Downing street, 7th December 1877.

SIR,—I have the honor to transmit to you a copy of an Order of the Queen in Council, dated the 28th December 1866, applying the *Foreign Deserters Act 1852* to the Kingdom of Madagascar. This Order appears to have been sent out in original to the Governor of Mauritius without any steps having been taken at the time to communicate it to the rest of the colonies. It is therefore now forwarded for your information and for publication in the colony under your government.

PRESENT:

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the *Foreign Deserters Act 1852* it is provided that whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities are or will be given for recovering or apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the territories of any foreign power, Her Majesty may by Order in Council stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that seamen, not being slaves, who desert from merchant ships belonging to such power when within Her Majesty's dominions, shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships, and may limit the operation of such Order, and may render the operation thereof subject to such conditions and qualifications, if any, as may be deemed expedient: And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities are given for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the territories of Her Majesty the Queen of Madagascar:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said *Foreign Deserters Act 1852*, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared that, from and after the publication hereof in the *London Gazette*, seamen, not being slaves, and not being British subjects, who within Her Majesty's dominions desert from merchant ships belonging to the Kingdom of Madagascar, shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships:

Provided always, that if any such deserter has committed any crime in Her Majesty's dominions, he may be detained until he has been tried by a competent court, and until his sentence (if any) has been fully carried into effect.

And the Right Honorable the Earl of Carnarvon, the Right Honorable Viscount Cranborne, and the Right Honorable Spencer Horatio Walpole, three of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions accordingly.

THE Governor in Council has revoked so much of the Order in Council of the 10th December 1877 (*Gazette*, page 2453) as fixes the rates to be charged for water to be supplied from the aqueducts in quantities of not less than one million gallons per month, and, in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Waterworks Act* 1865, has made the following Regulation respecting the Castlemaine and Sandhurst District Water Supply, viz.:

The rate to be charged for water to be supplied from that portion of the main aqueduct situated between Malmesbury and the tunnel, at a distance of twenty-six miles from Malmesbury, known as tunnel No. 3, and from any of the branch aqueducts which diverge from such portion of the main aqueduct, shall be One halfpenny per thousand gallons for quantities of not less than one million gallons per month.

The rate to be charged for water to be supplied from any other portion of the main aqueduct, or from any other of the branch aqueducts, shall be One penny per thousand gallons for quantities of not less than one million gallons per month.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that the Governor might make and proclaim reserves for the preservation and growth of timber, and might from time to time, after one month's notice should be given in the *Government Gazette*, alter and revoke any such proclamation, and the Board of Land and Works might issue licenses to cut timber upon such reserve or any part thereof on such terms and conditions, and subject to the payment of such license fee as should from time to time be approved of by the Governor and be set forth in such license: And whereas it is expedient to diminish the timber reserve herein-after mentioned: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter and revoke the Proclamations of the timber reserve called the Grampians State Forest which bear the dates hereinafter mentioned, so far as they relate to the portion of land hereby deducted from the said timber reserve, that is to say:—

Regulation fixing the amount to be paid by persons using or carrying away Water from the Reserve for Water Supply in the town of Donald, known as the "Donald Tank."

WHEREAS by a Regulation of the Board of Land and Works made on the 6th day of December 1876, the Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud was duly appointed a Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order of 11th September 1876, as a site for water supply in the town of Donald, and hereinafter styled the "Donald Tank": Now therefore the said Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud, for the care, management, and protection of the said reserve, having framed the following regulation, submit the same to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in accordance with the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

ii. For every hogshead of water, after the first hogshead, taken away in any one day, One shilling.

iii. For each head of cattle brought to water at any one time, Threepence.

2. Every person offending against this regulation, or refusing to pay, upon demand, the fees specified therein, shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence.

ST. ARNAUD RACECOURSE AND RECREATION RESERVE.

WE, Andrew Anderson, George Powell, James Harvey, and James Jackson Wolfenden, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land reserved for Racecourse and Recreative purposes, at St. Arnaud, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management of the above-named reserve, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve is parcelled out in the following divisions:—The grand stand, the saddling paddock, the weighing yard, and judge's box; the remainder of the land reserved and enclosed including the training ground.

2. All persons shall be admitted to the second division free of charge.

3. No person shall be admitted to any race or other meeting into the first of the said divisions, nor permitted to bring any horse, carriage, or other vehicle therein excepting on production of a ticket issued by the committee of management duly authorizing him or her in that behalf.

4. No person except the judge or any person he may call to his assistance shall enter the judge's box at the time the horses are about to start or are running for any race.

5. No person shall enter the weighing yard or the approaches thereto except the jockeys requiring to be weighed.

6. The following persons shall not be admitted to the first division of the reserve:—

1st. Any person proved to the satisfaction of the committee of management to have been at any time guilty of any malpractice or dishonourable conduct in connection with racing.

2nd. Any person proved to the satisfaction of the committee of management to be a defaulter.

7. All persons paying for admission to the first of the said divisions, or any part thereof, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he or she shall upon demand produce or (if required) surrender to all gatekeepers and other persons having authority from the committee of management to demand the production of the same.

8. Persons renting or hiring from any race meeting the grand stand or any portion thereof, or any booth in the reserve, shall abide by any order given by the committee of management in reference to the reserve and the buildings and other erections for the time being thereon.

9. No person shall take any dog upon the race course.

10. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards his or her dress, language, or conduct.

11. No person shall damage in any way any trees, shrubs, or flowers at any time planted or growing in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted in the reserve.

12. No person shall climb over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, gates, trees, or slabs, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

13. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, without the authority in writing of the committee of management.

14. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the committee of management being first obtained.

15. No persons, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plot which may be enclosed within the reserve for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

16. Any person committing in the said reserve or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences, shall, together with any horses, carriages, or other vehicles in their possession or care, be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased, and is or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the first of the said divisions or any part thereof:—

1st. Assaulting any other person.

2nd. Being drunk.

3rd. Riding, crossing, or trespassing upon the course or any part of it during a race meeting, or when the horses are prepared to start, or are running for any race.

4th. Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.

5th. Using threatening, abusive, or insulting words.

6th. Behaving improperly or riotously.

7th. Being found in any part of the first of the said divisions and not producing upon demand, and (if required) not surrendering to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management to demand production of the same, a ticket duly authorizing admission to that part of the first of the said divisions where such person shall be so found, unless such person shall forthwith satisfy the committee of management, or the stewards deputed by them, that the proper charge for admission has been paid by such person, and that such person's ticket has been lost.

8th. Obtaining admission to any part of the first of the said divisions when disentitled to such admissions under these regulations.

17. The following is the scale of charges or fees which shall be levied and taken for admission to the first of the said divisions and the buildings respectively:—

1st. For admission to the first of the said divisions, for every person	2	6
2nd. For admission to the second of the said divisions, for every horse	2	0
3rd. For admission to the second of the said divisions, every vehicle drawn by one horse	2	6
4th. For admission to the second of the said divisions, for every vehicle drawn by two or more horses	3	0

Provided that the committee may exempt any member of a racing club, wholly or partially, from the payment of all or any such charges or fees, and the money so received shall (after deducting necessary expenses) be applied on the permanent improvement of the reserve for racing and recreation purposes, or in the erection, maintenance, or repairs of buildings and fences, or the planting of trees or shrubs in the reserve as shall be necessary or expedient for the purpose of rendering the same more convenient and useful for racing and recreation purposes.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1863*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a

baillif of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such baillif or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall upon conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

mouth of Murray river is derived from a Notice published by

[All bearings are magnetic. Variation 5° 30' easterly in 1877.]

SEA MOUTH OF MURRAY RIVER.—Nation bank, on the east
side of Murray river entrance, extends now 1½ cables in a
westerly direction from the base of Barker knoll.

Buoy.—A red buoy has been placed in 6 feet water to mark
the sandspit which extends from the south-east extreme of
Hindmarsh island.

Tides.—On the bar at the sea mouth of the Murray river
high tide occurs in the night or morning from September to
March; and from March to September in the day or after-
noon. Also that the time of high water only varies two hours
from the time observed on full and change days (0h. 50m.),
ranging from 1h. when the moon's age is 10 or 26 days; to 3h.
when the moon's age is 20 or 7 days.†

Semaphore.—A flagstaff has been erected on Mundoo island
from which tidal and other signals are made. The following
signals to guide vessels across the bar will be made from a
semaphore affixed to the flagstaff.—

The arm pointing to the eastward means port the helm, or
steer in the direction indicated.

The arm lowered, steady.

The arm pointing to the westward, means starboard the
helm, or steer in the direction indicated.

TIDAL SIGNALS.

The following signals will be shown from the flagstaff, on
vessels approaching the bar from seaward; or to those pro-
ceeding to sea, namely:—

First quarter flood.—Red flag at mast-head.
Half flood.—Red flag at mast-head; ball at east yard-arm.
Last quarter flood.—Red flag over ball at east yard-arm.
High water.—Red flag over ball at mast-head.
First quarter ebb.—Blue flag at mast-head.
Half ebb.—Blue flag at mast-head; ball at west yard-arm.
Last quarter ebb.—Blue flag over ball at west yard-arm.
Low water.—Blue flag over ball at mast-head.

As it frequently happens that owing to freshets and other
causes, the tide rises without the stream setting over the bar
from seaward, the following signals in such cases will be made,
viz.:—

Instead of one ball with the flood tide signals, two will be
used.

Bar dangerous.—When the bar is dangerous, and should not
be approached, a blue flag over a red flag will be hoisted at
the mast-head.

Information relating to the state of the channel and bar
should be obtained at Goolwa or Mundoo island before pro-
ceeding to sea.

Directions.—Masters of vessels acquainted with the entrance,
having taken all requisite precautions, should steer towards
it; but before shoaling the water to less than 5 fathoms (if
the bar be not quite smooth) it would be advisable to keep the
vessel in that position, in order to observe if the rollers break
with sufficient force to endanger the steering; being satisfied
that the condition of the bar is safe, steer in, promptly fol-
lowing the signals from the semaphore.

Having passed Barker knoll (where the channel is only
about half a cable wide) and proceeding up Goolwa channel,
leave the red buoy off the south-west extreme of Hindmarsh
island on the starboard hand.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA.—REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE JETTY AT ALBANY, K. G. SOUND.

1. No ship, vessel, or boat shall be fastened to any part of the public jetty at Albany, except to the main piles or to such ring-bolts, buoys, or other fastenings as may be provided for the purpose; and no vessel or boat shall lie alongside of such jetty unless so fastened, and then only while loading or unloading.
2. All ships, vessels, boats, or flats, of what description soever, so fastened, shall also be anchored in such a way as to relieve the jetty as much as possible from the weight of such craft, and in case of rough weather must haul off to their anchor, and the masters or owners thereof will be responsible for any damage done to such jetty by any such craft.
3. No vessel or boat shall be so fastened, except for the purpose of loading or of unloading, or for any longer period than may reasonably be required for such purposes.
4. Passenger boats only shall be allowed alongside the steps of such jetty, and then for no longer period than may be required to embark or disembark the passengers and their personal luggage.
5. All goods must be removed from the jetty within twenty-four hours after being placed thereon, and while permitted to remain must be so placed as not to obstruct the free passage of foot passengers.
6. No gunpowder or other explosive article as defined in 35 Victoria, No. 5, may be left on the jetty without being in charge of a keeper, and well covered with a tarpaulin.
7. No cargo shall be landed upon or shipped from the jetty on Sundays, except in cases of emergency, the permission of a magistrate being first obtained.
8. No substance of any kind whatsoever may be thrown into the water from the jetty or the boats alongside thereof.
9. No fire shall be made on or near the said jetty.
10. No goods of any kind shall be handed over or under the rails of the said jetty; and vessels or boats shall only take in or discharge cargo, firewood, or other goods at the appointed places on such jetty.
11. The trucks, rails, cranes, &c., in and upon the said jetty are in charge of the duly appointed servants of the municipality of Albany, for the use of the public, subject to the following tolls or dues, viz. :—

Wool, per bale	0	2
Sandalwood, at per ton of 20 cwt.	0	3
Firewood, per cord	0	3
Landing and trucking, per ton as per contract price, to be tendered for yearly.		

But these charges may at any time be altered by a vote of the Municipal Council, such alteration being duly approved by His Excellency the Governor.

EXEMPTIONS.

All goods or stores belonging to the Government, the Governor, or the Municipal Council, shall be free of duty.

12. The consignee, shipper, or owner of cargo, goods, or merchandise shall within (7) seven days furnish the chairman of the council with a statement of the quantity of cargo, goods, or merchandise taken on board, or landed, from any ship or vessel, and such consignee, shipper, or owner of such goods shall within (7) seven days, or immediately if demanded, pay to the collector of the council all tolls or dues payable thereon.

13. No person or persons are allowed to fish from or clear fish upon the said jetty, or commit any nuisance from or upon the same, and no children are allowed to be upon the said jetty at such times when cargo is being landed or shipped, unless such shall be over twelve years of age, or in charge of their parents or guardians.

14. The municipality of Albany will not hold themselves responsible for any loss or damage whatever which may occur in landing or shipping goods or luggage.

15. When cargo boats shall contain goods the property of more than one person, the said goods must be landed and conveyed over the jetty as they leave the ships or boats.

16. No greater weight shall be raised or hoisted with any crane belonging to the jetty than the weights respectively marked or painted thereon.

CONDITIONS OF TENDER.

1. Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and may be forwarded (if by post, prepaid) addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for the Conveyance of Mails" endorsed on the cover, or placed in the tender-box at the General Post Office.

2. Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers as below the mail services for which they tender. Such numbers to be stated in the tender itself and endorsed on the cover enclosing the tender.

3. Every tender will be taken to include the entire service as called for. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM FOR ONE or THREE YEARS in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being completed.

7. The money deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts but not otherwise.

8. In the event of a portion of railway affecting any particular service being opened for traffic during period of contract, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the place of departure for the mail coaches shall be altered in such way as the Postmaster-General may from time to time direct; a ratable reduction shall be made in the amount paid for the service as then rendered by the contractors, such reduction to be computed on the basis of the average mileage rate of the lump tender or the average mileage rate of the single tender, in whichever form the tender may be accepted.

9. Persons tendering are requested to state the description of the vehicle they intend to use, and the number of horses by which it is to be drawn.

10. A separate tender must be sent in for each service; but notwithstanding this condition, any offer will be entertained for the performance of any number of services for a lump sum.

5. Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small, will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations and all charges except the bags, which will remain the

property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied, the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractors' expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender, it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Telegrams will not be entertained.

Tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet and of the best description; chaff to be made from oatens hay of the best quality.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses be required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desire it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

4. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

5. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

6. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

7. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 5.

8. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 5.

9. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such neglect, not exceeding £20, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

11. BYE-LAWS OF THE HORSHAM DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

Incorporated under Act 27 Vic. No. 220.

OBJECT.

1. The object of the institution is to afford medical and surgical aid to poor persons requiring it, irrespective of country, color, or creed, and for casualties; but no person who shall meet with casualties and be found able to pay for aid elsewhere shall receive further than temporary assistance.

2. The institution shall consist of a president, two vice-presidents, treasurer, governors, and contributors, who shall be deemed the contributors for the time being.

QUALIFICATIONS AND PRIVILEGES OF GOVERNORS AND CONTRIBUTORS.

3. The following shall be the qualifications and privileges of governors and contributors:—

£20, personal contribution in one year, life governor;
 £10, layman collecting in one year, annual governor;
 £10, society, association, or company in one year, to entitle to nominate annual governor;
 £1 yearly subscription, contributor, entitled to sit on committee;

with power to recommend patients according to the under-mentioned scale:—

Life governor: 1 in-patient or 3 out-patients yearly.
 Annual governor: 1 in-patient and 3 out-patients yearly.
 Contributors: 1 in-patient and 3 out-patients annually for each £1 subscription.

4. Annual subscriptions must be paid in advance for the current year, such year to be computed from the day on which such subscription is paid, and no governor or contributor will be entitled to any privilege until the subscription be paid.

5. Life and annual governors and contributors of £1 and under £5 per annum, shall be entitled to one vote; contributors of £5 and under £10 per annum, two votes; contributors of £10 and upwards per annum, three votes, at all meetings of governors and contributors.

6. No person shall vote as a governor or contributor while he is a salaried officer or pupil of the hospital, nor any new governor or contributor unless his subscription shall have been made one month previously.

7. At all meetings of contributors, the president or one of the vice-presidents, or the treasurer, as the case may be, shall take the chair, but in their absence the meeting shall choose its own chairman, who shall have a casting vote only.

8. The annual meeting of contributors to the hospital shall be held on the second Thursday in the month of January in every year for the following purposes:—

(1.) The election of the president, vice-presidents, treasurer, honorary medical officers, and two auditors for the ensuing year.

(2.) The election of members of the committee of management.

(3.) The transaction of any other business of which due notice has been given or that may arise at such meeting.

9. At all general meetings of contributors twelve shall constitute a quorum, and as soon as a quorum is present the chair will be taken, but if no quorum is present within half an hour of the time named, such meeting shall stand adjourned for the following week at the the same day and hour.

10. It shall be competent for the committee of management, or any twelve or more contributors, by a writing under their hands, to require the secretary to summon a special meeting of contributors, the occasion of calling such meeting being specified in the requisition; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned. Every such meeting shall be called by the secretary.

11. All elections, where contested, shall be by ballot.

COMMON SEAL.

12. The common seal of the corporation shall be kept with the bankers of the hospital, in a box with two different locks and keys, one of which shall be kept by the president and the other by the secretary.

13. The common seal shall not be affixed to any deed or other instrument except by order of the committee of management, at a meeting at which a quorum of members at least are present.

14 and 15. Extract from Acts.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

16. The institution shall be managed by 4 president, two vice-presidents, treasurer, and twenty-seven members of committee, twelve of whom shall be residents in the country districts, and shall be elected from the contributors for the time being.

17. The committee of management shall direct the general business of the institution, frame rules for its internal regulation, and appoint and discharge all paid officers of the institution.

18. They shall meet on the second Wednesday in each month, and on such other days as they may appoint, four to form a quorum. The chairman of committee shall, in case of equality of votes, have a casting but no deliberative vote.

19. The committee of management may depute two or more of their number, who, together with the visiting surgeon, shall have full power to consider any applications, and discharge any patient who in their opinion is not a fit and proper person to receive the benefits of the institution, reporting in their minutes their reason for refusing any application or ordering any discharge.

20. No officer of the hospital shall be a contractor or become security for a contractor, directly or indirectly, nor shall any member of the committee of management be present at the discussion of, nor record his vote upon, any matter in which he is pecuniarily interested.

21. The committee of management shall present a general report of the affairs of the institution, together with a duly audited balance-sheet, to be published in one or more of the local papers at least three days before such meeting.

22. The president shall be a member *ex officio* of all committees, and the treasurer shall be a member *ex officio* of the committee of management.

HOUSE COMMITTEE.

23. The committee of management shall choose from among themselves a house committee of three, two to form a quorum, who shall attend to the internal management of the house, the admission and discharge of in-patients, the examination of all accounts presented for payment, the supervision of the collectors, dispensers, and house stewards, books, and such other matters (except the final acceptance of tenders) as may be delegated to them by the committee of management.

24. They shall retire in rotation, two at each monthly meeting of the committee of management, and their places shall be filled up by the appointment of other members of the general committee, all such appointments being made in alphabetical order.

25. They shall meet once in each week, or oftener, on such days and at such hours as they may appoint, and the honorary medical and surgical officers (if any) shall be members *ex-officio* of the house committee, and if they are not able to attend the reception of out-patients, they shall assign a reason for their absence.

26. They shall, also, once at least in each month audit the house accounts, compare the balances in the secretary's ledger

with the bank pass-book, and examine the books relating to provisions, wines and spirits, &c., kept by the house steward and dispenser respectively.

27. They shall watch the entire expenditure of the institution, and shall carefully scrutinize the monthly analysis of such expenditure, with a due regard to the number of patients in the house, reporting to the committee of management any matter of importance.

28. They shall be present (without notice), once in each fortnight, at the receipt and distribution of stores, wines, and spirits, and twice in each year shall check the balance remaining on hand of such stores, wines, and spirits, with the house-steward's and dispenser's books.

29. In all cases where vouchers are checked by them, the signature of some member of the house committee shall be appended, with the date of examination, in token of the correctness of such books or vouchers to that date.

AUDITORS.

30. The accounts of the hospital shall be verified annually by two auditors appointed for the purpose by the contributors. At such audit the accuracy of the whole accounts for the preceding year, and the balance-sheet prepared (with list of subscriptions and donations, and statement of securities for the annual meeting), shall be certified for the satisfaction of the contributors for the time being.

31. They shall specially call attention to erasures, or important alterations in any book or document, and shall report to the contributors for the time being, or to the committee, on any matters connected with the book-keeping of the institution, or otherwise within their province.

32. They shall be appointed at a general or special meeting of contributors for the time being.

HONORARY SURGEONS.

33. It shall be optional for the annual meeting of contributors, for the time being, to elect one or more honorary medical officers, who shall be legally qualified medical practitioners, and shall be elected for one year. They shall have access to the hospital at all times; they shall assist the visiting surgeon in the performance of capital surgical operations, but no such operation shall be performed without previous consultations of the medical staff, and they shall regularly consult in all cases of importance or protracted continuance in the hospital.

MEDICAL OFFICERS.

34. The institution shall be under the charge of a duly qualified medical officer, who shall arrange that the institution shall be visited at least once a day, and at such other times as may be necessary. He shall receive for his services such remuneration as the committee of management may determine.

TREASURER.

35. All moneys received on account of the hospital shall be paid to the treasurer, and be deposited by him in such bank as the committee of management may from time to time appoint.

36. On receiving any moneys from the collector he shall sign the collector's acquittance book for the amount so paid to him, after first satisfying himself that the addition of the items is correct.

37. All payments shall be made by cheques, which shall be signed by the president (or a vice-president), the treasurer, and countersigned by the secretary.

38. Previously to signing a cheque for the payment of any account, the treasurer shall require a warrant signed by the chairman of the meeting at which the account was passed.

39. He shall cause to be prepared by the secretary, for submission to the committee at the meeting in each month, a progress balance-sheet, in prescribed form, showing the actual position of the hospital funds on the previous Monday, with an estimate of the surplus or deficiency at the end of the financial year; such balance-sheet to be signed by him, and be laid on the table by the secretary with the bank certificate or pass-book made up to the same date.

SECRETARY AND COLLECTOR.

40. The secretary and collector shall keep the minutes, accounts, and records of the hospital; compile all reports, conduct the correspondence, attend all meetings, and bring all business before the same; carry out their resolutions, and perform all clerical duties that may be ordered by the committee of management.

41. He shall collect subscriptions and all money due to the hospital; in all cases give a receipt for the same, and pay to the treasurer, at least once in every week, all money he may have received, and render an account of the same to the committee of management. He shall furnish security from a public company to such an amount as the committee may deem necessary.

PATIENTS.

42. Members of committee and honorary professional staff shall have a discretionary power of recommending both in-patients and out-patients, subject to the committee. Accidents and cases of decided emergency shall be admitted at any time, and in ordinary cases patients shall be admitted daily (Sundays excepted) at such hours as may be appointed by the committee.

43. No pregnant female (for the purpose of confinement), no child under five years of age (unless suffering from serious injury, or for the purpose of undergoing a surgical operation, or in case of accident), no insane person, no person afflicted with primary syphilis, or suffering from chronic paralysis, nor

any person who, in the opinion of one of the medical or surgical officers and visiting surgeon, or of the committee, is unsuitable to be admitted, shall be received as an in-patient under any circumstances.

44. Any person wishing to be received into the hospital, and being in a position to pay for medical aid, may be admitted with the sanction of the house committee. He shall be charged Ten shillings per day (or a smaller sum if deemed expedient by the committee); and in the event of any operation being performed, a fee shall be paid by him to the hospital; the amount of such fee to be decided by the medical officers, but in no case shall it exceed Five guineas.

45. Patients quitting the hospital at their own desire shall sign a declaration to that effect before leaving.

46. In the event of any person in a position to pay for medical or surgical advice elsewhere being detected in the receipt of the charity of the institution, such person, if an in-patient, shall be liable to be prosecuted, and shall be charged at the rate of Ten shillings (10s.) per day for each day from the date of admission; or, if an out-patient, he may also be prosecuted, and shall be charged the sum of Ten shillings (10s.) for each occasion upon which he shall have consulted the visiting surgeon; and the committee may order the removal of any such person from the hospital, provided the case is not one of emergency.
