A NEW Pilot Station is now erected on the north-side entrance to the Manawatu River, and is plainly visible several miles from sea. The Colonial Tidal and Bar or Danger Signals are in use, as well as the International Code. Two moveable beacons—the seaward one painted red, and the landward one black—which can be seen 2 or 3 miles, are placed, which, kept in one, lead over the bar. At night when the bar is passable, a green light is shown on the red or seaward beacon, and a red light on the black beacon, in addition to the white light on flagstaff, which is always shown, and may be seen in clear weather 8 or 10 miles.

GRANTS FOR AGRICULTURAL AND HORTICULTURAL SOCIETIES, AND FOR PARKS AND GARDENS.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the subjoined regulations in connection with the Grant-in-Aid, 1877-8, Division No. 55, Nos. 1, 2, and 7, viz. :—

AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

1. The sum of Three hundred and ninety-one pounds (£391) shall be paid to the Wimmera District Pastoral and Agricultural Society, the same being the amount of the Government prizes awarded at the Spring Show of the said society, held at Stawell, on the 17th, 18th, and 19th October 1877, under the auspices of the Department of Agriculture.

2. The balance then remaining on the vote, viz., Six thousand six hundred and nine pounds (£6609) shall be divided among the societies making claim on the vote in proportion to the amount awarded and paid away in prizes by each between the 1st January and 31st December 1877; provided always that two-thirds of the amount so awarded and paid away does not exceed the amount raised by members' subscriptions and private donations, and if it do exceed the same, then the amount so raised shall be adopted as the basis of distribution.

3. The sum to be paid out of the vote shall in no case exceed two-thirds of the amount awarded and paid away in prizes.

HORTICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

1. Each society making claim on the vote shall be paid a sum not exceeding the amount awarded by it in prizes between the 1st January and 31st December 1877.

PARKS AND GARDENS.

1. A sum not exceeding One pound shall be paid to the managing body of any public park or garden making claim on the vote for every One pound expended by it on the improvement of such park or garden, between the 1st January and 31st December 1877, out of funds locally contributed.

2. The term "locally contributed" shall be taken to mean the difference between the total expenditure incurred between the 1st January and 31st December 1877, and the Government subsidy received during that period, or the balance of any subsidy prior thereto.

3. The foregoing clauses, 1 and 2, shall not apply to parks and gardens within the limits of the city of Melbourne, nor to the Botanical Garden of Geelong.

REGULATIONS.—RESERVE FOR BOTANICAL GARDENS AT BAIRNSDALE.

THE Council of the Shire of Bairnsdale, the duly appointed committee of management of the land at Bairnsdale, in the parish of Bairnsdale, reserved for botanical gardens, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management of the above mentioned reserve for botanical gardens, and for the preserving of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869* :—

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person on entering or leaving the reserve shall leave the gate open and unfastened.
3. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards his dress, language, or conduct.
4. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or throw stones in the reserve.
6. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee being first obtained.
8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots which may be enclosed within the reserve for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The Board of Land Works in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Land Act 1869*, section 108, doth hereby make the foregoing regulations in respect of the reserve for botanical gardens at Bairnsdale.

REGULATION FIXING THE AMOUNT TO BE PAID BY PERSONS USING OR CARRYING AWAY WATER FROM THE RESERVE FOR AFFORDING ACCESS TO WATER IN THE PARISH OF SWANWATER, KNOWN AS "EGAN'S DAM."

WHEREAS by a Regulation of the Board of Land and Works made on the third day of April 1878, the Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud was duly appointed a committee of management of the land temporarily reserved by Order of 20th November 1876, as a site for affording access to water, in the parish of Swanwater and hereinafter styled "Egan's

Dam": Now, therefore, the said Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud, for the care, management, and protection of the said reserve, having framed the following Regulation, submit the same to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in accordance with the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*—

REGULATION.

1. Every person using or carrying away the water from "Egan's Dam" Reserve shall pay therefor to any person duly appointed by the Committee of Management in that behalf, and duly authorized to demand the same, the fees hereinafter specified:—

- i. For one hogshead of water taken away in any one day—Sixpence.
- ii. For every hogshead after the first hogshead of water taken away in any one day—One shilling.
- iii. For each head of cattle brought to water at any one time—Threepence.

2. Every person offending against this Regulation, on refusing to pay upon demand the fees specified therein, shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence.

The foregoing Regulation was made and approved by the Shire Council of St. Arnaud this second day of May 1878.
