LIGHT-VESSEL OFF CHANNEL ROCK, CAPE MELVILLE.

On and after this date, a light will be exhibited from a light-vessel, moored in 14 fathoms, in the following position, viz.:—

Channel Rock, S. ½ W.
Pipon Island Reef Beacon, E. ½ N.

The light, which is dioptric, is at an elevation of 35 feet above the water, and should be visible from the deck of a small craft about 10 miles.

Vessels in rounding the cape will pass to the northward and eastward of the light-vessel.

NEW HERRIDES.—PORT RESOLUTION, ISLAND OF TANNA.

CAPTAIN KILGOUR, of the *Stanley*, schooner, reports that the formation of Port Resolution has been considerably altered by the effects of an earthquake, which took place at 7 a.m. on the 10th of January, and which was followed by a wave said to have been some 20 feet in height. The shock lasted about half a minute, throwing down—according to the report of Mr. Neilson, the missionary—about 40 acres of the high land forming the North Head. From the rocks on the north-west side of the entrance to the large shelving rock, immediately opposite the Missionary's house, Captain Kilgour found no change to interfere with the navigation; but the rock itself appeared to have been raised about 10 feet, and a long ledge of coral rock, extending from it S. by E. about 50 yards, thrown up above high water, thereby narrowing the harbor to that extent, just above what was formerly the best anchorage. He further states that the harbor now presents a

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totally different appearance to that shown on the charts and described in the sailing directions, the principal changes having taken place on the western shore, while the depth of water in the port has shoaled about a fathom.

Vessels are cautioned to be very careful, if leaving the mid-channel, and not to proceed further up the harbor than Missionary's Point.

SHOAL, TRINITY BAY.

THE position of the shoal reported by Captain Saunders, of the s.s. *Alexandra*, and of which a notice was published from this office on the 16th November last, having been examined by Lieut. Connor, R.N., the officer in charge of the Admiralty Survey, the supposed danger has been found to be the north-east extremity of the main reef, which lies in the following position, viz.:—

North extremity of Island Point ... N.W. by W. ½ W.
Round Hill ... S. by W. westerly

Vessels passing along the coast will be clear of this danger while keeping the two remarkable hills denoted on the chart as 2652 and 2710 feet in height respectively, and lying south-west of Cape Grafton, open to the north-east of Double Island; while vessels going to or from Port Douglas will clear it by keeping the hill denoted as 1757 feet in height open to the north-east of Island Point.

LAKE BULOKE COMMON.—Nine thousand eight hundred acres, more or less, county of Borung, parish of Witchipool: Commencing at a point on the western margin of Lake Buloke where it would be intersected by the prolongation eastwards of the north boundary of allotment 1 of section 12: thence north-easterly by the southern boundary of the Water and Timber reserve to the eastern margin of the said lake; thence southerly by that margin to the north boundary of the Banyenong East pre-emptive section; thence west and south by that section to the southern margin of the aforesaid lake; and thence by the southern and western margin of that lake to the point of commencement.—(78.C.13968.)

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might from time to time make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette* and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the Shire of Korong has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order re-subdivide the Shire of Korong into three several subdivisions, the boundaries whereof shall be as follow, that is to say:—

CONDITIONS OF TENDER.

1. Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and may be forwarded (if by post, prepaid) addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for the Conveyance of Mails" endorsed on the cover, or placed in the tender-box at the General Post-Office.

2. Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers as below, the mail services for which they tender. Such numbers to be stated in the tender itself and endorsed on the cover enclosing the tender.

3. Every tender will be taken to include the entire service as called for. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM FOR ONE OR THREE YEARS in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being completed.

7. The money deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts, but not otherwise.

8. 4. Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.
