(All bearings are magnetic.)

Reuben Point Light is bluff, with reddish clay cliffs immediately to the northward. A fixed white light is displayed about 50 yards inside the extreme of the point; it is placed on a small scaffolding, and is supposed to be visible 14 miles; as, however, on it for the present.

Fire.—A wooden pier is built 14 cables to the west of the Portuguese Fort, its extreme dries at low-water; it is the first part of the town that shows when rounding Reuben Point.

Variation.—In chart No. 644 Delagoa Bay the variation is marked as decreasing 1' annually. In chart No. 646 English R. the variation is marked as increasing 1' annually. In chart No. 646 English R. Tides.—In H.M.S. Dana outside the shoals we found the first of the flood setting to the northward about 2 knots, with a strong in-draught towards the channel north of Cockburn Shoal. On leaving we found the last of the cbb setting in an opposite direction. Inside the shoals the flood sets about 3 knots to the westward through the channels, over Shefeen Reefs and towards English R. The ebb sets in an opposite direction.

Directions for Crossing the Shoals.—On entering, H.M.S. Dana crossed the shoals in parallel 25° 49' S., fixing her position by a bearing of C. Imjack and an angle to Black Bluff, with a check to Cutfield Hummocks. The angle between C. Imjack and Black Bluff was taken from the mast-head by an officer. George Hill was undistinguishable Least soundings obtained crossing in this manner was 4 fathoms (L.W.S. Pgs.). On leaving, H.M.S. Dana used the channel to the north of Cockburn Shoal and south of Hope Shoal, but as this passage is narrow, the tides strong, and the points not good, it cannot be recommended until better surveyed. Coming from the southward perhaps the best and simplest course would be after passing about a mile to the eastward of C. Imjack to steer north by east for 3 miles, then bring C. Imjack to bear S. ½ W. keep it on this bearing until the lightship bears S.W. by W. ½ W., when haul in for the lightship and cross the shoals, keeping the

CAPE ST. FRANCIS LIGHT.

REFERRING to a preliminary notice by the Chief Inspector of Public Works, dated 17th July 1877, which first appeared in the Government Gazette of this colony of 20th July 1877, and to a Government notice, No. 348 of 1878, of 29th April 1878, which first appeared in the Government Gazette of 30th April 1878, subjoined to the former, and affording further information concerning the tower and light proposed to be exhibited at Cape St. Francis; it is now hereby notified that the light was first exhibited on The light is a second order holophotal revolving white light, flashing at intervals of twenty seconds, and is visible, in Clear weather, about sixteen and three-quarters miles from the deck of a vessel fifteen feet above the sea.

The tower has been built upon a low point (Seal Point), situated one and three-quarter miles westward of Cape St. Francis, and is in latitude 34° 12′ 30″ south (not 34° 22′ 30″ as was erroneously printed in the two former notices above alluded to); longitude 24° 50′ 20″ east of Greenwich.

The tower is a cylindrical stone structure, ninety-one feet high, and forms a good day mark; the focal plane is one hundred and eighteen feet above the level of high-water.

CAUTION.

The following are special points of difference between this tower and light and those at Cape Recife (45 miles to the

eastward):—
The tower at Cape St. Francis is wholly white, that at Cape Recife is painted in horizontal bands alternate red and white.
The light at Cape St. Francis is revolving white, showing a bright flash every twenty seconds; that at Cape Recife is revolving white, attaining a maximum of brightness and completing its phases once every minute.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for a Common.

GOBUR COMMON.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE GOBUR COMMON. WHEREAS by The Land Act 1869 power is given to the Governor in Council to frame Regulations for the management of Commons, and in pursuance of the provisions of Chapter XIII. of the regulations made under the said Act by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of May 1873, the managers of the Gobert Common submit to the Board of Land and Works for approval the following regulations for the management of the said common:—

1. In the construction and for the purposes of these regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean bulls, cows, heifers, oxen, steers, horses, mares, geldings, colts, filties, asses, and mules. The words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats. Words importing the singular number shall mean and include the plural number, and words importing male persons shall include females.

- 2. Ratepayers within the shire, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers may depasture on the common within a distance of five miles from their places of residence respectively, four (4) head of large cattle or the equivalent number of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one additional head of large cattle for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him; provided always that no person shall be entitled to depasture any cattle upon more than one common.

 3. The fees for denasturing cattle upon the common shall
- depasture any cattle upon more than one common.

 3. The fees for depasturing cattle upon the common shall be payable to the herdsman of the common half-yearly in advance, and shall be at the rate of Four (4) shillings per annum for each horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, and mule. The fees for depasturing small cattle shall be One shilling and fourpence (1s. 4d.) per head per annum. No fees shall be charged for cattle under nine months old whose dams are lawfully depasturing on the common.
- 4. The managers may grant to butchers or slaughtermen special licenses to depasture, for such periods of time as may be agreed upon, cattle intended for slaughter on the following terms, viz.:—Large cattle (not to exceed 15 in number) Sixpence per head per week, to be paid in advance. And the managers may grant to dairymen a special license to depasture a number of cattle, for dairy purposes only, not exceeding 20 head of large cattle, upon payment at the rate of .Four shillings (4s.) per head for such term of three months.
- 5. No person shall depasture cattle on the common unless such cattle be his or her own property.
- such cattle be his or her own property.

 6. No animal affected with any disease shall be allowed to depasture on the common, and as soon as the herdsman of the common shall discover that any cattle registered on the common is infected with any such disease he shall forthwith give notice thereof to the owner of such cattle, and also to the nearest inspector of stock having jurisdiction in the district in which the common is situated, and shall also forthwith give notice to the managers of the common. It shall be the duty of the herdsman to observe and carry out all the requirements of the Acts of the Parliament of Victoria in force for the time being, relating to diseases of animals, which are demanded of owners or persons in charge of diseased cattle, so far as such requirements can be held to apply to the common, or the managers or persons in charge thereof.

 7. No person shall be allowed to depasture on the common
- 7. No person shall be allowed to depasture on the common an entire horse, or bull, or ram, or he-goat, except with the consent, in writing, of the managers.
- 8. No cattle shall be removed from the common by the owner, or by any person on his behalf, until all fees for commonage due in respect of such cattle shall have been paid, nor until after such reasonable notice shall have been given to the herdsman as will enable him to attend at the removal, if he thinks it necessary.
- 9. If any cattle, while registered and actually depasturing on the common, shall be sold by the owners thereof, but not removed, neither the managers nor the herdsman of the common shall be liable or responsible for any loss, damage, costs, penalties, or forfeitures which may happen to, or be incurred by, the owners thereof in respect of such cattle.
- 10. The managers will keep books in the forms prescribed by Schedules A and B, hereto annexed. All licenses for depasturing shall be in the form in Schedule A, and shall be signed by the managers. The book of accounts to be kept by the managers shall be in the form in Schedule B, and a copy of such account shall be forwarded to the Board of Land and Works.
- 11. All books of accounts or licenses, registers, plans, and other documents relating to the common and to the management thereof, shall be open to the inspection of any persons entitled to commonage, at all reasonable times during the hours in which the managers transact business.

Herdsman.

Herdaman.

The cattle depasturing on the common are in the care and custody of a herdsman appointed by the managers, and he is responsible for the efficient carrying out of these regulations. He shall also conform to any special instructions issued to him by the managers relative to the registration, custody, and delivery to owners of the cattle on the common, and to the prevention of trespass thereon of cattle, tother than travelling cattle, for which no commonage fees shall have been paid. He shall also provide security, by approved bond with two sureties, ffor the bonest and faithful discharge of his duties, in such amount (not less than £50) as the managers may deem adequate.

The herdsman shall register the permanent brands or brand with the common brand all cattle registered on the common. All cattle not registered or branded with the common brand shall be deemed to be trespassing on the common; and such cattle may be impounded, or the herdsman may be instructed by the managers to sue for trespass in a summary way before a court of petty sessions. The register-book shall be in the form prescribed by the managers, and shall be supplied to the berdsman. herdsman.

The herdsman, for all fees received by him, shall give printed The nerosman, for all rees received by limit, shall give printed receipts in the form of Schedule A, hereto annexed, consecutively numbered, the butts of which receipt must be retained for inspection; and he shall forward to the managers, on the first Tuesday in each month, a certified account, together with all moneys received by him on their behalf during the preceding month; and a return showing the number of the various kinds of cattle then on the common. The herdsman's monthly return shall be a copy of his register-book for the period.

The herdsman of the common shall assist to muster and brand all cattle registered on the common, and, in the event of his missing any cattle from the common, shall, within forty-eight hours from the time of missing the cattle, give notice to the owners thereof that such cattle are missing.

The herdsman shall be responsible for any penalties, damages, trespass rates, or costs incurred by and recovered from any owner of cattle lawfully depasturing on the common in any case where such penalties, damages, trespass rates, or costs shall, in the opinion of the managers, have been occasioned by the neglect of the herdsman.

Recovery of Fees and Fines.

When the owners of cattle depasturing on the common refuse or neglect to pay the prescribed fees within twenty-one (21) days from the date from which they may be due, such fees may be recovered in a summary way before a court of petty sessions.

Any person who shall infringe any of these regulations shall, on conviction thereof, pay for every such offence a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds (£20), and every such penalty may be recoverable in a summary way before a court of petry sessions.

or petty sessions.

The following shall be the purposes to which the residue of fees paid in respect of depasturage on the common after paying incidental expenses, shall be applied, viz.: To making improvement on the said common and aiding charitable institutions, subject to the concurrence of the Board of Land and Works first obtained thereto.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds for each offence.

A Bye-law of the Borough of Hamilton, made under section 213 of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 16, for regulat-ing Passenger Vehicles.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Hamilton order as follows:—

1st. The words "prescribed space" shall, for the purposes of this bye-law, mean the space within the circumference of a circle whose radius is five miles in length from the principal post office of this borough.

circle whose radius is five miles in length from the principal post office of this borough.

2nd. In this bye-law the term "backney carriage" shall include every wheeled carriage, whatever may be its form or construction, used in standing or plying for hire for a passenger in any street within the prescribed space for this borough stage carriage as next hereimafter mentioned; and the term "borough stage carriage" shall include every wheeled carriage, whatever may be its form or construction, used in standing or plying for hire for passengers at separate fares, and which shall upon every journey go from or come to any place within the prescribed distance for this borough to or from any other place within such prescribed distance, and for all purposes the terms "backney carriage" or "borough stage carriage" (as the case may require) shall be deemed sufficient to describe a carriage of either of the kinds hereinbefore mentioned; and the word "owner" shall include every person who, either alone, or in partnership with any other person, shall keep or be concerned otherwise than as a driver or attendant in the keeping, employing, or letting to hire of any hackney carriage or borough stage carriage; and the word "conductor" shall include every director or other person except the driver who shall attend upon the passengers in any borough stage carriage; and the word "passenger" shall include every person carried by any backney carriage or borough stage carriage or borough stage carriage or or diver, and (where there shall be a conductor to such borough stage carriage) one conductor.

3rd. No agreement made with the owner or driver of any hackney carriage for the payment or hire thereof of more than

3rd. No agreement made with the owner or driver of any hackney carriage for the payment or hire thereof of more than the proper sum, limited by some regulation in that behalf, shall be binding on the person making the same; and every owner or driver of a hackney carriage who exacts or demands for the hire thereof more than such proper sum, whether in pursuance of any such agreement or not, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings, and the adjudicating justice may, upon the hearing, order in addition that such owner or driver pay to the party aggrieved the amount of such overcharge, if paid.

4th. No owner or driver of any hackney carriage bevice.

4th. No owner or driver of any hackney carriage, having agreed to take any fare for any time or from or to any place, shall refuse, neglect, or delay to fulfil such agreement, and every owner or driver offending against this section shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

5th. Every driver of a hackney carriage who, save for such reasonable time as may be required for taking up or setting down any passenger or luggage, stands or plies for hire with such carriage, or suffers the same to stand elsewhere than at some standing or place appointed for that purpose by some regulation in that behalf, or stops such carriage across any street, whether public or private, or alongside of any other carriage whatsoever, or refuses to give way if he conveniently can to any other carriage, or who by loitering or any wilful misbehaviour causes any obstruction in any street whether public or private, or who obstructs or hinders the driver of any other hackney carriage in taking up or setting down any person into or from such carriage, or who wrongfully in a forcible manner prevents the driver of any other hackney carriage form being hired, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

No borough stage carriage shall stand or ply for passengers elsewhere than on some standing duly appointed, according to the route and terminus by and to which such carcarriage is to proceed, or upon such route, or shall stop or delay upon such route, save whilst taking up or setting down passengers or at some place of call on such route appointed by some regulation in that behalf; and no such carriage shall leave any standing for use as a stage carriage save in such succession or turn as shall have been appointed as aforesaid; and every driver or conductor of any such carriage who shall offend against this section shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

Bye-law No. 2 for making a Rate for Water Supply Purposes.

THE Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Talbot order as follows:—

The Council of the Borough of Talbot doth hereby, purand tenerical the Borough of Tabba doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by *The Local Governing Bodies Loan Act* 1872, make the following rate from the date hereof upon all lands and tenements within the water supply district, that

- 1. The rates and charges hereafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied, viz.:—
 - 1. On every house or tenement (not being an hotel, and not having steam-engines attached) of £20 annual value and under, One pound per annum.
 - 11. On every house or tenement (not being an hotel, and not having steam-engines attached) above the annual value of £20, a rate of Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.
 - 111. On all houses or tenements having steam-engines attached, a rate of Ten pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.
 - 1v. On every hotel, a rate of Six pounds per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.
 - v. Government departments, by meter, at the rate of 2s.
 - per 1,000 gallons.
 vi. The rates to be charged for water supplied from standpipes shall be One shilling for every load of 120 gallons; One penny for every bucket.
 - VII. Water-troughs will be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum each.
- Ten shillings per annum each.

 2. The council may cause meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary, such meter to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for by special arrangement. Syphon pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering (1,000,000) one million gallons.
- 3. If any meter should cease registering, and during the time it is undergoing repairs, the council shall estimate and charge for the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.
- 4. Any person receiving water from the council who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- 5. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the council who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- 6. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the council, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the council, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the council, he shall obtain

from the council a license in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

- 7. Before any such license shall be granted by the council the person applying for the same shall satisfy the council that he is a competent plumber, and pay the sum of One pound as the fee for such license. The council shall have the power of cancelling such license at any time.
- pound as the fee for such license. The council shall have the power of cancelling such license at any time.

 8. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the council without giving two days' notice to the council of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the council without the permission in writing of the council being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine the property of the council, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

 9. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the council without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the council, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the council, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipe of the council of a strength and material not sanctioned by the council, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council. Galvanized iron and lead piping of approved quality only will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services. No service of a larger bore than 3-inch will be permitted unless by special consent of the council.

 10. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the council into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the council that such service-pipe requires repairing, the council may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe, or otherwise as to the said council may seen fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and, if none, the owner, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair, or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council.
- 11. Any person supplied with water by the council who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council.

 12. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council.
- 13. Overflow-pipes to private baths will not be permitted.
- 14. Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.
- two gailons can escape at each flush.

 15. If any person supplied with water by the council does or causes to be done anything in contravention of any of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the council may cut of the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied.
- 16. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except under the directions of the officers of the council, shall be liable to a penalty of Two pounds for each offence.
- 17. In the construction of this bye-law the word "council" shall mean the Borough Council of Talbot.

from the Lacepede Islands group, which is situated in about 17° south latitude, and 122° cast longitude from Greenwich, and on which it is calculated there are now at least 40,000 tons of guano. Such tenders must be sent in to the Colonial Secretary, Perth, Western Australia, on or before the 15th October next, but the Government does not bind itself to accept the highest or any tender.

All tenders will have to state the price or royalty offered per ton for the guano (1) if shipped in the natural state; (2) if artificially prepared, dried, or sifted before shipment.

The person whose tender may be accepted (hereinafter spoken of as "the contractor") will have to bind himself to the following conditions:—

- 1. To remove the whole of the guano that there may be on the islands.
- 2. To take it away at the minimum rate of twenty thousand tons a year.
- 3. To remove the guano in such a manner and from such places as may be from time to time pointed out by the Government Officer stationed on the islands; and the contract will contain a clause providing that in case of the breach or neglect of these conditions the contract shall be void, and the contractor shall forfeit all buildings, erections, and plant that he may have set up on any of the islands, and also the sum of Two thousand pounds hereinafter mentioned.

hereinafter mentioned.

The contractor will be required, within seven days after receiving a notification by telegraph or otherwise that his tender is accepted, and before the issue of any license, to deposit in the hands of the Western Australian Government, or of such person as they may name as their agent in this behalf, the sum of Two thousand pounds, as security for the due performance of the contract, and this sum will be retained by the Government until the termination of the contract, and will be liable to forfeiture as hereinbefore mentioned. He will also be required at the same time to pay a like sum of Two thousand pounds, by way of royalty, in advance. The, contractor will at no time be at liberty to remove any guano unless the royalty agreed upon has been paid, and no less sum than Two thousand pounds will be accepted at any time in payment of royalty until such time as there is left on the slands a quantity of guano the agreed royalty on which shall be less than Two thousand pounds.

The only instructions that will be given to the Government

The only instructions that will be given to the Government Officer stationed on the islands, and which he will be required to insist upon with regard to the manner in which and the places from which the guano shall be removed, will be to divide the islands into convenient sections, to point out the section or sections from which guano may be removed, and to require that the whole of any one section be cleared before any new ground is entered on.

The quantity of guano taken by each ship on which royalty has to be paid shall be ascertained by adding 25 per cent. to the registered tonuage of timber-built ships, and 40 per cent. to the registered tonuage of iron-built ships; provided that, if the captain or agent of any ship, or the Government Officer, shall in any instance be dissatisfied with the foregoing arrangement, he shall be at liberty to cause the ship to be exactly measured according to Lloyd's rules, and the number of cubical feet so ascertained divided by 40 shall be taken to be the tonuage capacity of the ship.

No tonnage, light, or harbor dues will be charged in any port of the colony on ships solely engaged in the guano trade, and no customs duties will be levied on goods and stores that may be landed on the islands for persons solely employed in the preparation and shipment of guano.

The contractor will be at liberty to erect on any or all of the islands any buildings, jetties, tramways, &c., and, subject to the conditions before expressed as to forfeiture, to remove the same at any time within six months of the termination of the contract.

No license for the shipment of guano under the regulations now in force will be granted after the 15th August next, and every such license granted after the date hereof will provide for the compulsory removal of the guano for the shipment of which it is the permit before the 15th October next.

· It will at all times be optional with the licensee to ship the guano in its natural state, or artificially prepared, dried, or sifted.

The contract to be entered into in pursuance of this notice shall be deemed to commence on 1st January 1879.

Each tender, unless otherwise expressed, shall be deemed to be open to acceptance by the Government for the space of one calendar month from the 15th October, and the Government shall be at liberty to accept any tender by notifying to the person making it, by telegraph, that his tender is accepted.
