PROSPECTING VOTE.—"APPROPRIATION ACT 1877-78."

IN accordance with the terms of the vote—

"To assist in the development of the mining industry by loan or otherwise, in accordance with regulations previously framed and published in the *Government Gazette*. £20,000"

it is hereby notified that sums of money from such vote will be advanced only on loan, and for the undermentioned purposes, viz. :—

(a.) The development of mines in which the proprietors are engaged in advance of other mines in prospecting for the continuation of auriferous leads or quartz lodes that have proven to be of great value.

(b.) The opening up of alluvial or quartz mines situated on known auriferous leads or lodes in which unusual difficulties have to be overcome, by reason of the great inflow of water, depth of sinking, or from any other cause.

No loan will be granted in aid of any mine unless the proprietors thereof shall be in a position to give a substantial and sufficient guarantee to the Government for the return of such loan from the first profits of the mine, after the payment of working expenses, and also an undertaking for an equal expenditure of money in approved mining operations in addition to the sums advanced.

Monies will be advanced in such instalments as may be agreed upon, and vouchers must be forwarded to the Mining Department representing the expenditure of an amount equal to the next preceding instalment, and of a similar sum on the part of the proprietary, before a further instalment shall be paid.

All applications for assistance from the vote will be submitted for the consideration and recommendation of a Board appointed for that purpose.

The births of 686 children, viz., 345 boys and 341 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of March. In the month of February 682 births were registered, or 4 less than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in March numbered 481, viz., 255 of males and 226 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 205. The deaths exceeded those in February by 26, and also the average of March during the previous ten years by 40. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been 29 less than the average of those ten years.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 96.8° on the 13th, and the lowest was 45.1° on the 18th. The mean temperature of the month (64.8°) was nearly 2° below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (41.0°) took place on the 13th, viz., from a maximum of 96.8° to a minimum of 55.8°. The least range (2.6°) was on the 15th, viz., from a maximum of 60.6° to a minimum of 58.0°. The mean daily range was 18.3°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.955 inches) was a little below the average.

Of the deaths recorded during the month 53 per cent. were of males and 47 per cent. of females. Forty-nine per cent., or nearly half, were of children under the age of 5 years, as against 49 per cent. in March 1877; 50 per cent. in March 1876; 58 per cent. in March 1875; 46 per cent. in 1874; 49 per cent. in March 1873; 55 per cent. in March 1872; 52 per cent. in March 1871; 47 per cent. in March 1870; 48 per cent. in March 1869; 61 per cent. in March 1868.

Only 8 deaths of persons of the age of 75 years or upwards were registered during the month, viz., those of a gentleman, aged 75, of phthisis; an auctioneer, aged 75, of cystitis; a general servant, aged 78, of disease of the heart; a female, aged 78, of congestion of the lungs; a female, a cooper, a gentleman, and a draper, aged 76, 78, 81, and 82 respectively, of old age.

Twenty-seven deaths from external causes were recorded during the month, of which 20 were ascribed to accident and 7 to suicide. The following are the particulars:—Two boys, aged 4 and 13 respectively, were killed by being passed over by vehicles; a carter, aged 43, died of fracture of the legs, caused by the fall of a stack of wood; a laborer, aged 45, of fracture of the shoulder, caused by a fall from a scaffold; a bricklayer, aged 55, of fracture of the spine, caused by falling from a cart; a waterman, aged 54, through being struck by the revolving paddle of a steamer; a female, aged 48, of injuries received through jumping from a vehicle; a boy, aged 6, of fracture of the leg; a carpenter, aged 59, of fracture of the femur; a boy, aged 8, of tetanus; a male child, aged 1, of sunstroke; a boy, aged 10, and a currier, aged 18, were accidentally drowned whilst bathing; a female infant, aged 1 month, was found dead, having died of suffocation; another, aged 2 months, was choked by food; a female, aged 38 was suffocated by smoke, resulting from her bedroom catching fire. Of the suicidal deaths, a storekeeper, aged 45, cut his throat; a plumber, aged 25, a male, aged 27, of occupation unstated, and a rate-collector, aged 41, poisoned themselves; a poultryer, aged 87, drowned himself; and a brickmaker and a groom, aged respectively 50 and 58, hanged themselves. All these persons were set down as laboring under insanity at the time of their committing self-destruction.

Eighty-eight deaths, or 18 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—55 in the Melbourne Hospital, 5 in the Immigrants' Home, 1 in the Children's Hospital, 11 in the Alfred Hospital, 5 in the Lying-in Hospital, 5 in the Benevolent Asylum, 2 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 2 in the Homœopathic Hospital, and 1 in the Industrial School.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 212, of which 112, or 53 per cent., were of males; and 100, or 47 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 138 were under one year of age, 49 were between one and two, 12 were between two and three, 7 were between three and four, and 6 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 269. Of these, 143, or 53 per cent., were males, and 126, or 47 per cent., were females; 13 were between five and ten, 10 were between ten and fifteen, 25 were between fifteen and twenty, 20 were between twenty and twenty-five, 16 were between twenty-five and thirty, 13 were between thirty and thirty-five, 24 were between thirty-five and forty, 33 were between forty and forty-five, 25 were between forty-five and fifty, 20 were between fifty and fifty-five, 23 were between fifty-five and sixty, 15 were between sixty and sixty-five, 14 were between sixty-five and seventy, 8 were between seventy and seventy-five, 6 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 2 were upwards of eighty.

Zymotic diseases caused 162 deaths in February and 163 in March. Seventy-five persons fell victims to diarrhoea, and 45 to typhoid fever in the former month, and 76 to diarrhoea and 47 to typhoid fever in the latter. Phthisis, tabulated as a constitutional disease, caused 54 deaths in the former month and 49 in the latter. In the month under review 6 deaths were set down to the consequences of childbirth, or 1 death of a mother to every 114 births registered.

LIGHTHOUSE, POINT MOORE, CHAMPION BAY.

A lighthouse has been erected at the extremity of Point Moore, one and a half miles south-west of Geraldton Pier, in latitude 28° 46' 52" south, and longitude 114° 35' east. The Tower (iron), round, forming the frustum of a cone, with a base of 21 feet diameter, and is painted white. The upper light is a white revolving dioptric light of the second order, with an interval of flash of 40 seconds, visible for about 18 miles from the deck of a vessel, and has a seaward range of 263°. The lower subsidiary is fixed, and is a fourth order dioptric light, with vertical prisms, so disposed as to give two

strong beams of red light; the northern arc gives a ray of 28°, the bearing of the seaward side of angle being north 30°, east (magnetic), and the southern arc shows a ray of 23°, the bearing of the seaward side of the angle being south 2° east, leading two miles outside of African Reef. The height from high water to centre of lantern is 110' 4"; the height of tower from base to vane is 114' 6", and from base to focal plane of light 101' 3".

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

LALLAT AND DUNMUNKLE COMMON.—The Lallat Common, described in a proclamation bearing date the 25th October 1875, is hereby united with the Dunmunkle Common, described in a proclamation bearing date the 7th May 1877, and the said united commons shall be designated by the name of the Lallat and Dunmunkle Common.—(78.C.13995.)

EAGLE POINT RECREATION RESERVE.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE EAGLE POINT RECREATION RESERVE.

THE Council of the Shire of Bairnsdale, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land at Eagle Point, in the parish of Bairnsdale, reserved for Public Recreation, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the above-mentioned recreation reserve, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*—

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards his dress, language, or conduct.
2. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted within the reserve, except on the immediate margin of Eagle Point Bay.
3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names or figures on the fences, seats, or trees, or otherwise deface the same, or throw stones in the reserve.
4. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, sheep, or pigs without the written permission of the Council of the Shire of Bairnsdale; and any person allowing cattle, including horses, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, oxen, heifers, bulls, steers, calves, sheep, or goats, to wander within the reserve, shall be liable to be prosecuted under the provisions of *The Land Act 1869*.
5. No person shall shoot, snare, or destroy any game within the reserve without the written permission of the Council of the Shire of Bairnsdale.
6. No person on entering or leaving the reserve shall leave the gate open and unfastened.
7. No person shall erect or occupy any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth, tent, or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission in writing of the Council of the Shire of Bairnsdale.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling for each offence; and any person who shall unlawfully and knowingly offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds sterling.

SHIRE OF WINCHELSEA.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE BIRREGURRA COMMON WITHIN THE SHIRE OF WINCHELSEA.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations for the management of commons, and in pursuance of the provisions of chapter XIII. of the regulations made under the said Act by the Governor in Council, on the 26th day of May 1873, the Council of the Shire of Winchelsea, as managers of the Birregurra Common within the said shire, submit to the Board of Land and Works for approval the following Regulations for the management of the said common:—

1. The managers shall appoint a secretary to keep the books and accounts relating to the common, and to make entries of the proceedings of the managers in such books under their superintendence; and shall appoint a herdsman to the common, who shall be responsible for the efficient carrying out of the regulations for the management of such common, and shall conform to any special instructions issued to him by the managers relative to the registration, custody, and delivery to the owners of the cattle thereon, and to the prevention of trespass thereon of animals for which no commonage fees have been paid or which are not allowed to depasture as hereinafter provided. Such herdsman shall be remunerated for his services out of the fund derived from the commonage fees.
2. The managers shall at any time, if they deem fit, have power to cancel the appointment of the secretary or herdsman and remove him from such his office. If a herdsman desires to resign his office he must give at least one month's notice in writing thereof to the managers.

3. The managers shall from time to time make rules for the time and manner of reception of cattle on the common, for their removal, and for periodical mustering and branding; they shall also issue such orders and instructions to the herdsman as they think fit and necessary for the proper management and care of the cattle depastured on the common; every such order and instruction shall be given in writing and shall be signed by the secretary.

4. All ratepayers within the shire, holders of miners' rights, business or carriers' licenses, and farmers, shall be respectively entitled to depasture on the said common, if the same be within five miles of their places of residence, four (4) head of large cattle (two horses or three head of small cattle to be equivalent to four head of horned cattle). In addition to the above any ratepayer in the shire having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him, will be allowed to depasture one additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him. In no case shall any person be allowed to depasture more than six (6) head of large cattle on the common, and every person entitled to commonage must be the *bona fide* owner of every animal depastured by him; and no person will be allowed to transfer any animal during the currency of each half-year.

5. All fees must be paid half-yearly in advance to the herdsman of the common; licenses to date from the first day of April and the first day of October in each year.

The depasturing fee shall be as follows, per each half year:—

For every horse or mare ...	Five (5) shillings.
For every head of horned cattle ...	Three (3) shillings.
For every goat or sheep ...	Two (2) shillings.

No fee will be charged for foals or calves under three months old if running with their mothers.

6. No bulls or entire horses over the age of nine months will be allowed on the common without the written sanction of the managers; and sheep shall be allowed to depasture on such portions only of the said common as may be set apart for that purpose by the managers.

7. The managers shall cause their books to be kept in the form prescribed by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of May 1873, and in each book shall be recorded the descriptions and brands of the cattle depastured on the common, the moneys received for depasturing fees, the payments made from the common's funds, and the date of such payments; and the managers shall, by their herdsman, give receipts in proper form for the fees paid for all cattle depastured or intended to be depastured on the common under the charge of such herdsman.

8. Before the herdsman of the common enters upon his duties, he shall furnish security to the satisfaction of the managers in the sum of Twenty pounds (£20) sterling.

9. The herdsman on receipt of any cattle into his charge, and after payment to him of the proper amount of depasturing fees thereon, shall, with the assistance of the owner or other person in charge, immediately pitch-brand such cattle in a plain and conspicuous manner with the common brand; and such brand shall be renewed whenever necessary, so as to become plainly legible during the whole period that such cattle are depasturing on the common.

10. The herdsman shall impound all cattle trespassing on the common whose owners are not known, travelling cattle excepted, provided that notice has been given in accordance with the Act No. 370 (Diseases of Animals).

11. No cattle duly registered in the books of the managers shall be removed from the common without and unless notice be first given to the herdsman, who shall obtain a receipt for the same from the owner.

12. The herdsman shall, on any cattle straying or being otherwise removed without the owner's consent, notify such owner thereof within ten days; and in default of giving notice within that time, if the cattle should be lost, the herdsman shall be held responsible for the loss, to be computed at a rate not exceeding Two pounds sterling per head for horses, and Two pounds sterling per head for horned cattle; such amount, when determined, shall be deducted from the herdsman's salary.

13. The herdsman of the common shall be in attendance, at a place to be named, on the seven days immediately preceding the first day of each half-year, for the purpose of registering cattle intended to be depastured, and to receive the fees thereon; due notice of such attendance, and of time and place thereof, shall be given by the managers.

14. Every person offending against any regulation for the management of the common, shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

15. The managers of the common may sue for and recover any fees for depasturing stock on such common, or any penalty for breach of regulation, for management of such common.

16. The herdsman of the common shall take the necessary steps for the effectual destruction of all thistles growing upon the common, the expenses in such work to be defrayed out of the common's fund; provided that express authority of such expenditure be first obtained from the managers.

17. The herdsman shall pay over all moneys received by him in respect of depasturing fees to the treasurer of the shire, and deliver therewith a statement of the particulars of such moneys so received.

18. The managers shall, within one month after the termination of each year publish, in a newspaper circulating in

the district where the common is situated, a certified account of the receipts and expenditure for the year, and forward copy thereof to the Board of Land and Works.

19. The herdsman shall report immediately on the indication of any contagious disease in any cattle on the common under his charge to the manager or the secretary, and shall give notice to the owner of such cattle. The managers shall at once take precautionary measures to remove such cattle from the common, but they shall not be responsible for any loss the owners of such diseased cattle may sustain.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards his or her dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, horses, goats, pigs, or sheep, nor bring any dog therein, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee of management.

6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent in writing of the committee of management first obtained.

7. No person except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve shall enter any plots which may be enclosed within the reserve for plantations of trees and shrubs.

8. Persons who may have secured the consent, in writing, of the committee of management to the erection of any structure, &c., within the reserve for special purposes, shall be bound by any order given by such committee of management in such matter.

9. It shall be competent for the committee of management to allow any part of the reserve, except that portion set apart and enclosed as a cricket ground, to be depastured by quiet stock, the proceeds of such agistment to be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve.

10. The sums chargeable upon special occasions, such as race meetings, athletic sports meetings, cricket matches, fêtes, shall be—

For admission to the stand on racecourse, not exceeding ...	10s.
For admission at the cricket ground gates, not exceeding ...	2s. 6d.

11. Any and every person offending against any of these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

KYNETON PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in them, the Trustees of the Kyneton Public Cemetery rescind the rules and regulations and make the following rules and regulations, that is to say:—

1. That all fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.

2. That any person desiring ground for a private grave or a vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, tombstone, or for any other purpose in the cemetery under the above Act, shall apply to the trustees thereof. If approved, the trustees, on the payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial in the form specified in Schedule A.

3. That any person desiring to construct a brick grave vault, or tomb, or to erect a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection in any part of the cemetery, shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a plan, design, or drawing of such with full particulars for approval.

4. That any order for interment shall be given at the cemetery nine working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made. No free interment shall be allowed without said notice.

5. That the name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of the deceased, and other particulars mentioned in Schedule C shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.

6. That the trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, under directions of the secretary, on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

7. That every coffin shall have on the lid a lead or copper plate with the name of the deceased stamped thereon.

8. That every grave shall be at least seven feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than three feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground, after such interment.

9. That no interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault, without the production of the certificate of right of burial, or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided for in the next rule.

10. That in the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault, to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given in with the order.

11. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in said cemetery without a certificate from a deputy registrar of deaths, or a coroner. Such certificate shall be delivered to the gatekeeper before the funeral enters the cemetery.

12. That the hours fixed for burials shall be as follows:—On week days—September to April inclusive, from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August inclusive, from 10 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. On Sundays throughout the year from 1 to 4 p.m.

13. That no burial shall be allowed to take place between the hours of 7 p.m. and 7 a.m., except by special permission of the trustees.

14. That the time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.

15. That every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner.

16. That any person desiring to place any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a copy thereof.

17. That any person putting up any erection or placing any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery without the permission of the trustees shall be liable to the penalties imposed by the above Act for so doing, and to be further dealt with as a trespasser.

18. That every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations (extending to the bottom of the grave when ordered). No Bath, Caen, or other soft stone shall be allowed to be used in any work. All stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed at once. Copper cramps only shall be allowed in the erection of tablets or other exposed stone work.

19. That all materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the principal entrance; and no vehicle conveying any such materials shall be permitted to enter the cemetery without the consent of the trustees first obtained.

20. That no catacomb shall be allowed.

21. That the trustees shall not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for reinterment either in said or any other cemetery.

22. That before any such exceptional case can be dealt with by the trustees, a written application setting forth the reasons

for the proposed removal, and verified by a statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased; and in the event of said application being granted the permission of the Minister administering *The Coroners Statute 1865*, and the Act numbered CCCXXVIII, in addition to that of the trustees, shall be obtained. If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and airtight coffin, prior to removal.

23. That any workman not employed by the trustees shall be under the supervision and control of the surveyor, who shall have power to regulate his hours of labor, to see that his work is completed satisfactorily and with despatch, and to remove him summarily from the cemetery upon any cause of offence.

24. That, unless otherwise ordered, the principal entrance shall be open daily from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. during the other months of the year.

25. That no child under 10 years shall be admitted into the cemetery, except in charge of a responsible person.

26. That no smoking shall be allowed within the cemetery, nor any fireworks discharged therein.

27. That no dogs shall be admitted into the cemetery.

28. That any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, or otherwise infringing the above Act, or any rule, regulation, or bye-law made for protecting the cemetery, shall be prosecuted as the law directs.

29. That no person shall be allowed to pluck or to take any flower or plant out of the cemetery.

30. That the secretary shall exercise a general supervision and control, under the trustees, over all matters pertaining to the cemetery.

31. That no person employed under the trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment from the trustees.

32. That any person so employed accepting any such gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to be summarily dismissed.

33. That licenses to grave dressers may be issued by the trustees in the form set out in Schedule B.

34. That a plan of the cemetery showing the distribution of the land, compartments, situations, and numbers of the graves, and a registry of all certificates of right of burial shall be kept at the office.

The candidate will be required to produce a reliable medical certificate of sound constitution, nor will he be admitted if affected with any physical infirmity which may in any way interfere with the efficient discharge of the duties he may be called on to perform. He will also have to send in with application, specimens of plan drawing, and, provided he possesses the qualifications specified, he will be examined in plotting and computation of trigonometric problems by logarithms.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR ADMISSION.

1st. Having completed the first and second years of the course for the certificate of engineer in the Melbourne University, and his age at time of application must not exceed 24 years.

2nd. Having completed the first year of the course for the certificate of engineer in the Melbourne University. His age at time of entry must not exceed 23 years.

3rd. Having matriculated at the Melbourne or other recognized University; after passing in Algebra, Euclid, and Arithmetic; or passed the Civil Service Examination, including the subjects above named; or produce such a certificate of competency in such subjects as shall satisfy the Board of Examiners for Authorized Surveyors. His age at time of application must not exceed 22 years, nor be less than 16 years.

PERIOD OF SERVICE.

All pupils must serve three months on probation, during which period only half salary will be paid. After probationary period, should the report of the Board of Examiners be unfavorable, the services of the pupil draftsmen will be dispensed with without further remuneration.

1st. An applicant of the first class will be required to pass eighteen months in the offices of the Lands Department as a draftsman, and eighteen months in the field under the direction of a departmental surveyor.

1st. Applicants of the first class will be paid at the rate of £52 per annum during the period of service passed in the offices of the department, and £84 during the eighteen months passed in the field.

2nd. Applicants of the second class will be paid at the rate of £52 during the eighteen months passed in the offices of the department, £60 for the first year in the field, and £84 during the last year in the field.

To obtain a certificate as qualified draftsman the applicant would have to pass the period of service as before specified; then six months in the field, the latter period at a salary of £52 per annum, and afterwards pass an examination in trigonometric computation by logarithms including areas and reduction of traverses, plotting from field-books, and their construction, including feature delineation.
