HIGH COMMISSIONER AND CONSUL-GENERAL FOR THE WESTERN PACIFIC.

THE Governor has received the subjoined Despatch (with its enclosure) from His Excellency the Honorable ARTHUR HAMILTON GORDON, K.C.M.G., the Governor of Fiji, &c., Her Majesty's High Commissioner and Consul-General for the Western Pacific.

His Excellency the Governor of Fiji to His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

Nasova, Fiji,
20th March 1878.

Sir,

I have the honour to inform Your Excellency that Her Majesty the Queen has been pleased to appoint me Her High Commissioner and Consul-General for the Western Pacific, and that I have been directed by the Secretary of State for the Colonies, in a despatch bearing date the 31st December last, to communicate to you a copy of a Royal Order passed by Her Majesty in Council on the 13th August 1877 for regulating the powers and duties of the High Commissioner, and of the Court constituted by this Order in Council under the provisions of the Act 38-39 Victoria, cap. 51.

2. I am at the same time directed to offer such "explanations, being in accordance with the tenor of my instructions, as may explain" to you the proposed operation of this enactment.

3. These explanations will, I think, be best afforded by the enclosed extract from the instructions which I have had the honour to receive from the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

4. I beg to assure you that if at any time it should be in my power, in the exercise of my functions as High Commissioner, to render any assistance to the Government of Victoria, it will afford me the most sincere satisfaction to do so; and that I shall lose no opportunity of communicating to Your Excellency any information which may appear likely to be in any way interesting or useful to Your Excellency.

The Secretary of State for the Colonies to the Governor of Fiji.

(Extract from Despatch dated 19th November 1877.)

These appointments, which confer upon you very extensive power and authority, will entail upon you numerous duties which may be classed under four heads:—

First.—Relations with the Representatives of Foreign Powers established within your Consular Jurisdiction.

Second.—Relations with the semi-civilized groups of islands in the neighbourhood of Fiji where a settled form of government exists, such as the Friendly and Navigators Islands.

Third.—The regulation of the labour traffic as carried on by British subjects in the Western Pacific Ocean.

Fourth.—The maintenance of law and order among British subjects in those islands where no settled form of government exists, such as the Solomon Islands and the New Hebrides.

A copy of the Royal Order, passed by Her Majesty in Council on the 13th of August 1877, for regulating the powers and duties of the High Commissioner and of the Court constituted by such Order in Council under the provisions of the No. 44.—APRIL 26, 1878.—1.

Act of the Imperial Parliament 38-39 Victoria, cap. 51, is deposited at this office.

The said Order commenced and took effect from and after the 4th of February 1878, in pursuance of a Proclamation of the Governor of Fiji, dated and published in the *Fiji Royal Gazette* on the 2nd of February.

4. The graves to be of the proper depth.

5. In the event of the contractor failing to attend punctually to the order, the work will be otherwise performed, and the extra expense, if any, incurred will be charged to the contractor.

6. When burials are required to take place on Sunday no delay must take place in complying therewith, and any additional fees charged by the cemetery authorities will be repaid to the contractor.

7. The attendance of a minister of the denomination named in the order for the burial must, if practicable, be provided. Such order to be produced at the cemetery when the contractor gives the order for interment. The contractor must pay the minister's fee for reading the burial service, should it be claimed, and he will be reimbursed, on producing the minister's receipt, which must specify that the burial service was duly and properly performed, and that he received the fee for so doing; the receipt must also specify the name, age, and denomination of deceased, the name and denomination of the minister who performed the burial service, and the hour when the service was performed.

8. The account is to be rendered monthly to the officer ordering the service for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne. The charge for the minister's fee should be included in the account for the funeral.

9. In the event of any charge of impropriety or neglect in conducting the funerals being established against the contractor, the Government may for the first offence deduct from the security money, by way of fine, £5; and for the second offence a similar amount, and, in addition thereto, may forthwith cancel the contract.

10. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.
