PREPARATION OF GENERAL ELECTORAL LISTS DURING THE WEEKS ENDING 1st SEPTEMBER AND 1st DECEMBER 1878.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of Electors' Rights issued on or before 1st September 1877 for the Provinces, and 1st December 1877 for the Districts, must obtain renewed Rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the general lists to be made up from and after the 1st September next for the Provinces, and 1st December next for the Districts.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new Lists to be made up as aforesaid.

The old Right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed Right will bear the same number and be in the same form and tenor as that in lieu of which it is issued, and will be equally available for any election that may take place before the completion of the new Rolls in October and January next.

No elector whose name is on a Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any Province or District, is entitled to a renewed Electors' Right for such Province or District (*vide* sections 61 and 62 of *The Electoral Act 1865*, and section 21 of *Act No. 384*).

MINING OPERATIONS AUTHORIZED ON CERTAIN RESERVED LANDS.¹

THE Governor in Council has authorized miners to occupy for mining purposes, subject to the bye-laws of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Sandhurst, the land described at the foot hereof forming the catchment area of the Grassy Flat reservoirs at Sandhurst, subject to the conditions, restrictions, and regulations following:—

1. Persons shall not sink any shaft or make any excavation, deposit any earth, stone, or other substance upon, or in any other way occupy the surface of any portion of the said land without having first obtained the permission in writing of the officer in charge of the works.

2. Any person having permission to mine by sinking pits shall, on ceasing to work, fill in the pits with the material excavated, and bring the ground as nearly as possible to its original level, and in the event of his refusing to do this it shall be done at his expense.

3. Previous to occupying any portion of the said land under the authority of this order, each applicant or applicants for a claim shall deposit in the hands of the Receiver and Paymaster, at Sandhurst, Ten shillings sterling, as a guarantee that he or they will observe and fulfil these conditions, such deposit to be retained until such person or persons shall relinquish the land aforesaid and discontinue mining operations; and if the said conditions, restrictions, and regulations shall then have been observed and fulfilled, the said deposit shall be returned to the depositors, but if any of them shall not then have been observed and fulfilled, then the whole or such part of the sum so deposited as aforesaid as the Governor in Council shall think fit shall, by an Order of the Governor in Council, be declared forfeited, and shall thereupon become public money, and be applied accordingly.

4. In case any person or persons employed in the mining operations hereby authorized shall in any way violate any of the above conditions, it shall not be lawful for him or them any longer to mine under, upon, or within the said land, or to continue in any way to occupy the same; and the Governor in Council shall be the sole judge whether or not any condition has been violated.

5. The Minister of Mines, or any person authorized by him in writing, shall have at any time power to order the immediate discontinuance of any mining operations within or under any part of the said land, whether the above conditions shall have been observed or not, and the mining operations shall thereupon be immediately discontinued, and an order in writing, served on any one of the miners, or a written order, posted on any part of the land aforesaid, shall be sufficient notice.

6. The Governor in Council may at any time revoke this Order.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that the Governor might make and proclaim reserves for the preservation and growth of timber, and might from time to time, after one month's notice should be given in the *Government Gazette*, alter and revoke any such proclamation, and the Board of Land and Works might issue licenses to cut timber upon such reserve or any part thereof on such terms and conditions, and subject to the payment of such license fee as should from time to time be approved of by the Governor and be set forth in such license: And whereas it is expedient to diminish the timber reserve hereinafter mentioned: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter and revoke the Proclamation of the timber reserve called the Egerton and Kamarooka State Forest, which bears date the twenty-ninth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, so far as it relates to the portion of land hereby deducted from the said timber reserve, that is to say:—

THE EGERTON AND KAMAROOKA STATE FOREST, proclaimed by Order of the 29th September 1873, and diminished by Order of the 12th June 1876, is hereby further diminished by deducting therefrom the portion hereinafter described, viz.:—Three acres, county of Bendigo, parish of Whirrakee: Commencing at a point bearing east thirteen chains thirty-nine links and south thirteen chains fifty-one links from the south-west angle of allotment 125B, parish of Kamarooka; bounded thence by lines bearing respectively east seven chains fifty links, south four chains, and west seven chains fifty links; and thence by a road bearing north four chains to the point of

commencement. The bearings are from the true meridian.—(K.14B.) (76.G.815.)

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF HEIDELBERG PARK.

WE, the President and members of the Heidelberg Shire Council, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land at Heidelberg gazetted as a Park, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the above-mentioned park, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The park and enclosure made by the Heidelberg Cricket Club shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset except the parts hereinafter mentioned.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the park or enclosure aforesaid who may offend against decency as regards his dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, flowers, fences, gates, or other erections in the park or enclosure, nor shall fires be lighted therein nor the grass or herbage injured.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the enclosure aforesaid or any part of the park.
5. No person shall put in the said enclosure so made and used by the said cricket club any cattle, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord, without the

authority, in writing, of the above committee or the committee for the time being.

6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the said enclosure or park, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the said committee for the time being first obtained; nor shall any game or pastime be played therein by any persons or any club without such permission.

7. No person except laborers and workmen employed in the park or enclosure shall enter any plots which may be enclosed within the said park or enclosure for plantation of young trees or shrubs, nor any plots fresh ploughed or dug up where seed is sown.

8. On any special occasion, such as athletic sports, cricket matches, &c., the sum chargeable for admission to the ground if required shall not exceed One shilling, or to any special reserved portion of the ground, One shilling and sixpence.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

LACEPEDE ISLANDS—WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

THE Government of Western Australia invites tenders from persons desirous of obtaining the sole right to remove guano from the Lacepede Islands group, which is situated in about 17° south latitude, and 122° east longitude from Greenwich, and on which it is calculated there are now at least 40,000 tons of guano. Such tenders must be sent in to the Colonial Secretary, Perth, Western Australia, on or before the 15th October next, but the Government does not bind itself to accept the highest or any tender.

All tenders will have to state the price or royalty offered per ton for the guano (1) if shipped in the natural state; (2) if artificially prepared, dried, or sifted before shipment.

The person whose tender may be accepted (hereinafter spoken of as "the contractor") will have to bind himself to the following conditions:—

1. To remove the whole of the guano that there may be on the islands.
2. To take it away at the minimum rate of twenty thousand tons a year.
3. To remove the guano in such a manner and from such places as may be from time to time pointed out by the Government Officer stationed on the islands; and the contract will contain a clause providing that in case of the breach or neglect of these conditions the contract shall be void, and the contractor shall forfeit all buildings, erections, and plant that he may have set up on any of the islands, and also the sum of Two thousand pounds hereinafter mentioned.

The contractor will be required, within seven days after receiving a notification by telegraph or otherwise that his tender is accepted, and before the issue of any license, to deposit in the hands of the Western Australian Government, or of such person as they may name as their agent in this behalf, the sum of Two thousand pounds, as security for the due performance of the contract, and this sum will be retained by the Government until the termination of the contract, and will be liable to forfeiture as hereinbefore mentioned. He will also be required at the same time to pay a like sum of Two thousand pounds, by way of royalty, in advance. The contractor will at no time be at liberty to remove any guano unless the royalty agreed upon has been paid, and no less sum than Two thousand pounds will be accepted at any time in payment of royalty until such time as there is left on the islands a quantity of guano the agreed royalty on which shall be less than Two thousand pounds.

The only instructions that will be given to the Government Officer stationed on the islands, and which he will be required to insist upon with regard to the manner in which and the places from which the guano shall be removed, will be to divide the islands into convenient sections, to point out the section or sections from which guano may be removed, and to require that the whole of any one section be cleared before any new ground is entered on.

The quantity of guano taken by each ship on which royalty has to be paid shall be ascertained by adding 25 per cent. to

the registered tonnage of timber-built ships, and 40 per cent. to the registered tonnage of iron-built ships; provided that, if the captain or agent of any ship, or the Government Officer, shall in any instance be dissatisfied with the foregoing arrangement, he shall be at liberty to cause the ship to be exactly measured according to Lloyd's rules, and the number of cubical feet so ascertained divided by 40 shall be taken to be the tonnage capacity of the ship.

No tonnage, light, or harbor dues will be charged in any port of the colony on ships solely engaged in the guano trade, and no customs duties will be levied on goods and stores that may be landed on the islands for persons solely employed in the preparation and shipment of guano.

The contractor will be at liberty to erect on any or all of the islands any buildings, jetties, tramways, &c., and, subject to the conditions before expressed as to forfeiture, to remove the same at any time within six months of the termination of the contract.

No license for the shipment of guano under the regulations now in force will be granted after the 15th August next, and every such license granted after the date hereof will provide for the compulsory removal of the guano for the shipment of which it is the permit before the 15th October next.

It will at all times be optional with the licensee to ship the guano in its natural state, or artificially prepared, dried, or sifted.

The contract to be entered into in pursuance of this notice shall be deemed to commence on 1st January 1879.

Each tender, unless otherwise expressed, shall be deemed to be open to acceptance by the Government for the space of one calendar month from the 15th October, and the Government shall be at liberty to accept any tender by notifying to the person making it, by telegraph, that his tender is accepted. Any person who shall tender, and, on his tender being accepted, shall fail to pay the two several sums of Two thousand pounds as hereinbefore set forth, shall be deemed to have broken his contract, and the Government shall thereupon be at liberty to accept any other tender, and to hold such person responsible for all loss consequent on his breach of contract.
