PREPARATION OF GENERAL ELECTORAL LISTS DURING THE WEEKS ENDING 1st SEPTEMBER AND 1st DECEMBER 1878.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of Electors' Rights issued on or before 1st September 1877 for the Provinces, and 1st December 1877 for the Districts, must obtain renewed Rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the general lists to be made up from and after the 1st September next for the Provinces, and 1st December next for the Districts.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new Lists to be made up as aforesaid.

The old Right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed Right will bear the same number and be in the same form and tenor as that in lieu of which it is issued, and will be equally available for any election that may take place before the completion of the new Rolls in October and January next.

No elector whose name is on a Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any Province or District, is entitled to a renewed Electors' Right for such Province or District (*vide* sections 61 and 62 of *The Electoral Act 1865*, and section 21 of *Act No. 334*).

POWER TO COMPEL CESSPOOLS IN THE BOROUGH OF ST. ARNAUD TO BE FILLED UP.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign, called *The Public Health amendment Act 1876*, it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend the provisions of the twentieth section of the said Act to any part of Victoria, and from and after three months from the coming into operation of the said section in any part of Victoria if the owner of land whereon there should be a cesspool for the reception of nightsoil, which cesspool in the opinion of the local board should be in such a condition or position as to be calculated to generate disease or be a public nuisance, should be required by notice from the local board to fill up the same within a time to be expressed in such notice not being more than one month from the date thereof, such owner should be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day from the expiration of the time mentioned in such notice that such cesspool should not be filled up as thereby required: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation extend the provisions of the twentieth section of the above-recited Act to the Borough of St. Arnaud.

LENGTH OF VOYAGE FOR VESSELS CARRYING PASSENGERS FROM VICTORIA TO NEW GUINEA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight
Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint
Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-
Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Depen-
dencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Imperial Parliament of
Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the eighteenth
and nineteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled *An Act*
to amend the Law relating to the Carriage of Passengers by Sea, it
was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful
for the Governor of each of Her Majesty's Possessions abroad
by any Proclamation to be by him from time to time issued
for that purpose (which should take effect from the issuing
thereof), to declare what should be deemed for the purposes
of the said Act to be the length of the voyage of any ship
carrying passengers from such possession to any other place
whatsoever, and to prescribe such scale of diet for the use of
the passengers during the voyage as he should think proper,
and also to declare what medicines, medical comforts, medical
instruments, and other matters should be deemed necessary
for the medical treatment of the passengers during such
colonial voyage: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria,
by this my Proclamation, issued for that purpose, do declare
that the following shall be deemed, for the purposes of the
said Act, the length of the voyage of any sailing vessel,
auxiliary screw propelling vessel, screw steam vessel, or
paddle-wheel steam vessel carrying passengers from any port
or place in Victoria to New Guinea, that is to say:—

And I do hereby further declare that, in addition to and
irrespective of any provisions of their own which any passen-
gers may have on board, the master of every such ship shall
make to each passenger during the voyage, including the time
of detention, if any, at any port or place before the termina-
tion of such voyage, the following issues of pure water, and
sweet and wholesome provisions, being in accordance with
the dietary scale fixed in the said recited Act (that is to say):—
Of water three quarts daily to each statute adult, exclusive
of the quantity specified in the 31st section of the said Act as
necessary for cooking purposes, namely, ten gallons for every
day of the prescribed length of voyage for every one hundred
statute adults on board.

LACEPEDE ISLANDS—WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

THE Government of Western Australia invites tenders from persons desirous of obtaining the sole right to remove guano from the Lacepede Islands group, which is situated in about 17° south latitude, and 122° east longitude from Greenwich, and on which it is calculated there are now at least 40,000 tons of guano. Such tenders must be sent in to the Colonial Secretary, Perth, Western Australia, on or before the 15th October next, but the Government does not bind itself to accept the highest or any tender.

All tenders will have to state the price or royalty offered per ton for the guano (1) if shipped in the natural state; (2) if artificially prepared, dried, or sifted before shipment.

The person whose tender may be accepted (hereinafter spoken of as "the contractor") will have to bind himself to the following conditions:—

1. To remove the whole of the guano that there may be on the islands.

2. To take it away at the minimum rate of twenty thousand tons a year.

3. To remove the guano in such a manner and from such places as may be from time to time pointed out by the Government Officer stationed on the islands; and the contract will contain a clause providing that in case of the breach or neglect of these conditions the contract shall be void, and the contractor shall forfeit all buildings, erections, and plant that he may have set up on any of the islands, and also the sum of Two thousand pounds hereinafter mentioned.

The contractor will be required, within seven days after receiving a notification by telegraph or otherwise that his tender is accepted, and before the issue of any license, to deposit in the hands of the Western Australian Government, or of such person as they may name as their agent in this behalf, the sum of Two thousand pounds, as security for the due performance of the contract, and this sum will be retained by the Government until the termination of the contract, and will be liable to forfeiture as hereinbefore mentioned. He will also be required at the same time to pay a like sum of Two thousand pounds, by way of royalty, in advance. The contractor will at no time be at liberty to remove any guano unless the royalty agreed upon has been paid, and no less sum than Two thousand pounds will be accepted at any time in payment of royalty until such time as there is left on the

islands a quantity of guano the agreed royalty on which shall be less than Two thousand pounds.

The only instructions that will be given to the Government Officer stationed on the islands, and which he will be required to insist upon with regard to the manner in which and the places from which the guano shall be removed, will be to divide the islands into convenient sections, to point out the section or sections from which guano may be removed, and to require that the whole of any one section be cleared before any new ground is entered on.

The quantity of guano taken by each ship on which royalty has to be paid shall be ascertained by adding 25 per cent. to the registered tonnage of timber-built ships, and 40 per cent. to the registered tonnage of iron-built ships; provided that, if the captain or agent of any ship, or the Government Officer, shall in any instance be dissatisfied with the foregoing arrangement, he shall be at liberty to cause the ship to be exactly measured according to Lloyd's rules, and the number of cubical feet so ascertained divided by 40 shall be taken to be the tonnage capacity of the ship.

No tonnage, light, or harbor dues will be charged in any port of the colony on ships solely engaged in the guano trade, and no customs duties will be levied on goods and stores that may be landed on the islands for persons solely employed in the preparation and shipment of guano.

The contractor will be at liberty to erect on any or all of the islands any buildings, jetties, tramways, &c., and, subject to the conditions before expressed as to forfeiture, to remove the same at any time within six months of the termination of the contract.

No license for the shipment of guano under the regulations now in force will be granted after the 15th August next, and every such license granted after the date hereof will provide for the compulsory removal of the guano for the shipment of which it is the permit before the 15th October next.

It will at all times be optional with the licensee to ship the guano in its natural state, or artificially prepared, dried, or sifted.

The contract to be entered into in pursuance of this notice shall be deemed to commence on 1st January 1879.

Each tender, unless otherwise expressed, shall be deemed to be open to acceptance by the Government for the space of one calendar month from the 15th October, and the Government shall be at liberty to accept any tender by notifying to the person making it, by telegraph, that his tender is accepted. Any person who shall tender, and, on his tender being accepted, shall fail to pay the two several sums of Two thousand pounds as hereinbefore set forth, shall be deemed to have broken his contract, and the Government shall thereupon be at liberty to accept any other tender, and to hold such person responsible for all loss consequent on his breach of contract.

HYDROGRAPHIC NOTICE.—[No. 8.]

New Zealand Pilot.—Notice No. 5.

THE following information relating to ports and coast of New Zealand has been derived from Notices issued by the New Zealand Government:—1877.

(All bearings are magnetic. Variation in 1878.)

Kaipara Harbor... 14° 00' E. | Dusky Sound ... 16° 20' E.

NORTH ISLAND.—EAST COAST.¹

Monganui Harbor.—The flagstaff formerly on the hill over the south entrance point does not now exist.

Wangaroa Bay.—Mr. Dennis, master of barque *Royal Diadem*, reported in 1875 the existence of a rock rather close in-shore, about 1½ miles S.W. from the West Head, and which breaks with but very little swell on: the position, however, is doubtful.

*Wangaruru Harbor.*²—A sunken rock is reported to exist at 3 cables south of the small islet which bears east 6 cables from Hay Island: this, however, needs confirmation.

Auckland Harbor. Rangitoto Island.—The west point of this island is marked by a beacon.

Bean Rocks.—The iron framework from which Bean Rocks light is exhibited is not conspicuous from seaward by daylight.

Tawanga Harbor. Stony Point.—There are two beacons on Stony Point close together, consisting of staves and cages, the inner beacon painted black and the outer white.

The eastern edge of the main bank opposite Maketu mound is marked by two pile beacons.

Waiapu River. Anchorage.—H.M.S. *Sappho* in 1875 anchored off the mouth of this river in 7 fathoms water, about three-quarters of a mile off shore, 5 miles southward of East Cape, with the cape bearing N. by E.; and the north entrance point of Waiapu River W.S.W. This anchorage, affording shelter from off-shore winds, is much frequented by coasting vessels wind bound.

*Wellington.—Time ball.*³—On certain days (notified in the *New Zealand Times*) a time ball painted red and white is dropped from a staff at the custom house at the instant of mean noon corresponding to longitude 172° 30' E.,⁴ which meridian, determined on the assumption that Wellington Observatory is situated in longitude 174° 48' 50" E., has been adopted to ensure uniformity of time throughout the colony of New Zealand.

Alzdorf Jetty in Lambton Harbor has been removed.

NORTH ISLAND.—WEST COAST.

*Kaipara Harbor.*⁵ *North-east or Kemp Channel.*—The outer edge of the bar of this channel has shifted about 1½ miles seaward, and there is now a depth of 5½ fathoms water on it at low-water springs with 15 fathoms close to outside. Inside the bar a depth of 6 to 7 fathoms is maintained for about 1½ miles, when the water gradually deepens to 23 fathoms, between Tory Shoal and North Spit.

Tory Shoal has considerably extended towards North Spit, and the channel between is only three-quarters of a mile wide with deep water close to either side.

North Spit extends three-quarters of a mile farther seaward than formerly.

Directions for entering.—Bring Puki-tu to bear E. by N., and proceed on that course until the middle green hillock on North Sand Head bears N.E. ½ N. (a conspicuous conical hill called Wakahuranga bearing N.E. distant 10 miles from North Sand Head will now appear just open east of North Sand Head); from this position steer N.E. ½ N. with the beacon, house, and semaphore flagstaff (all standing behind the green patch on the middle hillock on North Sand Head) in line Puki-tu bears E.S.E., when Wakahuranga will appear immediately over North Sand Head, a vessel will then be guided by semaphore, steering in the direction towards which the arm points, and steadying the course when it is dropped. If the signals are not seen, a vessel should keep from a quarter to half a mile off the northern shore until abreast the semaphore station, when a course may be steered for either Kaipara or Wairoa Rivers.

Tides.—Both ebb and flood streams set slightly towards the north shore of the north-east or Kemp Channel, great care should therefore be exercised when beating, or in light winds.

MIDDLE ISLAND.—EAST COAST.⁶

Port Lyttelton.—The channel between the moles of the inner harbor of Port Lyttelton is 200 feet wide, and has been dredged to a depth of 16 feet.

Akaroa Harbor.—Observation Point.—The buoy marking the outer extremity of the reef off this point is painted red.

Otago Harbor.—Tide Signals.—From a flagstaff at Port Chalmers signals are made showing the least depth of water

in the southern channel leading to Dunedin from the first quarter flood until high water.

Tables of the signals used can be obtained at the Harbor Offices at Dunedin and Port Chalmers.

MIDDLE ISLAND.—WEST COAST.

Dusky Sound.—Facile Harbor.—A ledge of sunken rocks with 9 feet water over it lies in the centre of the entrance to the cove on the north-east side of Facile Harbor.

Duck Cove.—A sunken rock, with about 6 feet water over it at low water, lies W. by N. from Porpoise Point (the eastern point of Duck Cove) distant about 3 cables.

Awarua Point.—A reef of rocks is reported to extend from Awarua Point, the north point of Big Bay, in a westerly direction for a distance of 1½ miles. The coast between Milford Sound and Cascade Point should be approached with great care.

NEW ZEALAND.—NORTH ISLAND.—EAST COAST.

1. Particulars of Pauhenche Spit Light.

THE New Zealand Government has given the following additional particulars concerning the fixed white light exhibited at the outer extreme of Pauhenche Spit, southern point of Ponui Pass, Tehmaki Strait:—

The light is of the fifth order, elevated 50 feet above high water, and is obscured over Pahiki Island.

The lighthouse is an open frame structure supporting the keeper's dwelling, which is painted white and surmounted by the lantern.

2. Revolving Light on Portland Island.

Also, with reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 5, of 14th January 1878 (1), on the intended exhibition of a light from a lighthouse in course of construction on the south point of Portland Island, north point of entrance to Hawke Bay:—

Further notice has been given that the light would be exhibited on 10th February 1878.

The light is a revolving white light of the second order, attaining its greatest brilliancy every thirty seconds, elevated 300 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 24 miles.

From the lower part of the lighthouse, a fixed red light visible through an arc of about 6°, is shown in the direction of Bull Rock, which bears N.E., 4 miles distant.

The lighthouse, 28 feet high, is built of wood, and painted white. Position approximate, lat. 39° 18' S., long. 177° 53' E.

MIDDLE ISLAND.—EAST COAST.

3. Particulars of Cape Wanbrow Light.

The following additional particulars have also been received concerning the fixed white light exhibited on Cape Wanbrow, Oamaru:—

The light should be visible from seaward in clear weather, through an arc of 146°, or between the bearings of N.N.W. and S. by W., from a distance of about 15 miles. Cape Wanbrow bearing S. by W. indicates the outer anchorage of Oamaru.

(The bearings are magnetic. Variation—Hawke Bay, 143° easterly in 1878; Cape Wanbrow, 16½° easterly in 1878.)

Sailing Directions for Port Moorowie, from an Admiralty Survey in April 1878.

MOOROWIE is a coaster's port, immediately to the eastward of Point Gilbert, in Sturt Bay, on the north side of Investigator Strait. The anchorage is a round hole, two cables in diameter, with 12 to 21 feet, to get into which a bar has to be crossed with eight feet over it. As a general rule the port is not available for vessels drawing more than 10 feet.

Point Gilbert has some rush-covered sandhills, 60 feet high, on its western part. Rocks, awash and with less than one fathom over them, stretch three cables to the southward of the Point, and, half a mile south from it, there are five fathoms. A stony bank, which dries at half tide, lies two and a half cables to the eastward of Point Gilbert; and E. by N., two cables from the centre of this bank, a black buoy marks the extreme of the one-fathom line to the eastward of the Point. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ N., four-fifths of a cable from the black buoy, a chequered buoy marks a rocky bank, with 5 to 6 feet water, extending three-quarters of a cable east and west, and half a cable north and south. The buoy lies on the N.W. part of the bank.

From Point Gilbert the coast bights to the N.E. (a rocky bank 20 to 40 feet high, fronted by sand and stones) for one mile to a point above which are some bare and rush-covered sandhills, the highest of which is 65 feet. A reef, awash at No. 76.—August 2, 1878.—2.

low-water, extends two cables S.S.W. from this point, and there are no more than 6 feet water, S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ S., four and three-quarter cables from it, where a red buoy marks the eastern side of the entrance to the port. The chequered buoy bears W. by N. $\frac{1}{4}$ N., one and two-thirds cables from the red buoy.

Tides.—It is high-water full and change in Port Moorowie at three hours ten minutes—springs rise 6 feet. The tidal stream is scarcely felt inside the port; outside, in ten fathoms, the flood sets to the eastward and ebb to the westward, following the direction of the coastline at a rate of $1\frac{1}{2}$ knots at springs.

Directions and Anchorage.—Point Gilbert should be kept to the northward of N.W. by W. until the red buoy bears east of north; then steer in between the red and chequered buoys, passing half a cable to the westward of the former; or bring the post office (the highest limestone house) to bear N. by W., steer for it on that bearing, and anchor one and a half cables N.N.W. from the red buoy, with the high-water extreme of Point Gilbert bearing W. by S. $\frac{1}{4}$ S., in 20 feet sand and weed, the holding ground being very good. From the westward, keep more than half a mile off Point Gilbert, until the post office bears N. by W., then proceed as before. In going in, a vessel will pass over 8 to 9 feet, some distance outside the buoys. If obliged to wait outside for high-water, anchor in 30 feet, with Point Gilbert Hill bearing N.W., and the rush-covered hill east of the township N.E. by N.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim, or add to (as the case may be) the Commons hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for Commons.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF COMMONS UNDER THE CONTROL OF THE COUNCIL OF THE SHIRE OF MEREDITH. VIZ.:—THE COOLEBARGHURK FARMERS' COMMON, THE MEREDITH TOWN COMMON, THE DARRIWILL FARMERS' COMMON, THE ANAKIE FARMERS' COMMON, AND THE BEREMBOKE COMMON.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations for the management of commons, and in pursuance of the provisions of chapter XIII. of the regulations made under the said Act by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of May 1873, the Council of the Shire of Meredith, as managers of the above-named commons, submit to the Board of Land and Works for approval the following Regulations for the management of the said commons in lieu of all regulations hitherto in force in respect thereof:—

1. Owners and occupiers of land, holders of miners' rights, or business and carriers' licenses, residing within five (5) miles of a common, shall be entitled to depasture cattle thereon.

2. Irrespective of land held each person so entitled shall be allowed to depasture four (4) head of large cattle; owners and occupiers of land having under cultivation not less than one-tenth of the land occupied by them, shall be entitled to depasture one additional head for every ten (10) acres so held, but in no case shall the total number allowed to any one person exceed twelve (12) head on the Meredith Town and Coolebarghurk Farmers' Commons; and sixteen head on any of the other commons abovenamed.

3. The fees for depasturing cattle shall in all cases be paid in advance to the managers, or to whom they may appoint, and shall be for six (6) months from the commencement of a certain date at the following rates, viz.:—

On the Coolebarghurk and Meredith Commons: horned cattle, 5s. per head per annum; horses, 6s. per head per annum.

On the Darrivill Farmers' Common: horned cattle, 4s. 6d. per head per annum; horses, 5s. 6d. per head per annum.

On the Anakie and Beremboke Commons: horned cattle, 5s. per head per annum; horses, 8s. per head per annum.

4. The responsibility of the herdsman for all cattle branded and received on the commons shall extend to his preventing

the straying of such cattle as shall have been running on the common of which he has charge for a period of not less than three (3) months; nevertheless he shall exercise equal vigilance over all cattle placed under his charge. He shall release all cattle impounded during the currency of the period for which they have been entered on the common, at his own expense, and shall give notice to the owners of any cattle which may have strayed from the common within three (3) days of having missed them, and shall use all due diligence to recover them, otherwise he will be responsible to the owners for the value of all such cattle not recovered.

5. The managers will not be responsible for cattle placed on the commons beyond supervising the duties of the herdsman.

6. All persons desirous of removing cattle permanently from a common shall give twenty-four (24) hours' notice to the herdsman before so doing.

7. The herdsman shall impound all cattle found trespassing on the common, and keep correct accounts of the same, so that the fees arising therefrom shall go to the commons' account.

8. No pigs, goats, or geese, shall be allowed to depasture on the commons, nor any bull or entire horse without the consent, in writing, of the managers.

The managers may set apart such portion of a common as they may think fit for depasturing sheep thereon; and all sheep placed on a common shall be restricted to such part, and the fees to be charged for their pasturage shall be paid in advance, and such fees shall be specially fixed by the managers.

9. The herdsman (if appointed to receive under clause 3) shall pay over to the shire secretary, as treasurer, all fees received by him on account of a common within one month of receiving such fees, and shall furnish a written report at each monthly meeting of the managers.

10. A special brand for each common will be provided by the managers, which shall be used at the beginning of each half-year to pitch-brand all cattle registered on the common, which shall be renewed by the herdsman when necessary so as to keep it plainly visible.

11. The owners shall, at branding times, assist to muster and produce their cattle at the yards, or where most convenient for inspection by the managers, and to be branded by the herdsman.

12. Cattle affected with any contagious disease will in no case be allowed to remain on the commons.

13. Every person offending against any of the preceding regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

The foregoing rules and regulation were made and approved by the Council of the Shire of Meredith the 26th day of June 1878.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR RACING AND RECREATION PURPOSES AT ELMHURST.

WE, John Easterbrook, William Webster, Samuel S. Hanson, Isaac Kearn, Thomas McLaughlin, Andrew Melrose, jun., and James Wise, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved, by Order of 23rd April 1877, as a site for Racecourse and other purposes of Public Recreation at Elmhurst, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management of the said reserve, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards his or her dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the fences, gates, trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, horses, goats, pigs, or sheep, nor bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee of management.

6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the committee of management be first obtained.

7. Persons who may have secured the consent in writing of the committee of management to the erection of any structure, &c., within the reserve for special purposes, shall be bound by any order given by such committee of management in such matter.

8. It shall be competent for the committee of management to allow any part of the reserve to be depastured by quiet stock, the proceeds of such agistment to be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve.

9. No person shall ride upon any part of the reserve, or train a horse thereon, at any time, without the consent in

writing of the committee of management, and paying such fee as may be fixed from time to time by the said committee.

10. The sums chargeable upon special occasions, such as race meetings and athletic sports meetings, shall be—
For admission to the stand on racecourse, not exceeding 10s.

For admission at the ground gates, not exceeding 2s. 6d.

11. Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and may be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
