PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGOUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

MY LORD,—I have the honor to inclose copy of a note dated the 22nd instant, but which only reached my hand this day, addressed to me by the Federal Council denouncing the Extradition Treaty of the 31st March—28th November, between Great Britain and Switzerland.

The reasons amongst others, given for this step, are the melancholy results of the demand made for the extradition of Alfred Thomas Wilson.

The Federal Council declares itself ready to enter into negotiations with Great Britain for a new treaty, in which article III. of the present treaty should be revised and other emendations introduced, and expresses the desire that the negotiations should take place at Berne.

I have informed the Federal Council, in answer to this communication, that I had immediately forwarded copy of it to your Lordship.

Les tristes expériences qui ont été faites à l'occasion de la demande d'extradition présentée contre le nommé Alfred Thomas Wilson prouvent de voir d'objets postaux pour une valeur d'environ fr. 50,000 ont convaincu le Conseil fédéral suisse de la nécessité de reviser le traité d'extradition conclu en 1874 entre la Suisse et la Grande Bretagne.

LANDING DEPOT AT CALCUTTA FOR IMPORTED HORSES.

NOTIFICATION.

With a view to assist shippers of horses, and to save the risk and expense which has been hitherto incurred in landing and stabling horses imported to Calcutta, it is notified for general information that the Government of India have authorized arrangements being made at the Government Remount Depot, 13 Garden Reach, for the reception of horses arriving from Australia under the terms laid down in the following rules and regulations.

In such cases as may appear necessary, the Government of India are also prepared to advance the amount of freight required to clear the consignment of horses from the ships, together with captain's and other fees connected with the voyage. Such advances to be recovered from the shippers on payment by the Remount Agent of the value of horses purchased by him.

Rules and Regulations.

1. Every shipper landing any horse or horses at the Government Remount Landing Depot, Garden Reach, Calcutta, shall be subject to the rules hereinafter detailed, and to any such directions as the Remount Agent, Calcutta, may give regarding the horses stabled in Government stables, and every shipper shall sign an agreement on landing to this effect, and that he will not remove any horse or horses without the special leave of the Remount Agent.

2. Every horse landed at the Government Remount Landing Depot shall be subject to a charge of Rs. 10 per horse.

In return for this charge the horses will be stabled in the depot until presented for approval to the Remount Agent.

3. The actual cost of landing the horses and surplus forage remaining at the end of the voyage will be borne by the shipper. The work will be carried out in the most economical way possible, the shipper and his assistants performing their due share of the work.

4. The shippers may, if they wish it, feed their horses on the remainder of the forage put on board their ship for the voyage. Grain, bedding, and fodder will be supplied, as required, under instructions from the Remount Agent, to be paid for by the shipper at such rate as will cover the total cost of such supplies.

5. Syces and the necessary native establishment will be provided by the Remount Agent, as required, and the shipper will be charged at the actual rate for wages of such establishment.

6. Veterinary attendance will be given by the Assistant Remount Agent, free, and medicine supplied at actual cost rates.

7. Horses landed at the Remount Landing Depot will be inspected with a view to purchase as soon as the Remount Agent considers them fit for inspection. Horses which have not been landed at the Government Landing Depot will not be inspected until all the horses awaiting inspection in the Landing Depot stables have been submitted for the approval of the Remount Agent.

8. All horses not selected by the Remount Agent for Government must be removed from the Government Landing Depot within four days after the completion of the Remount Agent's inspection on behalf of the Government.

9. No horse is to be removed from the Government Landing Depot without the permission of the Remount Agent.

10. Should the stables at the Government Landing Depot be insufficient to accommodate all the horses landed at one time, horses shall be selected from the first arrivals and be removed to the Remount Depot at Ballygunge to await inspection of the Remount Officer. Such removal is to be at the risk of the shipper, and the horses are to stand at the Ballygunge Remount Depot on the same terms in every respect as if they were at the Landing Depot at Garden Reach.

11. All charges of every kind whatsoever against the shipper will be recovered from him on payment being made for the remounts selected for Government by the Remount Agent.

THE lighthouse which has been for some time past in course of erection on the Little Basses Rocks, off the S.E. coast of Ceylon, being now nearly completed: Notice is hereby given that it is intended to exhibit the light therefrom on or about the 25th March next.

Mariners are to observe that the Little Basses light will give two white flashes in quick succession every minute, showing all around the horizon at an elevation of 110 feet above the sea, and visible in clear weather at a distance of about 16½ miles.

In thick and foggy weather a bell will be sounded twice in quick succession every half-minute.

Great Basses Fog Signal.

Notice is also given that, at the same time, the character of the fog signal at the Great Basses lighthouse will be altered, and that the bell will thenceforth be sounded in thick and foggy weather once every fifteen seconds.

Further notice will be issued when the light is exhibited and the alteration in the fog signal is made.

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything therein before contained the Governor might by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the Proclamation hereinafter mentioned as to certain lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do hereby revoke the Proclamation bearing date the third day of September One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, whereby the cutting, digging, or removing of live red gum timber from the Crown lands comprising the Gunbower State Forest and the Murrabit Timber Reserve was prohibited, so far as it relates to the Murrabit Timber Reserve.—(78.A.7431.)

COONGULMERANG COMMON.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE COONGULMERANG COMMON.

WHEREAS, by regulations made by the Governor in Council, under *The Land Act 1869*, the council of every shire in which any common is situate are appointed managers of such common, and empowered to frame rules and regulations for its management, and submit the same to the Board of Land and Works: Now, therefore, the Council of the Shire of Bairnsdale hereby submit the following regulations for the management of the Coongulmerang Common:—

1. In the construction and for the purposes of these regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules, and the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.

2. Persons entitled to commonage will be permitted to depasture, on payment of fees, according to the following scale:—

Four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him, may depasture one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of land cultivated by him.

3. The fees to be paid for depasturing on the common shall be as follows:—

a. For every horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule, per annum ... Six shillings.
b. For every cow, heifer, ox, steer, or calf, per annum ... Four shillings.
c. For every head of small cattle, per annum ... Three shillings.

4. No cattle shall be considered as registered unless the above fees are paid at the time of entering their brand or other distinguishing mark and description by the herdsman, and all fees must be paid half-yearly in advance, the licenses dating from the first day of May and the first day of November in each year.

5. No fees will be charged for the progeny of registered cattle which, in the opinion of the manager or herdsman, are under six months old. No bulls or entire horses will be allowed to depasture on the common without the special consent of the managers.

6. All large and small cattle shall have a distinguishing brand on them, and all horned cattle shall be marked with the common brand.

7. The herdsman will attend at the common yards every Monday from Nine a.m. to Three p.m. to register and brand all cattle brought to him, and in the performance of this duty the owners are required to assist.

8. It will be the herdsman's duty to see all cattle under his care every alternate day; the managers will not, however, be responsible for any cattle depasturing on the common, but the herdsman is required to give immediate notice to owners when he becomes aware of their cattle having strayed from off the common; neither do the managers hold themselves responsible for any neglect or irregularity on the part of the herdsman.

9. The herdsman will be authorized to impound all cattle, sheep, pigs, and goats trespassing on the common; and the entries of all impoundings shall be kept in a book for that purpose, so that all damages and fees accruing from that source may be accounted for.

10. No person will be allowed to remove any cattle from the common without giving at least twelve hours' notice to the herdsman, and no person will be allowed to disturb or remove any cattle unless the herdsman is present.

11. The managers reserve to themselves the right to cause to be removed from the common any cattle suspected of contagious diseases.

12. Persons desirous of registering cattle shall sign a description of such cattle, describing all brands and other distinguishing marks in the form of Schedule 24 appended to the regulations made by the Governor in Council under *The Land Act 1869*. The herdsman shall give to each person registering a receipt for all money paid on account of the depasturing of any cattle, and shall hand over all such money to the shire treasurer within three days of its receipt.

13. At the request of the person registering, the herdsman may register and brand elsewhere than at the common branding yard, in which case an additional fee of One shilling per head for one beast, and Sixpence per head for two or more, will be made.

14. The general mustering of cattle shall take place in the first week in May and the first week in November in each year, the three first days in each of these weeks to be for horses, the remainder for neat and small cattle. Cattle thus mustered for registration shall, if not registered and paid for, be impounded on the third of the respective days set apart for such musters.

15. The managers are empowered to set apart a portion of the common for the grazing of sheep.

16. Persons removing cattle will be allowed to substitute others upon payment of a registration fee of One shilling per head.

17. Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

SHIRE OF SOUTH BARWON.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE CONNEWARRE FARMERS' COMMON WITHIN THE SHIRE OF SOUTH BARWON.

THE Council of the Shire of South Barwon, in pursuance of the regulations relating to commons made by the Governor in Council on the 26th May 1873, having drafted the following regulations for management of the Connewarre Farmers' Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and in lieu of the regulations for the management of the said common approved by the Governor in Council on the 20th March 1871:—

Regulations.

1. All persons entitled to depasture stock on the Connewarre Farmers' Common shall be permitted to do so, subject to the following regulations, and on payment of the under-mentioned fees:—

2. Every farmer and ratepayer shall be allowed to depasture on the said common four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him, may depasture on the said common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

3. No bulls or entire horses will be allowed to run on the common without special permission, in writing, from the common managers; and all goats, geese, and swine found on the common will be either impounded or destroyed.

4. The fees for pasturage shall be as follows, per quarter, payable in advance to whomsoever the managers may appoint to receive the same:—

For every head of horned cattle of any age, One shilling.

For every horse of any age, One shilling and sixpence.

For sheep of all ages, Sixpence per head.

The quarters shall commence on the first day of the months of January, April, July, and October in each year. The first seven days in each quarter will be allowed for taking out and the renewal of licenses.

5. All stock before being admitted to the common must be fire-branded or pitch-branded with the common brand; and no person shall be allowed to transfer their depasturing licenses, or to place on the common any stock not their *bona fide* property.

6. No persons shall be allowed to remove stock (except milking cows and working stock) from the common without first applying to the herdsman.

7. The herdsman shall be subject to a fine of Sixpence for every head of cattle or for every horse found on the common without being registered; and, in case of repeated neglect, may be removed from office at the discretion of the managers.

8. The herdsman shall take every possible care of all stock duly delivered into his charge; but in no case will either the common managers or the herdsman be responsible for the safe custody of any stock placed on the common.

9. All cattle found on the common affected with any contagious disease must be immediately removed by the owners on receiving notice thereof.

10. All complaints against the herdsman or the management of the common in any way must be submitted, in writing, to the Council of the Shire of South Barwon at an ordinary monthly meeting.

11. The common managers shall have full power to instruct the herdsman to sue for and recover any fees for depasturing of stock on the common.

12. The herdsman shall pay to the secretary of the shire, at the Shire Hall, Belmont, at the beginning of each month, all fees received by him during the preceding month, and shall at the same time produce his books to be audited.

13. Every person offending against any regulation for the management of the common shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

The above regulations were made and approved of by the Council of the Shire of South Barwon, on the 11th day of March 1878.

REGULATION FIXING THE AMOUNT TO BE PAID BY PERSONS USING OR CARRYING AWAY WATER FROM THE RESERVE FOR AFFORDING ACCESS TO WATER IN THE PARISH OF DOBOOBETIC, KNOWN AS "THOMPSON'S DAM."

WHEREAS by a Regulation of the Board of Land and Works, made on the third day of January 1878, the Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud was duly appointed a Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved, by Order of 10th December 1877, as a site for affording access to water, in the parish of Doboobetic, and hereinafter styled "Thompson's Dam": Now therefore the said Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud, for the care, management, and protection of the said reserve, having framed the following Regulation, submit the same to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in accordance with the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*:-

REGULATION.

1. Every person using or carrying away the water from "Thompson's Dam" Reserve shall pay therefor to any person duly appointed by the Committee of Management in that behalf, and duly authorized to demand the same, the fees hereinafter specified:-

- (i.) For one hoghead of water taken away in any one day ... Sixpence.
- (ii.) For every hoghead after the first hoghead of water taken away in any one day ... Oneshillings.
- (iii.) For each head of cattle brought to water at any one time ... Threepence.

2. Every person offending against this Regulation, or refusing to pay upon demand the fees specified therein, shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence.

CONDITIONS OF TENDER.

1. Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and may be forwarded (if by post, prepaid) addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for the Conveyance of Mails" endorsed on the cover, or placed in the tender-box at the General Post-Office.

2. Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers as below, the mail services for which they tender. Such numbers to be stated in the tender itself and endorsed on the cover enclosing the tender.

3. Every tender will be taken to include the entire service as called for. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM FOR ONE OR THREE YEARS in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to *TEN PER CENT.* of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being completed.

7. The money deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts, but not otherwise.

8. TENDERS are hereby invited, and will be received until Noon of Friday the third day of May 1878, for the Conveyance of Post Office Mails as undermentioned, for ONE or THREE YEARS from the 1st July 1878 to 30th June 1879, or 30th June 1881.

The covers of Tenders for these services must be endorsed "Tenders for Fourth Call."

CONDITIONS OF TENDER.

1. Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and may be forwarded (if by post, prepaid) addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for the Conveyance of Mails" endorsed on the cover, or placed in the tender-box at the General Post Office.

2. Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers as below the mail services for which they tender. Such numbers to be stated in the tender itself and endorsed on the cover enclosing the tender.

3. Every tender will be taken to include the entire service as called for. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM FOR ONE or THREE YEARS in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to FIVE PER CENT. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being completed.

7. The money deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts but not otherwise.

8. In the event of a portion of railway affecting any particular service being opened for traffic during period of contract, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the

place of departure for the mail coaches shall be altered in such way as the Postmaster-General may from time to time direct; a ratable reduction shall be made in the amount paid for the service as then rendered by the contractors, such reduction to be computed on the basis of the average mileage rate of the lump tender or the average mileage rate of the single tender, in whichever form the tender may be accepted.

9. Persons tendering are requested to state the description of the vehicle they intend to use, and the number of horses by which it is to be drawn.

10. A separate tender must be sent in for each service; but notwithstanding this condition, any offer will be entertained for the performance of any number of services for a lump sum.





