## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight, Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Licensing Act 1876 (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the under-mentioned localities to be respectively districts wherein publicans' licenses may be specially granted under the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act, that is to say:—

The parish of Yea.

That portion of the county of Evelyn south of the River Yarra and east of the boundary of the shire of Lilydale.

The district of Eaglehawk.

The district of Corack East.

The shire of Kilmore.

The shire of St. Arnaud.

The vicinity of the Bridge and Camping-place at the Stony Creek on the Tamblough road, between Violettown and Shepparton.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eighteenth day of February in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and in the forty-first year of Her Majesty's reign.

**TARTAR REEF.**—The Tartar Reef is a coral bank some few feet below low-water springs, 2½ miles long and 1 mile broad, and lying in a direction N.N.W. and S.S.E. Its north point is situated S. 34° W. 18½ miles from the summit of Waia N. 55° W. 21 miles from summit of Island of Malolo S. 17° E. 17½ miles from the south point of the Kiva Reef. Immediately in a line between the Tartar Reef and the south point of the Kiva Reef there are no dangers, but coral banks exist which have from 9 to 25 fathoms of water upon them. In shore of a meridian 5 miles east of this line, and between the parallels of Naviti and the Namanutha, Hudson's Island, there are numerous reefs with from 2 to 5 fathoms of water which break occasionally.

**VIWA.**—Viwa Island is not more than 100 feet high and cannot be seen at night. On the south point of the reef there is a heavy break at all times.

**BARRIER REEF OFF MALOLO.**—The barrier reef west of Malolo ends abruptly in a horn S. 81° W. 7 miles from the summit of that island.

**NEW REEF WEST OF HUDSON GROUP.**—Between this horn and the Tartar Reef there is a chain of coral banks with from 3 feet to 5 fathoms of water on them; there are blind rollers on these banks, but they break continuously only in strong winds, the safest passage through will be found in the following positions:—N. 80° W. 10 miles from Malolo summit; S. 84° W. 7 miles from Malolo summit. A good light is necessary for entering as the edges of the banks are badly defined. Soundings of between 100 and 200 fathoms were obtained ½ mile to the west of the banks.

**MAMANUTHA OR HUDSON'S ISLANDS.**—The most westerly of the Mamanutha islands, viz., Mondriko (Alden Island of Wilkes) lies N. 54° W. 11½ miles from the summit of Malolo.

**PASSAGES INTO MAUDI WATERS.**—There are two good passages into the Maudi Waters, the Navula and the Malolo passage, the latter is between Waldron and Nipiden islands. No reef exists directly in front of it as represented in the published chart.

**VARIATION.**—Variation at Maudi R., 9° 25' E. Bearings are given magnetic.

**VATI OR SANDWICH ISLAND, NEW HEBRIDES.**—The *Nymphe* made the island to extend ten miles further to the eastward than marked on chart. Mr. Young, a resident of long standing in Havannah Harbor, says that traders are constantly speaking to him of Sandwich Island being so much out of

position, he himself thinks the island cannot be far short of 40 miles in length.

Panoe Bay in Vate Island is quite 5 miles across, whereas in chart No. 1380 it is only put as one mile wide from point to point. The northern point should not be rounded closer than a quarter of a mile, as a reef extends some distance from the point.

#### TIMBER RESERVES DIMINISHED.

##### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that the Governor might make and proclaim reserves for the preservation and growth of timber, and might from time to time, after one month's notice should be given in the *Government Gazette*, alter and revoke any such proclamation, and the Board of Land and Works might issue licenses to cut timber upon such reserve or any part thereof on such terms and conditions, and subject to the payment of such license fee as should from time to time be approved of by the Governor and be set forth in such license: And whereas it is expedient to diminish the timber reserves hereinafter mentioned: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter and revoke all former Proclamations, so far as they relate to the portions of land hereby deducted from the timber reserves hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

**BALLARAT AND CRESWICK STATE FOREST.**—The Ballarat and Creswick State Forest, proclaimed by Order of the 26th March 1872, as a reserve for the preservation and growth of timber, and which was diminished by Orders dated respectively the 28th April 1873, the 28th July 1873, and the 1st May 1876, is hereby further diminished by deducting therefrom the portion hereinafter described, viz.:—Two acres one rood thirteen perches and seven-tenths, county of Talbot, parish of Creswick: Commencing at a point bearing S. 66° 35' W. one chain and S. 23° 25' E. one chain from the south-east angle of the land licensed under the 42nd section of *The Amending Land Act 1865* to W. L. Jones; bounded thence by roads bearing respectively S. 23° 25' E. six chains eighteen links, S. 66° 35' W. three chains sixty-six links and a half, N. 25° 33' W. six chains eighteen links and a half, and N. 66° 35' E. three chains eighty-nine links and a half to the point of commencement.—(C.400.) By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim as a Common the Crown lands hereinafter described, that is to say:—

**LOY-YANG COMMON.**—Twelve thousand acres, more or less, county of Buln Buln, parish of Loy-Yang, being the unappropriated Crown land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.: Commencing at the south-west angle of A. Whalley's 19th section block, No. 4023; thence east and north by that block and north by a line to the south boundary of J. Barton's block, No. 2089; thence east by that block and C. Stammer's block, No. 3717, to the south-east angle of the latter; thence south-easterly by a direct line to the south-west angle of J. Johnson's block, No. 2918; thence east and north by that block to the north-east angle thereof; thence east by a road to the north-west angle of J. Misen's block, No. 3137; thence south-east and north by that block to the north-east angle thereof; thence east by a road to the west boundary of R. G. Lindsay's block, No. 522; thence south by that block and a water reserve to the south-west angle of the latter; thence south-westerly by a direct line to the north-west angle of R. G. The births of 719 children, viz., 369 boys and 350 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of January. In the month of December 637 births were registered, or 62 less than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in January numbered 537, viz., 270 of males and 267 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 182. The deaths exceeded those registered in December by 41, and were in excess of the average of January during the previous ten years by 44. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been 33 less than the average of those ten years.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 99.2° on the 9th, and the lowest was 46.1° on the 22nd. The mean temperature of the month (65.8°) was slightly below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (44.2°) took place on the 17th, viz., from a maximum of 91.1° to a minimum of 46.9°. The least range (9.0°) was on the 27th, viz., from a maximum of 69.0° to a minimum of 60.0°. The mean daily range was 22.2°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.953 inches) was more than a tenth of an inch above the average.

The deaths of males recorded during the month were only slightly in excess of those of females. Forty-seven per cent. of the mortality was of children under the age of 5 years as against the following per centages in previous years:—49 in January 1877; 52 in January 1876; 66 in January 1875; 57.5 in January 1874; 49 in January 1873; 56 in January 1872; 57 in January 1871; 58 in January 1870 and 1869; and 62 in January 1868.

Fourteen deaths of persons who had attained the age of 75 years were recorded during the month, viz.:—Those of a female, aged 75, of serous effusion on the brain; a carpenter, aged 75, and a gardener, aged 76, of old age; a female, aged 76, of cancer of the stomach; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 76, of heart disease; a "gentleman," aged 77, of bronchitis; a female, aged 78, and a female and a mariner, each aged 82, of old age; a female, aged 83, of diarrhoea; a laborer, aged 84, of hemiplegia; a dealer, aged 86, and two females, aged 87 and 96 respectively, of old age.

The deaths from external causes registered during the month under review numbered 22; of which 17 were ascribed to accident, 2 to homicide, and 3 to suicide. The particulars are as follow:—A news-agent, aged 24, died of fracture of the skull, caused by a fall from a horse; a nightman, aged 30, died of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall from a cart; a carter, aged 45, was killed by a lorry wheel passing over his neck; a female, aged 53, died of fracture of the neck, caused by a fall from a buggy; a boy, aged 14, died of an injury to the head caused by running against a clothes-line; three females, aged respectively 9, 12, and 70, died of burns, the result in the two latter instances of their clothes having caught fire; a female, aged 40, and a stonebreaker, aged 50, died of sunstroke; a female child, aged 2, was poisoned by eating the berries of the deadly nightshade; five persons, viz., two boys, aged 7, one boy, aged 12, and two females, aged 19 and 23, were accidentally drowned; a male, of occupation unknown, aged about 60, was found in the River Yarra, but in so decomposed a state that the cause of death could not be ascertained. The homicidal deaths were those of two new-born infants (a male and a female), who were wilfully murdered by suffocation. Of those who committed suicide, a gardener, aged 24, poisoned himself with opium; a carpenter, aged 43, drowned himself in the Saltwater River; and a steward, aged 49, hanged himself.

Ninety-five deaths, or 18 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—60 in the Melbourne Hospital, 3 in the Immigrants' Home, 1 in the Children's Hospital, 6 in the Alfred Hospital, 7 in the Lying-in Hospital, 6 in the Benevolent Asylum, 8 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 2 in the Protestant Refuge, and 1 in the Protestant Orphan Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 255, of which 118, or 46 per cent., were of males; and 137, or 54 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 170 were under one year of age, 58 were between one and two, 14 were between two and three, 12 were between three and four, and 1 was between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 282. Of these, 152, or 54 per cent., were males, and 130, or 46 per cent., were females; 15 were between five and ten, 10 were between ten and fifteen, 14 were between fifteen and twenty, 28 were between twenty and twenty-five, 24 were between twenty-five and thirty, 27 were between thirty and thirty-five, 14 were between thirty-five and forty, 81 were between forty and forty-five, 28 were between forty-five and fifty, 18 were between fifty and fifty-five, 20 were between fifty-five and sixty, 18 were between sixty and sixty-five, 12 were between sixty-five and seventy, 9 were between seventy and seventy-five, 7 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 7 were upwards of eighty.

In the month under review, as in the previous one, most deaths were set down to local diseases, which is unusual during the summer season. The mortality from some complaints of the zymotic class, shows considerable increase in January as compared with December. Thus, deaths from diarrhoea rose from 62 to 75; deaths from dysentery and deaths from diphtheria, each rose from 6 to 11; and deaths from typhoid fever rose from 18 to 24. On the other hand, deaths from scarlatina fell from 16 to 10, and deaths from whooping-cough from 19 to 16. Phthisis caused 43 deaths in December and 42 in January. Five deaths were set down to the consequences of child-bearing in December and 7 in January, the former being in the proportion of 1 to every 131, and the latter of 1 to every 103 births registered.

1. Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and may be forwarded (if by post, prepaid) addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for the Conveyance of Mails" endorsed on the cover, or placed in the tender-box at the General Post Office.

2. Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers as below the mail services for which they tender. Such numbers to be stated in the tender itself and endorsed on the cover enclosing the tender.

3. Every tender will be taken to include the entire service as called for. The amount of the tender must be stated at RATE PER ANNUM FOR ONE or THREE YEARS in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being completed.

7. The money deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts but not otherwise.

8. ##### CONDITIONS OF TENDER.

**T**ENDERS are hereby invited, and will be received until Noon of Friday the twelfth day of April 1878, for the Conveyance of Post Office Mails as undermentioned, for ONE or THREE YEARS from the 1st July 1878 to 30th June 1879, or 30th June 1881.

The covers of tenders for these services must be endorsed "Tender for Second Call."

1. Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any postoffice in the colony, and may be forwarded (if by post, prepaid) addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for the Conveyance of Mails," endorsed on the cover, or placed in the tender-box at the General Post Office.

2. Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender. Such numbers to be stated in the tender itself and endorsed on the cover enclosing the tender.

3. Every tender will be taken to include the entire service as called for. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM FOR ONE or THREE YEARS in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bonâ fide* signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being completed.

7. The money deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts, but not otherwise.

8. In the event of a portion of railway affecting any particular service being opened for traffic during period of contract, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the place of departure for the mail coaches shall be altered in such way as the Postmaster-General may from time to time direct; a ratable reduction shall be made in the amount paid for the service as then rendered by the contractors, such reduction to be computed on the basis of the average mileage rate of the lump tender or the average mileage rate of the single tender, in whichever form the tender may be accepted.

9. Persons tendering are requested to state the description of the vehicle they intend to use, and the number of horses by which it is to be drawn.

10. A separate tender must be sent in for each service; but notwithstanding this condition, any offer will be entertained for the performance of any number of services for a lump sum.

2. If the licensee, or any person claiming an interest through or under the licensee in the land comprised in this license shall, at any time during the period for which the license has been issued, employ any person to apply for a license of an allotment under *The Land Act* 1869, contrary to the true intent of the provisions thereof, or shall make or cause to be made any agreement or contract, or shall give or take, or cause to be given or taken, any negotiable security for the purpose of defeating or evading the provisions of, or shall in any way whatsoever, directly or indirectly, commit or be privy to a fraud upon the said Act, this license shall be void.

3. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this license shall be deemed within the operations of this license.

4.
