PREPARATION OF GENERAL ELECTORAL LISTS DURING THE WEEKS ENDING 1ST SEPTEMBER AND 1ST DECEMBER 1878.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of Electors' Rights issued on or before 1st September 1877 for the Provinces, and 1st December 1877 for the Districts, must obtain renewed Rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the general lists to be made up from and after the 1st September next for the Provinces, and 1st December next for the Districts.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new Lists to be made up as aforesaid.

The old Right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed Right will bear the same number and be in the same form and tenor as that in lieu of which it is issued, and will be equally available for any election that may take place before the completion of the new Rolls in October and January next.

No elector whose name is on a Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any Province or District, is entitled to a renewed Electors' Right for such Province or District (*vide* sections 61 and 62 of *The Electoral Act 1865*, and section 21 of Act No. 834).

ARRANGEMENTS FOR CARRYING ON THE INTER- COLONIAL TELEGRAPH BUSINESS BETWEEN VICTORIA, NEW SOUTH WALES, AND SOUTH AUSTRALIA.

THE Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following arrangements in connection with the Inter-colonial Telegraph business being entered into between the administrations of the Colonies of Victoria, New South Wales, and South Australia, to take effect from the 1st July 1878:—

1. After office hours the charge for intercolonial messages (press and private), with the exception of English mail reports, to be fifty per cent. on the ordinary rates. On Sunday the minimum charge for private messages to be as follows:—

For ten words and under ... Five shillings.
For each additional word ... Four pence.

2. Collect messages to be guaranteed by the sending station, and should the receiving station be unable to collect thereon, the sending station to be forthwith advised and checked without further communication. This is not to apply to collect messages sent in answer to messages containing the words "Reply paid."

3. The letters L, Y, and Z to be altered thus: L — — — — —, Y — — — — —, Z — — — — —.

NOTICE UNDER THE "STAMP STATUTE 1869."

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the eighth day of July 1878.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor in Council.

WHEREAS by the 4th section of the *Stamp Statute 1869* (No. 355) it was provided that, from and after such time or respective times as the Governor in Council should from time to time by notice published in the *Government Gazette* appoint, the following fees, or such of them as should be specified in such notice, or respective notices, should be collected by stamps, namely:—All fees payable to the Crown or the Consolidated Revenue of Victoria, or to the several officers of Government in the several courts and offices in respect of matters or things to be done or performed under certain enactments specified in the schedule to the said Act; and all fees payable to the Crown or the Consolidated Revenue of Victoria, or to any officers of the Government under any other enactment which the Governor in Council should by any such notice in the *Government Gazette* direct to be collected by stamps: And whereas by a notice published in the *Government Gazette* on the fifteenth day of February in the present year (page 355), the Governor in Council directed that all fees payable under the Regulations made in pursuance of *The Friendly Societies Act 1877* (No. 590) should be collected by stamps from and after the date thereof: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this present Order give the notice hereinafter contained, viz.:—

Fees collected under *The Friendly Societies Act 1877* (No. 590), so far as they are payable into the Consolidated Revenue, shall be collected by stamps, in accordance with the provisions of *The Stamp Statute* (No. 355), and all the rules in relation to fee-stamps contained in the Order dated the twelfth day of June 1876 (page 1127 of 1876) shall, so far as the same are applicable, be applied in regard to the collection of fees by virtue of this notice.

The Stamps for Fees payable under *The Friendly Societies Act* aforesaid on the lodgment of an application to register a society and on the lodgment of an amendment of rules for registration shall be affixed to the application for the registration of such society or of such amendment of rules.

This Order is to have effect from the first day of January 1878.

And the Honorable Henry Cuthbert, Her Majesty's Postmaster-General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR RECREATION PURPOSES AT MALVERN.

WE, the Councillors of the Shire of Malvern, being the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land at Malvern reserved for recreation purposes, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the above-mentioned reserve, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 103 of *The Land Act 1869*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Malvern Recreation Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, except when closed or granted by the council for any special purpose, of which due notice will be given.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any horses, cattle, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein without the authority in writing of the council.

6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the council first obtained.

7. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots which may be enclosed within the reserve for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

8. The council shall have power to grant the use of the reserve for games, fetes, or any purpose under such conditions, general or special, as the council shall from time to time impose.

9. Inhabitants desiring the use of the reserve for any games, fetes, or any special purpose, must apply in writing to the Shire Secretary.

10. Persons obtaining the use of the reserve for any special purpose shall abide by any order given by the council in reference to the use of the reserve.

11. The council shall have power on special occasions to impose a small charge for admission to the reserve, such charge not to exceed the sum of One shilling per adult.

12. Any person or persons committing in the reserve any of the following offences shall be expelled therefrom, notwithstanding such person may have paid for admission:—

(1) Assaulting any person.

(2) Being drunk.

(3) Swearing or using threatening, abusive, insulting, profane, or obscene language.

(4) Behaving indecently, improperly, or riotously.

(5) Obtaining admission to the reserve when not entitled to admission under these regulations.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

PLENTY RANGES TIMBER RESERVE.

IN pursuance of the 108th Section of *The Land Act 1869*, the Board of Land and Works do hereby make the following Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the reserve forming the watershed of the Plenty River and its tributaries, and the Yan Yean reservoir, together with the Timber reserve lying north of the crest of the Dividing Range, the boundaries of which are described in the proclamation dated 28th April 1873, published in the *Government Gazette* of the second day of May 1873.

1. No person will be allowed to trespass upon Crown lands forming the watershed of the Plenty River, its tributaries, or the Yan Yean Reservoir, or upon that portion of the timber reserve extending one mile north from the crest of the Dividing Range, for the purpose of cutting and removing timber, or for excavating and removing soil, clay, rock, or other material, or for diverting, damming, or polluting any stream, watercourse, or reservoir, or causing injury of whatever kind to the property of the Board or of Her Majesty.

2. Permission to enter upon that portion only of the timber reserve situated within its northern boundary and one mile south of such boundary in the parishes of Kingleake, Flowerdale, and Glen Burnie, in the county of Anglesey, for the purpose of felling, cutting, splitting, and removing timber, for a period ending on 31st day of December 1878, subject to the following rules and conditions, may (if the Board think fit) be granted by the Board upon written application addressed to the Honorable the Commissioner of Public Works:—

i. The fee to be paid with such application shall be at the rate of Two pounds per annum.

ii. Traffic for drays, waggons, carts, or other vehicles will not be permitted, except on proclaimed roads, or such other roads as hereinafter described, or as may from time to time be authorized by the Board for temporary use.

iii. No trees shall be felled except those pointed out and marked by the ranger.

iv. When a tree is felled the trunk shall be worked up, and the branches lopped and properly stacked for burning at the proper season, and they shall be so burned under the inspection of the ranger. No second tree will be allowed to be felled by any woodman or splitter, or by any one of his party, until the first part of this condition shall have been observed.

v. No person shall burn off scrub or underwood for the purpose of making roads or tracks, or obtaining access to timber, except at the proper season, and then only under the inspection of the ranger.

vi. Barking trees is strictly prohibited unless a license for that special purpose is obtained, and in such cases no standing trees shall be barked, but they shall be cut down, and the trunks, branches, and tops treated as described in paragraph iv.

vii. Saplings or trees of less than twelve inches diameter are not to be felled.

viii. Access will be allowed during the months of December, January, February, and March to any of the unenclosed portions of this reserve, for the purpose of removing dry timber only.

ix. Tracks or roads for obtaining access to such portions of this reserve may be formed and maintained by and at the expense of the splitters, carters, and others engaged in the removal of timber, worked or unworked, subject to the approval of the proper officer of the Melbourne Water Supply Department, provided that no such road or track shall cross the Dividing Range or enter on the watershed of the Plenty River prior to its junction with the Yea road, or shall in other places approach closer than five chains, or as near that distance as practicable, to the crest of line dividing the southern from the northern watershed.

x. The before-mentioned permission to enter for the said purposes may be revoked by the Board at any time without giving any compensation.

3. Cattle may be depastured on those portions of the said reserve forming the Farmers' Common, and the owners of such cattle shall upon notice being given by the ranger immediately cause to be destroyed, removed, burned, or buried, any diseased cattle, sheep, or carcasses found on the reserve.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE FRANKSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common,

and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described as a Common, that is to say:—

BURRAMINE COMMON.—Four thousand five hundred acres, more or less, county of Moira, parishes of Boosey, Burramine, and Yarrowonga, being the unappropriated Crown land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:—Commencing at a point on the left bank of the Murray River in line with the west boundary of allotment 13, parish of Boosey; thence south by a line and a road to the road from Echuca to Wangaratta; thence south-easterly and north-easterly by that road to the west boundary of P. Bourke's licensed land in the parish of Burramine; thence north and north-easterly by that land and north and east by allotment 4 to the north-east angle of the latter; thence north by a line to the Murray River aforesaid; and thence by that river downwards to the point of commencement. Also: Commencing at a point on the Murray River in line with the west boundary of allotment 12, parish of Burramine; thence south by a line and a road to the north boundary of Anne Thom's leased land; thence easterly, north-easterly, south-easterly, easterly, north-easterly, south-easterly, and north-easterly by the boundary of the leased and licensed land to the west boundary of the Yarrowonga township reserve; thence south, east, and north by the boundaries of that reserve to the Murray River aforesaid; and thence by that river downwards to the point of commencement; excepting a reserve under 110th section, situated in allotments 28 and 30, parish of Burramine, and containing an area of about Two hundred acres, and a block withheld under the 102nd section, situate in allotment 2, parish of Yarrowonga, and containing an area of about Forty-five acres.—(77.C.13933.)

And with the advice aforesaid I do hereby abolish the under-mentioned common, viz.:—

BALLISTON COMMON, which was proclaimed by Order in Council of 6th November 1876.—(78.C.9727.)

Description of Land.—Two acres, county of Bourke, city of Melbourne, being allotments 1, 2, 3, 16, 17, 18, 19, and 20 of section 14, at East Melbourne: Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 15; bounded thence by that allotment and allotment 4 bearing south 5 chains; thence by George street bearing west 4 chains; thence by Clarendon street bearing north 3 chains; and thence by Hotham street bearing east 4 chains to the point of commencement.

Names of Trustees.—The Bishop of Melbourne; the Honorable Sir William Foster Stawell, Chief Justice of Victoria; the Honorable James Wilberforce Stephen, a Judge of the Supreme Court of the colony of Victoria; the Honorable Thomas Turner a Beckett, Registrar of the diocese of Melbourne; Robert Ker, Esquire.

Power of Disposition.—To sell, lease, mortgage, or exchange, subject to the approval of the Bishop, or during the absence of the Bishop from the diocese, or the vacancy of the See, to the approval of the person for the time being administering the affairs of the diocese. The Bishop or such person as aforesaid to have power to remove trustees and to appoint new trustees, and to fill up all vacancies occurring in trusteeship. The land, until otherwise disposed of, to be held for the purposes for which it was granted or reserved by the Crown.

Purposes to which Proceeds of Disposition are to be applied.—To such purposes of the Church of England as may be agreed upon by the trustees and the Bishop, or during his absence from his See, or during the vacancy thereof, by the person for the time being administering the affairs of the diocese.

CAPE OF GOOD HOPE—SOUTH COAST.

It is hereby notified that a light tower is being built about two hundred to three hundred yards within the pitch of a low point (Seal Point), situated one and three-quarter miles westward of Cape St. Francis, to be hereafter called "Cape St. Francis Lighthouse."

The tower is a cylindrical stone structure, ninety-one feet high, with keeper's quarters attached at base, and is situated in latitude 34° 22' 30" south, and longitude 24° 50' 20" east of Greenwich. It is intended to display a second order heliophotal revolving white light, flashing at intervals of twenty seconds, with focal plane one hundred and one and a-half feet above the base of the tower, and one hundred and eighteen feet above the level of high water.

The light will be visible in clear weather about sixteen and three-quarter sea miles from the deck of a vessel fifteen feet above the sea. It will command the coast uninterruptedly to the westward, but will be cut off to the eastward by Cape St. Francis on the line N. 53° E. true, or would not be visible from the eastward on a bearing more southerly than S. 58° W. true. The nearest existing lights are Cape Recife, about forty-five miles to the eastward; and Mossel Bay (Cape St. Blaize), about one hundred and thirty-three miles to the westward.

The tower will probably be ready for the reception of the lenticular about January 1878, and the light may probably be exhibited some time between 1st March and 30th April 1878, of which due and precise notice will be given.

Chart 1090, Bay of Islands.—Bird Rock, which is given in chart as 2 feet above high water, is at least 25 feet.

Chart 1090, Bay of Islands.—The Twins, which are given as 3 feet, are about 13 feet above high water.

Chart 1896, Auckland Harbor.—Shoal Water.—Between a line drawn from the beacon on Rangitoto Reef and the Black Buoy, about 8 cables S.E. from it, extending off W.S.W. about 2½ cables, the water has shoaled considerably, 4½ fathoms having been found W.S.W. 2½ cables from the beacon at low water.

Furnished by H. M. S. "Sappho," March 1878.

Rurick Rock (P.D.), Tasmania.—Captain Largie of the ship *Pericles* reports that on coming round the south coast of Tasmania, from the westward, on the evening of 30th November 1877, wind light from N.W. at the time, a rock was sighted on the starboard bow. It was made out to be the Rurick Rock, and was clearly seen from the deck. It would be about 16 miles from Eddystone Rock and 26 miles from Cape Bruny; the rock seemed to be about 10 feet above the horizon and about 40 feet long. Captain Largie says that he has never seen it before, that it is right in the way of vessels rounding there, is placed on the charts and mentioned in the books of directions as being doubtful.

Volcanic Island, Hapai Group, Friendly Islands, Chart 2421.—A small island, about 200 yards long and 110 feet high, was passed by H. M. S. *Sapphire* on 16th April 1878, in lat. 19° 11' S., long. 174° 49' W., S. 17 W. 23 miles from Letto Island. It ejected a quantity of white smoke, and is covered with sulphur.

Reef (P.D.), and Home Shoal (P.D.).—The position of Reef marked P.D. in lat. 19° 18' S., long. 174° 59' W., was passed within 3 miles, and that of the reported rock, 27 feet high, said to have been seen by a Dutch ship, within 4½ miles; also the position of the Home Shoal was passed over, and in no case was there any appearance of a reef or discolored water. It is therefore probable that this island, which is stated by the natives to have grown rapidly, from being just level with the water on its first appearance, accounts for all these reported dangers. A reef awash is well known by the natives to exist about the place marked "reported dangerous hereabouts," but its position could not be accurately ascertained.

Extracts from sailing directions sent to the Hydrographer of the Navy respecting N.E. Bampton Reefs by Lieut. Richards, H. M. S. schooner "Renard."

Bampton Reefs.—The extreme north point of the Bampton Reef lies in lat. 18° 56' 20" S., long. 158° 52' E. From this point the eastern edge runs S.E. ¾ miles, and the western edge due south in broken patches for a distance of 8 miles.

Due west from the end of these patches, distance 2 miles, is a sand cay from which a reef runs in a W.N.W. direction for 5 miles to another cay, here it tends to S.W. for a distance of 4½ miles in direction of the islet formerly marked P.D. on the chart.

This island I have named Bampton Island, and lies in lat. 19° 08' 02" S., long. 158° 36' 36" E. Anchorage may be obtained in from 6 to 13 fathoms on a coral grit patch, the centre of the island bearing N.E. 1 mile.

Due west from Bampton Island, distant 2 miles, is a circular reef 1 mile in diameter with a sand cay on its eastern edge.

Returning to eastern edge of North Reef.—The south end of it is separated by a passage 1 mile broad from a small horse-shoe reef, which is 1 mile N.W. of another reef, which runs S.E. 2½ miles, and then tends to S.W. forming a right-angle, having a sand cay always uncovered at the angle. Fair anchorage inside this reef with the cay before-mentioned E. by N. 2½ miles.

S.W. by S. 4½ miles from the south end of this reef is "Renard" Island (not previously marked on the chart), lying in lat. 19° 13' 35" S., long. 158° 56' 42" E. This island is 300 yards in length and 200 in breadth, and its height, including the bushes on it, 20 feet. Anchorage may be obtained on N.W. or west sides in from 9 to 14 fathoms, taking care to avoid a rocky patch with only 9 feet on it at L.W. springs, from which the centre of the island bears E. by N. 4 N. 1 mile. S.E. by S. 3½ miles from Renard Island is the north extreme of a reef which extends in a southerly direction for 10 miles, terminating in a large cay always uncovered (Skeleton Cay).

Five miles S.W. from this cay are some detached reefs, the easternmost one of which lies in 19° 30' 15" S., 158° 51' 40" E. They, however, did not seem to extend for any considerable distance, and the ground to the southward appeared clear from the masthead of the *Renard*.

Tides.—As far as could be ascertained, the flood tide sets to the S.W.; the ebb tide to the N.E. It is H. W. F. and C. at Renard Island at 8h. 20min., and springs rise about 5 feet.

Current.—The prevailing current was to W.N.W. and N.W., but close to the reef a southerly and south-westerly drift was sometimes experienced.

Wind.—Prevailing from S.E. to E.S.E., with fine weather; force, 3 to 5. Occasional squalls from S.W., with rain, but these latter were very rare and never lasted for long.

EXHIBITION OF A FIXED WHITE LIGHT AT TIMARU.

It is hereby notified that, on and after the 1st day of July next, a harbor light will be exhibited from the lighthouse which has been erected at Timaru, the position and characteristics of which are as follow:—

The Timaru lighthouse is situated in the town of Timaru, on the east coast of the Middle Island of New Zealand, and bears from Patiti Point N.W. ¼ N. distant 1¼ miles. The tower is 30 feet in height, is built of timber, and painted stone color. The light will be a fifth order fixed white light, and will be visible from N. 20° W. round by W. to S. 20° E. The light is elevated about 85 feet above the sea, and, allowing 15 feet for the height of the observer's eye, will be seen at a distance of about 14½ nautical miles in clear weather, and at lesser distances according to the state of the atmosphere.

I LATELY inspected some works carried on in Norfolk Island by Messrs. Quintales and party, for the opening of a passage into Emily Bay, situated on the north-west end of the island.

The passage was cleared to a depth of two feet low-water spring tides, and will, when thoroughly cleared (which I anticipate will take about two or three months), give a depth of at least six feet at low-water, with a width of (65) sixty-five feet. Rise and fall spring tides being six feet.

The harbor or lagoon possesses a sandy bottom and is completely sheltered from all winds save S.W., in which direction, however, it is barriered by a double reef. The harbor and passage is capable of being made navigable to vessels of from 150 to 300 tons.

LACEPEDE ISLANDS—WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

THE Government of Western Australia invites tenders from persons desirous of obtaining the sole right to remove guano from the Lacepede Islands group, which is situated in about 17° south latitude, and 122° east longitude from Greenwich, and on which it is calculated there are now at least 40,000 tons of guano. Such tenders must be sent in to the Colonial Secretary, Perth, Western Australia, on or before the 15th October next, but the Government does not bind itself to accept the highest or any tender.

All tenders will have to state the price or royalty offered per ton for the guano (1) if shipped in the natural state; (2) if artificially prepared, dried, or sifted before shipment.

The person whose tender may be accepted (hereinafter spoken of as "the contractor") will have to bind himself to the following conditions:

1. To remove the whole of the guano that there may be on the islands.

2. To take it away at the minimum rate of twenty thousand tons a year.

3. To remove the guano in such a manner and from such places as may be from time to time pointed out by the Government Officer stationed on the islands; and the contract will contain a clause providing that in case of the breach or neglect of these conditions the contract shall be void, and the contractor shall forfeit all buildings, erections, and plant that he may have set up on any of the islands, and also the sum of Two thousand pounds hereinafter mentioned.

The contractor will be required, within seven days after receiving a notification by telegraph or otherwise that his tender is accepted, and before the issue of any license, to deposit in the hands of the Western Australian Government, or of such person as they may name as their agent in this behalf, the sum of Two thousand pounds, as security for the due performance of the contract, and this sum will be retained by the Government until the termination of the contract, and will be liable to forfeiture as hereinbefore mentioned. He will also be required at the same time to pay a like sum of Two thousand pounds, by way of royalty, in advance. The contractor will at no time be at liberty to remove any guano unless the royalty agreed upon has been paid, and no less sum than Two thousand pounds will be accepted at any time in payment of royalty until such time as there is left on the

islands a quantity of guano the agreed royalty on which shall be less than Two thousand pounds.

The only instructions that will be given to the Government Officer stationed on the islands, and which he will be required to insist upon with regard to the manner in which and the places from which the guano shall be removed, will be to divide the islands into convenient sections, to point out the section or sections from which guano may be removed, and to require that the whole of any one section be cleared before any new ground is entered on.

The quantity of guano taken by each ship on which royalty has to be paid shall be ascertained by adding 25 per cent. to the registered tonnage of timber-built ships, and 40 per cent. to the registered tonnage of iron-built ships; provided that, if the captain or agent of any ship, or the Government Officer, shall in any instance be dissatisfied with the foregoing arrangement, he shall be at liberty to cause the ship to be exactly measured according to Lloyd's rules, and the number of cubical feet so ascertained divided by 40 shall be taken to be the tonnage capacity of the ship.

No tonnage, light, or harbor dues will be charged in any port of the colony on ships solely engaged in the guano trade, and no customs duties will be levied on goods and stores that may be landed on the islands for persons solely employed in the preparation and shipment of guano.

The contractor will be at liberty to erect on any or all of the islands any buildings, jetties, tramways, &c., and, subject to the conditions before expressed as to forfeiture, to remove the same at any time within six months of the termination of the contract.

No license for the shipment of guano under the regulations now in force will be granted after the 15th August next, and every such license granted after the date hereof will provide for the compulsory removal of the guano for the shipment of which it is the permit before the 15th October next.

It will at all times be optional with the licensee to ship the guano in its natural state, or artificially prepared, dried, or sifted.

The contract to be entered into in pursuance of this notice shall be deemed to commence on 1st January 1879.

Each tender, unless otherwise expressed, shall be deemed to be open to acceptance by the Government for the space of one calendar month from the 15th October, and the Government shall be at liberty to accept any tender by notifying to the person making it, by telegraph, that his tender is accepted. Any person who shall tender, and, on his tender being accepted, shall fail to pay the two several sums of Two thousand pounds as hereinbefore set forth, shall be deemed to have broken his contract, and the Government shall thereupon be at liberty to accept any other tender, and to hold such person responsible for all loss consequent on his breach of contract.
