. I therefore enclose the following remarks from my own observations.

Rennells Island is about 38 miles long and 8 wide at the N.W., and lies in a N.W. and S.E. direction, is about 500 to 600 feet high, of uniform height throughout, and thickly wooded down to the water's edge. Along the whole N.E. side is a fringing reef about two cables from the shore. The N.W. point is a gradually-sloping point, with a hummock two hundred or three hundred yards from the beach, and has a reef extending about four or five cables from the shore, with a strong tide rippling round the point; the coast trends about three miles to the S.W., and thence to south-eastward. Bellona Island appears to be about the same height as Rennells Island, and also thickly wooded.

Trusting that you will give this publicity for the benefit of shipmasters generally.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE WARANGA GOLD-FIELDS COMMON.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act* 1869 power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations for the management of Commons, and in pursuance of the provisions of chapter XIII. of the regulations made under the said Act by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of May 1873, the managers of the Waranga Gold-fields Common submit to the Board of Land

and Works for approval the following Regulations for the management of the said Common:—

1. Persons entitled may respectively depasture on the common (subject to the conditions, restrictions, and limitations hereinafter set forth) within five miles from their places of residence, four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or portion thereof in small cattle on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle.

2. That it shall be lawful for the managers when and so often as they shall deem fit, to grant to butchers, slaughtermen, dairymen, and others, a special license in accordance with the provisions of the regulations under *The Land Act* 1869, to depasture on said common any number of cattle not exceeding 30 head, and to charge for such special license a fee in accordance with the scale of fees hereafter prescribed.

3. That it shall be lawful for the managers, if they think fit so to do, to permit goats to be depastured upon the common on the payment of the fees prescribed in the scale of fees: Provided always that one person shall not be entitled to depasture more than four goats without the consent, in writing, of the managers.

4. That no bulls or entire horses shall be depastured on the common without the sanction of the managers, but the managers may, when and so often as they may please, grant special licenses for the depasturing of bulls and entire horses.

5. That all young cattle, the progeny of cattle upon the common, may, while under six (6) months old, be depastured on the common free of charge, but all cattle over six (6) months shall be charged for at the rate hereafter prescribed in the scale of fees: Provided always that no young bulls or entire colts over twelve (12) months old shall be permitted to remain on the common without the express sanction, in writing, of the managers.

6. That the managers shall be empowered to appoint some suitable person as herdsman, and such herdsman at any time to suspend, remove, or dismiss, and to allow such herdsman a salary or remuneration from and out of the common fund: Provided always that the salary of the herdsman shall be a charge upon the common fund only, and not upon the managers personally.

7. That it shall be lawful for the managers to impose upon the herdsman all such duties, obligations, responsibilities, and restrictions as shall be or appear to them necessary to secure to the commoners the full benefit of the common, and to invest him with all such powers as they themselves possess, and to bind such herdsman by such instrument, in writing, as to them shall appear necessary, and to take from such herdsman such security as shall to them appear necessary to insure the faithful discharge and exercise of the duties and powers vested in him.

8. That all fees collected by the managers in respect of cattle, &c., depasturing upon the commons, shall be by them paid to a fund to be called the Common Fund, and they may disburse such fund for the purposes of said common, but for no other purpose, without the express sanction of the Board of Land and Works.

9. That the managers of the common shall appoint certain times and places for the registering and branding of cattle, shall give due notice thereof, and shall by themselves, or the herdsman, attend at such times and places for the purposes

aforesaid, and all persons desirous of depasturing cattle upon the common shall be in attendance with their cattle, at the time and place appointed, for the purpose of giving a full and correct description of such cattle and assisting to brand the same, and shall pay the prescribed fees for such cattle before the same shall be branded or registered, and the manager shall cause all cattle, &c., in respect of which the fees shall have been so paid, to be registered in proper books to be by them kept for that purpose, and to be branded with the common brand.

10. That the fees for cattle depasturing upon the common shall be paid by the owners of such cattle half-yearly or quarterly in advance, and that the quarters shall commence respectively upon the first Monday in the months of January, April, July, and October in each year; that the fee for the quarter then next ensuing shall be deemed to be due on the first Monday aforesaid, and any person neglecting to pay the said fees within fourteen days from and after the day on which the same shall have become so due, shall be proceeded against by the managers according to law.

11. That all cattle, goats, or sheep, found upon the common without the common brand, shall be deemed to be trespassing thereon, and shall be forthwith impounded by the herdsman.

12. Cattle shall not be taken off the common without notice to the herdsman from the owners thereof, except in cases where they may be frequently required, when the managers may, if they think proper, grant permission to the owners to remove and replace the same at pleasure, in a quiet manner, so as not to interfere with or disturb other stock unnecessarily, but the herdsman shall not be considered to have any supervision whatsoever over such cattle.

13. That the managers in charge of the common shall not be responsible for any loss or injury of, or to, any cattle depasturing upon said common, but shall by their herdsman take every possible care of such cattle, and in the event of loss or injury shall give to the owners of such cattle every information and assistance.

14. That the managers shall cause to be removed from the common under their control all diseased cattle, or all cattle which may by a competent person be declared to be diseased and dangerous to the health of other stock on the common, and may require the owners thereof to keep such cattle off the common; and should the owner refuse or neglect so to do, the managers may cause such diseased cattle to be forthwith destroyed, and the owner of such cattle shall not be entitled to compensation therefor.

15. That it shall be lawful for persons travelling with cattle to encamp with such cattle upon the common for a space of twenty-four (24) hours free of charge, but should such cattle remain upon the common after the expiration of the said twenty-four hours they shall be deemed to be trespassing thereon and shall be impounded accordingly; provided always that the managers may, if they think fit, grant permission for such cattle to remain upon the common, on payment in advance being made to them or to the herdsman of the fees following, that is to say:—For horses, 3d. per head per day; for horned cattle, One and a halfpenny (1½d) per head per day.

16. The managers of the common may destroy any goats found on the common unless such goats are branded with the common brand, and the fees for depasturing such goats be duly paid.

17. That no person shall wilfully injure or destroy or unnecessarily disturb any cattle depasturing on the common.

18. That it shall be lawful for the managers to frame and adopt rules (not inconsistent with these regulations or with any Act or bye-law relating to or affecting gold-fields commons in this district) for fixing the times and places of their meetings, for regulating the proceedings at such meetings, and for regulating the conduct and defining the duties of their officers and servants; but no such rules framed or adopted by the managers shall in any way affect or interfere with the number of cattle to be depastured upon such common, nor with the fees to be paid for depasturing such cattle thereon.

19. The managers may set apart a portion of the common for depasturing sheep thereon. Persons depasturing sheep shall be responsible for the same being kept on the portion of the common (if any) set apart for their use; sheep trespassing on any other part of the common may be impounded.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

LANDSBOROUGH RECREATION RESERVE REGULATIONS.

WE, John Elder Andrews, John Hayes, William Booth Hodgetts, Frederick Cazimar Hodgetts, and Fredrick Vendy, the duly appointed committee of management of the land at Landsborough reserved as a site for Recreation purposes, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the above-mentioned recreation reserve, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards his dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.

6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management be first obtained.

7. It shall be competent for the committee of management to allow any part of the reserve to be depastured by quiet stock. The proceeds of such agistment to be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve.

8. The sums chargeable upon special occasions such as athletic sports, meetings, &c., shall be for admission at the ground gates not exceeding One shilling and sixpence.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

DISPOSITION OF CHURCH LANDS ALLOWED.

A STATEMENT of Trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination of the Roman Catholic Church, under the provisions of the *Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion*, for allowance by the Governor, the same was allowed by him on the twenty-fifth day of November 1878, and the following is the form in which such statement of trusts has been allowed:—

Description of Land.—Two acres, county of Bourke, city of Melbourne, parish of South Melbourne: Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 2 of section 8; bounded thence by that allotment bearing east four chains; thence by Punt road bearing south five chains; thence by the Wesleyan Church reserve bearing west four chains; and thence by Faulkner Park bearing north five chains to the point of commencement.

Names of Trustees.—The Most Reverend James Alipius Goold, D.D., Archbishop of Melbourne; the Rev. James Francis

Corbett, D.D., of Saint Kilda; John Pearson Rowe, of Seven Creeks, Euron; Patk. Hayes, of Prahran; and Thomas Testar of Saint Kilda.

Powers of Disposition.—Power to sell, lease, mortgage, exchange, or otherwise dispose of, subject to the written approval of the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Melbourne for the time being, or (in case of his death) of the person or persons administering the affairs of the Archdiocese. The Archbishop or such person as aforesaid to have power to remove trustees and to appoint new trustees, and to fill up all vacancies occurring in trusteeship.

Purposes to which Proceeds of Disposition are to be applied.—To such purposes of the Roman Catholic Church as may from time to time be agreed upon by the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Melbourne and a majority of the trustees.

No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Order, amongst other things, altering, for the purpose of adjusting the boundaries of conterminous municipal districts, being shires, without any petition; and it was further enacted that every Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the date of such publication: And whereas it has been deemed expedient that a portion of the boundary-line between the Shires of Avoca and Bet-bet should be altered and adjusted: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby alter and adjust the boundaries of the said Shires of Avoca and Bet-bet, and doth re-define the boundaries of the conterminous shires respectively in manner following, that is to say:—

AVOCA—Commencing at the intersection of the road from Horsham to Navarre, with the west boundary of the township of Navarre; thence southward along road to allotment 20, section 9, parish of Crowlands; southward along the east boundaries of allotments 41, 46, 66, and 67 of section 9, and 16, 17, 19, 6, and 5 of section 7; south-eastward by the east boundaries of allotments P and O, section 3, and L, G and E of section 2, and a direct line south to the south-west angle of the township of Crowlands; thence easterly by a direct line to the north-west angle of Hodgkinson's pre-emptive right; thence along the north boundary of said right to the centre of Bet-bet Creek; thence northerly by the Bet-bet Creek to the north boundary of the township of Bung Bong; thence west by the north boundary of the township of Bung Bong to the west boundary of the parish of Bung Bong; thence north to the north-west angle of the parish of Bung Bong; thence by a direct line north-easterly to the north-east angle of allotment

14, section C, parish of Rathscar; thence north by the east boundary of allotments 13 and 12 to the Nattie Yallock and Maryborough main road; thence by that road westerly to a one-chain road forming the east boundary of C. Rowland's 19th section; thence north and north-westerly by that road to the Avoca and Dunolly road; thence north-easterly by that road to the northern boundary of the parish of Rathscar; thence northerly, westerly, and south by the northern and western boundaries of the parish of Rathscar to the north-east angle of W. G. McCulloch's purchased land; thence west by the north boundary of W. G. McCulloch's land to the east boundary of T. Henderson's 19th section; thence south by the east boundary, west by the south boundary, and north by the west boundary of T. Henderson's 19th section to the north-west angle of said section; thence further north by a direct line to a road forming the south boundary of A. J. Yates' and J. E. Taylor's 19th sections; thence by that road west to the Avoca River at the south-east angle of Nattie Yallock; thence north by the Avoca River to the north-east angle of Nattie Yallock; thence by the north boundary of Nattie Yallock to its north-west angle; thence by a direct line westerly to the commencing point.

Wherever the line so described as aforesaid runs beside or along a creek or road, whether such is specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such creek or road shall be taken to be the boundary-line.

Taylor's 19th sections; thence by that road west to the point of commencement.

Wherever the line so described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary-line.

And the Honorable James Brown Patterson, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

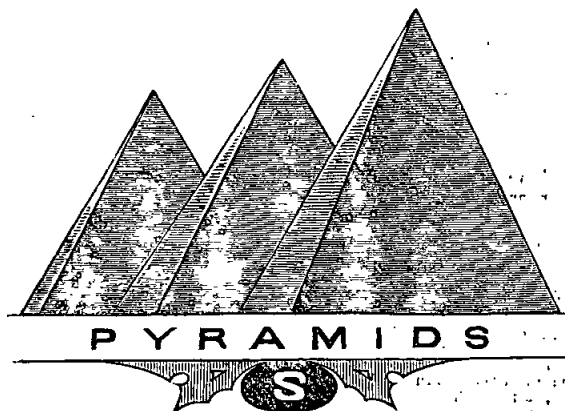

BYE-LAW No. 3.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Dandenong made under section 213 of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 3, for regulating traffic on roads.
