WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything therein before contained the Governor might by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the Proclamation hereinafter mentioned as to certain lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do hereby revoke the Proclamation bearing date the twenty-fourth day of September One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven prohibiting the cutting, digging, or removing of live redgum timber from certain Crown lands specified therein so far as it relates to the two blocks of land in the parish of Moorooma, containing about One thousand acres, surveyed for, and for which licenses have been applied for under the 53rd section of *The Land Act 1869* by John J. Gemmill and George Tanner respectively.—(78.A.2061.)

# KERANG CEMETERIES.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE KERANG CEMETERIES.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or  
before the ground or vault is opened.

2. By the 16th section of *The Cemeteries Act*, it shall be  
lawful for the trustees of any such cemetery to permit any  
vault or grave to be dug and made in such cemetery, and any  
monument or tombstone to be erected or placed in any parts  
of any such cemetery as they may think proper, upon pay-  
ment to them by the person desiring to dig and make such  
vault or grave, and to erect and place such monument or  
tombstone, of the proper fees, by the 19th section of such  
*Act*; and any person so digging and making such vaults or  
erections, or erecting and placing such monument in such  
cemetery by and with such permission as aforesaid, and upon  
payment of the fees aforesaid, shall be entitled to have main-  
tained and kept up such vault, monument, or tombstone  
according to the terms of such permission to and for the sole  
and separate use of such person and his representatives for  
ever.

3. Application for such permission to be made at the office  
of the trustees. A certificate of permission in the form set  
out in the schedule will be granted to the party applying for  
such permission on payment of the charges in the schedule.

4. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor  
person in such cemetery, on a certificate of a minister of reli-  
gion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the  
trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations  
and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and  
charges.

5. Orders for interment to be given either to the sexton at  
the lodge, or at the office of the trustees; such notice to be  
given before Four o'clock p.m. on the previous day; if not,  
an extra charge will be made.

6. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but  
parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to  
construct them under the direction of the trustees or their  
surveyor; and in case interment is to be made in any private  
grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled  
thereto must be left with the order.

7. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause  
of death of the deceased must be stated at the time of giving the  
order.

8. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the  
procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be  
punctually observed.

9. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the  
performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. in  
the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten  
a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months, except on Sun-  
days, when the usual and only hours for funerals will be from  
Two to Five o'clock throughout the year.

10. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be  
kept in proper repair and proper condition at the expense of  
the owners.

11. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in,  
cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

12. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of  
every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy  
of every epitaph or inscription, to be submitted to the trustees  
for approval, who are required, by the 8th section of the *Act*,  
"to withhold permission and prevent the erection of any  
monument which shall appear to them inappropriate or un-  
becoming, and shall determine and fix the position of any  
monument which may be prepared to be erected according to  
the description, size, and character thereof, having reference  
to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an  
appropriate manner." In the erection of tablets copper cramps  
must be used.

13. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in  
any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive  
any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

14. The ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise  
to sunset.

15. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the  
purchased and other graves, is to be kept at the office, and

16. The sexton has orders to turn out any person who shall  
behave indecorously or commit any trespass or injury to the  
trees, flowers, or erections, or otherwise infringe *The Ceme-

and such persons will be proceeded against according to the  
provisions of such *Act*.

17. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations

The Governor in Council has also approved of the omission from clause 38 c of the existing regulations of the following words, viz., "or should the vessel requiring a pilot not belong to any company."

"All vessels requiring a pilot to sea and not belonging to either of the companies are to be entered in a book to be kept for the purpose, and numbered consecutively from (1) one upwards.

"All the odd numbers are to go to No. 1 Company, the even numbers to go to No. 2 Company.

"In the event of either company neglecting or refusing to take any vessel to sea which under this rule falls to their turn to pilot, the other company shall take her to sea without prejudice to their claim to the following vessel which would have come to them in the ordinary course."

**W**HEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-first year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled *An Act to amend the Laws relating to or affecting Public Health* (31 Vict. No. 310), it was amongst other things enacted that Part II. of the said Act should apply to all places where the Part of the Act thereby repealed, or any portion thereof, had been in force, and all or some of the provisions of Part II. aforesaid should also apply to every such city, town, borough, shire, district, or place in Victoria as the Governor in Council should by Proclamation direct; and the Governor in Council might at any time, and from time to time, alter, repeal, or revoke any such Proclamation theretofore or thereafter made: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the seventeenth day of January 1876, Part II. of the said Act was extended to the Shire of Wimmera: And whereas a portion of the said shire has been separated therefrom and constituted the Shire of Dunmunkle: And whereas it is expedient to extend Part II. aforesaid to the Shire of Wimmera as now constituted, and to the new Shire of Dunmunkle: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation direct that all the provisions of Part II. of the above-recited Act 31 Vict. No. 310, shall apply to the respective shires hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF DUNMUNKLE and  
THE SHIRE OF WIMMERA.

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by an Act passed by the Parliament of Victoria in the twenty-fifth year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act to consolidate and amend the Law relating to the Distillation, Rectifying, and Compounding of Spirits, to the granting a Duty upon Spirits Distilled in Victoria, and to regulate the Brewing of Beer and the Sale of Fermented and Spirituous Liquors in certain cases*, it was amongst other things enacted, that any person, except as thereafter excepted, who should carry on the business of a distiller or rectifier and compounder of spirits, or who should have in his possession, or who should make use of any still or other utensil for distilling or rectifying and compounding spirits, excepting in such place as the Governor in Council should by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* direct, should be liable to a penalty of not less than One hundred pounds nor more than Five hundred pounds: And whereas by a proclamation, under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the fifth day of January One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, certain premises in Northumberland street, East Collingwood, were proclaimed as a place wherein the distillation of spirits might be carried on: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the proclamation of the premises in question, and to re-proclaim the same, with amended boundaries, as a place wherein the distillation of spirits may be carried on: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the proclamation of the premises hereinbefore referred to, and do proclaim the undermentioned place as a place wherein the distillation of spirits may be carried on, that is to say:—

Allotment of land situated in Northumberland street, in the City of Collingwood, colony of Victoria, and bounded as follows, viz. Beginning at a point one hundred and fifty-two feet from Wellington street, Collingwood; thence seventy-eight feet running east along Northumberland street; thence by a line running due south one hundred and eighty-five feet; thence by a line running due west seventy-eight feet; thence by a line running due north one hundred and eighty-five feet to the point of commencement.

### MELBOURNE BENEVOLENT ASYLUM.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Statute, 27 Victoria No. 220, the following bye-law was made by the corporation on the thirteenth day of December 1877, and such bye-law was confirmed by a general meeting of the contributors specially convened for the purpose, and held at the Athenæum, Collins street east, in the city of Melbourne, on the 17th day of January 1878, and will come into operation at the expiration of one month after the date of such confirmation and the publication hereof in lieu of the bye-laws heretofore in force:—

#### BYE-LAW.

##### OBJECT.

To relieve the aged, infirm, disabled, or destitute of all creeds and nations, and to administer to them the comforts of religion:—(1) By receiving and maintaining, in a suitable building, such as may be most benefited by being inmates of the asylum. (2) By giving out-door relief in kind to families and individuals in temporary distress. (3) By affording medical assistance and medicine, through the establishment of a dispensary or otherwise. (4) By affording facilities for religious instruction and consolation to the inmates of the asylum.

##### QUALIFICATIONS AND PRIVILEGES OF CONTRIBUTORS.

1. Every person subscribing towards the maintenance of this charity not less than £1 per annum or £20 in any one year shall be entitled to recommend patients for admission to the institution, and also to vote at all elections and general meetings of contributors.

2. Annual contributors of £1 shall be entitled to one vote; of £2, two votes; and £5 and upwards, three votes.

3. Every donor of £20 in one sum, or the same amount in one year, shall be designated a life governor, and be entitled to exercise all the privileges of an annual contributor of £1; donors of £50 to the privileges of annual contributors of £2; and of £100 and upwards to the privileges of annual contributors of £5.

4. Every person (except the paid collector) who shall collect and pay into the funds of the institution, during any one year, the sum of £25 shall be designated a life governor, and shall be entitled to the privileges of an annual contributor of £1; collectors of £100 to the privileges of annual contributors of £2; and collectors of £200 and upwards to the privileges of annual contributors of £5. Provided always that the real contributors of the amount so collected do not claim the privileges which the amount they subscribe would otherwise entitle them to.

5. The executor first named in any will by which £25 and upwards is bequeathed to the institution, on paying the amount to the treasurer for the time being, shall be enrolled a life governor, and shall be entitled to all the privileges pertaining to annual contributors of £1. In case the amount bequeathed exceeds £100, the two first named executors shall be enrolled life governors, and each be entitled to all the privileges of annual contributors of £1; and in case the amount exceeds £200, the three first named executors shall be enrolled life governors, and each be entitled to all the privileges of an annual contributor of £1.

6. Every public or corporate body that shall contribute the sum of £5 and upwards annually shall be entitled to nominate some person to exercise on its behalf the privileges pertaining to an annual contributor of £1. Should the contribution be £25, or more than £25, the body shall be entitled to nominate some person who shall be enrolled a life governor, and to exercise on its behalf all the privileges of an annual contributor of £1.

7. Every life governor and annual contributor absent from the colony of Victoria may by power of attorney containing a provision thereto exercise all the privileges which pertain to the contribution, provided always that such power of attorney shall have been exhibited to the secretary not less than seven days before the exercise of such privilege. The secretary shall keep a record of all such powers exhibited, and shall issue a certificate of such exhibition, which shall remain in force for twelve months, but not longer.

8. Every yearly subscription shall be paid in advance, and every first yearly payment shall be calculated from the date of such payment; but no such first yearly payment shall entitle to a vote at a general meeting or election within three months of the date of such payment.

9. The privileges of annual contributors shall be suspended until all arrears are paid.

10. Every firm or partnership subscribing may exercise their privilege through some one member of such firm.

11. Persons who shall have conferred any signal benefit on the asylum, irrespective of subscription, may be elected life governors by the committee, and shall be entitled to exercise all the privileges or annual contributors of £1.

##### COMMITTEE AND GENERAL MEETINGS.

12. The entire management of the institution, its paid officers and inmates, shall (subject to these bye-laws) be vested in the committee, which shall consist of twelve contributors, of whom three, and not more, may be honorary medical officers on the staff of the institution, together with the president,

vice-president, and honorary treasurer, who shall be *ex-officio* members of the committee.

13. His Excellency the Governor shall be the president of the institution during his residence in the colony. The two vice-presidents shall hold office for three years, and thereafter until the election of their successors.

14. The honorary treasurer and four of the ordinary members of committee, "in rotation," shall retire from office at the annual meeting in every year, but, if otherwise qualified, shall be eligible for re-election. The members who shall retire shall be those who have been longest in office without re-election by the contributors.

15. Annual general meetings of contributors shall be held in the city of Melbourne, on the third Thursday in the month of January in every year, at such time and place as the committee shall appoint, of which notice shall have been given in two or more Melbourne newspapers seven clear days before the day of meeting, to receive a report and balance-sheet from the committee; to elect members of committee, treasurer, medical officers, and auditors; and to transact any other business of which due notice shall have been given. Seven annual contributors, or life governors, shall form a quorum at annual or general meetings of contributors.

16. The committee shall meet at the asylum once every week, or oftener if necessary, on such day and at such hour as they may from time to time appoint, and four members form a quorum for transaction of business. They shall have power to frame regulations (not inconsistent with these bye-laws) for the conduct of their own proceedings and that of the officers, inmates, and visitors of the institution, and generally for the proper management of the asylum. Such regulations shall be binding upon all parties until duly altered or repealed. The committee shall have power to appoint house, finance, and other sub-committees from time to time; to enter into contracts for the supply of provisions, materials, or the performance of any work that may be required for the institution; to appoint and discharge all paid officers of the institution, to fix their salaries, and to specify their duties and hours of attendance.

17. The president, or, in his absence, one of the vice-presidents or treasurer, shall preside at all meetings of committee and contributors; and, in their absence, those present shall appoint their own chairman; and the president or chairman shall have an additional or casting vote.

18. All meetings shall commence so soon after the hour appointed as a quorum shall be present. If, after a lapse of twenty minutes, no quorum shall be present, the members present shall adjourn the meeting to such date as they may think desirable, not being less than twenty-four hours nor more than seven days from the time fixed for holding the meeting. In the event of no members being present, the secretary shall adjourn the meeting. All such adjournments shall be entered in the minute-book, and the secretary shall immediately give due notice of the time to which the meeting stands adjourned.

19. The committee may convene a special general meeting of contributors at any time upon giving notice at least seven days previously in two or more of the Melbourne newspapers; which notice shall be repeated three times in each of such papers, and shall contain the particular subjects to be brought before such general meeting, and none other shall be discussed thereat. Any twenty contributors may request the committee to call a special meeting at any time; and should the committee, after receiving such requisition, signed by twenty or more contributors, refuse or neglect to call such meeting within seven days, then any twenty contributors shall have power to convene such meeting upon giving notice as directed above.

20. There shall be two standing sub-committees, each consisting of three members. First: The house committee, whose duties shall be to inspect weekly the several wards and other parts of the institution; to inquire into the condition of the inmates, the character and quality of the provisions, and other articles supplied to the institution; and, in conjunction with the resident medical officer, ascertain if any of the inmates are in a fit state for employment or to leave the asylum, and to report them to the weekly meetings of the committee; also to offer suggestions from time to time as to necessary repairs, alterations, or improvements. Second: The finance committee, whose duties shall be to examine collectors' books and accounts; to examine and recommend all accounts for payment; to examine the accounts when paid, and generally to investigate the books and accounts of the institution.

##### ACCOUNTS.

21. All moneys received on account of the institution shall be paid into the asylum account, at such bank as the committee may from time to time direct, to the credit of one or other of the following accounts:—Maintenance Account—Building Account—Endowment Account.

22. All legacies and bequests (unless otherwise especially directed), together with any special gifts for the same purpose, shall be paid into the Endowment Account, which shall be invested from time to time, under the direction of the committee, in the names of three trustees, who shall be appointed by the committee, and may be removed from office by a

meeting of the committee especially convened for that purpose, and others appointed in their place.

23. The said endowment fund shall be allowed to accumulate, with the interest derivable from its investment, until it amounts to £10,000, after which the interest may be paid into the Maintenance Account.

24. Under no circumstances, temporary or otherwise, shall the money to the credit of endowment fund be used otherwise than herein provided, without the sanction of a general meeting of the contributors specially convened for that purpose.

25. The finance committee shall meet once a month, as may be directed by the committee; shall examine all accounts and certify to their correctness or otherwise.

26. All payments shall be made by order of the committee, upon the recommendation of the finance committee.

27. All cheques shall be signed by the treasurer, one member of the finance committee, and countersigned by the secretary or some person authorized thereto by the committee. In the event of the absence of the treasurer, or inability otherwise arising, one other member of the finance committee shall sign the cheques "for the treasurer."

28. A proper statement of accounts shall be presented to the annual general meeting of contributors, duly examined and approved by the auditors.

#### AUDITORS.

29. Two auditors (being contributors) shall be elected at every annual meeting, whose duty it shall be to examine the accounts and report thereon to the next annual meeting. In the event of death, resignation, or absence from the colony of either or both the auditors so elected, it shall be the duty of the committee to appoint some person or persons in his or their room.

#### MEDICAL OFFICERS.

30. No one shall be eligible for the office of honorary physician or honorary surgeon unless, in addition to the requirements of *The Medical Practitioners Statute 1865*, he is a graduate in medicine of some university of Great Britain, Ireland, Melbourne, or some of the Australian colonies; or is a licentiate or member of a college of physicians of the United Kingdom; or for the office of honorary surgeon, unless he has received his degree in surgery from the University of Melbourne or some of the Australian colonies, or the diploma of the College of Surgeons of England, Scotland, or Ireland, or of the Faculty of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow.

31. The physicians and surgeons shall regularly consult on all cases of importance, or of protracted indisposition, in the asylum; and when either the physicians or surgeons deem it necessary they may call a full consultation of all the medical gentlemen connected with the establishment. The surgeons shall perform all the surgical operations necessary, but no capital operation shall be performed on any patient without a previous consultation of the physicians and surgeons, or at least one physician with the surgeons, excepting in cases of sudden accident not admitting of delay.

32. Every second year, at the annual meeting to be held as aforesaid, the two medical officers (namely, one physician and one surgeon) who have been longest in office shall retire, but shall be eligible for re-election.

33. Whenever any vacancy occurs the committee shall give notice thereof in some daily newspaper published in Melbourne, and fix therein the time within which candidates shall send in their applications and evidence of their qualifications.

34. The committee shall determine all questions as to the sufficiency of the qualifications of any candidate, and its decision thereon shall be conclusive.

35. Whenever at the expiration of the time so fixed there is only a sufficient number of duly qualified candidates to fill the vacancy or vacancies the committee may declare him or them duly elected, or in their discretion may from time to time postpone the election, and advertise as hereinbefore directed. Provided always that no vacancy remain unfilled more than six weeks.

36. When at the expiration of the time so fixed there are more than sufficient duly qualified candidates the committee shall appoint a time and place for the election by ballot, as provided in bye-law No. 45, of some one or more of such candidates to fill the vacancy or vacancies, and shall give not less than seven days' notice in some daily newspaper published in Melbourne of such election, and of the names of the several candidates.

37. The person or persons so elected shall hold office only so long as the person or persons in whose place he or they were elected would have remained in office, except in case of vacancy from effluxion of time, in which case the person or persons elected shall hold office for four years.

38. No honorary medical officer shall be absent from the institution for more than fourteen consecutive days without leave from the committee, duly recorded on the minutes. An attendance book shall be kept, in which the honorary medical officers shall record their visits. Such attendance book shall lie on the table at each meeting of the committee.

39. The committee may, by an absolute majority of the whole committee, suspend any member of the honorary staff, and shall within fourteen days of the order of such suspension convene a special meeting of the contributors to confirm or otherwise deal with such suspension.

40. No one shall be eligible for the office of resident medical officer who does not possess the certificate of the Medical Board of Victoria.

#### SUPERINTENDENT.

41. The superintendent shall, subject to the laws of the institution and the regulations and orders of the committee, have the charge, control, and management of the asylum, and of the inmates and hired servants thereof.

42. Neither the superintendent nor the matron shall be absent from the asylum between the hours of 10 p.m. and 8 a.m., nor for more than two hours at one time, without permission of the committee, except on Sunday, when his or her absence may extend to three hours.

#### COMMON SEAL.

43. The common seal of the corporation shall be kept in a box with two locks and keys (one of which keys shall be kept by the treasurer and the other by the secretary). The common seal shall not be affixed to any deed or instrument except by order and in the presence of the committee, and shall be verified by the signature of the treasurer and the secretary.

#### ELECTIONS.

44. Every candidate for the office of auditor, or to any office or seat on the committee, shall lodge with the secretary a written intimation of his intention to offer himself for election at least three days before the annual general meeting. If the number of candidates for any of the respective offices exceed the number to be elected the choice shall be determined by ballot, to be taken between the hours of 12 noon and 4 in the afternoon, on such day and at such place as the chairman of the meeting may appoint. The ballot to be taken before some member of the committee and two scrutineers (being contributors) to be appointed by the meeting. In case of equal voting the member of committee presiding at the ballot box shall have a casting vote.

45. In case of the number offering themselves prior to the meeting not being sufficient to fill the vacant offices, those duly offering shall be declared elected, and the remaining vacancies shall be filled up by the meeting by a show of hands.

#### RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION.

46. The committee shall frame regulations, and may from time to time amend or alter such regulations for the purpose of affording all the inmates the opportunity of receiving religious instruction and consolation from some minister or other accredited visitors of the denomination to which they belong.
