ON and after this date, a Fixed and Flashing Light will be exhibited from the Lighthouse recently erected on North Reef.

The Tower, which is circular, is painted white, and is 80 feet in height.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, of the second order, showing two flashes in succession, at an interval of one minute, followed by two minutes of fixed light, the series of changes occupying four minutes.

The light, which shows all round the horizon, is 72 feet above high water, and is visible from the deck of a small craft about 13 miles.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE EXAMINATION FOR THE GRADES OF MASTER AND MATES.

THE following Regulations issued by the Board of Trade, London, have been adopted by the Steam Navigation Board, and will be given effect to from and after the 1st day of January next.

EXAMINATION BY SUMNER'S METHOD OF PROJECTION.

CANDIDATES for examination for the grades of first mate and master shall be examined in Sumner's Method by Projection, and this subject shall be considered as forming part of the Navigation Examination.

Candidates will be required to ascertain their longitude by chronometer, worked with two assumed altitudes, one greater and one less than the latitude, by dead reckoning.

They are to mark off the two positions so ascertained on the chart, and are then to connect them with a straight line, which will show the bearing of any land it may intersect, and draw a line at right angles to this in the direction of the sun, showing the sun's true bearing.

With reference to a second observation, the candidates will not be for the present obliged to perform the calculations. The longitude corresponding to the two latitudes are to be furnished to them by the examiner, with the course and distance made good by the ship between the two observations. The candidates will then be required to correct the first line of equal altitude for the ship's change of station, in the interval between the two observations, to project the line of equal altitude corresponding to the second observation on the chart, showing by its intersection with the first line of equal altitude, as corrected for change of station, the position of the ship at the time of the second observation. Outline charts extending from 46° to 49° and from 49° to 52° will be furnished by the Board for this purpose.

Service as second mate to be subject to certain conditions equivalent to service as first mate for the purpose of qualifying for examination for a master's certificate.

The following regulation shall be substituted for that now in force relating to the amount and class of sea service required of a candidate for an ordinary master's certificate, viz.:

A master must be twenty-one years of age and have been either six years at sea, of which one year must have been as first or only mate, and one year as second mate, or he must have been six and a half years at sea, of which two and a half years must have been as second mate, during the last twelve months of which he must have been in possession of a first mate's certificate.

REGULATIONS.

Section referred to.

Section 5. Bye-laws or regulations may from time to time be made altered or repealed in and for any city town (including the city of Melbourne and the town of Geelong) borough or shire by the council thereof hereinafter called the local authority in accordance with the provisions of any Act for the time being in force relating to local government for any or all of the undermentioned purposes: Provided however that no such bye-laws or regulations shall be of any force or effect until confirmed by the Governor in Council, and that if any local authority shall not make any such bye-law or regulation within six months from the commencement of this Act the Governor in Council may from time to time make alter or repeal any such regulations in lieu of such local authority:—

Clause 1. Licensing factories for the manufacture of explosives.

Clause 2. Prescribing the conditions upon which licenses will be issued and the fees payable thereon to the local authority.

Clause 3. Prescribing the rules to be observed by the owner occupier and persons employed in the factory.

Clause 4. Prescribing the mode of construction and the purposes for which such factory or any particular part thereof may be used.

Clause 5. Regulating the attaching of lightning conductors to the factory.

Clause 6. Defining the part of the factory in which any particular explosive or ingredient shall be kept, the quantity that may be so kept, and the mode in which it shall be packed.

Clause 7. Regulating the use or retention in the factory of charcoal, oiled cotton, and any articles liable to spontaneous ignition, the cleaning of the building, the quantity of any explosives or ingredients that may be allowed in the factory or any part thereof at any one time, and prescribing the materials of which tools used may be made.

Clause 8. Regulating in the factory or any part thereof the mixing, sifting, and carriage of any explosives or the ingredients thereof, persons smoking, and the introduction of fire, lucifer matches, or any substance or article likely to cause explosion by fire, or any iron, steel, or grit.

Clause 9. Regulating the employment in the factory of persons under the age of sixteen years.

Clause 10. Prescribing the period for which licenses may be issued, and the effect (if any) of change of owners or occupiers of the factory; and

Clause 11. Generally for regulating any matter which public safety or convenience may require.

In the event of any breach (by any act or default) of any bye-law or regulation in any factory—

Penalty for breach.

- (a) All or any part of the explosive or ingredients thereof in respect to which or being in any building or machine in respect to which the offence was committed may be forfeited; and
- (b) The occupier shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and in addition (in the case of a second offence) Ten pounds for every day during which such breach continues.

CLAUSE 1. *Licensing Factories for the Manufacture of Explosives.*

1. A factory for explosives shall not be *allowed* except on the site and in the manner specified in a license for the same granted under this Act.

2. An applicant for such license shall submit to the *Minister* the draft of a license, accompanied by a plan (drawn to scale) of the factory or magazine (which plan shall be deemed to form part of and to be in this Act included in the expression "*the license*") ; and

3. The draft license shall contain the terms which the applicant proposes to have inserted in the license, and shall specify such of the following matters as are applicable, namely:—

- (a) The boundaries of the land forming the site of the factory or magazine, and either any belt of land surrounding the site which is to be kept clear, and the buildings and works from which it is to be kept clear, or the distances to be maintained between the factory or magazine, or any part thereof, and other buildings and works; and
- (b) The situation, character, and construction of all the mounds, buildings, and works on or connected with the factory or magazine, and the distances thereof from each other; and

The same as in sub-clause
(a) of clause 6 of the
English Act.

The same as in sub-clause
(b) of clause 6 of the
English Act.

The same as in sub-clause (c) of clause 6 of the English Act except the words inserted in brackets of English Act, and the substitution of "explosives" for "gunpowder."

Much the same as in sub-clause (d) of clause 6 of English Act, wherein it reads "The amount of explosives and of ingredients thereof wholly or partly mixed to be allowed at the same time in any building or machine, or any process of the manufacture," &c.

The same as in sub-clause (e) of clause 6 of English Act except words of said Act inserted in brackets, and the use of "explosives" for "gunpowder."

The same as in sub-clause (f) of clause 6 of English Act.

The same as in sub-clause (g) of clause 6 of English Act.

Down to "site" is the same as in clause 6 of English Act.

Clause 8 of English Act has, to some extent, a paragraph of the same power.

Portion of clause 26 of English Act, "Minister" being used in place of "Secretary of State," and "annual" inserted.

Copied from third schedule of English Act

This is portion of clause 26 of English Act, "Minister" used in place of "Secretary of State."

The same as in English Act, clause 9, "explosive" being used instead of "gunpowder."

Ditto.

The same as in English Act, clause 9.

- (c) The nature of the processes to be carried on in the factory and in each part thereof, and the place at which each process of the manufacture and each description of work connected with the factory [or magazine] is to be carried on, and the places in the factory [or magazine] at which *explosives* and any ingredients of *explosives* and any articles liable to spontaneous ignition or inflammable or otherwise dangerous are to be kept; and
- (d) The amount of explosives and of ingredients thereof to be allowed in any building wholly or partly mixed, or any process of the manufacture, or within a limited distance from such building [or machine], having regard to the situation and construction of such building and to the distance thereof from any other building or any works; and
- (e) The situation, in the case of a factory, of each factory, magazine, [and in the case of another magazine] of each building forming part of such magazine in which *explosives* are to be kept, and the maximum amount of explosives to be kept in each factory magazine, and in each building as aforesaid; and
- (f) The maximum number of persons to be employed in each building in the factory; and
- (g) Any special terms which the applicant may propose by reason of any special circumstances arising from the locality, the situation or construction of any buildings or works, or the nature of any process or otherwise.

4. The Minister, after examination of the proposal, may reject the application altogether, or may approve of the draft license with or without modification or addition, and grant to the applicant permission to apply to the local authority for their assent to the establishment of the factory on the proposed *site*, and such assent shall be first obtained and forwarded to the Minister before the application for a license is finally dealt with.

CLAUSE 2.—*Prescribing the conditions upon which Licenses will be issued; and the Fees payable thereon to the local authority.*

1. On the preliminary approval of an application for a license the applicant shall complete the arrangement of the factory in accordance with the terms of the proposed license and to the satisfaction of the local governing body and of the inspector before the license shall be actually issued; and

2. In every license a clause shall be inserted giving power to the Minister to summarily stop the manufacture of explosives at a factory provided he deem such stoppage necessary in the interest of the public safety, and to compel the licensee or his agent to alter or amend the process of manufacture, or to alter or re-arrange the buildings in which the same may be carried on; and

3. In every license a clause shall be inserted authorizing the Governor in Council, upon the production of satisfactory evidence that a factory is not being conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Act and Regulations relating thereto, and that its further continuance will imperil the public safety, to declare the license void; and

4. There shall be payable in respect of licenses and continuing certificates granted by the *Minister* such *annual* fees as may be from time to time fixed by him, not exceeding—

For Factory License, original ...	£10.
Ditto, amending ...	£5.
Ditto, renewal when lost ...	5s.
For Importation License, first grant ...	£1.
Ditto, renewal ...	10s.
For Continuing Certificate ...	£2.

Such fees shall be paid by the licensee to the local authority of the district in which the factory is situated.

The *Minister* may also require an applicant for a new license to pay such sum as the *Minister* may think reasonable for expenses incurred upon any inquiry made by order of the *Minister* with respect to the grant of such license.

CLAUSE 3.—*Prescribing the Rules to be observed by the Owner, Occupier, and persons employed in the Factory.*

In every *explosive* factory and magazine—

1. The factory or magazine or any part thereof shall not be used for any purpose not in accordance with the license; and

2. The terms of the license shall be duly observed, and the manufacture or keeping or any process in or work connected with the manufacture or keeping of *explosives* shall not be carried on except in accordance with those terms; and

3. The factory or magazine and every part thereof shall be maintained in accordance with the license; and any material alteration in the factory or magazine by enlarging or adding to the site, or by externally enlarging or adding to any building thereon, or by altering any mound otherwise than by enlargement,

or by making any new work, shall not be made except in pursuance of an amending license granted under the Act.

CLAUSE 4.—Prescribing the mode of Construction and the purposes for which such Factory or any particular part thereof may be used.

1. In a factory every factory magazine and in every building in which *explosives* are kept shall be used only for the keeping of *explosives*, and receptacles for or tools or implements for work connected with the keeping of such *explosives*; and

The same as in sub-clause 1 of clause 10 of the English Act, "*explosives*" used instead of "*gunpowder*."

2. The interior of every building in which any process of the manufacture is carried on or in which *explosives* or any ingredients thereof, either mixed or partially mixed, are kept, or in the course of manufacture are liable to be, and the benches, shelves, and fittings in such building (other than machinery) shall be so constructed or so lined or covered as to prevent the exposure of any iron or steel in such manner, and the detaching of any grit, iron, steel, or similar substance in such manner, as to come into contact with the *explosives* or ingredients thereof in such building, and such interior shelves and fittings, and all other portions of such buildings, shall, so far as is reasonably practicable, be kept free from grit and otherwise clean; and

The same as in sub-clause 2 of clause 10 of the English Act, "*explosives*" used in place of "*gunpowder*," and the words "all other portions of such buildings" inserted.

3. Two or more descriptions of explosives shall not be kept in the same store or registered premises, except such descriptions as may be prescribed in that behalf; and when so kept shall be kept subject to the prescribed conditions and restrictions; and

The same as in sub-clause 5 of clause 40 of the English Act.

4. Before any repairs are done to or in any room or other part of a factory that room or part shall, so far as practicable, be cleaned by the removal of all *explosives* and wholly or partly mixed ingredients thereof, and the thorough washing out of such room or part; and

This is portion of sub-clause 5 of clause 10 of the English Act, "*explosives*" used instead of "*gunpowder*."

or 5. If in any matter (which is not provided by any express provision of the Act) an inspector find any factory, magazine, or store for an explosive or any part thereof, or any thing or practice therein or connected therewith to be unnecessarily dangerous or defective so as in his opinion to tend to endanger the public safety or the bodily safety of any person, such inspector may require the occupier of such factory, magazine, or store to remedy the same.

This is portion of clause 56 of the English Act.

CLAUSE 5.—Regulating the attaching of Lightning Conductors to the Factory.

Every factory or separate building connected with a factory or magazine shall be protected by sufficient lightning conductors.

This is a much abbreviated form of sub-clause 3 of clause 10 of the English Act.

CLAUSE 6.—Defining the part of the Factory in which any particular explosive or ingredient shall be kept, the quantity that may be so kept, and the mode in which it shall be packed.

1. The inspector shall define the part of the factory in which any particular explosive or ingredient shall be kept, the quantity that may be so kept, and the mode in which it shall be packed; and

2. There shall be on the outermost package containing the explosive the name of the explosive, with the addition of the word "*Explosive*."

Part of sub-clause 8 of clause 40 of the English Act.

CLAUSE 7.—Regulating the use or retention in the Factory of Charcoal, Oiled Cotton, and any articles liable to spontaneous ignition, the Cleaning of the Building, the Quantity of any Explosives or Ingredients that may be allowed in the Factory or any part thereof at any one time, and prescribing the Materials of which Tools used may be made.

1. Charcoal, whether ground or otherwise, and oiled cotton, oiled rags, and oiled waste, and any articles whatever liable to spontaneous ignition, shall not be taken into any room containing *explosives*, or partly made *explosives*, except for the purpose of immediate supply and work or immediate use in such building, and upon the cessation of such work or use shall be forthwith removed.

The same as in sub-clause 4 of clause 10 of the English Act, "*any room*" being used for "*any danger building*," and the words "*partly made explosives*" inserted.

CLAUSE 8.—Regulating in the Factory or any part thereof the Mixing, Sifting, and Carriage of any Explosives or the Ingredients thereof, Persons Smoking, and the introduction of Fire, Lucifer Matches, or any substance or article likely to cause explosion by fire, or any Iron, Steel, or Grit.

1. Due provision shall be made by the use of suitable working clothes without pockets, suitable shoes, searching and otherwise, or by some of such means, for preventing the introduction into any factory of fire, lucifer matches, or any substance or article likely to cause explosion or fire, and for preventing the introduction of any iron, steel, or grit into any part of the factory where it would be likely to come into contact with *explosives* or the wholly or partly mixed ingredients thereof; but this rule shall not prevent the introduction of any artificial light of such construction, position, or character as not to cause any danger of fire or explosion; and

The same as in sub-clause 8 of clause 10 of the English Act, "*explosives*" is used instead of "*gunpowder*."

2. No person shall smoke in any part of the factory or magazine, except in such part (if any) as may be allowed by special rules.

The same as in sub-clause 9 of clause 10 of the English Act.

CLAUSE 9.—*Regulating the Employment in the Factory of Persons under the age of Sixteen Years.*

The same as in sub-clause 11 of clause 10 of the English Act.

A person under the age of sixteen years shall not be employed in or enter any factory except in the presence and under the supervision of some grown up person.

CLAUSE 10.—*Prescribing the Period for which Licenses may be issued, and the effect (if any) of change of Owners or Occupiers of the Factory.*

1. The number of years for which a license shall be granted shall be decided by the Minister on the advice of the local authority, but in no case shall a license be granted for a term of more than five years; and

2. No person or persons shall carry on the business of a factory other than the licensee, and should such licensee desire to transfer his interest in such factory he shall apply for a transfer of the license to the name or names of the person or persons intended to supersede him, and such person or persons shall endorse the application for transfer; and

3. The Minister shall have power to grant or refuse any application for a transfer of license; and

This is the same as the second paragraph of clause 13 of the English Act, with the words "gunpowder factory or magazine" omitted after the first word.

4. A license shall be determined by a discontinuance of the business carried on in pursuance of any such license if such discontinuance continues for a period of two years or more, or if the factory or magazine is used for any purpose not authorized by the license.

CLAUSE 11.—*Generally for regulating any matter which public safety or convenience may require.*

Taken from the Regulations of the Lithofracteur Magazines, Beaufort, Essex, England; approved by Major Majendie, R.A., H.M. Inspector of Explosives.

1. No fire or light shall under any circumstances be taken inside any building forming part of a factory (other than those specified by an inspector), nor any light except an authorized lantern provided for that purpose, and that only by the foreman. All persons entering the factories, and before passing within the fencing thereof, shall examine their clothes to see that they have no matches or other dangerous articles in their pockets or about their persons, and the foreman shall satisfy himself that such examination is carefully carried out, and shall himself from time to time search the persons employed, and satisfy himself that they have no such dangerous articles about them; and

Ditto.

2. No delivery whatever of explosives from the factory magazine shall be made without a written order from the licensee or his agent, duly signed by either of them, and such delivery shall be made only in the presence of the foreman; and

Ditto.

3. The keys of the factory magazine shall remain in sole charge of the foreman, and in his unavoidable absence in charge of a deputy duly authorized in writing by the licensee or his agent; and

Ditto, with the words "in store and the quantities" introduced.

4. The foreman shall keep a stock-book for each factory magazine, showing at all times the quantities in store and the quantities taken in and out; and

Ditto.

5. The gates of the fences and the doors of magazines shall be kept securely locked, except during inspection and at such times as explosives are being stored or removed. The foreman or other person in charge of the keys shall be responsible for the due observance of this rule.

Ditto.

6. No tools or instruments of any description shall be taken into the magazines for any purpose, nor used outside the magazines for opening or closing the cases of explosives, except those duly authorized and provided for that purpose; and

Ditto.

7. No cases or boxes containing explosives which are broken or defective shall be admitted into the magazines, nor shall any explosive be admitted which is not apparently packed in the manner directed by the *Explosive Substances Act*. Any explosive which may be spilt shall at once be carefully taken up and destroyed; and

Ditto.

8. On the approach of a thunder-storm the magazines and other places pointed out by the inspector shall be closed, and every person engaged in and about them shall withdraw therefrom.

9. All carriages used in the conveyance of explosives along public roads shall be of good and substantial construction, suitably roofed, and capable of being securely closed by means of doors and locks, and shall have the word "Explosives" painted in plain and conspicuous letters on both sides thereof; and no explosive shall be conveyed along a public road in any such carriage after sunset or before sunrise.

Nevertheless ordinary blasting powder and sporting powder may be conveyed at all hours along a public road in any description of carriage, in quantities not exceeding one hundred pounds in weight.

10. Any safety fuse or other explosive, the manufacture and storage of which shall be considered to be unattended with danger, may be excepted from the operation of a part or the whole of these regulations by order of the Governor in Council.

DRAWBACK REGULATIONS.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations under which a drawback of duty may be paid upon the articles and at the rates specified in Schedule I. attached hereto.

Such Regulations will come into force on and after 1st January 1879.

DRAWBACK REGULATIONS.

ACT 36 VICT. NO. 434 AND ACT 41 VICT. NO. 594.

1. A drawback of duty paid on importation may be paid on the exportation of the goods mentioned in Schedule I. hereunto attached, and at the rate respectively specified against any item exported.

2. In order to entitle the exporter to claim any such drawback he shall comply with the following conditions:—

Form A. (a.) A notice in the Form A hereto must be given to the Collector of Customs at the port of export, at least two working hours before, of the intention to pack.

(b.) The usual export entry must be passed (or if desired such may be deposited with the proper officer before the vessel by which the goods will eventually be shipped has been entered out, the name of the ship being subsequently filled in prior to shipment of the goods), accompanied by invoices as regards the undermentioned, distinguishing—

Goods—Free.

„ Liable to 10 per cent. on importation.

„ Ditto 20 per cent. ditto.

„ Boots and Shoes.

„ Clothing, &c., manufactured in Victoria [from material liable to duty].

„ And the following if re-packed: Glassware of all kinds, Matches and Vestas, Chinaware and Porecelain, Earthenware, Umbrellas, Parasols and Sunshades,

setting forth legibly in respect to each specific class of articles the actual cost price received, or to be received, from the purchaser of the goods, and in respect to boots and shoes the respective sizes, number of pairs, &c. The entry having been passed or deposited, and invoices in duplicate as required having been stamped, an officer of Customs will attend, before whom the following declaration must be made and subscribed by the exporter, or if by a firm, by a member thereof:—

“I, _____, do hereby declare that I am the exporter of the goods mentioned in this entry, that the quantities or sizes [as the case may be] are correct; and with regard to the goods on which an *ad valorem* drawback is payable, I further declare that the invoice dated _____ and signed by me represents the true value of the goods and the actual price paid to me or to be paid on the following terms _____ without any discount, rebate, or other allowance, by the purchaser thereof, trading at _____, in the colony or port of _____, under the style and title of _____; and I further declare that these goods were properly cleared at the Customs, and duty paid on importation at the rate specified in this entry, and that none of the said goods were the produce of or manufactured in Victoria, except as specified in the said invoice.”

Goods liable to a fixed rate of duty, if in original packages as imported, are always liable to examination, and cannot be shipped without the authority of the Landing Surveyor or Jerquer; but any such goods not in original packages must be re-packed in the presence of an officer of Customs and dealt with as in the case of *ad valorem* goods under these regulations.

(c.) Every facility, and especially any desired facility, must be given to the officer to superintend the packing of these goods and take a correct account according to such invoice.

(d.) Upon the completion of the packing, the goods must be secured and sealed by the officers of Customs, and despatched in charge of a carrier duly licensed under the Customs laws into the Customs shed, and delivered to the custody of the export officer for shipment; or if not so forthwith removed, they must be deposited in some secure room approved by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, under the lock of the Crown, until removal.

(e.) No claim for drawback of duty will be entertained unless the debenture in the Form B or Form C, as the case may be, be rendered duly completed with the necessary certificates thereon, unless otherwise authorized by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs.

(f.) If the exporter cannot specify the number of packages in the entry, such may be inserted, and the officer in charge is hereby required to see that such is inserted prior to the removal of the packages.

(g.) Such proof shall be given to the Landing Surveyor or Jerquer as may be required that full duty had been paid on importation.

(h.) Words and expressions used in these regulations and the schedules hereto shall have the meanings assigned to them respectively in any Act relating to the Customs.

3. No drawback of duty will be due or payable until the Collector of Customs at the port of export has received the drawback debenture duly completed, nor until such drawback debenture has been examined by the proper Landing Surveyor and found correct by him, nor until such drawback debenture has been approved under the hand of such Collector of Customs or other officer duly authorized by the Governor in Council.

4. No drawback will be paid unless the debenture be tendered, duly completed, within twelve months from the date of the exportation of the goods mentioned therein. Debentures, in the case of goods liable to a fixed rate of drawback, excepting with respect to goods exported across the Border, will be paid one week after the departure of the vessel by which such goods have been exported, but as regards other goods on completion of the forms herein provided.

5. No drawback will be paid unless a charge of One shilling and sixpence per hour during the time of an officer being employed under these regulations, or other expense incurred, as certified by the Landing Surveyor or Jerquer, shall have been paid.

6. Exporters of goods for drawback *via* any New South Wales or Victorian port on the River Murray must specify on the entry the name of the consignee and final destination of the goods, and at each port on the River Murray the Coastwaiter in charge will attend at his office on such day and at such hour as may be directed by public notice from the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, to pass such goods for drawback in respect to which he may have received notice on the previous day, in which case no charge will be made for the officer's attendance.

Claims for drawback under this regulation must be made to the Collector of Customs at Melbourne, who will, if they are correct, pay them at the Custom House, Melbourne, or remit the money to the claimant less the cost of remittance.

7. No drawback will be payable on goods except on packages re-packed in the presence of, or inspected by, an officer of Customs, who will in the latter case cause such to be examined, as may be directed by the Landing Surveyor or Jerquer, and certify on the entry that such has been done, specifying whether the quantities, values, weights, &c., as the case may be, were correct or not on such examination.

8. The persons before whom declarations under these regulations shall be made in Victoria shall be a justice of the peace of the said colony or an officer of Customs. The Commissioner of Trade and Customs is also hereby empowered to cause any debenture to be passed for payment though not strictly in accordance with the forms required by these regulations. Provided also that the Commissioner of Trade and Customs may, if he shall think fit, authorize the payment of claims for drawback on goods entered and exported under these regulations which may not be landed or be landed in a damaged state, upon such satisfactory proof as he may require that any such goods have been lost or damaged in consequence of shipwreck.

9. Should the consignee be unable to sign the declaration, the signature of a Custom House agent at the port of arrival, who must sign as such before the Collector of Customs, will be accepted.

10. Extra Weighers in attendance at the re-packing of goods for drawback shall be officers of Customs before whom the declarations in clause 8 may be made.

11. The attention of exporters is directed to the second section of Act No. 594, as follows:—

2. If any person shall commit any of the next following offences, namely—

Pass or attempt to pass for drawback any goods—

Not specified in any Order in Council under the provisions of the Act No. CCCCXXXIV., or

At a higher rate for drawback than is allowed under any such Order, or

At a higher value for drawback than the fair market value of such goods in Melbourne, or

As of a greater quantity or weight than appears in any invoice or entry of such goods, or

Which, on being shipped or brought to any quay, wharf, or other place to be shipped for

exportation, shall on examination by the proper officers of Customs be found not to

agree with the entry thereof in the shipping bill or other proper document for allowance

of drawback on shipment, or to be of less value for home use than the amount of

drawback claimed,

every such person shall in any and every such case forfeit the sum of One hundred pounds

or treble the amount of the drawback claimed, at the election of the Commissioner, and all

such goods and the package containing the same with all other the contents therein shall be

forfeited.

In the event of any of the above stated offences being detected, the goods connected therewith, and also any goods included in the same package, are liable to be seized. Should the Collector of Customs desire it, any goods may be re-opened or re-examined after having been passed by the drawback officer; the unpacking or re-packing to be conducted by or at the expense of the exporter.

12. Travellers' samples may be exported for drawback, subject to the following special conditions:—

(1.) The traveller in whose charge any such samples may be sent must be a party to the bond required.

(2.) The declaration in the export entry and in the claim for drawback must be signed according to forms D and E respectively.

(3.) The said traveller must, on his return to Victoria, present himself to the Landing Waiter of the vessel by which he may arrive, and submit all his luggage and baggage for examination and verification with the invoices deposited at the time of his departure.

SHIRE OF RIPON.—BEAUFORT RESERVOIR LEASEHOLD RECREATION RESERVE.

BYE-LAW No. 3.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Ripon, made under section 213 of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 3, for the care, protection, and management of the above-mentioned reserve, and for securing reasonable privacy for bathers, and the observance of decency.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ripon order as follows:—

1. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards his dress, language, or conduct.
2. No person shall damage in any way the bathing-houses, seats, trees, shrubs, fences, nor write or mark anything thereon, nor commit any nuisance.
3. No person shall bathe in the waters of the reserve except at the site of the bathing-houses.
4. The hours for bathing for male persons shall be from six in the evening until eight in the morning; for females, from eight to ten in the morning, and from four to half-past five in the evening.
5. No male person shall enter that part of the enclosure marked off as the bathing reserve during the hours set apart for females to bathe, nor approach by water nearer than 100 yards to the bathing-houses whilst females are bathing.
6. No person shall be allowed to use nets in fishing.
7. No person shall put any cattle in the reserve or place any boat on the waters thereof without the written permission of the council.

Any person who shall be guilty of any annoyance to females or improper conduct, shall, irrespective of any penalty imposed for such conduct, be prohibited from the use of the bathing-houses and of boating on the waters of the reserve.
