### PROCLAMATION

NAVIGATION OF THE WEST CHANNEL.—PORT PHILLIP BAY.  
SHOAL, NEAR SWAN SPIT PILE LIGHT.

PILOTS, masters of vessels, and others are informed that a sandy knoll is forming to the southward of the Swan Spit Pile Light.

The northern edge of the shoal bears S. by E. ½ E. (magnetic) from the Pile light, and is distant from it about 1½ cables. It is about one cable in length trending S.E. ½ S. towards No. 4 Buoy. The shoalest part is at its south-eastern extremity, where there are only 14½ feet at low water; there are 17 feet over the northern part of it.

A chequered buoy will be placed over the shoalest part. There is a passage with from 18 to 20 feet between this knoll and the Pile light.

At night vessels will be guided as to their proximity to this shoal by the change of the color of the Pile light on the N. by W. ½ W. bearing, with the high light bearing S.W. by W. ½ W.

## REGULATIONS RELATING TO TIMBER CUTTING, ETC.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *The Land Act 1869*, section 110, the Governor in Council has rescinded the conditions dated 16th August 1877, relating to regulations made under the said Act, and has made the subjoined schedule of conditions in lieu thereof, viz.:-

## CONDITIONS.

1. No tree of less diameter than eighteen inches shall be felled.
2. No greater number of trees shall be felled than is required for the current supply of the mill.
3. All trees felled and not delivered at the mill, at the expiry of the license, shall revert to the Crown.
4. No tree on the block under license shall be used merely for the purpose of obtaining bark therefrom.
5. The licensee shall protect saplings and young seedling indigenous trees, and neither he nor any other person shall depasture goats on the block under license to him, or cultivate any part of such block.
6. The license fee, amounting to pounds shillings and pence, shall be paid in advance on to the Receiver and Paymaster at , or to any other officer who may be authorized by the Board to receive the same.
7. The license shall be produced by the holder thereof when asked so to do by any bailiff of Crown lands, or police constable.

The births of 682 children, viz., 340 boys and 342 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of February. In the month of January 719 births were registered, or 37 more than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in February numbered 455, viz., 243 of males and 212 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 227. The deaths were less than those registered in January by 82, but exceeded the average of February during the previous ten years by 28. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than the average of those ten years by 38.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 91°3' on the 22nd, and the lowest was 48°1' on the 24th. The mean temperature of the month (65°8') was a fraction above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (34°9') took place on the 21st, viz., from a maximum of 86°1' to a minimum of 51°2'. The least range (5°5') was on the 5th, viz., from a maximum of 60°5' to a minimum of 57°0'. The mean daily range was 17°4'. The mean atmospheric pressure (29'946 inches) was slightly above the average.

Eighteen deaths of persons who had attained the age of 75 years were recorded during the month, viz.:—A carrier, aged 75, of heart disease; a male of occupation unknown, aged 77, of pneumonia; a watchman, aged 78, of gallstone; a gentleman, aged 79, of pneumonia; two females, aged respectively 80 and 82, of apoplexy; a gentleman, aged 84, of liver disease; a laborer, aged 84, and a female, aged 86, of dysentery; a male, aged 88, of bronchitis; a carpenter, aged 76, a carpenter, aged 82, a pensioner, aged 94, and five females, aged respectively 79, 80, 82, 90, and 104, of old age.

Seventeen violent deaths occurred during the month, 12 of which are set down to accident, 4 to suicide, and 1 to homicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A groom, aged 16, and a farmer, aged 61, died of internal injuries resulting from the kicks of horses; a coachsmith, aged 33, died of injury to the spine received by diving in shallow water; a female child, aged 1 month, was suffocated in bed; a carter, aged 27, died of the effects of chloroform; an hotelkeeper, aged 56, was suffocated by food; a male child, aged 1½, a boy, aged 11, a seaman, aged 21, a male, aged 38, of occupation unstated, a merchant, aged 43, and a tailor, aged 54, were drowned. The suicidal deaths were those of a schoolboy, aged 15, who laid himself under the wheels of a railway train; of a girl, aged 19, who drowned herself; of a female, aged 36, who hanged herself whilst of unsound mind; and a mining speculator, aged 58, who poisoned himself with laudanum. The homicidal death was that of a newly-born male child, who died of "injuries wilfully inflicted."

Sixty-nine deaths, or 15 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—31 in the Melbourne Hospital, 8 in the Immigrants' Home, 1 in the Children's Hospital, 10 in the Alfred Hospital, 4 in the Lying-in Hospital, 5 in the Benevolent Asylum, 1 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Pentridge Stockade, and 8 in the Melbourne Industrial School.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 238, of which 123, or 52 per cent., were of males; and 115, or 48 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 168 were under one year of age, 46 were between one and two, 10 were between two and three, 8 were between three and four, and 6 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 217. Of these, 120, or 56 per cent., were males, and 97, or 44 per cent., were females; 8 were between five and ten, 4 were between ten and fifteen, 17 were between fifteen

and twenty, 18 were between twenty and twenty-five, 21 were between twenty-five and thirty, 13 were between thirty and thirty-five, 15 were between thirty-five and forty, 23 were between forty and forty-five, 20 were between forty-five and fifty, 14 were between fifty and fifty-five, 15 were between fifty-five and sixty, 11 were between sixty and sixty-five, 9 were between sixty-five and seventy, 8 were between seventy and seventy-five, 6 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 12 were upwards of eighty.

Under the head zymotic diseases most of the complaints were less fatal in the month under review than they were in the previous one. Thus, diarrhoea caused 71 deaths against 75; whooping cough 9 against 16; scarlatina, 3 against 10; and diphtheria, 3 against 11. On the other hand, deaths from typhoid fever increased from 24 to 45. Under the head developmental diseases, 10 deaths were set down to old age against 8 in the former month, and 33 deaths to atrophy and debility against 35. Under constitutional diseases, deaths from phthisis fell from 42 in January to 31 in the month under review.

When shins of beef form a portion of the supply, a fair proportion of the bone, not less than ten inches, must have been cut off. The sticking pieces must be removed from the fore quarters of beef.

5. Potatoes to be dry and free from dirt. Contractors to supply 105 lbs. of potatoes for each cental credited to them, and, in addition, to take back all rejected before being cooked.

6. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department concerned.

7. The order issued by the head of department must accompany the goods, and the account is to be rendered simultaneously with the delivery of the supplies. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the person to whom the rations are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department, or officer in charge of the station, will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 8.

12. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report of the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government to terminate the contract forthwith.

13. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

14. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board on behalf of the Government, or the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months; it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the contract is made. It will also be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board to terminate the contract, without notice, on infringement of condition No. 13, or should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate improperly with a prisoner.

15. In the event of any alteration in the tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government, or the contractor, as may be the case, will make a proportionate allowance by way of deduction from or increase of the price of the item so affected.

16. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts made by the Imperial Commissariat, or on account of other Governments; or by the consumption of the produce or surplus stock of any Government establishment; or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment.

4. Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. ##### CONDITIONS OF TENDER.

1. Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any postoffice in the colony, and may be forwarded (if by post, prepaid) addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for the Conveyance of Mails" endorsed on the cover, or placed in the tender-box at the General Post Office.

2. *Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender. Such numbers to be stated in the tender itself and endorsed on the cover enclosing the tender.*

3. *Every tender will be taken to include the entire service as called for. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM FOR ONE OR THREE YEARS in words as well as figures.*

4. Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being completed.

7. The money deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts, but not otherwise.

8. In the event of a portion of railway affecting any particular service being opened for traffic during period of contract, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the place of departure for the mail coaches shall be altered in such way as the Postmaster-General may from time to time direct; a ratable reduction shall be made in the amount paid for the service as then rendered by the contractors, such reduction to be computed on the basis of the average mileage rate of the lump tender or the average mileage rate of the single tender, in whichever form the tender may be accepted.

9. Persons tendering are requested to state the description of the vehicle they intend to use, and the number of horses by which it is to be drawn.

10. A separate tender must be sent in for each service; but notwithstanding this condition, any offer will be entertained for the performance of any number of services for a lump sum.

11. The tender of any person failing to comply with the foregoing conditions will not be entertained.

12. The general conditions referred to in the printed form of tender, and upon which the tender is to be made, can be inspected by persons proposing to tender, either at the General Post Office or at any post office in the colony.

## CITY OF SANDHURST.

## REGULATION No. 11.

*A regulation of the City of Sandhurst, made under section 14 in the second subdivision of part 8 of the 13th schedule to "The Local Government Act 1874," in force in the said city by virtue of a bye-law of the above-named city, numbered 1, for licensing (where the council are empowered to license) and for registering and inspection of all private slaughter-houses; for appointing the fees for licenses and registration; for preventing cruelty in such slaughter-houses, and for keeping the same in a cleanly and proper state; and for removing the filth at least once in every 24 hours, and requiring them to be provided with a sufficient supply of water.*

IN pursuance of "The Local Government Act 1874," the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Sandhurst make the regulation following:—

1. 3. That every such private slaughter-house or place so licensed or registered as aforesaid shall, while any slaughtering shall be going on therein, and at all other reasonable times, be open to the inspection of the inspector of abattoirs and slaughter-houses and of cattle intended to be slaughtered appointed or hereinafter to be appointed for the said city.

4. That at the time of the application for a license under clause 1 of this regulation the applicant shall pay for every such license to the town clerk of the said city, at the office of the said council, the sum of Twenty-one shillings.

5. That the fee to be paid on application for registration under clause 2 of this regulation shall be Twenty-one shillings.

6. That at all times when and so long as any cattle shall be confined and kept in any such slaughter-house or place, such cattle shall be supplied with and allowed to drink a sufficient quantity of good and wholesome water, and buckets, troughs, or other proper implements and appliances for carrying out this requirement shall be kept in every such slaughter-house and place.

7. That the licensee of every slaughter-house and the owner or occupier of any place so registered as aforesaid, shall keep the same, or cause the same to be kept in a cleanly and proper state and shall provide and lay on to such slaughter-house or place a sufficient supply of water for that purpose, and have there the necessary appliances for using the same in an effectual manner, and shall remove or cause to be removed at least once in every twenty-four hours, all filth, offal, and refuse from every such slaughter-house or place; and the requirements and provisions of this section and the last preceding section of this regulation may, by the said council, be required to be carried out and observed by such licensee, owner, or occupier under the inspection of the said inspector of abattoirs and slaughter-houses, and to the satisfaction of such inspector.
