The following report, by Captain Johnson, of this department, containing sailing directions for Gore Bay, is published for general information.

Wellington, 6th February 1878.

Sir,—A single anchor mooring for a 200-ton vessel has been laid in Gore Bay, about 400 yards from the shore, and right opposite the new landing slip, in 3½ fathoms water, sheltered from all winds except from north to east, which blow right in, but seldom with great violence. Sailing vessels, if caught in such weather, will not be able to beat out from the mooring, and are advised to use their anchors in addition to the mooring. The boating establishment, when completed, will be very efficient, and, with a vessel at the mooring, great despatch in loading and discharging will be insured.

Vessels bound to Gore Bay will find no difficulty in making out the landing-place, which is situated immediately within the south side of the entrance. It should be brought to bear S.W. by W. when about two miles from shore, then steer straight in; and, should the vessel be large, she should anchor in convenient depth until a boat comes off. Seaward of mooring the anchorage is open to the S.E., but from here a vessel can get under weigh with the wind in.

QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE DISEASES IN STOCK ACT."

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Diseases in Stock Act* (No. 451) and No. 15 of the Regulations thereunder, the Governor in Council has determined and declared that W. H. Powell's land at Footscray, hereinafter described, be continued as a quarantine district under the said Act and Regulations.

DESCRIPTION OF THE QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—County of Bourke, parish of Donita Galla: Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 19; thence westerly by the Melbourne and Footscray road seven chains; thence by a line bearing N. 45° E. to the southern side of the Melbourne and Geelong railway; thence easterly by the railway fence to the north-western boundary of allotment 19 aforesaid; and thence south-westerly by that allotment to the point of commencement.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Diseases in Stock Act* (No. 451) and No. 18 of the Regulations thereunder, the Governor in Council has abolished the quarantine district of Cherry's Farm which was continued in quarantine by Orders in Council bearing date respectively the 11th and 18th of February instant (page 436 ante).

NOTE.—The births in 1877 numbered 26,043, or fewer than in any year since 1869. The deaths numbered 12,792, or less than in 1876 (13,561), or than in 1875 (15,287), but more than in any other year since the first settlement of the colony. The arrivals by sea numbered 41,196, or more than any other year since 1858; and the departures by sea numbered 33,943, or more than in any other year since 1863.

The increase of population exceeded that in 1876 by 3,476, and was also in excess of that in any year of the previous decenniad except 1868, 1869, 1870, and 1871, as will be seen by the following figures:—

ROADS PROCLAIMED UNDER "THE LAND ACT 1869."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that the Governor might from time to time by a notice in the *Government Gazette* proclaim as a street or road or as a town or village any portion or portions of Crown lands, and the lands in such town or village should be sold by auction in the manner therein provided for the sale of Crown lands by public auction, and the lands upon which such street or road should have been proclaimed should be and be deemed to be thenceforward dedicated to the public: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice proclaim as roads the portions of Crown lands in the several parishes mentioned in the schedule hereto annexed, such roads being delineated and shown by pink tint on plans which are deposited at the Crown Lands Office, at Melbourne, and bear date as having been laid before the Governor in Council on the twenty-seventh day of February 1878, that is to say:—

revoke the Proclamation of the timber reserve called the Gunbower State Forest, which bears date the twelfth day of January One thousand eight hundred and seventy four, so far as it relates to the portion of land hereby deducted from the said timber reserve, that is to say:—

THE GUNBOWER STATE FOREST, proclaimed by Order of the 12th January 1874 as a reserve for the preservation and growth of Timber, is hereby diminished by deducting therefrom the land comprised within the following boundaries, viz.:-Ten acres, county of Gunbower, parish of Patho: Commencing at a point bearing N. 30° 0' W. thirty-one chains sixty-four links and west four chains fifteen links from the north-west angle of Wm. By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to the undermentioned Commons respectively the areas hereinafter described, that is to say:—

ALEXANDRA COMMON.—The Alexandra Common, proclaimed by Order of the 26th August 1872, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:-County of Anglesey, town of Alexandra, and parish of Alexandra: Commencing at a point on the right bank of the Goulburn River in line with the north boundary of allotment 16, parish of Alexandra; thence east by a line, the said allotment, and a line to the west boundary of C. WANGARATTA PUBLIC PARK REGULATIONS.

WE, the Mayor and Councillors of the Borough of Wangaratta, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Wangaratta Public Park, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management of the said park, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The park shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
 2. No person shall enter or remain in the park who may offend against decency as regards his dress, language, or conduct.
 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the park, or the gates or fences thereof, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the park.
 5. No person shall put in the park any cattle, goats, or pigs, without the authority in writing of the mayor.
 6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the park, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the mayor being first obtained.
 7. No person except laborers and workmen employed in the park shall enter any plots which may be enclosed within the park for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
