- 11. Persons renting any portion of the said land for the crection of booths, or for any other purpose, shall abide by any order given by the committee of management in reference to the said land.
- III. No person shall put on the said land any cattle, goats, or sheep, without the consent in writing of the committee having been first obtained.
- iv. No person shall take any dog on the said land during a race meeting, unless led or tied up by a chain or cord.
- v. Any persons committing any of the following offences on the said land shall be removed therefrom:—

1st, Being drunk and disorderly.

2nd. Crossing or riding upon the racecourse proper, when the horses are prepared to start, or are running for any race.

3rd. Using indecent or obscene language.

- 4th. Wilfully obstructing any officer, agent, or servant of the committee in the execution of their duty.
- vi. No person shall enter the stewards' stand except the ficers of the club, and such persons as the stewards may officers of the invite to do so.
- vii. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or cut names on the fences or seats, or in any other way damage the property of the club erected on the said land.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of The Land Act 1869, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a hailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

HEREAS by The Land Act 1869 power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: And whereas by The Land Act 1878 it is amongst other things enacted that the said Act shall be read and construed as part of The Land Act 1869: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor in Council, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby rescind, to the extent hereinafter mentioned, all rules, regulations, schedules, and orders hereinafter expressed to be rescinded, and doth make in lieu thereof the regulations following :-

1. Except as to all matters done, rights acquired, and obligations incurred thereunder, the Regulations of the Governor in Council specified in Schedule I. hereto are hereby rescinded.

2. The Schedules hereto shall be taken as part of these Regulations and may be modified by the

Minister. 3. These Regulations shall be read and construed with the Regulations dated 7th February 1876,

and shall come into force on 1st January 1879.

4. Applications for the issue of licenses except non-residence licenses under the provision of Part II., Land Act 1869, as amended by The Land Act 1878, shall be in the form and shall be accompanied by the declaration prescribed in Schedule II. hereto.

5. Licenses issued under Part II., Land Act 1869, as amended by The Land Act 1878, shall be in

the form and subject to the conditions prescribed in Schedule III. hereto.

6. Any licensee under Part II. of The Land Act 1869 who may desire to take advantage of the provisions of section 8 of The Land Act 1878 shall apply, on or before the 30th April 1879, in the form prescribed in Schedule IV. hereto, to surrender his license and obtain a new license in lieu thereof. The fee for a new license shall be £1.

7. Any licensee under Part II., Land Act 1869, who may wish to absent himself for a period not exceeding in all three months in any one year of the currency of his license shall apply personally to the Land Officer for the district in which the land is situated, and fill up and sign a notice in the form prescribed in Schedule V. hereto.
